AID TO BUILDING FUND OF FREE LIBRARIES, 1880-81.

APPLICATION for a share in the sum granted by the Legislature in Aid of the Building Fund of Free Libraries will be received at this office until the 1st February 1881.

To entitle any institution to share in this Grant, such institution must be *bona fide* a free library, that is, a library open to the public daily free of charge, as is the case with the Melbourne Public Library.

The following particulars must be furnished, viz. :—

1. The name of the institution, which must indicate that it is a *bona fide* Free Library.
2. The amount expended in erection or purchase of Building.
3. Of what material constructed, and particulars of any further proposed expenditure.
4. The amount already contributed for building by the Government.
5. The amount locally subscribed for building purposes to date.
6. Is the land the property of the institution?
7. Has the land been granted by the Crown or purchased by the Institute?
8. The number of books.
9. The number of visitors during 1880 to date.

REGULATIONS AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF DRAWBACK ON MEAT FROZEN IN AND EX- PORTED FROM VICTORIA.

Act 43 Vic. No. 646, Sec. 8.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. Any person or company engaged in the freezing of meat in Victoria from imported sheep or cattle may, on compliance with the regulations hereinafter set forth, be allowed such amount of drawback on such frozen meat as is specified.
2. Any such person or company shall give at least six working hours' notice to the Collector of Customs of the intention to export, and pass the necessary export entry for any frozen meat intended for export, specifying whether beef or mutton, to be verified at the time of being passed by the following declaration :—

"I do hereby declare that I am the exporter of the frozen meat mentioned in this entry, and that the quantities and weights herein specified are correct, and that such meat was frozen in factory, situated at

"Witness my hand this day of 188

This should be signed by the exporter of the meat; if exported by a company, it should be signed by the secretary or other person duly authorized to sign on its behalf. The entry should be sent by the collector to such drawback or other officer for verification, as he may approve.

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3. A drawback of the full amount of duty paid on importation of sheep and cattle will be allowed on the exportation of the frozen carcasses. Satisfactory evidence of the payment of duty must be produced to the Collector of Customs.

4. Any such person or company desirous of availing themselves of these regulations shall at all times furnish any information required by the Collector of Customs, or permit him, or any officer deputed by him, to have access to the books, invoices, or other documents relating to the purchase or slaughtering of sheep or cattle, and the freezing of the meat, and shall afford every facility for enabling such Collector of Customs to check the claims which may be rendered by such person or company.

5. Should a special officer be, in the opinion of the Collector of Customs, required to examine and superintend the shipment of any meat for exportation, any such person or company shall, on demand by such collector, pay for the services of such officer at the rate of 1s. 6d. per hour.

6. The claim for any drawback shall be in the accompanying form :—

"I do hereby declare that the frozen meat above specified was duly exported as therein set forth; that it has not been re-landed in Victoria; that I am alone entitled to the drawback thereon, and which I hereby claim.

"Received this day of 188 , from the Collector of Customs, the sum of pounds shillings and pen , in full payment of the above drawback.

7. No drawback will be due or payable unless the debenture be tendered, duly completed, within one year after the exportation of the meat to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the Jerquer and found correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved under the hand of the Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by the Governor in Council.

8. The above Regulations shall take effect from the 1st of November 1880.

NOLAN'S DAM RESERVE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES KNOWN AS "NOLAN'S DAM," IN THE PARISH OF JEFFCOTT.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulations following to be observed and enforced in respect of the Reserve for Water Supply purposes known as "Nolan's Dam," in the parish of Jeffcott.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be under the control of the Council of the Shire of Saint Arnaud, as a Committee of Management thereof.

2. Every person using or carrying away water from the reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorised to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

(i.) For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

(ii.) For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

(iii.) For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

3. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

4. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**LORNE CRICKET AND PUBLIC RECREATION
RESERVE REGULATIONS.**

WE, John Stirling, Joseph Duncan, James Gosney, Richard Anderson, William Holliday, John Elkington, George Daniel Arnott, and William Allin Mountjoy, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the above-mentioned reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or light fires therein, without the permission in writing of the committee of management.

5. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

6. Any person who may have obtained the consent in writing of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any booth or other structure, for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the said committee in regard thereto.

7. The committee of management shall have power to charge and collect a fee, not exceeding One shilling, for admission of each adult person to the reserve, or to any portion thereof, on such occasions and on such days as the Board of Land and Works may authorize.

8. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed therefrom:—

(1.) Assaulting any other person.

(2.) Being drunk.

(3.) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice of cricket; or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground.

(4.) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(5.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

(6.) Behaving improperly or riotously.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of *The Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion*, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twelfth day of January 1881, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

Description of land.—Two acres, county of Bourke, parish of Dootta Galla, municipal district of Essendon and Flemington, being section 49: Commencing at the north-west angle, being a point bearing S. 82° 21' E. one chain from the north-east angle of allotment 2 of section 50; bounded thence by Racecourse road bearing S. 80° 21' E. three chains; and thence by roads bearing respectively S. 8° 29' W. six chains seventy-seven links, N. 81° 31' W. three chains, and N. 8° 29' E. six chains seventy-two links and a half to the point of commencement.

Names of trustees.—Samuel Grey King, Richard Hodgson, Edward Oakley.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, grant easements, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land, when and as the trustees, or the major part of them, shall with the approval of the Annual Conference regulating the affairs of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria think most advantageous. such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan model deed enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that Colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To Wesleyan Methodist building purposes in the neighbourhood of Flemington, Kensington, and Hotham Hill; one half to be appropriated to Flemington, and the other half equally between Hotham Hill and Kensington.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property, rights, and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every Order severing any district from any subdivided municipal district might abolish all the subdivisions, and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; in case any such Order did not abolish all the

subdivisions, the same should be deemed to cancel every entire subdivision severed, and as regards every subdivision of which a portion only was severed should either cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision or in separate portions to some other subdivisions, or should declare that such residue should thenceforth be deemed such subdivision; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Borough of Brunswick therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: And whereas by an Order made by the Governor in Council, and dated the sixth day of December 1880, the Borough of Brunswick was subdivided into three wards, namely, North Ward, Middle Ward, and South Ward, as therein described: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the South Ward of the Borough of Brunswick the portion firstly hereinafter described, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such ward of the said Borough of Brunswick shall be annexed to the City of Fitzroy: And the residue of the said South Ward of the Borough of Brunswick secondly hereinafter described shall thenceforth constitute and be the South Ward of the said borough, that is to say:—

Firstly: The portion annexed to the City of Fitzroy.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Nicholson street in line with the south side of Park street east; thence north by a line passing through the centre of the first-named street to the north boundary of portion 93, parish of Jika Jika; thence east by that boundary to Merri Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the south side of Park street east aforesaid; and thence west by the south side of that street to the point of commencement.

Secondly: The South Ward of the Borough of Brunswick as hereby constituted.—Commencing on the Merri Creek at the centre of Glenlyon street; thence west by the centre of the said street and a line to the Moonee Ponds; thence southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the south boundary of the municipal district; thence east by that boundary to the centre of Nicholson street; thence north by the centre of that street to the north boundary of portion 93, parish of Jika Jika; thence east by that boundary to the Merri Creek aforesaid; and thence northerly by that creek to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Graham Berry, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BYE-LAW No. 11.—PART I.—STREETS AND FOOTWAYS.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 11, for the purpose of adopting Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 of Subdivision 1 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 of Subdivision 1 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(1) PORTICOES, PROJECTIONS, ETC.

1. *Interpretation.*—The word "portico" shall mean and include every awning portico porch verandah shed shade or covering upon or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports other than the building against which it shall be of such portico.

2. *Erection of porticoes.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained it shall be lawful for the owner of any house or building abutting upon any public footway to erect or place against or in front of such building and upon or across such footway such portico as such owner shall see fit.

3. *Height, &c., of porticoes.*—Every such portico shall be supported by upright pillars or supports fixed on the outer line or kerb of the footway, and shall be in every part thereof of such height from the ground not less than seven feet, and with the pillars or supports thereof shall be of such shape figure dimensions and materials respectively as shall have been appointed as herein provided.

4. *Regulations relating to porticoes.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the height from the ground of such porticoes as aforesaid.

For appointing the shape figure dimensions and materials of such porticoes.

And there shall be deposited at the office of the council a plan and specification of such portico as shall be appointed in any such regulation, and such plan and specification shall be referred to in such regulation, and shall be open for inspection by any ratepayer or person interested at all reasonable times without fee or reward.

5. *Porticoes contrary to bye-laws or regulations.*—Projections and obstructions.—If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any building and upon or across any public footway contrary to some bye-law lawfully in force in that behalf, or if after such coming into operation any portico shall have been erected or placed against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway, otherwise than as shall have been appointed by some regulation to be made hereunder, or if any projecting window balcony step cellar door or window or steps leading into any cellar or otherwise lamp lamp-post lamp-iron sign sign-post sign-iron show board window shutters wall gate fence or opening or any other projection or obstruction placed or made against or in front of any building after the coming into operation of this subdivision therein shall be an annoyance in consequence of the same projecting into or being made in or upon or endangering or rendering less commodious the passage along any footway or street, it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to the owner or occupier of such building to remove or to alter so as to conform to such regulations such portico, or to remove or in such manner as the council shall by notice require to alter such projection or obstruction, and such owner or occupier shall within fourteen days after the service of such notice upon him remove or in manner aforesaid respectively alter such portico or such projection or obstruction as aforesaid respectively; and if the owner or occupier of any such building neglect or refuse for fourteen days after such notice served to remove such portico or such projection or obstruction, or to alter the same in manner aforesaid respectively he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which such projection or obstruction continues after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may be convicted of any such offence contrary to the provisions of this section.

6. *Porticoes erected without violation of previous bye-laws.*—Projections and obstructions.—*Proviso.*—If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico shall have been erected or placed without violation of any bye-law for the time being lawfully in force against or in front of any building and upon or across any public footway laid out as such hereunder or otherwise, and such portico shall not be in conformity with some regulation for the time being in force hereunder, or if any such projection or obstruction as in the last preceding section mentioned which has been placed or made against or in front of any building before such coming into operation of this subdivision shall be an annoyance, as in the said section mentioned, it shall be lawful for the council to cause such portico to be removed or altered so as to conform to such regulation, or (as the case may be) such projection or obstruction to be removed or altered as they see fit. Provided that the council shall give notice of every such intended removal or alteration to the owner or occupier against or in front of whose building such portico projection or obstruction may be seven days before such removal or alteration shall be commenced, and shall make reasonable compensation, to be ascertained and ordered, if the parties differ, by two justices, to every person who shall incur any loss or damage by such removal or alteration, except in cases where the portico projection or obstruction shall have been erected placed or made

without lawful right, or may be removable under some other act or law, in which no other compensation shall be made.

7. *Repair, &c., of porticoes.*—Every owner or occupier of any building against or in front of which there shall be any portico shall keep the same clean and in good repair; and it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to any such owner or occupier to clean and repair such portico, if and as the same shall require; and every owner or occupier who shall neglect or refuse within seven days after the service of such notice to effect such cleaning and repair shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which he shall fail to effect the same.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 12, for the purpose of adopting Sections 12, 13, 14 of Subdivision 3 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following Sections 12, 13, 14 of Subdivision 3 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(3.) SPOUTS AND DRAINS FROM HOUSES, ETC.

12. *Spouts, &c.—Drains.*—The owner or occupier of every house or building in adjoining or near to any street or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the council for that purpose, shall put up a shoot or trough of the whole length of such house or building, and shall connect the same either with a similar shoot on the adjoining house or building, or with a pipe or trunk to be fixed to the front or side of such first-mentioned house or building from the roof to the ground to carry the water from the roof thereof in such manner that the water from such house or the shoot or trunk fixed thereto, or from any portico or projection therefrom, shall not fall upon the persons passing along the street or road, or flow over the footway, but so that no such pipe or trunk shall be an obstruction to the safe and convenient passage along the footway, and shall construct or lay from and in continuation of such pipe or trunk to the water channel a gutter, herein called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through under and transversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as shall be authorized or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall thereafter keep in good condition every such shoot trough pipe drain and trunk, and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed laid and repaired subject to the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid or with the provisions of this section such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day that he shall so make default.

13. *Drains for discharge of surface water from land.*—Every owner or occupier of land in adjoining to or near any street or road, if such land shall be so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway, to the said channel and through under and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid or with the provisions of this section such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default.

14. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the materials and the size the level and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise, in like manner and so if they please that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation according to the discretion of such officer as the council shall thereby direct.

That the following Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26 of Subdivision 4 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:-

(4.) CROSSINGS OVER FOOTWAYS AND CHANNELS.

15. *Crossing, &c., footway, &c., save by made crossing.*—Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon along or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

16. *Notice of making crossing.*—If any land shall front to adjoin or abut upon the footway of any street or road and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

17. *Specification.*—Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

18. *Immunity of person giving irregular notice in certain cases.*—Unless within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid, the council shall give notice to the person giving the same, that (if the fact be so) such notice or the specification referred to therein and deposited is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulation as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

19. *Nature of crossing where there is a street-curb.*—In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street-curb in gentle curves outwards, and such crossing shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway, as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

20. *Nature of crossing where there is no street-curb.*—In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is no such curbing as in the last preceding section mentioned the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as shall leave a free passage for the water underneath the same, and shall be of such materials form length size strength and fall as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and the surface of such crossing so far as the footway extends shall be so made good by paving macadamizing gravelling or otherwise that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same shall not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing shall be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

21. *Departures from notice, &c., not punishable in certain cases.*—No person making any crossing shall be deemed guilty of an offence by reason only of some departure in making such crossing from the notice or specification relating thereto unless the officer of the council appointed as hereinafter provided to inspect the making of the crossing shall have reported in writing such departure to the council within three days after the same shall have occurred, and unless such person, being served by the council within three days after such report with a notice so to do, shall for the space of seven clear days after such notice have failed to correct or supply such departure.

22. *Council may alter improper crossing.—Expenses.*—If any crossing shall have been made in any respect contrary to this bye-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the council if they shall see fit to cause the same to be altered so as to conform hereto and to such regulation respectively, and to recover in manner in the "Local Government Act 1874" provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing shall lead; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

23. *Crossings for private streets.—Expenses.*—If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the council if they shall see fit to make in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

24. *Council may alter crossings made before subdivision in force.*—If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street or road, shall have been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision, but shall in any respect not be in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the council may if they shall see fit cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing shall have been made contrary to any bye-law in force at the time of making the same, the council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

25. *Repair of crossings.*—If any crossing shall be out of repair and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepared a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

26. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width depression and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length width size strength and fall of bridge crossings and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels inclination or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise in like manner.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That Section 27 of Subdivision 5 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:-

(5.) DEPOSIT OR DISCHARGE OF RUBBISH, LIQUID, ETC., ON STREETS, ETC.

27. *Causing, &c., offensive liquid, &c., to run in street, &c.*—Every person who causes to run from any manufactory or any establishment for the boiling or steeping of any animal matter or any brewery slaughter-house butchery shop or any dung-hill or other receptacle, or from any inn into or upon any street or road public or private or any footway or channel, and every occupier of any land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or road footway or channel, any offensive liquid or matter shall so run, forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run, forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

That Section 40 of Subdivision 8 of Part I. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:-

(8.) HOUSES, ETC., ENCRoACHING ON STREET, ETC.

40. *Houses built so as to encroach on street.*—If any person shall erect or place any house or other building or any part thereof upon over or across any public street or road footway or channel, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day while the same shall so continue.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—PART I.—PREVENTING OBSTRUCTIONS, ETC., TO STREETS, ETC., BY CATTLE, ETC.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 16, for the purpose of adopting Sections 41, 42, 43, 44, 45 of Subdivision 9 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following Sections 41, 42, 43, 44, 45 of Subdivision 9 of Part I of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(9.) OBSTRUCTIONS, ETC., TO STREETS, ETC., BY CATTLE, ETC.

41. *Cattle at large on unenclosed land.*—If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighborhood may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month of the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. *Cattle at large in streets.*—If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and the charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

43. *Goats sold for trespass to be released or killed.*—If any goat shall have been impounded under the provision of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorise the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

44. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district or such parts thereof as shall by boundaries be set forth in such regulation any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide if they shall see fit in such regulations separately with respect to Sundays and week days; and if any person shall drive any such cattle contrary to such regulation he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke.

45. *Breaking in, &c., horses in streets.*—It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street whether public or private, or in any public place save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorised to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

That the following Sections 5 and 6 of Part II. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

3. *Damming up water without consent.*—Whosoever shall without the consent in writing of the council construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river creek or natural watercourse or permanently obstruct the same in any way shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment or any part thereof shall continue.

6. *Obstructing, &c., culverts, &c.*—Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert sewer or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council by way of compensation for any such damage such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice shall order.

BYE-LAW No. 18.—PART V.—REGULATION, ETC., OF BUILDINGS.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 18, for the purpose of adopting Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, Subdivision 2 of Part V. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, Subdivision 2 of Part V. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(2.) RUINOUS OR DANGEROUS BUILDINGS, ETC.

5. *Notice to owner, &c., of ruinous building.*—If any building or wall or anything affixed thereon be deemed by the proper officer of the council to be in a ruinous state, and dangerous to passengers or to the occupiers thereof or of the neighbouring buildings, such officer shall immediately cause a proper board or fence and if he shall deem it necessary cause the occupiers, and shall also if he shall deem it necessary cause the neighbouring buildings to be properly shored up, and shall cause notice in writing to be given to the owner of such building or wall, if he be known and resident within the municipal district, and shall also cause such notice to be put on the door or other conspicuous part of the said premises or otherwise to be given to the occupier thereof (if any), requiring such owner or occupier forthwith to take down, secure, or repair such building, wall, or other thing, as the case may require.

6. *Justices may limit time for removal, repair, &c.—And in default, &c., council may do act.*—If such owner or occupier do not begin to take down repair or secure such building wall or other thing within the space of three days after such notice shall have been given or put up as aforesaid, and complete such taking down repairs or securing as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, such officer may make complaint thereof to two justices, and it shall be lawful for such justices to order the owner or in his default the occupier (if any) of such building wall or other thing to take down rebuild repair or otherwise secure to the satisfaction of such officer the same or such part thereof as appears to them to be in a dangerous state within a time to be fixed by such justices; and in case the same be not taken down rebuilt repaired or otherwise secured within the time so limited, or if no owner or occupier can be found on whom to serve such order, the council shall with all convenient speed cause all or so much of such building wall or other thing as shall be in a ruinous condition and dangerous as aforesaid to be taken down rebuilt repaired or otherwise secured in such manner as shall be requisite, and all the expenses of putting up every such board fence props and of shoring up such buildings and of taking down rebuilding repairing or securing such building wall or other thing shall be paid by the owner thereof, and any two justices may order such payment.

7. *Materials may be sold.*—If any such building or wall as aforesaid or any part of the same be pulled down by virtue of the powers aforesaid, the council may sell the materials thereof, or so much of the same as shall be pulled down, and apply the proceeds of such sale in payment of the expenses incurred in respect of such building or wall, and the council shall restore any overplus arising from such sale to the owner of the building or wall on demand.

8. *Land may be taken and sold in certain cases.*—If such owner cannot be found within the municipal district or sufficient distress of his goods and chattels within the municipal district cannot be made, and the said expenses or any part thereof remain unpaid, the council, after giving twenty-eight days' notice of their intention to do so by posting a notice in a conspicuous place on such building or wall or on the land whereon such building or wall stood, may take such building or land, provided that such expenses or so much as remains due be not paid or tendered to them within the said twenty-eight days making compensation to the owner of such building or

land in the manner provided by Part VII. of "The Public Works Statute 1865," in the case of lands taken otherwise than with the consent of the owners and occupiers thereof, and the council shall be entitled to deduct out of such compensation the amount of the expenses so unpaid as aforesaid, and may sell or otherwise dispose of the said building or land for the purposes hereof.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 19, for the purpose of adopting Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Subdivision 2 of Part VII. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following Sections 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Subdivision 2 of Part VII. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(2) DEPOSIT, ETC., OF INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS, ETC.

3. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land or from any building within which it shall not be lawful to make or keep any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, if not placed under roof or cover, and the like were placed under roof or cover, and for prohibiting or restraining the use for such covering of such inflammable materials as shall be described in such regulation.

For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any street or public place, or from any building, within which it shall not be lawful to deposit such combustible materials as shall be specified in the regulation, or save in some properly constructed fireplace within some building, to make or light any fire.

And every such regulation may be made to apply to the whole or separately to any part or parts of the municipal district described by boundaries in such regulation, and may provide as to the subject-matter thereof either absolutely or with relation to the consent of the council, or of the proper officer of the council, to be given or withheld in any case to be in question under such regulation.

4. *Stacks or coverings, &c., in violation of or otherwise than required by regulation.*—Every person who shall make or place any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, or place as for the covering of any such stack any inflammable material, or deposit any combustible material, or light any fire contrary in any such case to any regulation under this subdivision, and every occupier of any premises whereon any stack or any such covering of a stack shall be or any combustible materials have been deposited, if the same, though lawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of any such regulation, shall be there contrary to the tenor of such regulation, who shall not within seven days after notice from the council so to do remove such stack, covering, or materials, or who shall suffer to remain any such stack, covering, or materials, unlawfully made, placed, or deposited before the coming into force of such regulations, shall forfeit on conviction for such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after any such conviction during which such stack, covering, or materials shall so continue.

5. *Setting fire to matter without notice.*—Every person who wilfully sets fire to any inflammable matter whatsoever in the open air without having given notice in writing to the occupiers of the land adjoining to the land upon which such matter shall be, and also to the municipal clerk, of his intention so to do, or within twenty-four hours after giving the last given of such notices, or between the hours of four in the afternoon of any day and eight in the morning of the following day, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Fireworks.*—Every person who shall light any bonfire, tar barrel, or firework upon or within sixty yards of any public or private street or any public place shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

7. *Brush fences.*—It shall not be lawful for any person to make or place or to keep or continue any fence of brushwood bushes or other like material, and every person who shall make or place any such fence, and every owner or occupier of any premises who for seven days after notice from the council to remove any such fence thereto appertaining, if lawfully made or placed before the coming into operation of this subdivision shall suffer any such fence or any part thereof to remain, or who shall suffer to remain any such fence unlawfully made before such coming into operation, shall forfeit on conviction for such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in every such case a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day after any such conviction during which such fence shall continue.

BYE-LAW No. 20.—PART VIII.—NUISANCES, ETC.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 20, for the purpose of adopting Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 of Subdivision 1 of Part VIII. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:— That Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 of Subdivision 1 of Part VIII. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(1.) NUISANCES OF VARIOUS KINDS.

1. *Keeper of goats to register name and address.*—Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person shall, without lawful excuse, offend in any respect against this section, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. *Goats to be presumed to be kept by persons named on collar.*—If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. *Place for custody of goats seized hereunder.*—The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighborhood.

4. *Goats at large may be seized.*—Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may by the proper officer of the council be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. *Notice of seizure to registered owner.*—Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. *Goats seized may be destroyed after certain time.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this bye-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may by the proper officer of the council be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. *Owner may apply to a justice to have goat restored; but the restoration shall be conclusive as to his liabilities as owner.*—The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such a goat.

8. *Owners of all goats found at large to be liable to penalty.*—The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

9. *Regulation as to keeping swine.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing by limits to be set forth therein portions of the municipal district in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person shall keep any swine within such prescribed limits he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

10. *Removing nightsoil, &c.*—Every person who shall empty any privy, or load, carry, remove, or deposit any nightsoil, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter, save between such hours of the night, or shall deposit the same save at such places as respectively shall have been appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, or who shall use for any such purpose any cart or carriage not having a covering proper for preventing the escape of the contents of such cart or of the stench thereof, shall forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing such hours and places as aforesaid.

BYE-LAW No. 21.—PART IX.—MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 21, for the purpose of adopting sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 of Part IX. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 of Part IX. of the said Schedule be adopted, viz.:—

1. *Regulations as to Bathing.*—Where any part of the sea shore or strand of any river or creek used as a public bathing place

is within the municipal district or within three hundred yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough, the council may make regulations for and with respect to the time and place of bathing at or within such part, and according to the sex of the persons bathing or otherwise, and also as to persons resorting to or passing by such part whether by land or water, and for the stands of bathing machines, and otherwise for securing reasonable privacy for bathers and the observance of decency.

2. *Damaging trees.*—If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood, growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Removing soil, &c., from public places.*—If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break up, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. *What shall be deemed a secure fence in case of goats.*—For the purpose of those provisions of any statute now or hereafter to be in force whereby any person may be authorized to destroy goats, land shall be deemed to be securely enclosed and fenced if the same be enclosed or fenced with a substantial three-railed fence of the usual height, and the openings in which (if any) shall at the time of trespass be secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of like closeness and strength with the fence, or if such land be enclosed or fenced with any fence and gates or fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with such first-mentioned fence.

5. *Exclusion of rats from borough.*—Whosoever wilfully and knowingly, save by the authority hereinafter in this section contained, shall convey into or through the municipal district or shall within the municipal district have in his possession, or on his premises, or receive any rats, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such rat, and any person may seize and forthwith destroy any rat found within the municipal district, whether confined or not.

6. The council may employ any person or persons to destroy sparrows and minnows, and may make regulations for the effectual destruction of such birds.

BOROUGH OF GEELONG WEST.

BYE-LAW No. 22.—PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, &c.

A Bye-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 22, for the purpose of adopting Part XI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act, excepting such additions to and alterations and excisions therefrom as hereafter described.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That Part XI. of the said 13th Schedule to the "Local Government Act 1874," as given below, be adopted, viz.:—

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by councillor giving same except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of councillors.*—The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of councillors.*—If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing council.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Councillor not to speak second time on same question.*—No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Councillors not to digress, &c.*—No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Councillors to apologise for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. *Councillor called to order to sit down.*—A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. *Councillor twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Councillor not attending order for call.*—Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Councillors may demand documents.*—Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protest.*—Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered, three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes, if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted, by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored the notice-book for a future day, on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committees' minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days after its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. *Councillors to affix their names.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Councillors confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person

to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *No councillor, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work done for the council.

52. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Miscellaneous.*—The plans and specifications for any public work, where the council deem it necessary, shall be for inspection not less than five days before contracts for the same be entered into, and any ratepayer may inspect such plans and specifications during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the town clerk from time to time, on the written order of the mayor, to disburse such moneys as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole, in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council, the sum of five pounds.

55. The common seal of the borough shall be kept in a box or safe having two locks, of one of which locks the mayor shall have a key, and the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the town clerk, and such seal shall not be affixed to any document (except in compliance with any Act now in force, or that may come into force hereafter) without the order of the council, and every such document so sealed shall bear the signature of the mayor and shall also be duly verified with the signature of the town clerk.

56. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by unanimous vote of the whole council then present.

57. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BYE-LAW 3.—FIXING THE SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, &c.

THE Corporation styled The Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by The Water Works Act 1880 and The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872 and other Acts to be read and construed therewith, fix the following scale of charges for water supplied by measure, &c., to take effect from the first day of January 1881. That is to say:—

1. The charge for water supplied to miners and others for steam boiler purposes shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for water supply to any such boiler shall be ten thousand gallons per month.
2. For water supplied to be used in crushing, puddling, sluicing, or washing auriferous stone or earth, Three pence per thousand gallons.
3. For water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes unless otherwise specified, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
4. Where water is supplied for domestic use and is used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse power, the charge shall be by special agreement or at the rate of Ten shillings per horse power per annum, in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse power).
5. For water supplied to charitable institutions for all purposes, Six pence per thousand gallons.
6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Six pence per thousand gallons.
7. For water supplied for irrigation and to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.
8. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
9. For water supplied for private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
10. For water supplied to troughs in streets, Ten shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
11. CENSUS DISTRICTS.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the 4th section of *The Census Act 1881*, the Governor in Council has defined the Districts for which Enumerators shall respectively act in manner following, that is to say:—

BOUNDARIES OF CENSUS DISTRICTS.

[Whenever a boundary is described as running along or by a creek, river, street, road, &c., the centre of such creek, river, street, road, &c., unless otherwise mentioned, is to be taken to be the boundary-line.]

No. 1.—East Melbourne.

Commencing at the intersection of the north bank of the River Yarra by the western side of the Falls Bridge, thence northerly and westerly by the western side of that bridge and the approaches thereto to Flinders street; easterly by Flinders street to Elizabeth street; north by Elizabeth street to Victoria street; east by Victoria street to Hoddle street; south by Hoddle street and the Punt road to the River Yarra; westerly by the River Yarra to the commencing point.

No. 2.—West Melbourne.

Commencing at the intersection of the north bank of the River Yarra by the western side of the Falls Bridge, thence north westerly by the western side of the approaches to the Falls Bridge to Flinders street; east by Flinders street to Elizabeth street; north by Elizabeth street to Victoria street; west by Victoria street to the Benevolent Asylum fence; south, west, and north west by Victoria street to Munster terrace; south by Munster terrace to Miller street; west by Miller street to the north fence of the railway; westerly by the north fence of the railway to a road leading to the Footscray Town Reserve; south-westerly by that road to the Footscray Town Reserve; east by the north, and south by the eastern boundary of the Footscray Town Reserve to the north bank of the River Yarra; easterly by the north bank of the River Yarra to the commencing point.

No. 3.—Hotham.

Commencing at the intersection of Victoria and Elizabeth streets, thence west by Victoria street to the Benevolent Asylum fence; south, west, and north by the Benevolent Asylum fence to Victoria street; further west by Victoria street to Munster terrace; south by Munster terrace to Miller street; west by Miller street to the north fence of the railway; westerly by the north fence of the railway to the Moonee Ponds; northerly by the Moonee Ponds to the Flemington road; south-easterly by the Flemington road to Elizabeth street; southerly by Elizabeth street to the commencing point.

No. 4.—Carlton.

Commencing at the north-western angle of the Royal Park on the eastern bank of the Moonee Ponds, thence by the northern boundary of the Royal Park and Parkside street to Nicholson street; south by Nicholson street to Victoria street; west by Victoria street to Elizabeth street; northerly by Elizabeth street to Flemington road; north-westerly by Flemington road to Moonee Ponds; northerly by the Moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

No. 5.—JANUARY 14, 1881.—1.

No. 5.—Fitzroy.

Commencing at the intersection of Victoria and Nicholson streets, thence north by Nicholson street to Parkside street; east by Parkside street to the Merri Creek; south-easterly by the Merri Creek to a bridge south of High street, in the town of Northcote; southerly by the Plenty road to the Heidelberg road; south-westerly by the Heidelberg road to Smith street; south by Smith street to the Victoria parade; west by the Victoria parade to the commencing point.

No. 6.—Collingwood.

Commencing at the intersection of Victoria and Smith streets, thence east by Victoria street and Clifton street to the River Yarra; northerly and westerly by the River Yarra to the Merri Creek; northerly and westerly by the Merri Creek to the bridge south of High street, in the town of Northcote; southerly by the Plenty road to the Heidelberg road; south-westerly by the Heidelberg road to Smith street; south by Smith street to the commencing point.

No. 7.—Richmond.

Commencing at the intersection of Victoria and Hoddle streets, thence east by Victoria street and Clifton street to the River Yarra; southerly and westerly by the River Yarra to the Punt road; northerly by the Punt road and Hoddle street to the commencing point.

No. 8.—Prahran.

Commencing on Prince's Bridge, thence by the main Brighton road to Wellington street; east by Wellington street and the Dandenong road to the Boundary road; north by the Boundary road to the River Yarra; westerly by the River Yarra to the commencing point.

No. 9.—St. Kilda.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay in line with the centre of Fitzroy street, thence north-easterly by Fitzroy street to the centre of the Brighton road; east by Wellington street and the main Dandenong road to Hotham street; south by Hotham street and the main Brighton road to the Glen Huntly road; west by the Glen Huntly road to St. Kilda street, Elsternwick; south by St. Kilda street to Park street; west by Park street to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; northward by the shore of Port Phillip Bay to the commencing point.

No. 10.—Emerald Hill.

Commencing on Prince's Bridge, thence by the main Brighton road to Fitzroy street; southerly by Fitzroy street to the shore of Hobson's Bay; westward by the shore of Hobson's Bay to a point where the prolongation of Pickles street southward intersects the same; northerly by Pickles street to its intersection with the Sandridge road; north-westerly crossing the Sandridge road by Boundary street to the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway; further north-westerly crossing the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway by a prolongation of Boundary street to a point on the south bank of the River Yarra (defined by the production of the western boundary of the city of Melbourne to the south bank of the River Yarra); eastward by the bank of the River Yarra to the Falls Bridge; further eastward by the centre of the River Yarra to the commencing point.

No. 11.—Sandridge.

Commencing on the shore of Hobson's Bay at a point defined by the prolongation of Pickles street southward, thence northerly by Pickles street to its intersection with the Sandridge road; north-westerly crossing the Sandridge road by Boundary street to the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway; further north-westerly crossing the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway by a prolongation of Boundary street to a point on the south bank of the River Yarra (defined by the production of the western boundary of the city of Melbourne to the south bank of the River Yarra); westerly, north-westerly, and southerly by the River Yarra to the shore of Hobson's Bay; easterly by the shore of Hobson's Bay to the commencing point.

No. 12.—Williamstown.

Commencing on the sea-coast at the south-east angle of portion A, section 3, parish of Cut-Paw-Paw, thence north by a direct line to Stony Creek; southerly and easterly by the Stony Creek to the River Yarra; south by the River Yarra to the shore of Hobson's Bay; easterly, southerly, and westerly by the shore of Hobson's Bay to the commencing point.

No. 13.—Footscray.

Commencing at the intersection of Stony Creek and the eastern boundary of section 9 of the parish of Cut Paw Paw; thence south to the south-east angle of section 9; west to the south-west angle of section 9; north by the western boundaries of sections 9, 13, and 16, and of portion 8, to the Saltwater River; northerly and southerly by the Saltwater River to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section XIII of the parish of Doutra Galla; north by the western boundaries of allotment 1 and allotment A of section XIII to the Mount Alexander road; south-easterly by the Mount Alexander road to the Deep Creek road; north-westerly by the Deep Creek road to Woodland street; east by Woodland street to the Moonee Ponds; southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the north fence of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander Railway; westerly by the north fence of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander Railway to a road leading to the Footscray Town Reserve; south-westerly by that road to the Footscray Town Reserve; east by the north and south by the eastern boundaries of the Footscray Town Reserve to the River Yarra; westerly and southerly by the River Yarra to Stony Creek; westerly by that creek to the commencing point.

No. 14.—Brunswick.

Commencing at the north-western angle of the Royal Park on the eastern bank of the Moonee Ponds; thence east by the northern boundary of the Royal Park and by a line bearing east crossing the main road to Sydney to the Merri Creek; northwards and northerly by the Merri Creek to the north boundary of section 140 of the parish of Jika Jika; east by a road to the south-west angle of section 144 of the parish of Jika Jika; north by the west boundaries of sections 144 and 147 to the north-west angle of section 147, all of the parish of Jika Jika; west by the north boundaries sections 148, 149, and 150 of the parish of Jika Jika to the north-east angle of section 151; south and west by the eastern and southern boundaries of section 151 to the Moonee Ponds; southerly by the Moonee Ponds to the commencing point.

No. 15.—Northcote.

Commencing at a point on the Merri Creek where the north boundary of section 13, parish of Keelbundera, abuts thereon; thence east by the north boundaries of sections 13, 14, and 15 to the Whittlesea and Melbourne road; north-easterly by the Whittlesea and Melbourne road to the south boundary of section 28; east by the south boundary of section 28 to the River Plenty; southerly by the River Plenty to the River Yarra; south-westerly by the River Yarra to its junction with the Merri Creek; north-westerly by the Merri Creek to the north boundary of section 139, parish of Jika Jika; east by a road; north by the west boundaries of sections 144 and 147; west by the north boundary of section 148 to the Merri Creek; northerly by that creek to the commencing point.

No. 16.—Boroondara.

Commencing at the junction of the Yarra Yarra River and the Mullum Mullum Creek; thence up that creek to the west boundary of the parish of Ringwood; south by that boundary to the Dandenong Creek; further southerly by that creek to the south boundary of the parish of Namawading; west by that boundary to the south-west angle of the said parish; south by the west boundary of the parish of Mulgrave to the branch of the Kooyong Creek forming the south boundary of allotments 137, 138, and 139 of the parish of Prahran at Gardiner; easterly and north-easterly down that creek to the Yarra River; north-westerly and north-easterly by that river to commencing point.

No. 17.—Brighton.

Commencing at the south-west angle of Dendy's special survey; thence northward by the shore of Port Phillip Bay to opposite Park street, Elsternwick; east along Park street to St. Kilda street; north by St. Kilda street to the Glen Huntly road; east by that road to Hotham street; north by Hotham street to the Dandenong road; easterly by the Dandenong road to the Kooyong or Boundary road; north by that road to the Kooyongkoot Creek; easterly by that creek to the north-east angle of the parish of Prahran; south and west by the eastern and southern boundaries of that parish to Tucker's road; south by Tucker's road to the Point Nepean road; south-easterly by Point Nepean road to the South road, being the south boundary of Dendy's special survey; west by the South road to the commencing point.

No. 18.—South Bourke.

Commencing on the sea-coast at the mouth of Mordialloc Creek; thence easterly up that creek to the main drain forming the southern boundary of section 25, parish of Mordialloc; easterly by the south boundaries of that section and of portions

89, 88, and 87 of the parish of Dandenong to the most eastern angle of portion 87; north-westerly by the road forming the eastern boundary of 87, 61A and 62A of the same parish to the southern angle of 63A; north by the east boundary of 63A and 64A to the road forming the north-west boundary of 64A; north-east by that road to the south-west angle of 52; east by the south boundary of 52 and of 65A, all of the parish of Dandenong, to the Dandenong Creek; northerly up that creek to the road forming the northern boundary of the parish of Mulgrave; west by that road to the road forming the west boundary of the same parish; south by that road to the (North or Marine) road forming the north boundary of the parish of Moorabbin; west by that road to Tucker's road; south by Tucker's road to the Point Nepean road; south-easterly by the Point Nepean road to the South road; west by the South road to the sea-coast to the commencing point.

No. 19.—Keilor.

Commencing at a point on the shore of Port Phillip Bay where the east boundary of portion A of section 3, parish of Cut-Paw-Paw abuts thereon; thence north by the east boundaries of sections 3 and 6 to the south boundary of section 9; west by that boundary the south-west angle of section 9; north to the Saltwater River; down that river to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 7, parish of Doutra Galla; north by the west boundary of that allotment and of section XIII to the Mount Alexander road; north-westerly by that road to the south boundary of section 15, parish of Tullamarine; west by the south boundary of that section and of sections 14 and 13 to the Saltwater River; westerly by the north boundary of the parish of Maribyrnong to the Melbourne and Mount Alexander main road; north-westerly by that road to the western side of the Melbourne and Murray River railway; northerly by that railway to the north boundary of the town of Sunbury; westerly by that boundary to a road forming the north boundary of allotments 20, 21, D and C, parish of Buttlejorck and the north boundary of the parish of Yargandook to the Djerriwarh Creek; southerly by that creek to the Werribee River; south-easterly by that river to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; north-easterly by that shore to the commencing point.

No. 20.—Bacchus Marsh and Gisborne.

Commencing on the summit of Mount Diogenes; thence easterly by a direct line to the source of the Bolinda Creek; easterly down that creek to the Lancefield road; south-easterly by that road to the north-eastern boundary of the Mount Alexander Railway; south-easterly by that boundary to the north-west angle of section 19, parish of Bolinda; westerly by the north boundaries of the parishes of Bolinda and Buttlejorck to the eastern boundary of the parish of Gisborne; south by that boundary to the Mount Alexander road; easterly by the centre of the said road to the north boundary of the parish of Holden; west by that boundary and the north boundary of the parish of Yargandook to the Djerriwarh Creek; southerly down that creek to the Werribee River; north-westerly by that river to the Dividing Range; and easterly by that range to the commencing point.

No. 21.—Romsey.

PROCLAMATION OF A TIMBER RESERVE REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and might from time to time, after one month's notice should be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works might issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as should from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, revoke the Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of September One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, by which a reserve was made for the preservation and growth of timber, situate in the parish of Wataepoolan, and comprising an area of three hundred and twenty acres of land.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
