IMPORTANCE OF VACCINATION.

THE recent introduction of Small-pox to the colony of New South Wales has again shown our liability to such an attack at any moment; and, although the disease has happily not yet appeared in Victoria, the Central Board of Health deem it of great importance to the safety of the public that every advantage should be taken of the present very favorable season for vaccination, so that the protection which vaccination is known to afford against the horrors of Small-pox may be extended as widely as possible throughout the colony.

The Central Board therefore trust that the local sanitary authorities will use all means in their power for securing the extension of vaccination in their respective districts; and as the Board believe that the ministers of the various religious bodies might very beneficially use the influence and opportunities they possess in directing attention at the present time to the proved benefits of vaccination, they desire to appeal to the latter also to use their influence in promoting a hearty compliance with the provisions of the Vaccination Act.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS OF THE COLONY OF VICTORIA FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 1881. (Collected by the Sub-enumerators appointed under the Census Act 1881.)

** The following figures have been finally checked. The "Extent of Land in Occupation" does not include squatting stations to which no purchased land is attached, nor allotments which do not exceed one acre in extent, nor holdings which are occupied for other purposes than agriculture or the keeping of live stock. The number of holdings, and the extent of land occupied and cultivated in the various counties and shires, in some instances differ considerably from the amounts returned in former years, the reason being that the householders were instructed, on this occasion, to make returns not only of the farming carried on upon the land surrounding the dwelling, but upon detached blocks owned or rented, and managed by themselves, situated elsewhere. This mode of making the returns is necessary in the case of a house to house collection based upon a division of the colony into small sub-districts, which, while it is the only proper method of enumerating the population, has been found not to be so well suited for the collection of Agricultural Statistics. The totals of the component parts of the colony are alone affected by this way of proceeding, not the total of the colony itself.

PROCLAMATION

BYE-LAWS.

At a meeting of the Mining Board for the Mining District of Beechworth, held at Beechworth, in said district, on the 8th day of March A.D. 1881, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

Bye-law No. 51.—Ordinary Frontage Claims.

Dry frontage claims, i.e., alluvial claims exceeding 40 feet in depth, the drainage of which (if any) does not amount to 1200 gallons of water per 24 hours.

Wet frontage claims, i.e., alluvial claims exceeding 40 feet in depth, the drainage of which is at least 1200 gallons of water per 24 hours.

A frontage claim occupied on a supposed lead shall not exceed 65 feet in length, by a width not exceeding one mile. The holder of any such claim may defer the working thereof until the lead is discovered, without rendering the claim liable to forfeiture, provided he allows the registrar to mark on his miner's right the progressive number of the claim and date of registration; and shall on the same day post a notice on some conspicuous place on the claim, stating the progressive number of the claim, the name of the person registered therefor, and the date of registration; and shall, within forty-eight hours after the lead is discovered and the claims laid off by the surveyor, commence and carry on work upon the claim laid off for him, in the usual manner of proper and efficient mining.

Upon the discovery of the lead, all claims previously occupied shall be deemed to be forfeited, and the holders thereof shall be entitled to occupy in lieu thereof claims as laid off by the surveyor according to their priority of registration, excepting where any claimholder on such undiscovered lead has sunk a shaft at least two-thirds of the depth of the prospecting shaft previous to the discovery of the lead, in which case such claimholder shall be entitled to hold the parcel in which the shaft is situated, together with the number of adjoining parcels equal to the number of men constantly employed in sinking the shaft.

The extent of ground which may be taken possession of as a claim on a discovered frontage lead shall be determined by the depth of the lead below the surface of the ground in the nearest shaft being worked on such lead, and in the event of none being

worked, from the most reliable data obtainable, and shall be in accordance with the following scale:—

On dry frontage leads where the depth of sinking exceeds—

40 feet and does not exceed 60 feet, 70 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

60 feet and does not exceed 100 feet, 100 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

100 feet and does not exceed 150 feet, 135 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

150 feet and does not exceed 200 feet, 170 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

and so on, 35 feet being added to the length of the claim for every 50 feet additional in depth of sinking, until gold in payable quantities has been found in the claim, after which the width of the claim shall not exceed 300 yards.

On wet frontage leads where the depth of sinking exceeds—

40 feet and does not exceed 100 feet, 100 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

100 feet and does not exceed 150 feet, 150 feet on the course of the lead by a width of one mile;

And so on, 50 feet being added to the length of the claim for every 50 feet additional in depth of sinking, until gold in payable quantities has been found in the claim; thereupon the owners of such claim shall cease to be entitled to occupy a greater width than 600 yards across the course of the lead, for a distance of 100 yards above and below the point where gold in payable quantities shall have been found in such claim; and shall within 48 hours from the time of the application of any person, being the holder of a miner's right, requiring them to define the boundary-lines of the reduced width of such portion of such claim, do so in the same manner as is prescribed in Bye-law No. 6, as the mode of taking possession of claims.

On dry frontage leads no more than thirty men's ground shall under any circumstances be amalgamated and held as one claim.

On wet frontage leads no more than one hundred men's ground shall under any circumstances be amalgamated and held as one claim.

From and after the passing of this bye-law, bye-law No. 14 of this Board shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Bye-law No. 52.—Alluvial Prospecting Claims.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained in clause 1 of bye-law No. 18, any person who discovers a new or distinct lead of gold in payable quantities in alluvium, within a distance of not less than one mile from the centre of the nearest alluvial claim, shall be entitled to occupy a prospecting claim of the dimensions prescribed in the scale set forth in clause 4 of the above-mentioned bye-law No. 18.

GOBUR RACECOURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE REGULATIONS.

WE, Robert Burns, John Coghill, and Thomas Cumming, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Gobur Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

- 1st. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

- 6th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 7th. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
