PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING 1st DECEMBER 1881.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for Electoral Districts issued on or before 1st December 1880, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any District is entitled to a renewed electors' right for such District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*.)

REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO THE IMPORTATION INTO FRANCE OF PROVISIONS IN SOLDERED TINS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has directed the subjoined Circular Despatch and Enclosure to be published for general information.

SIR,

I have the honor to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a circular issued by the French Government, containing regulations with regard to the importation into France of provisions in soldered tins.

I have thought it advisable to send copies of this circular to all colonies, so that those colonies which do not export, but may import, provisions in tins may be aware of the opinion expressed by the French Government with regard to tins soldered in the manner described.

The attention of the Department of Commerce has been called to the dangers which consumers may incur by the use of preserved provisions enclosed in tins which have been soldered
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inside, and which are manufactured of white metal other than that lined with fine tin.

The Consulting Committee of Public Health, to whom the question has been submitted, has recognized that there are in effect serious disadvantages to the public health in the consumption of products which by their contact with solders, or with surfaces covered with an alloy containing lead, may be the cause of poisonings more or less severe. The Committee has, consequently, advised that it is necessary to prohibit the manufacturers of tins for holding preserved provisions from soldering them inside, and from using in the construction of these tins any white metals except those which have been lined with fine tin. The Health Committee has added that if the manufacturers persisted in continuing the practice of soldering inside they should be compelled to make use exclusively of pure tin. This advice has been adopted by the Minister of Commerce, and the Prefects of the Departments have received instructions accordingly.

It has been deemed necessary to make similar regulations with respect to tins for preserves of foreign make, as much in the view of the public health as not to place French manufacturers at a disadvantage as regard their outside rivals. The Minister of Finance has consequently decided, under date the 2nd April last, that it was necessary to insist that imported tins of preserved provisions should be made in compliance with these directions. Those which shall be known as not combining the conditions prescribed by the regulations shall be temporarily retained by the Department, whose duty it will be immediately to bring the matter under the judicial cognizance of the Public Prosecutor.

In order to allow French manufacturers to sell off the tins they may have in stock, it has been arranged that the new regulations shall only come into operation as from the 1st August 1881. It is likewise from that date that they will be enforced as regards foreign importations.

The Directors are invited to make these regulations known to the Department and to the trade.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the date of such publication: And whereas it is deemed expedient to adjust the continuous boundaries of the Shires of Berwick and Lillydale: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter and adjust the boundaries of the said Shires of Berwick and Lillydale, and doth re-define the boundaries of the continuous shires respectively in manner following, that is to say:—

CONDITIONS.

An applicant must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age; he will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or, he shall produce such a certificate as to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorized Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, on Monday, 19th of December, when the two competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where

he will be engaged in drawing and computing; he will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting for field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

A Bye-law of the city of Prahran, made under section 479 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 85, for regulating the Market place, situate in Commercial road, in the city of Prahran, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances and obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; for fixing the days (and hours during each day) on which the market shall be held; for regulating the use of the weighing-machines provided by the council; and for preventing the use of false or defective weights, scales, or measures; and for preventing the sale or exposure for sale of unwholesome provisions in the market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the city of Prahran order as follows:—

1. The market shall be opened for the sale of marketable commodities, vegetables, goods, wares, and merchandise, at half-past Five o'clock ante meridian on Tuesday and Friday in every week, and shall continue open until the hour of Eleven o'clock ante meridian; and shall also be open on Saturdays from Four o'clock post meridian until Eleven o'clock post meridian. The gates of the market-place shall be open for the admission of carts one hour before the time fixed for the opening of the market.

2. The duties of the inspector of the market, who shall also hold the office of collector and inspector of provisions, and his assistants shall be generally as follows:—

To see the market rules are duly observed in and with respect to the market.

To see that the gas is lit from 4.30 o'clock till sunrise.

To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended any person making a disturbance or cursing or swearing or using indecent language or offending against decency, or in any manner provoking a breach of the peace within the precincts of the market.

To inspect all articles of food or drink for human consumption exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome or of a nature deleterious to health, and prosecute or cause the persons in possession of the same to be prosecuted, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in the market which he may consider noisome or offensive.

To take charge of the market weighbridge and of the legally-stamped and verified scales and weighing appliances and standard weights and measures of the market, and on behalf of the council to demand, receive, and collect all tolls in respect of the weighing of carts with or without goods, or for the weighing or measuring of any commodities or articles sold in the market, to take care that all scales and weighing appliances, weights and measures used in the market be in accordance with the standard, and to seize such as are found fraudulent, un-stamped, or defective, and proceed as directed by the Weights and Measures Statute in respect to them and to their possessors.

To demand, receive, and collect, in the name and on behalf of the council, such sums of money as and for stallages, standings, rents, tolls, and market dues, as are for the time being appointed by special order of the council to be demanded, received, and had in that behalf respectively, and on non-payment thereof respectively to levy the same by distress, as by law provided, or to take proceedings before a justice in respect of the same, or for recovery of any penalty in respect of the selling, offering or exposing for sale, any commodity, article or thing without payment of dues or tolls. To proceed for the recovery of all penalties against every person who sells, offers, or exposes for sale, any unwholesome meat or provisions in the market, and for the destruction or confiscation of the same.

To weigh or measure any commodity as to the justness of which he shall have doubt, and, if found unjust, to prosecute the offender, and to seize such commodity in the meantime.

To appoint the several standing places and places for the deposit of goods, wares, and merchandise in the market, as well as the places for depositing and using utensils or materials requisite for the fixing of stalls, and to order the removal of the same, when and in such manner as he shall deem necessary.

3. The market standings shall be appropriated to the sale of marketable commodities, garden, farm, and dairy produce, goods, wares, and merchandise. Standings in the market shall be let to permanent occupiers for such days and periods and on such terms as the city council or the market committee may from time to time direct.

4. Commodities for food offered for sale in the market shall not be sold by bulk, but by Imperial weight or measure, according to their kind; any person offering to purchase may require the vendor of any such commodity to weigh or measure the same, and if any vendor shall refuse to weigh or measure such commodity, or if on reference to the market inspector it shall be found that such vendor has made a false representation of the weight or measure thereof, every such vendor shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

5. Any person who may sell or offer for sale by weight or measure any commodity which, when tried by the market inspector, may be found deficient in the weight or measure represented, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

6. Any person who may resist the inspector in the discharge of his duty shall, independently of any other penalty which may be imposed for assault or otherwise, forfeit and pay the sum of Five pounds for every such offence.

7. The entrance for vehicles into each market shall be by Commercial road and the exit by that in Elizabeth street, and any person contravening this rule shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay for every such offence, a sum not exceeding Ten shillings.

8. Except the carts of vendors occupying standings duly appointed for them, no carts or vehicles of any kind shall be permitted to stand in the market place, except where appointed by the market inspector, and after the ringing of the bell for opening the market, but the vehicles of purchasers or visitors to the market may be backed against the kerbstone of the market frontages of Commercial road and Elizabeth street, or at such other place or places in the vicinity as may be indicated for the purpose by the market inspector.

9. Any person who may place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the roads or footways in the market, or to occupy any other place than such as shall be appointed therefor by the market inspector, and shall neglect or refuse to remove the same on being required so to do by the market inspector, shall forfeit and pay the sum of Forty shillings for every such offence.

10. Any person who may place any nail, hook, or peg in any part of the wood, stone, brick, or ironwork of any standing or stall, or may in any way fit up or enclose any such standing or stall without the consent or contrary to the directions of the market inspector, or if any standing or stallholder neglect or refuse to take down any hook, nail, peg, or fittings in his or her standing or stall, when required to do so by the market inspector, every such person shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

11. Any person who may sweep or cause to be swept any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the roads, gutters, or footways of the market, and allow the same to remain there, or who, being the holder of any standing, shop, or stall in the market shall fail to remove any fat, offal, or other refuse or matter liable to putrescence therefrom, when required to do so by the market inspector, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

12. Any person who may place or keep any cart, carriage, wheelbarrow, or other matter or thing in any part of the market, contrary to the direction of the market inspector, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

13. Any person who may sell or offer for sale in the market any marketable commodity before the opening or after the closing of the market, or before or after the time appointed especially for the sale of such commodity, or for the occupancy of any standing place for the sale thereof, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.

14. Any person who may go into or appear in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or excite any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any gross, indecent, or abusive language, or be guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

15. The opening of the market shall be announced by the ringing of a bell.

16. The permanent occupiers of standings shall pay for them always in advance, for such period as the city council shall resolve from time to time to let them, the amount prescribed by any special order of the council; and in the event of any cart being loaded, in whole or in part, with vegetables or esculent roots containing other produce for which the said special order prescribes that dues shall be paid, then the owners shall pay the surplus dues over and above the previous payment. Any persons not holders of permanent standings shall occupy such places in the market as may be pointed out to them by the inspector of the market.

2nd. That it shall not be lawful for any person or persons whomsoever to keep, or allow to be kept, any swine or pig within the following boundaries of the Town of Geelong, such boundaries being defined as follows, viz.:—

1st. On the east by Garden street, from Corio Bay to Kilgour street.

2nd. On the west by Latrobe Terrace, from Griffin's Gully to Kilgour street.

3rd. On the north by Corio Bay, from Griffin's Gully to Garden street.

4th. On the south by Kilgour street, from Latrobe Terrace to Garden street.

And if any person shall keep, or allow to be kept, any swine or pig within any such prescribed limits, he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
