The births of 877 children, viz., 408 boys and 469 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 639 births were registered, or 238 less than in the month under review, and were greater than the average of the previous ten years by 168. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 106.

The deaths registered in March numbered 511, viz., 277 of males and 234 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 366. The deaths were more numerous than those in February by 84, and exceeded the average of March, during the previous ten years, by 28. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 44.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.0° on the 22nd, and the lowest was 49.4° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (63.8°) was nearly a third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.3°) took place on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 96.5° to a minimum of 55.2°. The least range (7.2°) was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 58.4° to a minimum of 51.2°. The mean daily range was 19.5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.003 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in March 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; and 52 per cent. in March 1871.

The number of persons who died at the age of 75 years or upwards was 19, viz.:—A female, aged 75, of congestion of the lungs; a gentleman, aged 76, of paralysis; a male, of occupation unstated, aged 77, of bronchitis; a housewife, aged 78, and a laborer, aged 79, of rheumatism; a miner, aged 79, of vesical calculus; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; a commission agent, aged 81, of disease of the kidneys; a tailor, aged 82, of carbuncle; a mining agent, aged 83, of disease of the heart; a male pensioner, aged 76, a female, aged 77, a farmer and a female, each aged 80, a female, aged 82, a housewife, aged 83, a laborer, aged 84, another laborer, aged 91, and a female hawker, aged 94, of old age.

Twenty-four deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 22 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 1, died of a contused wound in the forehead; a laborer, aged 30, of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 50, of injury to the head, and a laborer, aged 68, of fracture of the spine—all the result of falls; a quarryman, aged 31, died of severe internal injuries, caused by a fall of earth from the side of a quarry; a laborer, aged 57, was killed by the flap of a bridge falling on him; a stonemason, aged 48, died of injury to the leg, a stone crushing it; a boy, aged 11, was run over and killed by a hansom-cab; a drayman, aged 34, was killed by being thrown from a dray, the wheel passing over his head; a dressmaker, aged 51, died of compound fracture of the leg, caused by her stepping out of a train in motion; a female, aged 61, died of injury to the head, caused by being thrown from a cart; a farmer, aged 60, died of pyramia, caused by an injury to the foot; two seamen, aged 35 and 47 respectively, were killed by the bursting of a torpedo; a girl, aged 17, died of severe burns, her clothes having caught fire; two boys, aged 5 and 11 respectively, and a gentleman, aged 71, were drowned; a male, aged 22, of occupation unknown, was found drowned; 2 male infants, aged respectively 8 days and 3 months, were suffocated in bed; a farmer, aged 51, choked himself whilst eating. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born infant, whose skull was fractured. The suicidal death was that of a groom, aged 22, who poisoned himself.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 15 in the Alfred Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Industrial School, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 221, of whom 123, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 98, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 161 were under one year of age, 41 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 290. Of these, 154, or 53 per cent., were males, and 136, or 47 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 22 were between fifteen and twenty, 33 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

In the month under review, as compared with the previous month, deaths from scarlatina increased from 4 to 5, deaths from diphtheria from nil to 4, deaths from croup from 3 to 4, deaths from typhoid fever from 16 to 30, deaths from erysipelas from nil to 3, deaths from metria from 2 to 4, deaths from cholera from 1 to 2, and deaths from rheumatism from 2 to 5. On the other hand, deaths from measles fell from 2 to nil, and deaths from dysentery and diarrhoea from 64 to 58. Whooping-cough caused 2 deaths and carbuncle 1 death in both months. Under the head constitutional diseases deaths from phthisis increased from 39 to 55. Childbirth, combined with metria, was exceedingly fatal in the month under review, and caused no less than 10 deaths, or 1 death of a mother to every 88 births registered.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition in accordance with the thirty-ninth and forty-fourth sections of the said Act has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Alberton, and doth re-subdivide the said shire into three several subdivisions, the boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

## THE SOUTH RIDING.

Commencing at a point where the Albert River discharges into the sea; thence north-westerly by that river to its source; thence

by a line, magnetic north, from said source to the northern boundary of the shire; thence north-easterly by the shire boundary to a point, magnetic north, of the north-west angle of the parish of Wonwron; thence southerly by a direct line to the said angle; thence by the western boundary of the said parish further south to the Tarra River; thence south-easterly by that river to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

## THE EAST RIDING.

Commencing at a point where the Tarra River discharges into the sea; thence north-westerly by that river to a point south of the western boundary of the parish of Wonwron; thence northerly by the western boundary of that parish and a line in continuation thereof to the northern boundary of the shire; thence easterly by the said boundary to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

## THE WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point where the Albert River discharges into the sea; thence north-westerly by that river to its source; thence by a line, magnetic north, from said source to the shire boundary; thence westerly and following the shire boundary to the sea-coast; and by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

The shire boundary herein referred to is that proclaimed in *Gazette* of 29th April 1881.

The bearings given refer to the magnetic meridian.

And the Honorable George David Langridge, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### KRAMBRUK CRICKET AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, John Cawood, sen., Thomas Cawood, Thomas Richard Lawry, Charles Hamilton Lawry, Alexander Johnston, Charles Cawood, and John Swain Smith, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the above-mentioned reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall climb over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
4. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, or light fires therein, without the permission in writing of the committee of management.
5. No person shall damage the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
7. Any person who may have obtained the consent in writing of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any booth or other structure, for special purposes, shall be bound by any order made by the said committee in regard thereto.
8. The committee of management may charge and collect a fee, not exceeding One shilling, for admission of each adult person to the reserve, or to any portion thereof, on such occasions and on such days as the Board of Land and Works may authorize.
9. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed therefrom:—
  - (1.) Assaulting any other person.
  - (2.) Being drunk.
  - (3.) Crossing or trespassing on the playing ground during a cricket match or sports, or during practice of cricket; or crossing or trespassing on the running ground during the time any race is being run, or when crossing or trespassing on such cricket ground would be injurious to the same as a cricket ground.
  - (4.) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
