SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS

T is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for Electoral Districts issued on or before 1st December 1880, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any District is entitled to a renewed electors' right for such District (vide sections 61 and 62 of The Electoral Act 1865.)

REGULATION OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS MADE UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF "THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST ACT 1876."

TRUST AOT 1876."

In pursuance of the said Act, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation:

Whereas by The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners may from time to time, by Regulation approved by the Governor in Council, alter, raise, and lower at discretion all tolls, rates, and charges which they are authorized to demand, collect, and receive under the said Act: Now the said Commissioners, in pursuance of the said powers, do make the following Regulation, viz.:—

The Wharfage Rates on all goods landed from any vessel and proved to have been actually forwarded by railway within forty-eight hours after such landing to any part of New South Wales or South Australia shall be One shilling per ton, to be rated according to weight or measurement at the option of the Commissioners, anything in the Third Schedule to The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876 contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 1506, § 19, 38, 40, and 49), it was amongst other things emacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district, with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the Governorm Gazette, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised partly upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Rosedale therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act), and partly with a view of adjusting the portion of the boundaries of the said shires not affected by the said petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, and with the view aforcesaid, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Rosedale the portion of the shire described in such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Traralgon; and, with the advice aforcesaid, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Shire of Rosedale as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Traralgon now added to, in manner following, that is to say:

ROSEDALE SHIRE (reduced, and boundaries adjusted).—Commencing at the mouth of Merriman's Creek, county of Buln Buln; thence north-easterly by the Ninety-mile Beach to the entrance to the lakes; thence through that entrance and south-westerly by the southern shores of lakes King and Victoria, through McLennan's Straits, and by the southern shore of Lake Wellington to the mouth of the La Trobe River; thence up that river to and up the Thomson River to a point north of the north-east angle of allotment selected by F. A. Moore, but now held by Charles G. Wykes, parish of Moondarra; thence south to the said north-east angle; thence west by the northern boundary of said selection to its north-west angle; thence south-westerly by a straight line in the direction of the north-west angle of Anders Anderson's selection, parish of Tanjil, until such line is intersected by Rintoul's Creek, locally known as the Tyers Creek; thence southerly by that creek to its junction with the La Trobe River; thence easterly by the La Trobe River to its junction with Flynn's Creek; thence southey by the cast boundary of that selection and that of Ernest Bugge, Margaret Savage, John Draffin, and David Draffin, jun., to the south-east angle of the selection last named; thence southerly to the source of Merriman's Creek; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

A. Moore, but now held by Charles G. Wykes, in the parish of Moondarra, and the north-west angle of Anders Anderson's selection of 120 acres, in the parish of Tanji; thence southwesterly to the said north-west angle of the selection last named; thence southerly by its west boundary and the continuation thereof to the La Trobe River; thence easterly by that river to its junction with the Morwell River; thence southerly by the Morwell River to a point opposite the centre of a road south of J. #### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

\*\*W HEREAS by \*\*The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Commun hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act; that is to say:—

The Lexton Town Common, proclaimed by Order of the 18th

The Lexton Town Common, proclaimed by Order of the 18th day of February 1861, and increased by Order of the 2nd day of August 1869.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor might from time to time by a notice in the Government Gazette proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a Road and Street the portions of Crown lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders are given, or before the grave or ground is opened.
2. Orders for interuent must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment. the interment.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Seven p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten to Four in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours will be from Two to Five.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.

8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the

owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or

cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission, and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them unappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed; but, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

owner.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in Schedule A.

14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

17. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.

19. No grave to be of a less depth than seven feet. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

Rules and Reculations.

1. The charges for burying in, or otherwise using the cemetery, must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

2. The charge for occupying ground may be remitted by the trustees, when it is shown to their satisfaction that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charge, but all such burials must be made in that part of the cemetery marked "free ground" on the plan, and if the caretaker be required to dig the grave, then the usual fee for that service must be paid.

3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker at least six working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased by one-half.

half.

4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of an indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the caretaker.

5. The hours fixed for interment are from Ten o'clock a.m. till Six p.m., from September to April, inclusive, and from Ten a.m. till Four p.m. during the other four months, except Sundays, when the hours will be from Two till Five p.m. throughout the vear.

6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners, otherwise they may be removed by the trustees, after having given notice of their intention to remove them, by posting such notice to the last known address of one of the parties concerned.

7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented and covered in by a slab of stone, slate, iron, good blue or red-gum planking.

8. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal; and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every inscription must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.

9. The grounds will be open to the public daily, from sunrise to sunset.

9. The grounds will be allowed to be re-opened for further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years, except it be to place a second coffin on top of the first, and this will be allowed only when the grave has been originally sunk to a depth of six feet or

more.

12. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.
