1.—Agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Denmark relative to Merchant Seamen Deserters.

Signed at London, June 21, 1881.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, being desirous, for the benefit of the commerce of the two countries, to facilitate the discovery, apprehension, and surrender of seamen who may desert from merchant vessels of either country, on the basis of a full and entire reciprocity, have agreed as follows—

It is mutually agreed that if any seamen or apprentices, not being slaves, should desert from any ship belonging to a subject of either of the Contracting Parties, within any port in the territories or in the possessions or Colonies of the other Contracting Party, the authorities of such port and territory, possession or Colony, shall be bound to give every assistance in their power for the apprehension and sending on board of such deserters, on application to that effect being made to them by the Consul of the country to which the ship of the deserter may belong, or by the deputy or representative of the Consul.

It is understood that the preceding stipulations shall not apply to subjects of the country where the desertion shall take place.

Each of the two High Contracting Parties reserves to itself the right of terminating this Agreement at any time, on giving to the other a year's notice of its wish to that effect.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized for that purpose, have signed the present Agreement, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Man er enig om, at foranstaaende Bestemmelse ingen Anvendelse finder paa Undersaatter af det Land, hvor Rømningen har fundet Sted.

2.—Agreement between the Governments of Great Britain and Sweden and Norway for the Mutual Relief of Distressed Seamen.

Signed at London, July 12, 1881.

THE Government of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Government of His Majesty the King of Sweden and Norway, being desirous to make arrangements for the relief of distressed seamen of the respective nations in certain cases, the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have agreed as follows:—

If a seaman of one of the Contracting States, after serving on board a ship of the other Contracting State, remains behind in a third State or in its Colonies, or in the Colonies of that State whose flag the ship carries, and the said seaman is in a helpless condition in consequence of shipwreck or from other causes, then the Government of that State whose flag the ship bears shall be bound to support the said seaman until he enters into ship-service again, or finds other employment, or until he arrives in his native State or its Colonies, or dies.

But this is on condition that the seaman so situated shall avail himself of the first opportunity that offers to prove his necessitous condition and the causes thereof to the proper officials of the State whose support is to be solicited, and that the destitution is shown to be the natural consequence of the termination of his service on board the ship; otherwise the aforesaid liability to afford relief lapses.

The said liability is also excluded if the seaman has deserted, or has been turned out of the ship for any criminal act, or has left it on account of disability for service in consequence of illness or wounding resulting from his own fault.

The relief includes maintenance, clothing, medical attendance, medicine, and travelling expenses; in case of death the funeral expenses are also to be paid.

The present Agreement shall come into operation on the 1st September 1881, and shall continue in force until one of the Contracting Parties shall announce to the other, one year in advance, its intention to terminate it.

The births of 871 children, viz., 462 boys and 409 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 721 births were registered, or 150 less than in the month under review. The births were 123 above the average of the previous seven years, and 34 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 457, viz., 234 of males and 223 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 414. The deaths outnumbered those in July by 11, and exceeded the average of August, during the previous ten years, by 95. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been greater than that average by 68.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74°7' on the 16th, and the lowest was 33°1' on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (51°29') was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27°9') took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 60°1' to a minimum of 33°1'. The least range (7°1') was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 56°9' to a minimum of 49°8'. The mean daily range was 14°4'. The mean atmospheric pressure (30°077 inches) was slightly above the average.

Deaths of males and females in the month under notice were in the proportions of 51 and 49 per cent. respectively. Deaths of persons under and over 5 years of age were in the proportions of 67 and 33 per cent. Children under 5 contributed to the total mortality 43 per cent. In August 1880; 36 per cent. in August 1879; 31 per cent. in August 1878; 34 per cent. in August 1877; 32 per cent. in August 1876; 33 per cent. in August 1875; 30 per cent. in August 1874 and in August 1873; 33½ per cent. in August 1872; and 45 per cent. in August 1871.

The deaths of 24 persons of the age of 75 years or upwards were registered during the month, viz.:—Those of a blacksmith, aged 76, who died of pleurisy; a female domestic servant, aged 76, of pneumonia; a plasterer, aged 76, of asthma; a blacksmith, aged 78, and a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of hepatitis; a well-sinker, aged 80, of rheumatism; a miner, aged 80, of congestion of the lungs; a painter, aged 81, of anthrax; a gentleman, aged 81, and a female, aged 86, of apoplexy; a female, aged 81, and a farmer, aged 86, of paralysis; a female, aged 81, of pneumonia; a male pensioner, aged 86, and a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a miner, aged 96, of pleurisy; a laborer, aged 76, a gentleman and a laborer, each aged 78, and four females, aged 81, 85, 88, and 91 respectively, of old age.

Twenty deaths during the month under notice were ascribed to external causes, of which 14 were set down to accident and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 13, died of concussion of the brain caused by being knocked down by a cab; a bootmaker, aged 56, of fracture of the spine, resulting from a boiler rolling upon him; a dealer,

aged 50, of fracture of the leg, caused by a kick from a horse; a gentleman, aged 30, of laceration of the brain, caused by a fall from a horse; a broker, aged 52, of injuries caused by falling from a building; a carpenter, aged 74, of erysipelas, consequent on an injury to the knee, the result of a fall over a doorstep; a male child, aged 3, of scalds; a grocer's assistant, aged 19, and a lamp-cleaner, aged 22, of burning, the first in a building, the latter through his clothes catching fire; a male infant, aged 7 days, and a laborer, aged 42, were found drowned; a male and a female infant, both under a month, also a female infant, aged 1 month, were suffocated, the last while in bed. Of those who committed suicide, a butcher, aged 30, shot himself in the head; a gentleman, aged 44, and a plumber, aged 50, poisoned themselves with strychnine; a hawker, aged 50, a blacksmith, aged 60, and a watchmaker, aged 65, drowned themselves.

One hundred and nineteen deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 13 in the Lying-in Hospital, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Madeline-street Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 152, of which 73, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 79, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 101 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 305. Of these, 161, or 53 per cent., were males, and 144, or 47 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 15 were upwards of eighty.

In August, as compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 68 to 57. Under this head deaths from croup fell from 7 to 4, those from erysipelas from 6 to 2, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 6 to 3. On the other hand, an increase from 71 to 94 took place in deaths from constitutional diseases. This occurred in deaths from cancer which rose from 2 to 9, in deaths from phthisis which rose from 57 to 68, and in those from hydrocephalus which rose from 5 to 9. The mortality from childbirth and metria still continues high, as many as 9 deaths being set down to these complaints in August as against 12 in July. The deaths therefrom in the last eight months, also the births, and the proportion of the latter to the former, were as follow:—

Rules.

1. That all charges be paid to the secretary before any grave or vault be opened.
2. Order for interment be given to secretary, by eight p.m., the day preceding interment.
3. Burial certificate must be produced on application for interment.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery, punctual to time appointed.
5. Usual hours for interment, from Ten a.m. week-days; and from Two p.m. to Five p.m. on Sundays.
6. Except on certificate of a justice of the peace, under Act 310, charges to be remitted only at the discretion of the trustees.
7. Application for vault or monument must be made direct to trustees.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but a brick grave or vault must be made under the direction of the trustees, or some one appointed by them, and in case interment has to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent of such person must be obtained, in writing, and accompany the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, fences, and tombstones must be kept in good condition by the owner or owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or a brick grave must be bricked or cemented, or covered in with a slab of freestone, granite, iron, or slate.
11. Wooden fences allowed, but may be removed by trustees if not kept in good repair, without notice to owner or owners.
12. A plan of the cemetery and a registry of the graves kept at the Secretary's office.
13. No servant or other person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for such duties.
14. Any person found doing any damage to the cemetery will be considered guilty of a misdemeanor, and liable to be punished according to Act of Parliament.
15. No dog to be allowed in the cemetery.
16. Cemetery to be open daily.
17. Three (3) of the trustees to form a quorum.

18. No graves to be less than five (5) feet deep.

19. Trustees reserve the right to alter the above rules.
