GREETING—

WHEREAS the Governor of our Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in view of the yearly increase of expenditure necessitated by the extension of the existing system of Public Instruction, and, further, in view of the alleged grievances of a portion of the population, has deemed it expedient that a Royal Commission should forthwith issue to enquire into and report upon the whole administration, organization, and general condition of that system, with the object of ascertaining its deficiencies, improving its working, and, while retaining its efficiency, providing the most economic mode of further extending its operation: Now know ye that we, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, learning, and ability, have authorized and appointed, and by these presents do authorize and appoint you the said Sir Archibald Michie, John Macgregor, Cornelius Job Ham, John Warrington Rogers, Frederick McCoy, William Henry Archer, William Henry Cutts, Herbert James Henty, Edmond Keogh, Henry Nicholas Loughnan, George Meares, John Montgomery Templeton, Duncan Love, Francis Ormond, and William Peterson, to be our Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid: And we do by these presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power and authority to call before you such person or persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this our Commission, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever: And we will and command and by these presents ordain that this our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment: And we do hereby appoint you the said Sir Archibald Michie to be the Chairman of this our Commission: And for your assistance in the due execution of this our Commission we do hereby appoint Alexander Grant McIntyre, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to you our Commissioners, and to attend you, and his services we require you to use from time to time as occasion may require: And lastly, we direct that you do with as little delay as possible report to us under your hands and seals your opinions resulting from the said enquiry: In testimony whereof we have caused these our letters to be made patent and the seal of our said colony to be hereunto affixed.

Notes.—The increase during the quarter by excess of births over deaths was 4,228, viz., 1,957 males and 2,271 females. PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF WARANGA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Waranga has requested that the road hereinafter mentioned, within the Shire of Waranga, be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for a road as hereinafter described, and situate in the Shire of Waranga, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

SHIRE OF WARANGA.—Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 10, parish of Toolamba, north of Rodney, four chains forty-one links easterly from the north-western corner thereof; thence for one chain by the continuation of the said boundary in a straight line bearing easterly; thence for seventeen chains ninety-seven links by a straight line bearing southerly; thence for one chain by part of the northern boundary of the Mooroopna Station ground in a straight line bearing westerly to a point eight chains forty-eight links easterly from the north-western corner thereof; and thence for seventeen chains ninety-one links by a straight line bearing northerly to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 506, sec. 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exist, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the places or districts hereinafter mentioned to be places or districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. The locality known as Iguana Creek.
2. The township of Kaniva.
3. An area contained within a radius of two miles round the south-west angle of John Simpson's selection at Strathbogie.

THE Board of Land and Works, by virtue of the powers and authorities vested in it by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, doth hereby make the following Bye-law for fixing the Charges for the Carriage of Animals upon all Railways vested in the Board, to take effect on and after the 12th December 1881, that is to say:—

Sheep or lambs sent in vans of passenger or mixed trains must be in skeleton cases, and weight of skeleton cases to be included in the weight of the animals. All skeleton cases must be of a reasonable size, so as not to occupy too much room in the vans, and the department may refuse any case deemed too bulky, when the sender must supply one of the required dimensions.

Over three and up to ten animals, half sheep truck rate, whether sent in sheep or goods trucks; over ten animals, full sheep or goods truck rate, according to order. In calculating distances between stations either side of Geelong, the full mileage *via* Geelong is taken.

The minimum charge for a sheep truck is 40s., and for a goods truck, or half a truck, 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck for sheep trucks, and 1s. per truck for goods trucks, to be added to the above rate in all cases.

The department undertakes no responsibility as to number, but a free pass will be issued at the station from which the sheep or cattle are sent to a drover to accompany the sheep. For every order of three trucks up to fourteen, only one single second-class pass will be issued, whether the trucks are forwarded by one train or by several trains. If only one drover is present for a train of twenty-eight trucks, then one pass only will be issued, but a second pass will be given at the station where the train is divided should a second drover present himself. Under no circumstances are passes to be issued to drovers unless they are actually present and travel in the same train with the sheep. These passes are issued for the single journey only. Orders for conveyance of sheep will only be accepted on the forms provided by the department for the purpose.

Goats, pigs, or calves sent in vans of passenger or mixed trains must be in skeleton cases, and weight of skeleton cases to be included in the weight of the animals. All such skeleton cases must be of a reasonable size, so as not to occupy too much room in the vans, and the department may refuse any case which may be deemed too bulky, when the sender must supply one of the required dimensions.

Over three goats or pigs, and up to ten, not exceeding 100 lbs. each, half truck, and over ten, or over 100 lbs. each, full truck rate. Goats and calves at cattle rate. In calculating distances between stations either side of Geelong, the full mileage *via* Geelong is taken.

Store Sheep and Cattle.

Store sheep, in lots of not less than 500, to be carried from Newmarket to country stations at two-thirds published rates, and store cattle in lots of not less than five truck loads at one-half the published rates, provided always that the trucks are required to load on the up journey again from the line to which such store sheep and cattle are consigned.

NOTE.—Sheep or cattle which are carried at a lower rate on the down than on the up journey will be charged the lower rate for the through journey from one line to another, embracing both up and down journeys, provided the total distance carried is not less than 100 miles.

The minimum charge for a truck with horses is 20s., exclusive of a terminal charge of 2s. per truck to be added to the above rate in all cases.

RACE HORSES.

Bona fide trained race horses, i.e., horses kept solely for the purpose of racing, and not used in any other way whatsoever, will be charged full fare to the place of meeting, but on production of certificate from the secretary of the racing club under the auspices of which the meeting was held, that such horse or horses had started for one or more races during such meeting; they will be returned free to the station from which they were sent, certificate in each case to set forth the name, age, and reputed owner of the horse, and to be attached to the way-bill—Name and age of the horse to be also given by consignor in first instance. Should any doubt arise as to what constitutes a race meeting, the point will be decided by the committee of the Victoria Racing Club. Horses must be at the station one hour before the departure of the train by which they are intended to be forwarded.

NOTE.—The journey cannot be broken by horses claiming the above concession, and they must be booked back direct to their starting station within seven days after the meeting at which they ran has closed.

By the 121st section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, the liability of the Board is limited as follows, viz.:—For any horse, £50; for any neat cattle, per head, £20; for any sheep, pig, or other small animal, per head, £1. Any person forwarding animals of a higher value than as above-mentioned, and declaring their value at the time of booking, will, according to Bye-law XXXIX., be charged Five pounds per centum upon the value so declared above the respective sums so limited as aforesaid, and which percentage shall be paid in addition to the ordinary rate of charge.

No horses, cattle, or other animals are to be brought to the railway stations of the Board of Land and Works, except on the terms that the owner takes upon himself all risk of injury on its premises not arising from gross negligence on the part of the Board or its servants. And the Board is to be held free from all risk and responsibility in respect of any loss or damage arising on the loading or unloading, or from suffocation, or from being trampled on, bruised, or otherwise injured in transit, or from fire, or from any other cause whatsoever not arising from such gross negligence as aforesaid, or where the loss or injury arises wholly or partially from fear or restiveness; and all fastening in either horse-boxes or trucks must be done by the consignor, who will take the whole responsibility.

Horses, cattle, or other animals to be carried must be at the stations one hour before the departure of the train by which they are intended to be forwarded. And the Board does not undertake to forward horses, cattle, or other animals at or by any particular time or train. Not less than twenty-four hours' notice must be given when a horse-box is required, and 50 per cent. of the fare must be deposited when making the requisition. Such deposit to be forfeited if the horse or other animal does not arrive in time to be forwarded by the train appointed.

Rugs, bridles, saddles, or other trappings forwarded with horses or other animals are carried entirely at the risk of the owner, unless previously booked and paid for as parcels; and in any case the Board accepts no responsibility for damage done to these articles. Men travelling in horse-boxes or trucks, in charge of horses or cattle, to pay 2nd class fare.

DOGS.

Dogs will be charged for at the rate of One Halfpenny per mile, and must be provided with chains or other sufficient means to secure them, otherwise the Board will not be responsible for their safety. Minimum charge for each dog, sixpence.

NOTE.—In calculating the above rates, part of a mile will be charged for as a whole mile. In calculating all of the above rates for truck loads, odd pence are to be added on to make the even sixpence.
