## REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA.

*Lights for Fishing Vessels and Boats.*

By virtue of the power and authority conferred by the 116th section of the *Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, the Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in accordance with the Queen's Order in Council, dated the 26th day of August 1881, have adopted the provisions of such Order, and hereby give notice that the operation of Article numbered 10 of the new Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th January 1880) shall be suspended until the 1st day of September 1882, and that in lieu thereof, and in substitution therefor Article numbered 9 of the old Regulations (vide *Government Gazette* of 19th November 1880) shall continue and remain in force until the said 1st day of September 1882.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of South Australia, passed in a session held in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of Her Majesty's reign, No. 12, intituled "An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the importation of cattle into South Australia under certain circumstances, and for other purposes," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, to prohibit the introduction or importation of any cattle, or any particular description of cattle into the said province, from such places and during such times as should be set forth in such proclamation: And whereas by another Act of the said Parliament, passed in a session held in the twenty-seventh and twenty-eighth years of the reign of Her said Majesty, No. 19, intituled "An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Customs," it is, amongst other things, enacted that if any goods, enumerated or described in the table of prohibitions in the thirty-fourth section of the said Act, shall be imported or brought into the province of South Australia, then, and in every such case, such goods shall be forfeited, or destroyed, or otherwise disposed of as the Treasurer may direct: And whereas in the said table of prohibitions of goods absolutely prohibited to be imported are included infected cattle, sheep, or other animals, and hides, skins, horns, hoofs, or other part of cattle or other animals, which the Governor in Council may prohibit, in order to prevent any infectious or contagious distemper or disease: And whereas by a proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, on the tenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, the introduction or importation into the Province of South Australia of horned cattle, sheep, and pigs, shipped at any place or places beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies (save and except cattle, sheep, swine, and goats shipped from Great Britain, Ireland, the United States of America, and Canada, shipped at Timor to be landed in the Northern Territory), was prohibited until the said proclamation should be revoked in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas disease is known to exist in cattle, sheep, and swine, in divers places beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies, and it is expedient to continue the prohibition until further order herein: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the

provisions of the above-recited Acts, and of all other powers me enabling, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said province, do hereby revoke, annul, and make void the aforesaid proclamation published on the tenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, and in lieu thereof I do hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction or importation into the Province of South Australia of horned cattle, sheep, or pigs, shipped in Great Britain, or Ireland, or at any other place or places beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies (save and except cattle, sheep, swine, and goats shipped from the United States of America and Canada; and also save and except cattle, sheep, and swine shipped at Timor, to be landed in the Northern Territory: And I further order and direct that this proclamation shall take effect from the date hereof, and shall continue in full force and effect until the same is revoked by proclamation in the aforesaid Gazette.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette* : And whereas the names of the persons enumerated in the first and second schedules subjoined were incorrectly supplied by the Town Clerk of Geelong to the Electoral Registrar for the Geelong (North) and Geelong (South) divisions of the Electoral District of Geelong, the said persons not being entitled to be enrolled on the rolls of ratepaying electors for the said divisions, or either of them : And whereas the names set forth in the third and fourth schedules hereto were accidentally omitted to be furnished to the said electoral registrar for the electoral divisions aforesaid by the said town clerk within the time fixed by law for that purpose : Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth by this present Order direct that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the Geelong (North) and Geelong (South) divisions of the Electoral District of Geelong be rectified, by expunging therefrom the names so incorrectly supplied as aforesaid and contained in the first and second schedules, and including in the said divisional rolls the names as set forth in the third and fourth schedules hereto respectively, notwithstanding such accidental misfeasance as aforesaid ; and the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby declare valid the said divisional rolls of ratepaying electors so rectified.

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## SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

## BYE-LAW No. 1.

*A Bye-law of the Shire of Nunawading, made under the 218th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 1, for regulating the Proceedings of the Council, Officers, &c.*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follow:—  
Sections 1 to 57 of Part xi. of the 18th Schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874" is hereby adopted, in and for the Shire of Nunawading.

A Bye-law, No. 1, of this Shire, being the whole of Part xi. of the Thirteenth Schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874."

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed, as by this Act required, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing-order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor as the case may be.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise on addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision, as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. When ever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending, in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor, may of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but, if, on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk and signed by such councillor, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the

chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayers during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time on the written order of the municipal clerk to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole, in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council, the sum of Five pounds.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by an unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence, act of misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding (£5) Five pounds.

## SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

*Bye-law No. 2 of the Shire of Nunawading, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874."*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading order as follows:—

That the following portions of the "Police Offences Statute" shall be and are hereby extended to this shire, and adopted as a bye-law of the Shire of Nunawading, and such bye-law shall be numbered bye-law No. 2, viz.:—Part 1, sub-sections 1, 2, 7, 8, and 17, of section 5. "Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects, shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

1. Throwing any glass, filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any road, footway, or public place.

2. Riding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath.

7. Emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any nightsoil or other offensive matter, without a license from, and without having given such security as is required by, the local authority.

8. Allowing any nightsoil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into, or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.

17. Ruriously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.

## SHIRE OF NUNAWADING.

*Bye-law No. 3 of the Shire of Nunawading, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874."*

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Nunawading, order as follows:—

"If any cattle or horses shall be found upon any open ground, not being a common, or upon any street or road, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place or send the same to the nearest pound."

And any justice, if such owner be not known, may, upon proof thereof, issue a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner, as owner only, without otherwise naming or describing him, but the cattle so seized and the place of seizure shall be truly described therein, and such summons describing the cattle and place of seizure shall be published in some newspaper commonly circulated in the shire.

"Twenty-four hours after the publication of such notice the council, through the proper officer, may proceed with respect to such owner the same as if personal service of a summons, stating his name, had been effected, or, if the owner appears, then as in other cases; and the justice hearing the case may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting all penalties, costs, and expenses, shall, if demanded within one month from the day of sale, be paid to the owner, and if not so demanded then to the shire fund."
