VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 128.—"It shall be lawful
"for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons
"called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person
"who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of
"this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the autho"rity of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be un"known to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a
"police constable who shall convey him with all convenient
"despatch before some justice without any warrant or other
"authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with
"all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the
"complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 128th section of The Public Works Statute 1865, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of The Public Works Statute 1865, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE RUTHERGLEN MUNICIPAL COMMON.

MUNICIPAL COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Borough of Rutherglen, having drafted the following regulations for management of the Rutherglen Municipal Coumon, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

Regulations.

- 1. Ratepayers and holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.
- 2. In the construction, and for the purpose of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, horses, steers, mares, geldings, colts, filles, mules, asses; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- 3. - 4. No bull shall be permitted on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.
- 5. All goats legally depasturing on the common must have triangles around their necks not less than eighteen inches.

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works made on the 15th day of October 1880, the Council of the Shire of St. Armand was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the 6th September 1880, as a site for affording access to Water in the Parish of Banyena, and hereinafter styled "Avon Plains Tank Reserve": Now therefore, the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnand, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be

made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

Regulations.

- 1. Every person using or carrying away water from Avon Plains Tank Reserve shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the Committee of Management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter
 - (I.) For one hogshead of water taken away in any one
 - (II.) For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time, Threepence.
- 2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the Committee of Management, or their officer duly appointed.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.

Every person oftending against these regulations or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act* 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10. exceeding £10.

1. All the charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. Order for interment to be given to the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.

7. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from surrise to sunset, until otherwise ordered.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

9. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

10. By The Cemeteries Statute 1864, any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree or plant in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanor; and, being convicted thereof, will be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or, at the discretion of the justice, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months. And every person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, shrubbery, tree, or plant, twantonly or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony, by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

11. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.

According to the laws now in force, no funeral will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar, or coroner holding an inquest or inquiry on the body to be interred, or from a magistrate. Every such certificate must be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery, before the funeral enters the gates.

14. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
