PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE BOROUGH OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned, within the said borough, be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the borough of Hawthorn, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

SHIRES OF LOWAN AND KOWREE.

PROPOSED TRANSFER OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 39th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Lowan which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Lowan, and attached to that of Kowree.

Area described in the petition :—

Commencing at the intersection of the South Australian boundary with the north-west boundary of the pastoral run of Tallagiera; thence easterly by the north-west boundaries of the following runs, viz. :—Tallagiera aforesaid, Neuarpuir, Lemon Springs, Rose Bank, Pleasant Bank, Spring Bank, and Spring Hill, to the north-east boundary of the last-named run; thence by that boundary and the south-east boundaries of Spring Hill and Spring Bank runs, and part of the south-west boundary of Spring Bank (to Pleasant Bank); thence by the south-east boundaries of Pleasant Bank and Rose Bank runs south-westerly to the north boundary of the Shire of Kowree; thence by that boundary and the boundary of South Australia to the starting point.

Petitioners state that their sympathies and interests are more identified with Kowree than Lowan, that no money has been spent on the roads within the area described, and they desire that their rates may be expended on such roads, and therefore

Humbly pray that the portion of the Shire of Lowan above described, and forming one continuous area, may be severed from that shire, and annexed to the Shire of Kowree.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind clause 5 of chapter 3 of the Regulations made on the 1st day of April 1879, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:-

REGULATION.

Whenever it may be necessary to adjust the boundaries of any surveyed land, the Surveyor-General shall, on approval by the Governor in Council of such adjustment, certify as to the correct boundaries and area of any such portion or portions of land; and for every such certificate there shall be charged such fee as the Minister may direct.
