## PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING 1ST DECEMBER 1881.

### SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for Electoral Districts issued on or before 1st December 1880, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any District is entitled to a renewed electors' right for such District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*.)

## REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE PAYMENT OF DRAWBACK ON BEEF PRESERVED IN, AND EXPORTED FROM, VICTORIA.

(Act 43 Vict. No. 646, sec. 8.)

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the power and authority conferred by *The Duties of Customs Act 1879*, No. 646, sec. 8, has approved of Beef preserved in brine being included in the above Regulations, as published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th July 1880, No. 76, and that the amount of Drawback to be allowed shall be at the rate of Five shillings for every seven hundred and fifty pounds weight exported, of Beef so preserved in brine; to date from and after the 5th May 1881.

*Torres Straits*.—Moneta Shoal does not exist. The *Moneta* probably struck on the Harrison Shoal, a little further north (Charts 2375 and 691). Banda Rock was found by *Alert's* boats. It is a small patch six cables N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. of Booby Island Summit, and nine feet on it at low-water, with six fathoms around.

*Solomon Islands*.—Ugi.—Weather in May is on the whole fine, with occasional showers. Thermometer averages 80°. Trade wind blows daily, except during rain.

*Floridas*.—Port Parois (or *Utaha*).—*Cormorant* found a good passage both in entering and leaving by keeping in mid-channel. Table Rock was easily made out a long distance off. *Cormorant* anchored at the beginning of the *Utaha* Passage, leading to Niboli Harbor. The least water found by *Renard* in going through was 2½ fathoms.

*Eastern Florida Island*.—East Islet is about 200 yards in size each way, and covered with trees. There is a small reef off its south side. "Asses Ears" is about 30 and 40 feet high off a low shelving point, and a reef extends about 500 yards off it. No shoals were observed to the south or south-eastward of Asses Ears. There are several shoals between East Islet and the point to eastward of Tree Islet, generally with nothing less than 5 fathoms.

*Selwyn Bay*.—Best anchorage is in 18 fathoms, W. S. Trader's Hut bearing N. 80° E.; other berths can be taken to the northward. A vessel of longer than 170 feet should not anchor in less than 20 fathoms. At the anchorage there is often a current setting to the northward; at one time it set N. W. by W. 1' per hour.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF TREASURY, FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind Rules and Regulations for the care, protection and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind all Rules and Regulations heretofore made relating to the Treasury Garden, the Fitzroy Garden, the Carlton Garden, and the Flagstaff Garden, and doth hereby make the Regulations following for the care, protection, and management of the above-named gardens:—

## Regulations

1. All persons visiting or walking through the Treasury Garden shall keep on the footpaths.
  2. No person shall interfere with the seats, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds in any of the gardens, or throw stones or other missiles, beat carpets, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast off clothing, or litter, or refuse of any kind, or smoke when off the paths.
  3. No person shall climb on or jump over the seats or fences in or around the gardens, or lie on the seats or on the grass, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.
  4. No person, unless employed in the gardens, under the direction of the curator thereof, shall bring into the gardens any horse or vehicle, or enter plots of ground enclosed for plantations or for other purposes.
  5. No person shall bring into the gardens any dog, unless the same be held by a chain or cord.
  6. No children, under seven years of age, shall be allowed in the gardens, unless in charge of adult friends or nurses.
  7. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the gardens any act of indecency may be forthwith removed therefrom by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable, and will be liable to prosecution for an offence against these Regulations.
  8. All goats and poultry found within the gardens may be destroyed by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
  9. The Treasury Garden and the Carlton Garden shall be closed to the public daily during such hours as the Minister of Lands may from time to time determine.
- Offenders against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

## REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the Secretary when the orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. of the day previous to the interment, and certificate of registration produced.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
6. The charges will be reduced for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying, on payment of the proper charges.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
12. Wooden fences allowed, subject to the approval of the trustees; but, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Cemeteries Statute.
16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.
18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
19. No grave to be less than eight feet deep.

4. The time for bathing for each person shall not exceed 40 minutes.

5. No person shall use obscene language or deface the walls or doors of the said baths by writing or drawing thereon.

6. No person shall smoke or commit any nuisance in the baths.

7. No person shall be admitted to the baths who shall be under the influence of liquor, or who shall have been guilty of disorderly conduct in the said baths.

8. No dogs shall be allowed within the precincts of the baths.

Any person offending against this bye-law will be liable, under sect. 514 of the Act No. 506, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
