**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."**

WHEREAS by *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872*, among other things it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make such regulations as might be deemed expedient for the purposes mentioned in the said Act, and might rescind the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby, in exercise of the power conferred by the above in part recited Act, rescind the Fourth Schedule to the Regulations made in pursuance of the said Act, and dated the nineteenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty, and with the advice aforesaid doth order the subjoined schedule to be substituted in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

**Fourth Schedule.**

*By Land.*—Albury, Delegate, Echuca, Euston, Howlong, Moama, Penola, Swan Hill, Tintaldra, Tocumwall, Wahgunyah, Willis, Yarrawonga, and the point at which the main road from Narracoorte to Apsley intersects the boundary between Victoria and South Australia.

*By Sea.*—The Port of Melbourne.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. The Whittlesea Town Common, proclaimed by Order of the 13th November 1862.

2. The Whittlesea (Upper Plenty) Farmers' Common, proclaimed by Order of the 18th March 1861, and altered by Order of the 24th February 1862.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## PARKS AND GARDENS—HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the following Grants by Parliament, viz. —

1. Grant for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens. (Division No. 60, No. 2, 1880-81.)

Additional Regulations for the distribution of the unappropriated balance of the sum granted by Parliament for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

(a.) That a sum be paid to each participant in the vote under the Regulations dated 7th February 1881, equal to amount allotted to each under the said regulations.

(b.) That the balance then remaining be applied to the further improvement of such Parks and Gardens as the Board of Land and Works may consider to have special claims.

2. Grant to Horticultural Societies, 1880-81. (Division 60, No. 5.)

Regulation for the distribution of the sum of £500 granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies.

A sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away between the 1st January and the 31st December 1880, will be allotted to each society having a claim, and will be made payable to the Treasurer thereof, provided that the claims do not exceed in the whole Five hundred pounds, and if they do exceed that amount they will be reduced *pro rata*. Provided also that no society, whose expenditure in prizes between the dates named amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds, shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

EXAMINATION FOR LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Examiners which has been appointed in connection with the Department of Lands and Survey to enquire into the qualification of surveyors who desire to obtain certificates of competency, hereby notifies that the next examination will commence on Tuesday, 13th September 1881.

Intending candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; shall also specify the optional subjects in which they desire to be examined; and upon their applications being approved by the Board shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

All applications must be in the hands of the Secretary by the 20th August next.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, or the examination prescribed for candidates for admission into the Civil Service of Victoria (including in either case the subjects of Arithmetic, Euclid, and Algebra), or such other examination as shall in the opinion of the Board be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some authorized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or, he must have served under articles for not less than four years some certified surveyor of recognized standing, two years at least of such service to be of recognized standing, and must, if required, give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of country lands.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be examined in each of the seven compulsory subjects, and in one at least of the optional subjects included in each of the groups; but he will only be examined in such optional subjects as he shall have given notice of at the time of making his application.

**REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE WARRNAMBOOL MUNICIPAL COMMON.**

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Borough of Warrnambool, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Warrnambool Municipal Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common :—

*Regulations.*

1. Ratepayers and holders of business licenses or carriers' licenses may respectively depasture on the common four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.
2. The scale of fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, payable monthly in advance :—  
For every horse 1s. per week, or 5s. per annum.  
For every milch cow, dry cow, or heifer, 6d. per week, or 2s. per annum.  
Foals at foot and calves (under six months old) with cows, free.

3. When milch cows have calves at foot, the latter must be delivered every morning with the cows to the herdsman, or he will not be responsible in the event of the cows straying.

4. Travelling cattle may be depastured on the common free of charge, for any period not exceeding twenty-four hours, after which period a fee of one shilling per head per week, or part thereof, will be payable.

5. Goats, pigs, or other animals (except travelling cattle) than those provided for in the scale of fees shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as may be set apart for that purpose, on payment of fees to be agreed upon by the managers and the owners of such goats, pigs, or other animals.

6. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

7. The herdsman will attend at such times and places as may be duly advertised, for the purpose of receiving applications from persons entitled to depasture stock on the common, and every such person shall supply his or her name and address, and the brands and descriptions of the stock to be depastured, and shall pay the commonage fees thereon. The herdsman will, thereupon, give an order for admission of the stock to the common.

8. All stock which may at any time die upon the common must be buried by the owners within twenty-four hours after notice thereof in writing from the herdsman ; or, if not so buried, will be interred at the owner's expense.

9. The herdsman shall immediately report to the managers indication of disease in any of the stock on the common.

10. All unregistered stock (except travelling cattle) running upon the common will be liable to be impounded, or the owners of such stock may be prosecuted.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common.

12. All stock placed upon the common must be branded by the owners thereof with a legible brand.

13. No animal will be allowed to be tethered on any portion of the common.

14. No person shall be allowed to herd stock on the common, or to remove stock therefrom without first giving, in either case, twelve hours' notice in writing to the herdsman.

15. No person shall unnecessarily disturb stock depasturing on the common.

16. No bull, or entire horse, will be allowed to depasture on the common without the sanction, in writing, of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.
