PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEK ENDING 1ST DECEMBER 1881.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of Electors' Rights for Electoral Districts issued on or before 1st December 1880, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any District is entitled to a renewed electors' right for such District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865.*)

EXTENDING TIME DURING WHICH IT IS PROHIBITED TO HUNT, CATCH, OR KILL SEALS.

this eighteenth day of October 1881.

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council.
WHEREAS it is provided by the fifth section of *The Seals Fisheries Protection Act 1878* that, if he shall think it necessary for the preservation of seals to do so, the Governor may, by Order in Council, extend the time during which it is prohibited to hunt, catch, or kill seals over any term not exceeding three years: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the Colony of New Zealand, and in pursuance of the above-mentioned power, doth hereby extend the time during which it is prohibited to hunt, catch, or kill seals from the first day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, until the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

REGULATION OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS MADE UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF "THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST ACT 1876."

IN pursuance of the said Act, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation :—

Whereas by *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners may from time to time, by Regulation approved by the Governor in Council, alter, raise, and lower at discretion all tolls, rates, and charges which they are authorized to demand, collect, and receive under the said Act: Now the said Commissioners, in pursuance of the said powers, do make the following Regulation, viz. :—

The Wharfage Rates on all goods landed from any vessel and proved to have been actually forwarded by railway within forty-eight hours after such landing to any part of New South Wales or South Australia shall be One shilling per ton, to be rated according to weight or measurement at the option of the Commissioners, anything in the Third Schedule to *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876* contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.

DISTRICT WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, sec. 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exist, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say :—

Allotment 3 of section 3, township of Boort.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 13, 38, 40, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication; And it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised partly upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Rosedale therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act), and partly with a view of adjusting the portion of the boundaries of the said shires not affected by the said petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, and with the view aforesaid, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Rosedale the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Traralgon; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Shire of Rosedale as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Traralgon now added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

ROSEDALE SHIRE (reduced, and boundaries adjusted).—Commencing at the mouth of Merriman's Creek, county of Buln Buln; thence north-easterly by the Ninety-mile Beach to the entrance to the lakes; thence through that entrance and south-westerly by the southern shores of lakes King and Victoria, through McLennan's Straits, and by the southern shore of Lake Wellington to the mouth of the La Trobe River; thence up that river to and up the Thomson River to a point north of the north-east angle of allotment selected by F. A. Moore, but now held by Charles G. Wykes, parish of Moondarra; thence south to the said north-east angle; thence west by the northern boundary of said selection to its north-west angle; thence south-westerly by a straight line in the direction of the north-west angle of Anders Anderson's selection, parish of Tanjil, until such line is intersected by Rintoul's Creek, locally known as the Tyers Creek; thence southerly by that creek to its junction with the La Trobe River; thence easterly by the La Trobe River to its junction with Flynn's Creek; thence southerly by Flynn's Creek to a point north of the north-east angle of W. L. Rathgine's selection; thence south by the east boundary of that selection and that of Ernest Bugge, Margaret Savage, John Draffin, and David Draffin, junr., to the south-east angle of the selection last named; thence southerly to the source of Merriman's Creek; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

SHIRE OF TRARALGON (enlarged, and boundaries adjusted).—Commencing at a point in the centre of the La Trobe River opposite its junction with Flynn's Creek; thence westerly by said river to its junction with Rintoul's Creek, locally known as the Tyers Creek; thence northerly by that creek to a point in a direct line between the north-west angle of the allotment selected by F. A. Moore, but now held by Charles G. Wykes, in the parish of Moondarra, and the north-west angle of Anders Anderson's selection of 120 acres, in the parish of Tanjil; thence south-westerly to the said north-west angle of the selection last named; thence southerly by its west boundary and the continuation thereof to the La Trobe River; thence easterly by that river to its junction with the Morwell River; thence southerly by the Morwell River to a point opposite the centre of a road south of J. Collyer's selection, in the parish of Mirboo; thence west by said road to the south-west angle of that selection; thence south by same road to the south-east angle of Lucy Manton's selection; thence west again by said road to its intersection with Lydiard's track, south of the selection of Henry North; thence southerly by Lydiard's track to the Tarwin River; thence by that river south-westerly to a point due west of Mt. Fatigue; thence east by a line to a point on the track from Stockyard Creek to Morwell, *via* Mt. Fatigue; thence northerly by that track to its junction with the track to Rosedale; thence easterly by a line to the source of Merriman's Creek, being the south-west angle of the Shire of Rosedale; thence northerly by a line to the south-east corner of David Draffin, junr.'s, selection; thence by the eastern boundary of that selection and of the selections of John Draffin, Margaret

Savage, Ernest Bugge, and W. L. Rathgine to the north-east corner of the selection last named; thence northerly by a line to Flynn's Creek, and by that creek back to the commencing point. The bearings have reference to the magnetic meridian.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Order, amongst other things, altering for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of contiguous municipal districts, being shires, without any petition; and it was also enacted that any error in any Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act might be rectified by the Governor in Council by any subsequent Order: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the seventh day of November 1881 the boundaries of the Shires of Berwick and Lillydale were adjusted and re-defined: And whereas an error was made in the said Order in the description of the boundaries between the said shires which it is expedient to rectify: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke the hereinbefore-mentioned Order in Council of the seventh day of November 1881, and doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shires of Berwick and Lillydale in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

Bounded by a line commencing in the centre of the Dandenong Creek opposite the south-west angle of the parish of Scoresby, county of Mornington; thence up that creek by the parish boundaries of Ringwood and Mooroolbark and to its head at the boundary of the county aforesaid; thence southward by said county boundary to the centre of a road opposite the north-east angle of allotment 84, parish of Scoresby; thence by a direct line in a south-easterly direction to the junction of the Worriyallock Creek with Menzies Creek; thence southerly by the last-named creek to the northern boundary of the township of Emerald; thence westerly by that boundary and southerly by the west boundary of said township to its intersection with the county boundary of Mornington before mentioned; thence following that boundary easterly and southerly to a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of Cranbourne; thence west to the Kar-dinia Creek at said angle; up this creek to and by the south and west boundaries of the parish of Berwick to the north-east angle of section 31, parish of Eumemerring; thence along the north boundary of this section and the east and north boundaries of section 27 and allotments 13, 17, and 15 of section 25 to the main road from Melbourne to Sale; thence by this road to the east boundary of Dandenong township reserve; north by this boundary to the Dandenong Creek, and up this creek to the starting point.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

Bounded by a line commencing at the centre of the River Yarra Yarra, west of the north-west corner of section 12, parish of Warrandyte, county of Evelyn; thence up said river to opposite the south boundary of the parish of Gruyere; west to and by the said boundary to the Woerie Yaloak Creek; up this creek to its junction with Menzies Creek; thence by a straight line in a north-westerly direction to a point in the centre of a road opposite the north-east angle of allotment 84, parish of Scoresby, on the boundary between the counties of Mornington and Evelyn; thence northward along the county boundary to the head of the Dandenong Creek; down this creek to opposite the south-east angle of allotment 50, parish of Mooroolbark, in the county of Mornington; along the south boundaries of this parish and of Ringwood to its south-west angle; along the west boundary of same parish across the Mullum Mullum Creek to and along the west boundary of allotment 27, parish of Warrandyte; east to the south-west corner of section 23, in the same parish; north to the north-west corner of section 12, in the same parish; and west to the starting point.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders are given, or before the grave or ground is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery before Five o'clock p.m. on the day previous to the interment.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Seven p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten to Four in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the only hours will be from Two to Five.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the persons applying on payment of the proper charges.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission, and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument which may be preferred to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.
12. Wooden fences allowed; but, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in Schedule A.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. It is notified that any person wantonly or wilfully destroying or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, or tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished as prescribed by the Act in that case made and provided.
16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
17. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
19. No grave to be of a less depth than seven feet. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these charges and regulations.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The charges for burying in, or otherwise using the cemetery, must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.
2. The charge for occupying ground may be remitted by the trustees, when it is shown to their satisfaction that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charge, but all such burials must be made in that part of the cemetery marked "free ground" on the plan, and if the caretaker be required to dig the grave, then the usual fee for that service must be paid.
3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker at least six working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased by one-half.
4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of an indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the caretaker.
5. The hours fixed for interment are from Ten o'clock a.m. till Six p.m., from September to April, inclusive, and from Ten a.m. till Four p.m. during the other four months, except Sundays, when the hours will be from Two till Five p.m. throughout the year.
6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners, otherwise they may be removed by the trustees, after having given notice of their intention to remove them, by posting such notice to the last known address of one of the parties concerned.
7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented and covered in by a slab of stone, slate, iron, good blue or red-gum planking.
8. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal; and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every inscription must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.
9. The grounds will be open to the public daily, from sunrise to sunset.
10. No grave will be allowed to be re-opened for further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years, except it be to place a second coffin on top of the first, and this will be allowed only when the grave has been originally sunk to a depth of six feet or more.
12. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.
