VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE RUTHERGLEN MUNICIPAL COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Borough of Rutherglen, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Rutherglen Municipal Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers and holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. In the construction, and for the purpose of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, horses, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, mules, asses; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

3. The fees payable for depasturing stock on the common shall be Three shillings per head per annum for horned cattle; small cattle, One shilling and fourpence per head per annum; horses, Six shillings per head per annum. The fees shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the first day of April and the first day of October in each year. No fee will be charged for any cattle under six months old whose dams are lawfully depasturing on the common.

4. No bull shall be permitted on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

5. All goats legally depasturing on the common must have triangles around their necks not less than eighteen inches.

6. Travelling stock will be allowed the privilege permitted by law.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.—"AVON PLAINS TANK RESERVE."

Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from the reserve for affording access to water in the parish of Banyena, known as "Avon Plains Tank Reserve," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works made on the 15th day of October 1880, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 6th September 1880, as a site for affording access to Water in the Parish of Banyena, and hereinafter styled "Avon Plains Tank Reserve"; Now, therefore, the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be

made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from Avon Plains Tank Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—

(i.) For one hogshead of water taken away in any one day, Sixpence.

(ii.) For every hogshead of water after the first hogshead taken away in any one day, One shilling.

(iii.) For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.

3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person offending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The foregoing Regulations were framed and approved by the Shire Council of St. Arnaud this 14th day of April 1881.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* it was amongst other things enacted that where any street or road in any municipal district exceeds one chain in width such street or road might, for any length thereof, be reduced in width to any width not less than one chain, and that the council of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and every owner of any land having a frontage to such street or road in any place where the same is so reduced in width, or in any place not more than three chains from any such place, might agree in writing, under the common seals of the municipality and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hand and seal of every such owner, upon a scheme for the reduction in width of such street or road for the length mentioned in such scheme, and for the disposal of the surplus land taken from such street or road, and as to the purchase-money to be paid by any such owners who might be allowed to purchase any of the surplus land, and as to the compensation, if any, not exceeding in the whole the amount of the purchase-money to be paid in respect of any land injuriously affected by such scheme, and the Governor in Council might by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such scheme, and thereupon any land mentioned in such scheme in that behalf should cease to be a street or road, and all rights-of-way over the same should cease and determine; and it should be lawful for the Governor, on payment of the purchase-money for any surplus land to the Treasurer of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, to grant such land in accordance with the provisions of any such scheme in the manner prescribed by the said Act, and by warrant under his hand to direct payment of any such compensation out of the consolidated revenue, which is by the said Act appropriated for that purpose accordingly; And whereas a scheme has this day been submitted to the Governor in Council for reducing the width of Gladstone street in the city of Sandhurst, in the colony of Victoria, from one chain fifty links to one chain, as shown on

tracing annexed to the said scheme: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the 367th section of the said in part recited Act, doth by this present Order confirm the said scheme for the reduction of the undermentioned portion of Gladstone street from one chain fifty links to one chain, as shown on said tracing deposited at the Office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, that is to say, from its intersection with Mitchell street, in the city of Sandhurst, westward to the western boundary of allotment 4 of section 68c, in the said city, and in accordance with the said scheme, under the seals of the city of Sandhurst, the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the respective owners of land having a frontage to the portion of Gladstone street aforesaid, and dated the twenty-third day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty.

And the Honorable Richard Richardson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All the charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
4. Order for interment to be given to the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them.
6. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from sunrise to sunset, until otherwise ordered.
8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
10. By *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanor; and, being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or, at the discretion of the justice, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months. And every person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, shrubbery, tree, or plant, wantonly or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony, by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.
11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
13. According to the laws now in force, no funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar, or coroner holding an inquest or inquiry on the body to be interred, or from a magistrate. Every such certificate must be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery, before the funeral enters the gates.
14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

Bye-law making a rate for water supply purposes.

THE Council of the Shire of Chiltern doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872, make the following rate, from the date hereof, upon all lands, tenements, &c., within the water supply district, such rate to take effect on and after the first day of July 1881, on which date the first rate shall be due and payable for the half-year then next ensuing:—

1st. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied other than by measure for domestic purposes:—

1st. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £10 and under, *Ten pounds per centum per annum* on the amount of the valuation.

2nd. On every house or tenement of the value of £10, and not exceeding £20, *One pound per annum*.

3rd. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding £30, *One pound five shillings per annum*.

4th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £30, and not exceeding £40, *One pound ten shillings per annum*.

5th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £40, and not exceeding £50, *One pound fifteen shillings per annum*.

6th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £50, and not exceeding £60, *Two pounds per annum*.

7th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £60, and not exceeding £80, *Two pounds ten shillings per annum*.

8th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £80, and not exceeding £100, *Three pounds per annum*.

9th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £100, and not exceeding £150, *Four pounds per annum*.

10th. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £150, and not exceeding £250, *Five pounds per annum*.

11th. On every house or tenement, above the annual value of £250, *Six pounds per annum*.

12th. Water from the stand-pipes and public taps will be supplied to licensed persons only, at the following rates:—

A license to cart water for sale (with horse and dray) from the stand-pipes, *One pound per annum*.

A license to cart water (with horse and dray) for the use of the licensee only, *Ten shillings per annum*.

A license to carry away water from the public taps other than by horse and dray, *Five shillings per annum*.

13th. Water for steam boilers will be supplied by measure, or by special agreement.

14th. Water-troughs, *Five shillings per annum*.

15th. Livery-stables, *Ten shillings per stall* (one stall allowed for every Fifty pounds of annual value).

16th. Hotels with stabling (not being livery stables), *Four shillings per stall* (one stall allowed for every Fifty pounds of annual value).

2nd. The council may cause meters to be affixed in any case they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumers, and the water supplied to be charged for at the rate of *Two shillings per 1,000*

gallons over and above the amount for which they are rated. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No metre shall be affixed until its register shall be approved of by the council.

3rd. If any meter cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

4th. The council reserve the right to make the supply from the mains intermittent instead of continuous, and to fix the hours during which such intermittent supply shall be turned on to each portion of the town.

5th. The council also reserve the right to forbid the use of hose for watering the streets or footpaths of the town at any time when it may be considered necessary. Any person watering the streets or footpaths with a hose, after receiving notice from the council not to do so, will be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

6th. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for irrigation (which term irrigation shall include any mechanical or artificial contrivance for carrying water to the roots of plants without labor, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose).

7th. Any person receiving water from the council who shall allow any unlicensed person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8th. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the council, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

9th. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

10th. Before any such license shall be granted by the council, the person applying for same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent plumber, and pay the annual sum of Five shillings as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

11th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council, without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Wrought-iron and lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the council.

13. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the said council may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners, or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

14th. Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

15th. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the metre, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

16th. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted. 17th. If any person supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste,

the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

18th. In the construction of this bye-law the word "council" shall mean the Shire Council of Chiltern.

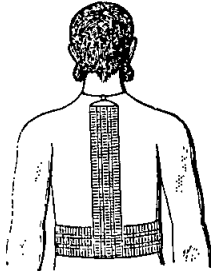
