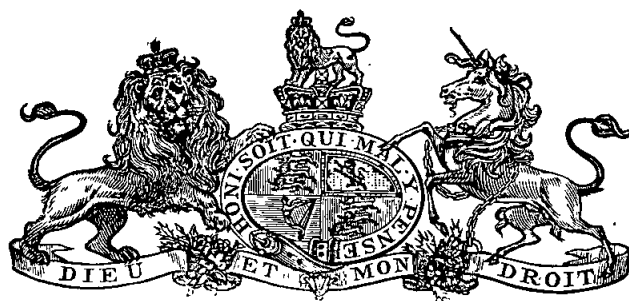

REVISED REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Circular Despatch and Enclosures to be published for general information.

SIR,—With reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 5th of April 1879, I have the honor to transmit to you, herewith, for the information of your Government, a copy of a letter from the Admiralty enclosing Revised Regulations respecting the appointment of naval cadets. I also transmit, with reference to Lord Carnarvon's Circular Despatch of the 19th of February 1875, a copy of the form recently amended by the Admiralty, which is required to be filled up by the parent or guardian of the candidate for nomination to a naval cadetship, and a copy of the Regulations, also recently amended, respecting cadets while under training.

SIR,—With reference to your letter of the 17th ultimo, forwarding specimens of the forms sent to applicants for colonial cadetships, I am commanded by my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Earl of Kimberley, that these forms are correct, with the exception of the one marked 'A', which has lately been amended so as to furnish information as to the profession of the candidate's parent, and I am to enclose fifty (50) copies of the amended form.

My Lords also think it would be as well if applicants were furnished with the Regulations respecting cadets while under training (marked B), fifty (50) copies of which are enclosed.

Fifty (50) copies of the Revised Regulations respecting Naval Cadets are enclosed herewith, as requested in your letter; and specimen copies of the examination papers will be sent from time to time.

Regulations respecting Cadets while under Training.
(For the information of parents and guardians.)

1. The naval cadets who join the *Britannia* are allowed four terms—two in each year—to complete their course of study; at the expiration of which they go up for final examination.

2. The terms are from about the 1st February to the 15th July,

and from about the 31st August to the 20th December;

and the vacations will be six weeks at midsummer, five weeks at Christmas, and two weeks at Easter;

the dates of commencement of vacation depending upon the completion of the examinations by the President, Royal Naval College, Greenwich.

3. The friends of the cadets must be prepared to receive them during all the vacations.

4. The following payment will be required from the parents or guardians of each cadet while in the *Britannia* as a contribution towards the cost of his education:—

Before the commencement of each term ... £35
except in the case of those received at the reduced rate of £40 a year, whose half-yearly payments will be £20 only. Claims will be made upon the parents or guardians by the Accountant-General of the Navy for these sums as they become due, and the money should be at once remitted. In the event of non-payment, although the cadets will not be refused admission into the ship while their friends are being communicated with, they will not be considered as entered for tuition until the amounts have been received.

5. In addition to the above payments, any expenses incurred by a cadet for clothing, books, &c., as well as the allowance of 1s. a week paid as pocket-money, will be included in the personal account sent in to the parent from the ship at the end of each term.

Captains of cadets are paid 2s. and chief captains 2s. 6d. a week pocket-money, but of this sum only the ordinary allowance of 1s. will be charged to the cadet.

6. All travelling expenses for cadets will be advanced by the Paymaster of the *Britannia*, who will charge the sum to the cadet's personal account.

7. Since the cadets will have a weekly allowance paid to them as pocket-money, and as an amount is allowed by the Government to pay the expenses attending their amusements, it is requested that their friends do not give them any money except on joining, or on their return from the vacations, and then the amount must not exceed Ten shillings. It is particularly requested that this regulation be adhered to. Such money as may be required by a cadet for any special circumstances will be advanced by the Paymaster under the authority of the Captain of the *Britannia*.

8. It is particularly requested that the cadets bring their linen clean, and clothes and boots in good order, when they join the ship, and also when they return from leave, and that the outfit, as required, be complete.

9. Cadets are not permitted to open an account with tradesmen. Parents and guardians are therefore requested to pay no bills that may be sent them.

10. Should there have been any infectious disease in the house where cadets have been staying during their holidays, notice of the circumstance is to be given to the Commanding Officer of H.M.S. *Britannia*, and they are not to join until they have received a communication from him that they may do so.

11. All letters relative to the cadets should be addressed as follows:—"The Commanding Officer, H.M.S. *Britannia*, Dartmouth."

12. Should cadets bring valuable gold watches or chains with them to the Training Ship, they will be taken from them and placed in security, until they return to their homes. Silver watches will be allowed to be used.

13. Parents or guardians of cadets must, in all cases of permanent change of residence, communicate the same to the Captain of the Training Ship, without delay.

NOTE.—(a) The books and other articles which may be required will be supplied on board the *Britannia* if they are not brought with the cadet.

(b) A case of instruments will be supplied on board the *Britannia* to the cadets in their second term to secure uniformity of pattern.

(c) Each cadet on entering his fourth term will be required to provide himself with a sextant in a case, such instrument being obtained under the recommendation of the captain of the *Britannia*.

REMARK.—Any new sextant must have the following qualifications:—

1. Circular frame, strong, and well finished.
2. Arc finely and distinctly cut, to read to 10 seconds.
3. 6½ m. radius to middle of graduation.
4. Weight, without telescope, 2 lb. 4 oz.
5. Fixed horizon glass, neutral tint shades.
6. Clamping screws to adjustments.
7. Reflector to index.
8. Screws and mirror of good quality.
9. Shades to clear the adjusting screws by a good distance.
10. Good-sized handle fashioned to fingers.
11. Microscopes to move easily with springs.

NOTE.—Sextants possessing such qualifications can be obtained from the undermentioned firms: Messrs. Bottomley, of 11 Billiter street, London; Messrs. Elliott Bros., of 449 Strand, London; or Mr. Cox, of 87 Fore street, Devonport; who have undertaken to supply and guarantee a good instrument for £7.

Should a sextant be presented to a cadet it cannot be accepted unless approved by the captain of the ship as an instrument fit for his use, and must not be inferior to the above.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

(For the information of candidates.—To take effect at the Examination in June 1881.)

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the under-mentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from the sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the preliminary examination specified in paragraph 8, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

2. Except in special circumstances not more than one third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves for examination at the Royal Naval College will be entered.

3. Nominations for naval cadetships will take place half-yearly as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received.

4. An examination of the young gentlemen who have obtained nominations will be held at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, on the third Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

5. No candidate will be eligible for examination in June whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz., not less than twelve nor more than thirteen and a half years of age, nor in November whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

6. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined at the Royal Naval College, Greenwich, he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

7. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate; (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) a certificate of good health.

8. The preliminary examination will be as follows:—

A certificate of baptism will not be accepted.

Candidates who obtain in each of the above subjects four-tenths of the marks assigned thereto will be further examined in any two of the following subjects they may select:—

Elementary mathematics: miscellaneous questions in arithmetic, algebra, including quadratic equations, and geometry to the end of the first book of Euclid's Elements

Latin: reading, parsing, and translating, by aid of a dictionary, Latin into English, and English into Latin

Geography and English history, outlines

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the preliminary, as well as in the further examination.

Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the preliminary examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as 14th in each subject.

9. A candidate who passes the preliminary examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the regulations as to limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice.

10. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the regulations as to limits of age.

11. For all cadets entered under these regulations, the payment will be at the rate of £70 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination a number, not to exceed 10, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the board of admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadets.

12. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

13. There will be examinations in seamanship and study at the end of each term.

Cadets who pass unsatisfactory examinations, or who are reported for unsatisfactory conduct, will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following or any subsequent term, should they again be reported as failing to attain the proper number of marks at the examinations, or for unsatisfactory conduct.

Any cadet who shall appear to their Lordships for any reason to be unfit for the service will be removed from the *Britannia*.

14. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the *Britannia*) to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

15. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

16. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

17. The pay and pocket-money now allowed by Government to the cadets will be discontinued in respect of all cadets entered in and after June next.

AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

MORETON BAY—BRISBANE RIVER.

(1) *Additional Leading Lights at Lytton.*

The Queensland Government has given notice that, on 18th January 1881, two leading lights would be exhibited from the beacons above the boat-shed, on the south shore at Lytton, Brisbane River.

The upper light is a white light, the lower a red light. These lights in line lead through mid-channel between the red and black buoys off the boat passage.

(2) *Upper Flats—Alterations in Lights.*

Also, that on 7th February 1881, the leading lights previously exhibited on the beacons above Parker Island, and below the Flats, would be transferred to the triangular beacons on the south shore above the Flats, Brisbane River.

These lights kept in line lead through the new cutting, which is 100 feet wide, with a depth of 15 feet at low-water spring tides. Also, that lights would be exhibited from the beacons below Cairncross house, which lead through the cutting in Hamilton reach.

PACIFIC OCEAN.—NOTICE No. 55.—SOUTH-WESTERN PART.

THE following hydrographic information relating to New Ireland, New Hanover, and the Solomon islands has been derived from a report made by Lieutenant Thomas de Hoghton, commanding H.M. Schooner *Beagle*, 1880.

All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1881.

New Hanover 5° 50' easterly.

NEW IRELAND.

SANDWICH ISLAND.¹—The south coast of Sandwich Island (situated off the west end of New Ireland) was examined by Lieutenant de Hoghton, and found to extend for about 12 miles in an E.N.E. and W.S.W. direction.

George Brown Point, named after an English Missionary, resident in 1880 at the Duke of York Group, is the easternmost point of Sandwich Island. A barrier reef extends for about 100 yards eastward of *George Brown Point*, and trending round to the south and west, again joins the shore reef at about a cable south-west of the same point.

Patchy Bay, about a mile across, and half a mile deep, indents the coast immediately westward of *George Brown Point*; it has a slight fringe reef around its shores, and several detached patches of coral scattered over it. Midway between the outside points of *Patchy Bay*, no bottom could be found with 28 fathoms of line.

The coast, from the south-west point of *Patchy Bay*, trends to the south-west for about 2 miles, having a fringe reef of coral extending along it, and then curves sharply back to the N.N.E., and, sweeping round, forms a semi-circular bay.

Deep Bay, which is 1½ miles across, is the name given to the bay just alluded to; it is full of coral patches, has a white sandy beach, and about 300 yards of its shore fringed with coral reef. No bottom at 25 fathoms could be found close up to the coral patches. Cacaoanut trees were observed growing near the beach.

The coast from the west point of *Deep Bay* trends W.S.W. for 8 miles, and at distances of one and two miles westward from that bay, has coral spits running out for a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the shore. About two miles westward of *Deep Bay* the shore becomes lined with mangroves, and the fringe reef extending along the shore becomes wider.

Beagle Point forms the south-west extremity of *Sandwich Island*. From it, the coral fringe reef increases in extent, and stretches to the southward for a distance of 3 miles. Several coral boulders are scattered over the reef, and remain uncovered, even at high-water.

Redlands Island is the larger of two islands, situated about a mile to the north-west of *Beagle Point*. Cacaoanut and bread-fruit trees were observed growing at the north-east end of this island, and signs of the former existence of a village.

Archway Islet, about 2 cables north-west of *Redlands Island*, is small, and has a natural archway through its north-east end. The estimated height of *Archway Islet* was 20 feet above the sea.

Barrier Reef, having contained within it, deep water, with numerous scattered coral patches, extends from the south point of *Redlands Island* for about 3 miles to the southward, then curving round, in convex form, to about 3 miles north-westward of the same island, nears the coast of *Sandwich Island*, passing close to the northward of *Archway* and *Redlands islands*.

A channel, about 1½ miles in width, divides the coral reef extending southward of *Beagle Point* from the east side of the *Barrier Reef*, which runs to the southward from *Redlands Island*. This channel was found to contain numerous coral patches, and though possibly navigable by a small steamer, should not be made use of before a closer examination has taken place.

The west point of *Sandwich Island* has an extensive barrier reef girdling it; this reef extends between the west point and *Archway Islet*, from thence, was seen to stretch to the northward for two miles, and to trend round to the eastward and south-eastward, but it was not further traced.

Current.—Off the south coast of *Sandwich Island* a westerly set was experienced, of about three quarters of a knot an hour.

Natives.—The south coast of *Sandwich Island* did not appear to be inhabited except near *Beagle Point*, where smoke, probably arising from a village, and a few natives were seen.

At *Sandwich Island* and along the *New Ireland* coast, catamarans as well as outrigger canoes were used by the natives.

A generally understood sign of amity in this vicinity was found to be patting the top of the head with the palm of the hand.

Supplies of cocoa-nuts and taro were brought off by the natives of *New Ireland*, *Sandwich*, *New Hanover*, and *Portland islands*, which were eagerly exchanged for hoop iron and beads.

Tobacco appeared to be unknown to these natives.

NEW HANOVER.

NORTH COAST.—*North Islands*.—The easternmost four of these islands are situated upon a barrier coral reef having deep water inside.

The third island from the eastern is larger than the remainder, and has several dead trees upon it. The western island is small, and has growing on it a clump of tall trees.

Westward of *North Islands*, the reef bordering the north shore of *New Hanover* was also observed to be of a barrier nature. To the westward of the third island, from the easternmost of *North Islands*, is a break or channel through this barrier reef, from a half to three quarters of a mile in width, and apparently carrying deep water. This was noticed to extend close up to the north shore of *New Hanover*, which consisted of fairly high land.

PORTLAND ISLANDS are three low, wooded, islands extending N.E. and S.W., on a reef of coral, with a fourth small islet to the westward. From the south-west island, the reef stretches about two miles to the south-west, and from the N.E. island, about half a cable to the north-east; on its eastern side this fringe reef appeared steep to.

Landing may be obtained at the north-east end of the northern of the *Portland islands*, in a break of the fringing coral reef.

Natives appeared peaceable and without weapons of any description, the total number inhabiting the *Portland Islands* was estimated at 100.

SOLOMON ISLANDS.²

BOUGAINVILLE ISLAND.—A sand bank extending about a quarter of a mile N.W. and S.E., with a small tree growing on its south-east end, whence also a reef runs off, was observed by the *Beagle*, to be in latitude 0° 10' S., longitude 154° 32½' E.

ELLICE ISLANDS.

Coral Bank.³—The master of the cutter *Rose* reports that he passed over a large coral bank to the south-east of *Sophia Island*. Approximate position as given, latitude 11° 3' S., longitude 179° 50' E. Several soundings were obtained in from 13½ to 15 fathoms. The bottom was visible and seemed level. No land was in sight from aloft.

The births of 832 children, viz., 418 boys and 414 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of May. In the month of April 735 births were registered, or 97 less than in the month under review. The births were above the average of May during the previous six years by 78. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 1.

The deaths registered in May numbered 444, viz., 230 of males and 214 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 388. The deaths were fewer than in April by 38, but exceeded the average of May, during the previous ten years, by 38. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average in those ten years by 23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 74.4° on the 8th, and the lowest was 35.9° on the 19th. The mean temperature of the month (55.6°) was more than three degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.9°) took place on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 71.9° to a minimum of 40.0°. The least range (8.1°) was on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 58.6° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 15.81°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.019 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Fifty-two per cent. of the deaths registered during the month were of males, and 48 per cent. were of females. Thirty-one per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, as against 31 per cent. in May 1880; 39 per cent. in May 1879; 26 per cent. in May 1878; 34 per cent. in May 1877; 38 per cent. in May 1876; 37 per cent. in May 1875; 39 per cent. in May 1874; 40 per cent. in May 1873; 46 per cent. in May 1872; and 39 per cent. in May 1871.

Twenty-four of the persons who died were stated to have been 75 years or over at the time of their decease, viz.:—A male patient in the lunatic asylum, aged 75, who died of cancer; a male teacher, aged 75, of apoplexy; a brickmaker, a venetian blind maker, and a female, each aged 75, of brain disease; a farmer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a blacksmith, aged 75, of pneumonia; a laborer, aged 76, of heart disease; a dealer, aged 80, of phthisis; a female, aged 80, of peritonitis; a bricklayer, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a railway gate-keeper, aged 83, of Bright's disease of the kidneys; a gentleman, aged 84, of gastritis; a laborer, aged 86, of erysipelas of the hand and arm; a laborer, also aged 86, of sloughing of the extremities and old age; a lady, aged 75, two females, each aged 76, a laborer, aged 80, a bricklayer, aged 83, a female, aged 86, a female, aged 87, and a female, aged 90, of old age.

Of the deaths recorded during the month 18 were attributed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 2, died of a fit, and a jockey, aged 18, of blood poisoning, both the result of falls; a laborer, aged 26, of a fall from a ladder; a seaman, aged 42, of contusion of the leg, caused by a fall from his bunk; a contractor, aged 52, of fractured ribs, occasioned by falling from a waggon; a laborer, aged 39, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall against a lamp post; a carter, aged 22, of fracture of the spine, caused by a waggon wheel passing over him; a laborer, aged 41, was killed by a train; a jockey, aged 19, shot himself accidentally; a male child, aged 3, and a boy, aged 11, died of burns; 2 boys, aged 6 and 10 respectively, and a cook on a steamboat, aged 37, were drowned; a clerk, aged 29, a packer, aged 38, and a mason, aged 48, were found drowned, the first in Hobson's Bay; and a female infant, aged 1 month, was suffocated. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 42, who died of the result of violence on the part of her paramour. The suicidal deaths were those of a female domestic servant, aged 30, who drowned herself, and of a laborer, aged 44, who hanged himself. Both were set down as laboring under insanity at the time of their committing self-destruction.

Eighty-four deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Blind Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 136, of which 63, or 46 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 54 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 91 were under one year of age, 23 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 308. Of these, 167, or 54 per cent., were males, and 141, or 46 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 13 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases rose from 90 to 98. Under this head deaths from diphtheria increased from 2 to 9, those from croup from 3 to 5, those from typhoid fever from 15 to 18, and those from syphilis from 1 to 4, whereas those from measles fell from 2 to nil, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 30 to 25. Under the "Constitutional" head, the deaths fell from 116 to 84, the decrease being in deaths from phthisis and hæmoptysis, which fell from 70 to 49, and in deaths from hydrocephalus, which fell from 15 to 9. Under the head of developmental diseases, deaths from old age rose from 8 to 14, but those from atrophy and debility fell from 35 to 21. Childbirth combined with metria proved very fatal during the month, no less than 13 deaths being attributed to these causes, or 1 death of a mother to every 64 children registered as born alive.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC GARDEN, PARK, AND RECREATION GROUND AT WINCHELSEA.

WE, Henry Meyler, William Stirling, George Anderson, Martin Kennedy Gullan, and Finden Murrell, the duly appointed trustees of the reserve for a public garden, park, and recreation ground at Winchelsea, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*:—

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, except when required for special purposes.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No persons shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, pigs, or dogs, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the trustees.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the trustees being first obtained.
7. No persons, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
