ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

THE Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Dundas doth hereby order and direct that—

All that piece or parcel of land in the colony of Victoria containing by admeasurement twenty-two perches, more or less, being portion of allotment seven B of section eight, in the parish of Bochara, county of Dundas: Commencing at a point south fifty-six degrees east seven chains sixty-four links from the most northerly angle of the said allotment; thence bearing south fifty-four degrees west three chains sixty-five links; thence north forty-one degrees seven minutes east three chains forty-five links; thence south eighty-two links to the point of commencement;

And also all that piece or parcel of land in the said colony containing by admeasurement two acres one rood and ten perches, more or less, being other portion of said allotment seven B of section eight, in the parish of Bochara: Commencing at a point on the north-eastern boundary line of said allotment, bearing south twenty-five degrees five minutes east thirty-three links from the western angle of the reserve forming the north-eastern boundary of the said allotment; thence south forty-one degrees seven minutes west ninety-eight links; thence south two degrees six minutes east six chains twelve links; thence south one degree fourteen minutes east three chains ninety-five links; thence south twenty-two degrees fifty minutes east fifteen chains; thence north two degrees thirty minutes east two chains thirty-three links; thence north twenty-two degrees fifty minutes west twelve chains seventy links; thence north one degree fourteen minutes west three chains seventy-six links; thence north two degrees six minutes west five chains seventy-two links; thence north forty-one degrees seven minutes east fourteen links; and thence north to the commencing point; and which said several pieces of land have been purchased by the said council of the municipality of the Shire of Dundas for the purpose of making a new road—shall, by the foregoing descriptions respectively, or by such other descriptions respectively as shall more accurately define the same, be Public Highways within the meaning of *The Local Government Act* 1874 from the publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*.

And the said council doth hereby declare that such public highways shall be in lieu of the former road over all that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement two acres one rood and twenty-nine perches, being part of the one-chain road forming the western boundary of allotment seven C of section eight, parish of Bochara: Commencing at the northern angle of said allotment seven C; thence bearing north fifty-six degrees east one chain; thence south thirty-three degrees west three chains fifty-five links; thence south two degrees thirty minutes west twenty chains seventy-nine links; thence east two degrees thirty

minutes south one chain; thence north two degrees thirty minutes east twenty-one chains four links; and thence north to the commencing point, or by such other description as shall more accurately define the said former road.

(1.) Directions for Wide Bay Bar.

THE Government of Queensland has published the following directions for Wide Bay Bar, southern entrance of Great Sandy Strait.

Crossing the bar at night, Hook Point leading lights must be kept in line bearing W. by S. until Inskip Point leading lights come in line, which should then be steered for until a red light on Inskip point opens out.

A vessel will then be clear of the spit extending south-eastward from Great Sandy Island, and a mid-channel course should be steered until the lights on the west part of Inskip Point are brought in line bearing S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., which lead to the Fairway buoy off Snout Point, when, if dark, anchor till daylight.

(2.) Flat-top Island—Directions for inner anchorage.

Also the following directions for the inner anchorage, Flat-top Island, approach to Pioneer River:—

Two beacons (white) have been placed on East Point, which, kept in line lead clear of the reef extending northward of Flat-top Island. Two similar beacons have also been placed on the south-west part of Flat-top Island, which, kept in line, lead westward of the reef off Flat-top Island. Lights will be exhibited from these beacons when necessary.

Directions by day.—Intending to anchor westward of Flat-top Island, bring the beacons on East Point in line bearing W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., and steer towards them until the beacons on Flat-top Island come in line bearing S. $\frac{1}{4}$ E.; then alter course to S. by W. until Flat-top Island Lighthouse bears S.E.; a vessel can then anchor in not less than 18 feet at low-water spring tides.

Vessels of light draught may anchor closer in, where better shelter is afforded during south-easterly gales.

By night.—Steer in with the two lights on East Point in line, until a light on the south-west part of Flat-top Island opens out—then proceed as above directed.

NEW ZEALAND PILOT.—NOTICE No. 7.

THE following information, relating to portions of New Zealand, has been derived from Notices issued by the New Zealand Government, and from the Remark-books of officers of Her Majesty's ships employed on the Australian Station.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1880:

Poverty Bay, $14\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly. Queen Charlotte Sound, $15\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly.
Hokianga, 14° " Otago, ... 17° "

NORTH ISLAND.—EAST COAST.¹

AUCKLAND HARBOR.²—Depôt Point.—The buoy off Depôt Flat is moored in $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, and the reef which dries, extending from Depôt Point, is marked by a pole beacon.

Britomart Point.—A railway wharf extends $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables in a northerly direction from this point.

KANGITOTO ISLAND.³—On the west side of Rangitoto Island, between the beacon and the black buoy lying 8 cables S.S.E. from it, the depth of water to a distance of about a quarter of a mile off shore is considerably less than was formerly supposed; a depth of $4\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms at low-water was found at $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables W.S.W. from the beacon.

FRITH OF THAMES.⁴—There are two telegraph towers painted white at the entrance to Piako River, which are valuable land marks, and can be seen from a distance of 9 miles.

Convenient anchorage may be found in four fathoms, with these towers open of each other, bearing S.E., and Mount Two Peaks bearing N.E. by N.

A long pier extends off Grahamstown, alongside which coasting steam vessels lie.

TAURANGA HARBOR.⁵—This harbor, from the Outer Middle Bank to the Sand Hills North of Whareroa, was examined, resounded, and buoyed in 1879. The best time for large vessels to enter Tauranga Harbor is at about 20 minutes after high-water by the shore, as the tidal stream runs for at least 40 minutes after high- and low-water.

Directions.—Steer for North Rock on a south bearing, and then keep $\frac{1}{2}$ cables off the Maunga-nui shore, until between the black buoy on the eastern side of entrance, and the red buoy on the western side; from thence steer so as to pass within 30 yards of the beacon on Stony Point and haul close round it.

The south side of the channel, opposite Stony Point, is marked by two red buoys; and the western side of the channel, south of Stony Point, is also marked by two red buoys.

POVERTY BAY.⁶—The Government of New Zealand has given notice of the existence of a sunken rock or shoal in Poverty Bay:—

This danger (*Hawea Rock*) on which the steam-vessel *Hawea* touched when entering the bay on 12th March 1879, lies with the following bearings, viz.:—

Pa Hill ...	N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.
South extreme of Tua Motu ...	E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Note.—Pa Hill is a conical hill (470 feet high) situated about half-way up the bay on the north side, and these bearings place the danger about $\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the north shore of the bay.

Portland Island.—With a high south-easterly sea running, heavy breakers have been observed between Portland Island lighthouse and Bull Rock, distant about $\frac{2}{3}$ miles from the island.

COOK STRAIT.⁸

PORT NICHOLSON.⁹—The land between Pipitea Point and Government House has been reclaimed, and it is intended to fill in the shore within a depth of three-quarters of a fathom, as far as the Custom-house Quay; there is a depth of between 5 and 6 feet at low-water alongside the part already completed.

The Government offices erected on reclaimed land just south of Government House form a large white conspicuous building.

Patent Slip.—The patent slip, capable of taking up vessels of 2000 tons burthen, is 1050 feet long, with a cradle which can be lengthened to 276 feet. The *Avalanche* of 1200 tons burthen is the largest vessel hitherto raised; there is a depth of 31 feet at high-water at the end of this slip.

Queen's Wharf is being considerably enlarged, and has a depth of 21 feet at low-water alongside the outer head.

Buoys.—Several large iron buoys, painted red, have been moored off Queen's Wharf, but the holding ground for these moorings is not good.

Manawatu River.¹⁰—The Government of New Zealand has given notice of the establishment of a pilot station at Manawatu River.

This station, situated on the northern side of the river entrance, is distinctly seen from seaward. The international code, the colonial tide and danger or bar signals, may be used.

Two moveable beacons have been erected, which kept in line lead over the bar, and may be seen from a distance of 2 or 3 miles. The outer beacon is painted red, the inner black.

WANGANUI RIVER.¹²—The Government of New Zealand has given notice that, on 1st October 1879, the following alterations would be made in the local signals authorized to be used at Wanganui River entrance:—

Two moveable beacons (inner the higher), have been erected on North Head, from which are shown, when the tide serves and the bar is safe, red flags by day and red lights at night. These now serve for crossing the bar instead of the beacon and signal mast as heretofore.

Crossing the bar during the day, these two beacons should be kept in line; particular attention also being paid to the semaphore arm (used for guiding vessels inside the bar), on account of the curves in the channel.

Crossing the bar at night, the two red lights of the beacons should be kept in line; particular attention being paid to the green light, which will be used like the semaphore arm for guiding

vessels inside the bar. This green light travels on a yard on the outer beacon, and vessels must be steered in the direction in which the light is moved.

Note.—Vessels arriving off Wanganui bar at night should burn flash or blue lights to make their positions known to the look-out at the pilot station, who will answer the signal with a torch or flare light.

Sailing vessels should not attempt to cross the bar at night, as then the wind generally dies away or draws off the land.¹³

Tory Channel.¹⁴—Two beacons have been erected on Alapawa Island, which kept in line, lead through the east entrance in mid-channel. The beacons are formed of spars, the upper of which is surmounted by a white square and the lower by a white triangle.

D'Urville Island.¹⁴—Between Stephens Island and Saddle Rocks breakers were observed at apparently about 4 cables S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from the south-west extreme of Stephens Island.

CAPE KOAMOROO.¹⁵—The Government of New Zealand has given notice of the existence of a sunken rock lying about a quarter of a mile from the extremity of the reef on the western side of Cape Koamoroo, south side of entrance to Queen Charlotte Sound.

This danger (*Stella Rock*), on which the steam vessel *Stella* struck on 15th April 1880, is nearly a cable in extent north and south, with a least depth of one fathom at low-water spring tides, and from 10 to 13 fathoms around; it lies with the following bearings, viz.:—

White Rocks ...	N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.
Cape Koamoroo ...	E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

Note.—The south extreme of Long Island just open of the westernmost Twin, leads $\frac{1}{2}$ cables north-westward of Stella Rock.

Nelson Haven.¹⁴—A black post has been erected on Haul-shore Island, in the position formerly occupied by the bush used as an anchorage mark.

NORTH ISLAND.—WEST COAST.¹⁸

HOKIANGA RIVER.¹⁹—The Government of New Zealand has published the following sailing directions for Hokianga River bar, the result of a recent survey (1878) made by the colonial steam vessel *Stella*:—

The shoals forming the bar at the river entrance extend, as formerly, in a north-west and south-east direction for about 2 miles, at the distance of from $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{1}{4}$ miles from the heads, with two channels (north and south), in both of which a least depth of 18 feet was found at low-water spring tides. In the former main channel, a depth of only 9 feet was found, consequently the beacons for this channel have been removed, and will not again be erected.

The soundings close outside the bar, decrease suddenly from 8 to $\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms. Monganui Bluff in a line with a low point about 6 miles south-east of Outer South Head, leads close outside the bar shoals.

Leading mark for North Channel.—Andrews store (the southern house on the beach in Martin Bay) in line with the extreme of South Head, bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

Leading mark for South Channel.—The Schoolhouse (a conspicuous single white building on the rising ground northward of the old Pilot's house) in a line with the extreme of South Head, bearing N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

Directions.—South Head, 150 feet high, has a large white signal staff on it, from which the international code and general signals for New Zealand ports are shown. Mariners should be guided by these signals, especially the semaphore arm (see page 13, New Zealand Pilot) by which vessels are directed over the bar to a position within the Heads where a pilot will board them.

Note.—From the frequent changes of the bar, mariners are cautioned not to place reliance on the leading marks for the channels, but should follow the above directions:—

Vessels should not attempt to cross the bar, except with a leading wind and moderate weather, and never unless directions are signalled.

KAIPARA HARBOR.—*Galatea (Kemp) Channel.*—The principal entrance into Kaipara Harbor from seaward, known as Galatea Channel, was examined in February 1878, when there was found to be a depth of $\frac{5}{8}$ to $7\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms on the bar.

Directions.²⁰—Waka huranga, open a quarter of a point east of North Sand Head, leads to the entrance of Galatea Channel; and Middle Green Patch, bearing N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., with beacons on North Sand Head in line, leads through this entrance in about mid-channel.

Note.—The beacons and flagstaff on North Sand Head can only be seen from seaward for a distance of 4 or 5 miles.

MANUKAU HARBOR.²¹—In February 1878, there were two channels from seaward into Manukau Harbor, known as Main and South Channels; the former is the only channel a large vessel could enter by, but the South Channel (formerly known as the Fanny Channel) is the entrance most frequented. The least water in the South Channel is 2½ fathoms, the tidal streams are strong and the channel shifts after strong south-west gales.

Directions.—When approaching from seaward, a vessel should steer as directed by the semaphore arm, until the three beacons on the north side of the entrance are brought in line; the course must then be sharply altered and care taken to keep them in line until the harbor is well open.

The beacons on South Head no longer serve as a leading mark for the deepest water in the South Channel. Vessels must therefore pay attention to the semaphore alone.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—EAST COAST.²²

PORT LYTTELTON.—**Lighthouse.**—The lighthouse on Godley Head is situated on the edge of the cliff, and makes from the eastward as a small square white house with a hill in the back ground.

Signal stations.—Signal stations have been established on the hill above Toloa Head, and at the Observatory (a dark-red building faced with white stone), whence all vessels are signalled.

Time ball.—A time ball is dropped from the Telegraph Office at 1 p.m. New Zealand mean time.

Note.—Throughout New Zealand one uniform time is kept, called "New Zealand mean time," computed for 172° 30' E. longitude, or 11^h 30^m 00^s.

Breakwater.—Moles have been constructed extending from Officer and Naval points, the enclosed space (110 acres) being dredged to a depth of about 17 feet at low-water; it is intended to further deepen this until a depth of 20 feet at low-water is attained.

There is a width of 550 feet between the mole heads with a depth of 16½ feet in mid-channel.

QUARANTINE STATION.—A Quarantine Station has been erected on Ripa Island.

OAMARU.²⁴—The Government of New Zealand has given notice that the following danger signals are shown from a flagstaff on the cliff immediately south of the breakwater at Oamaru:—

Put to sea or keep at sea:—

By day:—Two balls horizontal on yard, on either side of mast.

By night:—Two white lights placed horizontally, with a red light between them.

Note.—In bad weather the green light at the extremity of the breakwater cannot be shown.

As the danger signals have at times to be made during calm weather, mariners must exercise judgment as to the practicability of proceeding to sea from the roadstead.

OTAGO HARBOR.²⁵—The following information relating to the bar and entrance of Otago Harbor has been received from the New Zealand Government:—

According to a survey made by order of the Otago Harbor Board, in March 1879, the least water on the bar of that harbor, with the leading lights in line bearing S.S.W., was 15 feet at low-water ordinary spring tides.

The green light open north of the white light, and bearing S. by W. ½ W. leads across the bar in 16 feet.

The least water found in the north channel was 19 to 20 feet.

Note.—Within the bar the channel (on entering) is marked by red buoys and beacons on the starboard hand, and black buoys and beacons on the port hand. The light-vessel is moored S.W. by S. 2 cables from the first red beacon.

According to the survey above referred to, the lighthouse on Taiaroa Head is situated N. 7° E. 190 yards from the position heretofore assigned to the signal-staff.

Caution.—It should be observed that the depths on the bar of Otago Harbor are subject to change.—For some years there was reported to be not less than 18 feet at low-water, but the great tidal wave of August 1868, suddenly reduced the depths to 12 feet. After that date the bar slowly resumed its original depth, so that in February 1871 there was stated to be again 18 feet in the channel across it, and according to information published by the local authorities, the same depth was maintained in 1876.

The depths in the north channel are also reported subject to change.

DREDGING.²⁶—Extensive dredging operations are in progress between Port Chalmers and Dunedin, a depth of 9 feet has

already been attained, and it is intended to dredge this channel to a depth of 18 feet and a width of 100 yards, to admit of large vessels proceeding to Dunedin.

Dock.—The private floating dock at Port Chalmers is about 150 feet long, and capable of receiving vessels of 400 tons.

There are two piers having a depth of from 13 to 21 feet water alongside them, and with sufficient length to berth nine large vessels; the railway runs directly on to the Commercial Pier.

Current.—With southerly winds, a current in the vicinity of the entrance to Otago Harbor is experienced, setting to the northward at the rate of from one to 2½ knots an hour.

MIDDLE ISLAND.—WEST COAST.

DUSKY SOUND.²⁷—The existence is reported of a sunken rock in Nine-fathom Passage, between Cooper Island and the mainland:—

This rock is stated by Mr. Garrard, commanding the steam-vessel *Albion*, to lie about 30 yards from the shore of the mainland.²⁸

AUKLAND ISLANDS.²⁹

Port Ross.—The dépôt in this harbor is situated close to the watering-place in Erebus Cove, and is provided with provisions, stores, and ammunition; it is a square wooden house, nearly white from exposure to the weather.

Blanche Rock.—Breakers were seen when passing Blanche Rock, both in the vicinity of that danger and to the southward of it.

Carnley Harbor.—Vessels intended to anchor inside Figure-of-eight Islands, should pass northward of that group, as the channel south of them is obstructed by reefs.

The dépôt in this harbor is situated in a ruined house at Epigwaitt, on the east side of North Arm, and a notice to that effect has been placed on Flagstaff Point.

CAMPBELL ISLAND.

South or Perseverance Harbor.—The dépôt of provisions in this harbor is situated in Tucker Cove, and the position is indicated by a staff.

The shoal situated on the north shore of this harbor, north-east of the Terror Shoal, is plainly marked by kelp.

CHATHAM ISLANDS.³¹

North-west Reef.³²—This danger is reported on tolerably good authority to be situated W. by N. ½ N. from the Sisters distant 4 miles.

Port Waitangi.³³—A signal staff has been erected on the hill above Point Hanson; the shoal water of this point is marked by kelp.

Landing on the beach is not good.

PACIFIC OCEAN.—NOTICE NO. 51.—SOUTHERN AND WESTERN PARTS.

THE following information relating to reefs and dangers in the South-west Pacific, has been derived from the reports of officers of H.M. ships employed on the Australian station, and other sources, 1879–80.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1880: Friendly Islands 9° 40' easterly. Samoan Islands 8° 50' easterly.

Reported breakers.³⁴—Mr. Ringe, commanding the German barque *Jupiter* on the voyage between Newcastle (New South Wales) and Tahiti, reports having passed breakers during the night of 3rd December 1878, in lat. 36° 37' S. long. 150° 15' W. The breakers were observed in two places, each of which had a diameter of about 30 yards, and appeared to be a quarter of a mile apart.

Maria Theresa Reef.—Recent investigation in connection with the position of the breakers just referred to, goes to show that Maria Theresa Reef is situated in lat. 37° S. long. 151° 15' W.

Edith or Somme Bank.³⁵—H.M. surveying schooner *Alacrity*, Lieutenant W. U. Moore, searched in vain for the Edith or Somme Bank in lat. 30° 58' S., long. 178° 5' E. The swell during

the day was from the south-east, and 6 to 7 feet above the mean level of the sea. Satisfactory observations were obtained for latitude and longitude, the weather was bright and clear, and discolored water would probably have been detected at a distance of 2 miles.

La Rance Shoal.—H.M.S. *Wolverene*, 9th April 1879, sounded in 38 fathoms, rock, in lat. 24° 59' S., long. 174° 46' W., and after steering N. 11° E. (true) for 2 miles, sounded again in 39 fathoms, coral. The position of these soundings is about 70 miles south-eastward of the doubtful position of *La Rance* shoal, the existence of which, such soundings tend to confirm.

Kremhilda Rock was said to have been seen in 1877, by a vessel of that name, in lat. 24° 50' S., long. 174° 0' W.

Vibilia Rock in lat. 31° 50' S., long. 178° 20' E., was reported to have been seen in that position, by a schooner of that name, in 1877.³⁵

Reported reef.—Captain Bröcker, commanding the ship *Carl and Auguste*, passed over a reef which he places in lat. 19° 3' S., long. 174° 3' W. This reef, extending about 3 miles N.N.E. and S.S.W., has an extensive sand bank upon it, and may be identical with *Acou Jago* islet, formerly reported to be situated in lat. 19° 0' S., long. 173° 52' W. Also, high breakers were seen in lat. 19° 10' S., long. 174° 6' W., which Captain Bröcker considered to be the *Campion shoal*.³⁷

Zephyr Shoal.³⁸—Mr. Carmichael, master of the schooner *Louisiana*, passed over a reef to which he assigns the position of lat. 15° 57' S., long. 176° 56' W., sounding thereon in 15 fathoms. The reef appeared to extend about 5 miles S.W. of the position given, and in some parts seemed to have less than one fathom of water over it. Good sights were obtained.

H.M.S. *Pearl* in 1876 found a depth of 5½ fathoms in lat. 16° 0' 20" S., long. 177° 0' W., which position bears S. 59° E. (true), distant 4½ miles from the position of *Zephyr Shoal* as originally reported by Mr. Wilson (1875).

It seems probable that these different authorities are dealing with the same extensive reef; the lat. and long. of H.M.S. *Pearl*, being considered the most trustworthy, will be retained for the present as the accepted position of *Zephyr Reef*.

SAMOAN ISLANDS.—**UPOLU.**—*Coral bank*.—The commander of the German war vessel *Albatross* examined and determined the position of the coral bank, discovered by the missionary barque *John Williams*, about 4 miles northward of the inner shores of Apia Bay, to be in lat. 13° 45' 24" S., long. 171° 43' W. (approx.).

From the centre of the bank the following bearings were taken:—

Apolima Island (centre) ...	S. 73° W.
Tofua mountain ...	S. 54° W.
French Mission College above Apia ...	S. 7° W.

The bank is of small extent and the discoloration of the water over it scarcely perceptible, the soundings ranging from 9 to 13 fathoms.

MARSHALL ISLANDS.—*Catherine Island*.—Captain Carvoso, commanding the British ship *Hawkesbury* when on a voyage between Sydney and Shanghai, passed within 3 or 4 miles of Catherine Island of the Admiralty charts, and found it to consist of fourteen islands connected by a reef, the whole extending about 20 miles N.W. and S.E., or between lat. 8° 57' N., and 9° 12' N., and long. 165° 52' E. and 166° 5' E. This group is the most westerly of the Marshall Islands, and in the track of vessels between Australia or New Zealand and China. The islands at the time were inhabited, two native canoes coming off towards the *Hawkesbury*, but the breeze springing up, that vessel did not delay to communicate.

CAROLINE ISLANDS.³⁹—*Susanne Reef*.—Captain J. O. Löser, commanding the German brig *Susanne*, reports that at 10 h. a.m. of September 17th 1876, broken water, which, upon closer investigation, proved to be a reef having a few black rocks above water, was observed in lat. 7° 7' N., long. 149° 13' E. The reef extended 1½ miles N.N.W. and S.S.E., and the breadth was estimated at half a mile. The position of the *Susanne* at noon of the same day was in lat. 7° 8' N., long. 149° 11' E., Enderby Island bearing N.N.E., distant 13 miles.

Uranie Bank.—The same authority reports the *Uranie* Bank to be more extensive than has hitherto been supposed, he having sailed for 12 miles on an E. by S. ½ S. course over it, obtaining soundings varying from 7 to 31 fathoms; the position started from being at a distance of 7 miles E.N.E. of Pozoat Island, or in lat. 7° 22' N., long. 149° 25' E.

BREAKERS.⁴⁰—Captain W. A. Barnaby, commanding the barque *Quickstep*, of New York, reports, that on a passage from Batavia to Manila, on the afternoon of Feb. 15th 1877, he saw what appeared to be a shoal, the sea breaking over it in white foam, extending E.N.E. and W.S.W. for about 1½ miles, and apparently about an eighth of a mile wide.

The position assigned to these breakers as carried forward from the noon position was lat. 4° 18' N., long. 136° 21' E.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony of Victoria, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of August One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, certain buildings, consisting of ten separate cells, erected in the Richmond Police Barracks, were proclaimed to be a Police Prison for members of the Police Force undergoing sentences: And whereas by another proclamation bearing date the sixth day of October One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the said buildings hereinbefore described were declared to be a gaol and house of correction within the meaning of an Act then in force, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of offenders*, for the reception and safe keeping as well of members of the police force as of other offenders undergoing sentences: And whereas the said premises have ceased to be used for the confinement of prisoners: Now therefore, I the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said proclamations hereinbefore referred to, and do declare that the said buildings and premises shall from henceforth cease to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

1. **River Murray.**—Along the left bank of the River Murray from its source to the point where the boundary-line between the colonies of South Australia and Victoria intersects the same, all land, the property of the State, within a distance of three chains from the ordinary winter level of the river as confined by the said left bank, and as regards the several ana branches leaving and re-entering that river on its left bank, the beds of the same, and all lands of the State within a distance of two chains from either bank of the said ana branches measured from the winter level of the water confined within the said banks,

2. **River Glenelg.**—(A.) The bed of the River Glenelg from its source in the Victoria Range to the point at which the River Stokes falls into it, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river between those points measured from the ordinary winter level of the river as confined within its banks. (B.) The bed of the said river from the junction of the River Stokes to high-water mark made by spring tides on the shore of Discovery Bay (excluding that portion of the river bed which falls into South Australian territory), and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of three chains from either bank of the said river measured from the ordinary winter level of the said river, and from high-water mark so far as the tide-waters extend along the bed of the said river.

3. **River Wannon.**—The bed of the River Wannon from its source under Mount William to its junction with the River Glenelg, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and where there is no defined channel to this river, a strip of land, the property of the State, four chains in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed, and at the Upper and Lower Falls on this river all lands, the property of the State, within a circle of five chains radius measured from the centre point of the respective falls.

4. **River Stokes.**—The bed of the River Stokes from the point where it is intersected by the western boundary of the Village of Digby to its junction with the Glenelg River, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said River Stokes measured from the winter level of the water within the said banks.

5. **River Crawford.**—The bed of the River Crawford from its source near Bransholme to its junction with the Glenelg, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank, of the same measured from the winter level of the water within the said banks.

6. **Surry River.**—The bed of the Surry River from the point where it is crossed by the Portland and Melbourne Railway to high-water mark made by spring tides on the shore of Portland Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and from high-water mark at spring tides, as far as the same extends along the bed of the said river.

7. **Fitzroy River.**—The bed of the Fitzroy River from the junction of Hunter's Creek till it meets Darlot's Creek, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river.

8. **Darlot's Creek and Lake Condah.**—The bed of Lake Condah and all lands, the property of the State, around the same within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from the contour level at which the waters of the lake discharge into Darlot's Creek, the bed of the said Darlot's Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links of either bank of the said creek from Lake Condah to high-water mark at spring tides on the shore of Portland Bay, and from high-water mark as far as the tideway extends along the bed of the said river.

9. **Eumeralla River and Lake Yambuk.**—The bed of the Eumeralla River from its source to the point where it enters Lake Yambuk, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and where

there is no defined channel to this river, a strip of land, the property of the State, four chains in width following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed; the bed of Lake Yambuk and of the channel communicating therefrom with the sea, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains from the said channel and lake measured from high-water mark at spring tides in said channel, and on the shore of the said lake.

9a. *Shaw River*.—The bed of the Shaw River from the south boundary of the homestead section of Dunmore to the point where it enters Lake Yambuk, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river.

10. *Moyno River and Belfast Lough*.—The bed of the Moyno River from the northern boundary of section 13, parish of Kangertong, to the point at which it enters the drainage channel cut through the Moyno Swamp, the bed of the said channel, till it re-enters the river near Tarrone, and again the river-bed to the point at which it falls into Belfast Lough, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river and drainage-channel, the bed of Belfast Lough and of the channel communicating therefrom with Belfast harbor, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains from the said channel and lough measured from high-water mark at spring tides in said channel, and on the shore of the said lough.

11. *Merri River*.—The bed of the Merri River from the point where it enters the village reserve of Woolthorpe to the point where it runs into Warrnambool Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, the said distance to be measured from high-water mark at spring tides, so far as the tideway extends upwards along the bed of the said river.

12. *Hopkins River*.—The bed of the Hopkins River from its source in the Great Dividing Range to Allan's Ford, near Warrnambool, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same; from Allan's Ford to the point where it falls into Warrnambool Bay, the bed of the river, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains, measured from high-water mark at spring tides, along such portion of the course of the river; also all land, the property of the State, within a circle of five chains radius around the Hopkins Fall, measured from the centre of the said fall.

12a. *Brucknell Creek*.—The bed of the Brucknell Creek from its source to the point where it falls into the River Hopkins, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said creek.

13. *Mount Emu Creek*.—The bed of the Mount Emu Creek from the junction of the Trawalla Creek to its junction with the Hopkins River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said Mount Emu Creek.

13a. *Tributaries of Mount Emu Creek*.—The beds of the following tributaries of the Mount Emu Creek, viz.:—Trawalla Creek, Spring Hill Creek, from their source in the Great Dividing Range, and Baillie's Creek from the point that it emerges from Lake Burrambeet, to their several junctions with Mount Emu Creek, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links measured from either bank of the said streams.

14. *Curdie's River and Inlet and Lake Purrambete*.—The bed of Lake Purrambete and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from the contour level at which the waters of the lake overflow into Curdie's River, the bed of the said Curdie's River from Lake Purrambete to Curdie's Inlet, and all lands, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links measured from either bank of the same, the bed of Curdie's Inlet, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains of high-water mark at spring tides on the shore of the said inlet.

15. *Gellibrand River*.—The bed of the Gellibrand River from its source in the Coast Range to its mouth, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same down to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence all lands, the property of the State, within two chains of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

16. *Aire River*.—The bed of the Aire River from its source in the Coast Range to its mouth, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links of either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

17. *Calder River*.—The bed of the Calder River from its source of the Calder Lake and of the channel communicating therefrom with the Aire River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river, lake, and channel, to its junction with the said Aire River.

18. *Parker River*.—The bed of the Parker River from its source in the Coast Range to its mouth, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and at the falls near the mouth of the river, all lands, the property of the State, within a circle of five chains radius measured from the centre of the said falls.

19. *River Burrum Burrum*.—The beds of both branches of the Burrum Burrum River from the source in the Coast Range and the bed of the united stream to the mouth of the same in Mount's Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence to its mouth;

all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river.

20. *Ersine River*.—The bed of the Erskine River from its source in the Coast Range to its mouth at Loutitt Bay, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence within a distance of two chains from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river, and all land, the property of the State, within a circle of five chains radius around the Erskine Falls measured from the centre of the said falls.

The following Notices were Gazetted 1st on 25 February, pursuant to Orders of 21 February 1881.

21. *Spring Creek*.—The bed of Spring Creek from the point at which it is intersected by the south boundary of the village of Jan Juc to its mouth, and all lands, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and within a similar distance measured from high-water mark at spring tides, so far as the tidal waters reach along the said creek.

22. *Thomson's Creek*.—The bed of Thomson's Creek from the point at which it is intersected by the western boundary-line of the parishes of Paraparap and Duneed to its mouth, and all lands the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and within a similar distance from high-water mark at spring tides, so far as the tidal waters reach along the said creek.

23. *Barwon River and Lake Connearre*.—(a) The bed of the Barwon River, both in its eastern and western branches, and of their combined stream from their source in the coast range to the breakwater, near Geelong, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and where there is no defined channel to this river, a strip of land, the property of the State, two chains in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed. (b) The bed of the River Barwon, of Lake Connearre, and of the channel leading from that lake to the sea, from the Breakwater near Geelong to high-water mark at spring tides on the shore of Bass Straits, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two chains from high-water mark at spring tides as defined on the banks of the said river, and on the shores of the said lake and said channel.

24. *River Yarrowee*.—The bed of the River Yarrowee from the point where it is intersected by the south boundary of the city of Ballarat to its junction with the River Barwon, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same between the points above defined.

25. *River Moorarbool*.—The bed of the Moorarbool River, in its eastern and western branches as well as of their combined stream, from the source in the Dividing Range to the junction with the Barwon River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same.

26. *Duck Ponds Creek*.—The bed of the Duck Ponds Creek from the point where it is intersected by the south boundary of allotment 60, parish of Lara, to the boundary of the foreshore of Geelong Inner Harbor, and all lands, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links of the banks of the same within the aforesaid limits.

27. *Little River*.—The bed of the Little River from its source in the parish of Bereanboko to the point where it falls out into the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, and all lands, the property of the State, within one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same, and within one hundred and fifty links, measured from high-water mark at spring tides, so far as the tideway extends along such river.

28. *Werribee River*.—The bed of the Werribee from its source in the Great Dividing Range to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links, measured from either bank of the said river, and from high-water mark at spring tides, so far as the tideway extends along the bed of the said river.

28a. *Tributaries of the Werribee River*.—The beds of the following tributaries of the Werribee River:—Korweinguboora, Korjamunip, Myrniong, Korkuperinul, Coimadai, Djerriwarri, Toolern Toolern, Parwan, Lerderderg River, from their several sources in the Great Dividing Range till they fall into the Werribee River, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one chain from either bank of the said several tributaries.

28b. *Lerderderg River*.—The bed of the Lerderderg River from its source till it falls into the Werribee River, the bed of the Lerderderg Reservoir, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river, and from high-water mark in the said reservoir around the same.

29. *River Yarra Yarra*.—The bed of the River Yarra Yarra between its source and the point where it is joined by the Plenty Rivulet, and the beds of its several tributaries between these points, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river, and within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of each of the said several tributaries.

30. *Dandenong Creek*.—The bed of the Dandenong Creek from its source to the point where it enters Carrum Swamp, the bed of the several drainage channels intersecting the said swamp and discharging into the Mordialloc Creek and Kanannook Creek, the

bed of the said creeks last mentioned, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links measured from either bank of each of the said creeks and channels before mentioned, and within one hundred and fifty links measured from high-water mark at spring tides on the banks of the Mordialloc and Kananook creeks so far as the tide-way extends up these streams.

31. *Kardinia Creek and Poomuc Creek.*—The bed of Kardinia Creek and of Poomuc Creek from their several sources to the points at which they severally fall into Koo-wee-rup Swamp, the bed of the drainage channel through Koo-wee-rup Swamp leading from either into the central drainage channel, the bed of the said central drainage channel to the point where the same falls into the reserve around Western Port Inlets, and all land, the property of the State, to a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said creeks and of the said channels.

32. *Buncep and Yallock Creek.*—The bed of the Buncep River from its source to the point where it enters the Koo-wee-rup Swamp; thence a strip of land, the property of the State, four chains in width following the general direction of the lowest level of the swamp to the point where the Yallock Creek emerges from the swamp, the bed of the said Yallock Creek to its mouth in Western Port Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said creeks which confines the waters flowing therealong in the winter season to the extreme point reached by the tidal flow in the Yallock Creek; thence all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said creek to its mouth in Western Port Bay.

32a. *Parago River.*—The bed of the Parago River from its source to the point where it falls into the Parween River, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same within the limits mentioned.

33. *Lang Lang River.*—The bed of the Lang Lang River from its source to the point where it falls into the Porbenurrock Swamp; from that point the bed of the drainage channel to its entrance into Western Port Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river and channel, and where there is no defined channel in the course of the Lang Lang River, a strip of land, the property of the State, three hundred links in width following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

34. *Bass River.*—The bed of the Bass River from its source to its mouth in Western Port Bay, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters; thence within a distance of two hundred links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of said river.

35. *Tarwin River and Anderson's Inlet.*—The bed of the Tarwin River from its source to the point where it falls into Anderson's Inlet, the bed of Anderson's Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from either bank of the said river to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence within a distance of two hundred links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river, and within a similar distance of either shore of Anderson's Inlet.

36. *Stockyard Creek.*—The bed of Stockyard Creek from its source to its mouth in Corner Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred links of either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water, thence within a distance of one hundred and fifty links of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said creek to its mouth.

37. *Franklin River.*—The bed of the Franklin River from its source to its mouth in Corner Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred links of either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water, thence within a distance of one hundred and fifty links of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

38. *Agnes River.*—The bed of the Agnes River from its source to its mouth in Corner Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within one hundred links of either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters, thence within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

39. *Albert River and Jack Rivulet.*—The bed of the Albert River and of the Jack Rivulet from their respective sources to the junction, and thence the bed of the Albert River to its mouth in Port Albert, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said Albert River and Jack Rivulet to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters; thence within a distance of two hundred links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said Albert River to its mouth.

40. *Tarra River.*—The bed of the Tarra River from the point where it emerges from Trenton Valley Morass to its mouth in Shoal Inlet, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters, thence within one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

41. *Merriman's Creek and Lake Denison.*—The bed of Merriman's Creek from the junction of Sassafra Creek to Lake Denison, the bed of Lake Denison and the bed of the outlet channel therefrom unto the Ninety-mile Beach, and all land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said creek to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence within a distance of one hundred and fifty links

of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said creek on the shore of the said lake, and on either bank of the said outlet channel to its mouth.

42. *Latrobe River.*—The bed of the Latrobe River from its source to the point where it enters Lake Wellington, and all the land, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same from the source to the junction of the Narracan Creek; thence all land, the property of the State, within a distance of two hundred links from the bank on either side, which confines the river at its summer level, to the mouth of the river.

42a. *Southern Tributaries of Latrobe River: Moe River.*—The bed of the Moe River from its source to the point where it enters the Moe Swamp, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same, and from the point that the river enters the swamp, a strip of land, the property of the State, three hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level along the bed of the said swamp till it reaches the Latrobe River.

42b. *Narracan Creek—Morwell River—Traralgon Creek.*—The respective beds of the Narracan Creek, of the Morwell River, and of the Traralgon Creek, from their several sources to their junctions with the Latrobe River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several streams throughout their entire course.

42c. *Northern Tributaries of Latrobe River: Tanjil River—Moondarra River—and Tyers River.*—The bed of the Tanjil River from its source to its junction with the Moondarra River, the bed of the Moondarra River to its junction with the Latrobe River, and the bed of the Tyers River from its source till it falls into the Latrobe River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several streams throughout their entire course.

43. *Thomson River.*—The bed of the Thomson River from its source to its junction with the Latrobe River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same throughout its entire course.

43a. *Tributaries of the Thomson River: Aberfeldy River—Donnelly's Creek—Fulton's Creek—Stringer's Creek.*—The bed of Aberfeldy River, of Donnelly's Creek, of Fulton's Creek, and of Stringer's Creek, throughout their several courses, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several streams.

44. *Macalister River.*—The bed of the Macalister River, of its eastern and western branches from their source till they fall into the Barkly River; the bed of the Barkly River till it falls into the Macalister; the bed of the Macalister from the junction of the Barkly till it falls into the Thomson River; and all lands, the property of the State, within one hundred links of either bank of the said several streams throughout their entire course.

ST. KILDA.—Site for the Recreation and Convenience of the People about to be permanently reserved, being portion of the land temporarily reserved for Public Recreation, by Order of 23rd September 1867.

46. *Mitchell River.*—The bed of the Mitchell River from the point at which the Dargo River falls into it to its mouth in Lake King, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links of high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

46a. *Tributaries of the Mitchell: Wonnangatta River—Wongungarra River—Crooked River—Dargo River—and Wentworth River.*—The several beds of the Wonnangatta River, Wongungarra River, Crooked River, Dargo River, and Wentworth River, throughout their entire course, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said several rivers throughout their entire course.

47. *Nicholson River*.—The bed of the Nicholson River throughout its entire course, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal water; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth.

48. *Tambo River*.—The bed of the Tambo River throughout its entire course, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same to the extreme point reached by the tidal waters; thence all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on either bank of the said river to its mouth in Lake King, and where there is no defined channel to this river, a strip of land, the property of the State, three hundred links in width, following the general direction of the lowest level between the points where the defined channel is lost and is again re-formed.

48A. *Timbarra River*.—The bed of the Timbarra River from its source to its junction with the Tambo River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said river throughout its entire course.

49. *Gippsland Lakes: Lake Wellington—and Macleannan's Straits*.—The bed of Lake Wellington and of Macleannan's Straits, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from the contour line of the winter level of the water in the said lake and straits.

49A. *Lake Victoria—Lake Bunge—Lake Reere—Lake King—and Reeres River*.—The bed of Lake Victoria, of Lake Bunge, of Lake Reere, of Lake King, and of Reeres River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on the shore of the said lakes and river, and of all islands within the circuit of the said lakes and river to its mouth on the Ninety-mile Beach.

50. *Boggy Creek and Lake Tyers*.—The bed of Boggy Creek from its source to the point at which it falls into Lake Tyers, the bed of Lake Tyers and of its several arms, and of the outlet therefrom into the Ninety-mile Beach, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the said creek throughout its course, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links from high-water mark at spring tides on the shores of the said lake and outlet respectively.

51. *Snowy River*.—The bed of the Snowy River, from the point where it is intersected by the boundary-line between New South Wales and Victoria, to its mouth on the Ninety-mile Beach, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred and fifty links measured from either bank, confining the river at its summer level between the said boundary-line and the mouth of the river.

51A. *Tributaries of the Snowy River: Buchan River—Murrindall River—Toonginbooka River—and Jingallala River*.—The several beds of the Buchan River, of the Murrindall River, of the Toonginbooka River, of the Jingallala River, and all lands, the property of the State, within a distance of one hundred links from either bank of the same throughout their several entire courses.

2. *Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *Every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient. **CHEQUES ON ACCOUNT OF DEPOSITS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

BOROUGH OF PORTLAND.

BYE-LAW No. 33.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Portland made under section 213 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 33.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland order as follows:—

REGULATION, ETC., OF BUILDINGS.

1. *Regulations for buildings.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes, hereinafter in this subdivision called in common "chimneys," or of parts thereof respectively to be specified in the regulation.

For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.

For regulating the distance from any class of building at which it shall be lawful to erect or construct a building for burning clay or other material.

For regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

For regulating the construction, materials, and enclosing by building, or otherwise, of fireplaces or furnaces to be used in the working of engines by steam, or in any mill, brewery, bakehouse, or gas works, or in any manufactory whatsoever, although a steam-engine be not used therein respectively.

For regulating the erection of tents.

For limiting a time, not in any case less than seven years from the coming into force of the limiting regulation, after which it shall not be lawful without the consent of the council to use, keep, continue, or suffer to remain, any building, roof, fireplace, furnace, or chimney, or the enclosure of any fireplace, furnace, or chimney originally constructed or made without violation of law and existing at the time of such coming into force, being of any such construction, height, thickness, materials, or description, or within any such distance of other buildings as respectively are contrary to any regulation existing at the time of such coming into force.

For appointing fees, not in any case exceeding the sum of Two pounds, which may be charged and received on account of the municipal fund, by the proper officer of the council, for any inspection, superintendence, or other service, made or performed by him under any such regulations as hereinbefore in this section provided for.

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole, or separately to a part or parts of the municipal district, described by boundaries, in such regulations; and may provide, with respect to the several matters of prohibition, restraint, and regulation, hereinbefore in this section mentioned, either absolutely or with relation to classes, rates, situations, distances, or other like data, to be laid down or referred to in general terms therein, and with or without relation to a right of approval, disapproval, or inspection, to be vested in the council, or some proper officer of the council.

2. *Constructing buildings, &c., contrary hereto.*—If any person, after the coming into force of any such regulation in this subdivision aforesaid, and whilst the same is in force, shall construct, alter, repair, or renew, within the limits prescribed in such regulation, any building, roof, fireplace, furnace, or chimney, or to put up any tent or enclose any fireplace, furnace, or chimney, contrary in any of the cases aforesaid to such regulation, or shall, after the expiration of the time (if any) limited in that behalf, and notice from the council to remove or alter any building, roof, fireplace, furnace, chimney, or enclosure to which the limiting regulation applies, use, keep or continue the same, or suffer the same to remain, or (if the case be so) to remain unaltered for more than twenty-eight days after the time when such notice has been given him, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day while such building, roof, chimney, fireplace, furnace, or tent continues so constructed or standing, or continues so as unlawfully altered, repaired, renewed, or enclosed, or while (if the case be so) the same shall, after the expiration of the said twenty-eight days, be used, kept, continued, or suffered to remain as aforesaid.

3. *Buildings, &c., heretofore unlawfully constructed.*—If any building, roof, fireplace, furnace, or chimney shall before the coming into operation of this bye-law have been constructed, or any fireplace, furnace, or chimney, enclosed or left unenclosed in violation of any law or bye-law theretofore in force, it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to the owner or occupier thereof respectively to remove, or to alter or enclose, so as to conform to any regulation in force in that behalf under this subdivision, such building, roof, furnace, or chimney, and such owner or occupier shall remove, or in manner aforesaid alter or enclose the same, within twenty-eight days after the service of such notice upon him, and if such owner or occupier neglect or refuse within twenty-eight days after such notice so served to remove or in manner aforesaid to alter or enclose such building, roof, fireplace, furnace, or chimney, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which the same continues or (if the case be so) continued so unaltered or unenclosed after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may first be convicted of any such offence under this section.

4. *Building, &c., heretofore improperly constructed but without violation of law.*—If any chimney shall have been commenced or constructed before coming into operation of this bye-law, and shall be of other height, thickness, construction, or materials or enclosed otherwise than respectively required by, or left unenclosed contrary to the tenor of any regulation in force under this bye-law, but shall have been so constructed, enclosed, or left unenclosed without violation of law, and if the proper officer of the council upon inspection had (which inspection any ratepayer may upon payment of Five shillings demand and require) shall deem that such chimney by reason of want of proper height, thickness, or enclosure, or by reason of its being constructed of inflammable materials, causes reasonable danger of fire to any building, or causes a nuisance through not properly carrying up the smoke, it shall be lawful for such officer to give notice to the owner and occupier of the premises in which such chimney is forthwith to take down, or alter, or enclose such chimney as the case may require for prevention of such danger or nuisance; and if such owner or occupier do not within seven days after such notice comply with the same, then any two justices, if they are satisfied that for the reasons aforesaid such chimney causes such danger or nuisance, may order the same to be removed, altered, or enclosed, as they may see fit, by the said officer, and reasonable compensation shall be paid out of the municipal fund to all persons who shall be put to expense or suffer damage in complying with any such notice or through the execution of such order.

RUINOUS OR DANGEROUS BUILDINGS, ETC.

5. *Notice to owner, &c., of ruinous building.*—If any building or wall, or anything affixed thereon, be deemed by the proper officer of the council to be in a ruinous state, and dangerous to passengers, or to the occupiers thereof, or of the neighboring buildings, such officer shall immediately cause a proper board or fence, and, if he shall deem it necessary, props, to be put up for the protection of passengers and of such occupiers, and shall also, if he shall deem it necessary, cause the neighboring buildings to be properly shored up, and shall cause notice in writing to be given to the owner of such building or wall, if he be known and resident in the municipal district, and shall also cause such notice to be put on the door or other conspicuous part of the said premises, or otherwise to be given to the occupier thereof (if any), requiring such owner or occupier forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such building, wall, or other thing, as the case may require.

6. *Justices may limit time for removal, repairs, &c.*—If such owner or occupier do not begin to take down, repair, or secure such building, wall, or other thing within the space of three days after such notice shall have been given, or put up as aforesaid, and complete such taking down, repairs, or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, such officer may make complaint thereof to two justices, and it shall be lawful for such justices to order the owner or, in his default, the occupier (if any) of such building, wall, or other thing to take down, rebuild, repair, or otherwise secure, to the satisfaction of such officer, the same, or such part thereof as appears to them to be in a dangerous state, within a time to

And in default be fixed by such justices; and, in case the same &c., council be not taken down, rebuilt, or repaired, or otherwise may do act. wise secured within the time so limited, or if no owner or occupier can be found on whom to serve such order, the council shall, with all convenient speed, cause all or so much of such building, wall, or other thing as shall be in a ruinous condition, and dangerous as aforesaid, to be taken down, rebuilt, repaired, or otherwise secured in such manner as shall be requisite; and all the expenses of putting up every such hoard, fence, and props, and of shoring up such building, and of taking down, rebuilding, repairing, or of securing such building, wall, or other thing shall be paid by the owner thereof, and any two justices may order such payment.

7. *Materials may be sold.*—If any such building or wall, as aforesaid, or any part of the same, be pulled down by virtue of the powers aforesaid, the council may sell the materials, or so much of the same as shall be pulled down, and apply the proceeds of such sale in payment of the expenses incurred in respect of such building or wall, and the council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner of the building or wall on demand.

8. *Land may be taken and sold in cases.*—If such owner cannot be found within the municipal district, or sufficient distress of his goods and chattels within the municipal district cannot be made, and the said expenses, or any part thereof, remain unpaid, the council, after giving twenty-eight days' notice of their intention to do so by posting a notice in a conspicuous place on such building or wall, or on the land whereon such building or wall stood, may take such building or land, provided that such expenses or so much as remains due be not paid or tendered to them within the said twenty-eight days, making compensation to the owner of such building or land in the manner provided by Part VII. of "The Public Works Statute 1865" in the case of lands taken otherwise than with the consent of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the council shall be entitled to deduct out of such compensation the amount of the expenses so unpaid as aforesaid, and may sell or otherwise dispose of the said building or land for the purposes hereof.
