## AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1881-82.

6. Is the land the property of the institution.
7. Has the land been granted by the Crown or purchased by institute.
8. Number of books.
9. Number of visitors during 1881 to date.

Proceeding westward after clearing the reef under the Mission House, a course for the north end of Urara Island clears Midway Reef (or rather sandbank) on the port hand.

There are no dangers outside the fringe reef round Man Island. Proceeding west from Port Webber, there are no dangers between it and Matu Kanaputa Island, a berth of a mile being given Point Byney, as the reef runs out a great distance. On nearing Matu Kanaputa Island, Matara, or Matabert Island will be made out in one with the land. Course may be steered and anchorage picked up, when between the island and mainland, in 10 to 13 fathoms, sand; a small but well-sheltered anchorage with very good water easily procured.

When making Port Webber bring the Trader's house to bear N.E., and anchor when in 10 to 12 fathoms.

North-east coast of New Britain.—If required to anchor on the bank at Kabakadai a course may be steered for the Mission House, which will be easily made out (about 5 miles distant). After clearing Cape Stephens, to which a berth of half a mile must be given to clear the fringe reef, and when the reef is made out under the house, course may be steered for the White Patch, and anchor dropped in 13 to 15 fathoms; the bottom shelves rapidly.

The anchorage is only a stopping place for the night.

H.M.S. *Beagle* touched on a small patch at the entrance to Macada Harbor, Duke of York Island bearing as follows:—

## TORRES STRAITS AND NEW GUINEA.

THE following hydrographic information, supplied by H.M.S. *Wolverene* and *Alert*, is hereby made known for the guidance of officers commanding H.M. ships under my orders, and all others concerned.

NEW GUINEA.—(*Wolverene*).

A large vessel entering Port Moresby, after passing through the Barrier Reef, should steer N.E. by E. (magnetic) for Sandy Beach, on Locol Island, until Paga Paga Point bears N. by W., then steer for the point, passing it quarter of a mile off. The *Wolverene* anchored in nine fathoms between the two reefs marked on the plan, with Paga Paga Point bearing S. by E.

*Hood Bay, Kerepuna*.—*Wolverene* anchored mid-way between the reef (Kerepuna) and the shore in 5 fathoms, mud, with Kerepuna Point S.W. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  (where 10 fathoms is now marked on the chart). The bottom shoals gradually from 10 fathoms into 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ . A channel into the village was sounded for, but one could not be found safe for a large vessel, at least for 21 feet draught.

TORRES STRAITS.—(*Alert*).

Inner route to Torres Straits, near Cape Sidmouth.—*Alert* passed over a bank as she approached the anchorage; this was sounded out, least water found  $\frac{5}{4}$  fathoms. From the bank the Claremont Light Vessel bore N.E. 1 mile. *Alert* passed over a bank 9 fathoms, shoaling to  $\frac{4}{4}$  (reduced to low-water), then deepening to 8 and 11 fathoms. This bank was not sounded out. Claremont Light Vessel bears S. 30° E. 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ . Mehegan Rock (Prince of Wales Channel) has 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms on it.

Inee Point bears S. 67° W. 2', 7 $\frac{1}{2}$  cables.  
Strait Rock " S. 20° E. 3', 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  cables.

CENSUS OF VICTORIA, 1881.

THE following figures are the result of a tabulation direct from the Householders' Schedules, and may be accepted as final. The population as now given exceeds by 3,764—viz., 1,797 males, and 1,967 females—and the inhabited dwellings exceed by 67, the totals published in the approximate tables of the 23rd May last, which were compiled from the Enumerators' Summaries. An estimate of population, made up from the census returns of 1871, added to the excess of births over deaths, and of arrivals over departures by sea occurring between the period of that census and that of the census of 1881, would give the following numbers—Males, 507,075; Females, 422,856; Total, 929,931; or—Males, 54,902; Females, 12,093; Total, 67,085 more than the actual numbers returned at the latter census.

CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., WITHIN  
A CERTAIN AREA PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c. &c.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut or remove any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground were of less diameter than twelve inches, or remove bark from such trees on or from the Crown lands within the boundaries therein described: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the above-recited Proclamation, and to prohibit the cutting or removing of timber and bark from the Crown lands hereinafter defined: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of January One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground are of less diameter than eight inches, or which may be, from time to time, marked by any officer of the Government, with white paint, with the mark commonly known as the "broad arrow," or shall remove bark from such trees on or from the Crown lands around Sandhurst and Eaglehawk comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

SANDHURST AND EAGLEHAWK—DISTRICT AROUND.—Commencing at the junction of Wattle Creek with Sheepwash Creek, in the parish of Mandurang; thence up the last-named creek to the north-eastern boundary of the Sandhurst Water Supply reserve; thence north-westerly by that reserve to the road from Kangaroo Flat to Lockwood; thence south-westerly by that road to a branch of Bullock Creek bounding section 3, parish of Lockwood; thence north-westerly by the said branch to the east boundary of section 5; thence by the east and north boundaries of that section to the road from Lockwood to Marong; thence north-westerly by that road and the road forming the eastern boundary of sections 1 and 8, parish of Marong, to the south boundary of the town of Marong; thence east and north by the boundary of that town and east by the south boundary of the parish of Nerring to the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 4, in the last-named parish; thence north by that allotment and a line about two miles and a quarter to a point in line with the south-east boundary of section 1 and north-easterly by a line and the said boundary about three miles to the east angle of allotment 53; thence north-westerly by a road and north-easterly and east by the road forming the southern boundary of section 2 to the south-east angle of allotment 16 (J. A. Nicol's); thence northerly and north easterly by a road to the road from Raywood to Huntly, at the east angle of allotment 1 of section 5; thence south-easterly and easterly by that road, the road forming the north boundary of sections 5, 9, and 27, parish of Huntly, a line and the road forming the north boundary of section 24 to the north-east angle of allotment 5B of section 23; thence southerly by the east boundary of the last-named parish to the south-east angle thereof; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of allotment 69B, parish of Wellsford;

thence by that allotment and allotments 60 and 59 to the south-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-west angle of allotment 61; thence by that allotment and allotment 62 to the south-west angle of the latter; thence southerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of T. Murray's 19th section block; thence by that block to the south-east angle thereof; thence south-easterly by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 50; thence south-easterly and south-westerly by a road to the south-east angle of J. Frawley's 19th section block, parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence westerly by a road to the north-east angle of the town of Strathfieldsaye; thence by the east, south, and west boundaries of that town to the north-west angle thereof; thence westerly by a road to the west boundary of the last-named parish; thence south by that boundary to the south-west angle of the parish; and thence westerly by a direct line to the point of commencement; as shown on plan marked B, attached to correspondence 81.A.7462, deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the undermentioned Commons.

SHIRE OF TALBOT.—GERNDARUEL, ASCOT, AND TOURELLA FARMERS' COMMON; CRAIGIE AND EGLINTON FARMERS' COMMON; AMHERST FARMERS' COMMON; AND LILLICOUR, AND TATONG FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Talbot, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on any of the above-named commons, within five (5) miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses and mules, and the words "small cattle," shall mean sheep and goats.

3. The scale of fees, payable half-yearly in advance, for depasturing stock on any of the above-named commons, shall be as follows:—

For every horse ...	6s. per annum
" " head of large cattle ...	4s. " "
" " " small cattle ...	1s. " "
Young cattle under six (6) months old the progeny of stock legally depas- turing on the commons ...	Free

4. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on any of the above-named commons without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. Persons desiring to depasture stock on any of the above-named commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman, at the appointed branding yards, on the days set apart for reception of stock, and shall at the same time hand to the herdsman a duplicate of the written statements of the number and brands of the stock so delivered, and the managers shall on receiving the fees payable on such stock give a receipt in the prescribed form. The herdsman shall then proceed to brand the stock with the common brand in pitch and tar, and the owners or persons in charge of such stock shall render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding.

6. The managers or herdsman will not be responsible for the loss of any stock depasturing on the above-named commons.

7. The managers of the above-named commons may, if they think fit, set apart, for the depasturing of sheep only, portions of the above-named commons.

8. No person shall, without the permission in writing of the herdsman, wilfully disturb or remove from any of the above-named commons stock legally depasturing thereon.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the tenth day of October 1881, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of South Melbourne, municipal district of St. Kilda: Commencing at the north angle of the site; bounded thence by Princes street bearing south 45° E. four chains; thence by allotment 42 bearing south 45° W. five chains; thence by allotment 23 bearing north 45° W. four chains; and thence by Fitzroy street bearing north 45° E. five chains to the commencing point.

*Names of trustees.*—The Honorable Alexander Fraser, M.L.C., John Whitney, Florence Gardiner, Edward Whitehead, Thomas Newton, John Armstrong, Frederick Peterson, Percy Oakden, Greenwood Middleton, Henry Berry, Alfred Davis, Edward Tweddell, Ralph Wilson, and John Sundercombe the younger.

*Powers of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land, when and as the trustees or the major part of them shall, with the approval of the Annual Conference regulating the affairs of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria, think most advantageous. The authorized representative for the time being of the said church shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of *The Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said Annual Conference shall, for the purposes hereof, be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings. Subject to such power as aforesaid, the land or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan model deed enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales, under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To Wesleyan Methodist building purposes in St. Kilda, as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees.

REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or vault is opened.

2. Any person making a vault or erecting tombstone in the cemetery by permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives for ever.

3. On application for such permission being made to the trustees, a certificate will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. No charges will be made for permission to bury any poor person in such cemetery on proof to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that his relatives are unable to pay the costs and charges. Such applicants to sink all graves in such ground as the trustees may appoint.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, and in case an interment is to be made in any private grave or vault; the consent, in writing, of the person entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time of arrival at the cemetery.

7. The hours fixed for the performance of funerals are to be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m., and orders must be given the day before.

8. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, gravestones, and fencing to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners, and all wooden fencing not kept in repair may be removed by the trustees.

10. Every coffin in a brick grave or vault to be bricked or cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. The plans of all monuments and fences proposed to be erected must be first submitted to the trustees.

12. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

13. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise till sunset.

14. No person employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge of his duties.

15. A plan of the cemetery shall be kept for inspection.

16. Any person destroying fences or otherwise injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the laws direct.

17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

18. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges.

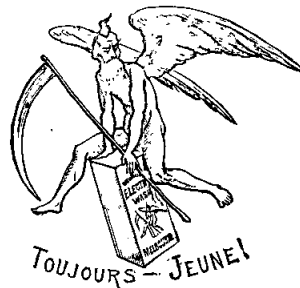

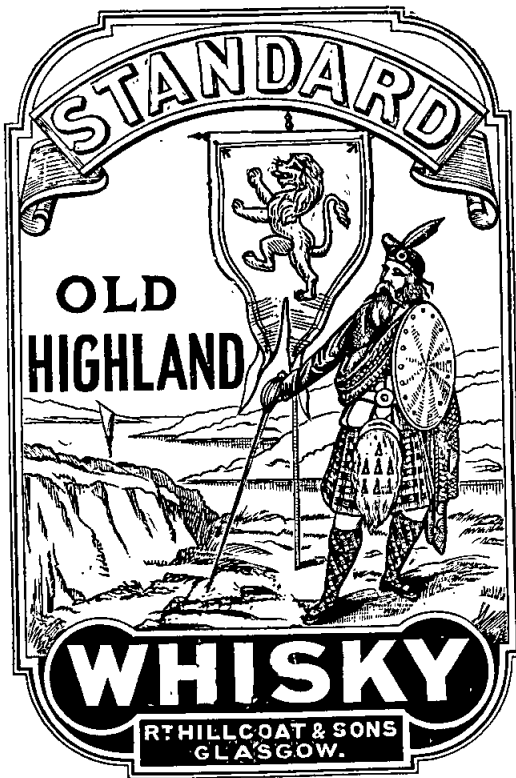
