## PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1ST SEPTEMBER AND 1ST DECEMBER 1881.

### SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before 1st September 1880 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1880 for the Districts, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed elector's right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of Act No. 334).

## RULES OF THE 1ST CASTLEMAINE VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

*Construction of the Corps and Enrolment of Members.*

1. The corps shall consist of those members whose names shall appear on the muster-roll on the date on which these rules shall be approved by the Governor in Council, and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted members in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

From and after that date every person desirous of being enrolled a member of the corps, shall forward to the commanding officer an application, supported by two members of the corps, giving the following particulars, in writing, viz. :—

Name in full,  
Age,  
Height,  
Occupation,

Private address and business address ;

which particulars shall be posted in the orderly-room for a period of one week, and thereafter submitted to the general committee, which shall have the power to admit or refuse the candidate, subject always to the decision of the commanding officer for the time being, and to the existing regulations of the force.

2. Any member of the corps permanently changing his address shall within fourteen days notify the same to the commanding officer in writing. Members failing to comply with this rule will render themselves liable to a fine of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.).

3. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, and, if required, deposit his arms and accoutrements in the store at the orderly-room under a penalty of five shillings.

4. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations (unless such parade shall have been ordered in plain clothes) or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding two shillings and sixpence.

*Management.*

5. The civil business of the corps shall be conducted by a committee of twelve, to be elected annually, five to form a quorum ; the commissioned officers and the secretary for the time being to be ex officio members of all committees ; committee for the years 1881-2 to be elected at the first general meeting held after passing of these rules, and annually in July at such dates as the officer commanding the corps may fix by public advertisement ; the secretary to the corps to be elected at such general meeting ; the accounts of the corps shall be audited by the auditors elected at the annual general meeting.

6. At the annual general meeting of the corps held in July of each year, all the elected members of the committee together with the secretary shall retire from office, but shall be eligible for re-election.

The seat of any elected member of committee who may tender his resignation thereof in writing, or shall without reasonable excuse be absent from three consecutive general meetings of committee may be declared vacant, and the vacancy filled up by the remaining members of committee with the approval of the commanding officer.

7. The duties of the general committee shall be as follows :—

To consider and recommend as to the eligibility or otherwise of all candidates for admission to the corps ; to consider and deal with such correspondence as may be submitted to them ; to take charge of and be accountable to the officer commanding for all property belonging to the corps which he may entrust to them ; to consider, pass, and recommend for payment all just and proper liabilities which may from time to time be incurred in the management of the corps (under the direction of the officer commanding) on the expenditure and condition of its funds and property, and all other necessary matters.

To challenge and accept, or decline challenges for matches with the rifle or other weapons ; to make and carry out all necessary arrangements for such matches ; to select members to compete therein ; to take charge of and arrange as to the competition for prizes ; and generally to manage all matters connected with matches ; subject in all cases to the consent and approval of the commanding officer.

To manage all matters connected with the band under the direction and subject to the approval of the commanding officer, and generally to transact such business as he may submit to them.

8. The general committee shall meet at least once a month, on such day as they may agree upon, and shall be at liberty to make rules for the conduct of its business.

9. The secretary shall attend the meetings of the corps and general committee, keep clear and intelligible minutes or records of all proceedings at such meetings ; have custody of all letters and other papers connected with the corps entrusted to his care, and conduct the correspondence relating thereto under the direction of the officer commanding.

10. The secretary may at any time be removed from office by the vote of the majority present at any general or special meeting

of the corps. In the event of such removal, or of the resignation of the secretary, the corps may, at any general or special meeting, elect a person to perform the duties for the remainder of the time for which such removed or resigned secretary shall have been elected.

*Property, uniform, &c.*

11. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements and clothing ; and any damage done thereto, except on duty, shall be made good by the person holding the same, or in default may be fined to the amount of such damage.

12. Every member must produce his arms for inspection by the officer commanding or other officer appointed for that purpose, whenever and so often as may be required, and must also return such arms to the officer commanding whenever directed by him so to do, or deposit the same in the orderly room under a penalty of Ten shillings.

13. Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must forward his uniform and other property of the corps in his possession to the officer commanding, or in default he may be fined to the amount of the value of the property retained by him.

14. Any member expelled from the corps within twelve months from receipt of new uniform shall pay to the officer commanding the full contract price of the same, or in default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding such contract price.

15. Any member who may damage, lose, destroy or retain any weapon, book, plate, or other property whatsoever belonging to the corps, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the officer commanding, or in default he will be liable to a fine not exceeding the value of the property so damaged, lost, destroyed or retained.

16. All property whatsoever belonging to the corps shall for all purposes be considered as vested in the commanding officer and his successors, whose decisions on all questions as to value or amount, with reference to the fines and penalties aforesaid, shall be final.

17. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or other person authorized by the commanding officer to receive the same, within seven days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment may be proceeded against according to law. In the event of such fine not being paid within seven days of the notification, the same shall be publicly intimated to the corps at their next parade, and the name of the defaulter posted in the orderly room until payment is made.

*Meetings.*

18. Annual general meetings of the corps shall be held in the month of July in each year, at which meeting a detailed statement of the financial position of the corps shall be laid before the members ; the meeting to be convened by advertisement, and notice to be given at parade or drill one week previous to such meeting, and may be adjourned on a motion to that effect.

19. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and shall do so on receiving a requisition signed by not less than twenty members (provided the subject be not of a military nature), giving not less than three days' notice.

20. Such notice shall consist of an advertisement in a local daily newspaper and an intimation on parade when practicable, or by circular forwarded by post to each member.

21. At every meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman.

22. No discussion shall take place except on a motion moved and seconded.

23. Immediately on a motion or amendment being made it shall be read by the chairman for discussion, and shall not then be withdrawn without leave of the meeting.

24. Every amendment on a motion shall be dealt with in like manner, but only one amendment shall be entertained and decided on at a time ; and if any amendment is carried it shall be held to have negatived the original motion and stand in its place, and it shall be competent, whether any amendment is carried or not, to receive other amendments, one at a time in like manner, to be discussed and decided on until the subject is finally disposed of ; provided that no member shall propose more than one amendment upon any motion, and no member shall speak more than once upon any motion or amendment, except the original mover of the motion first proposed, who shall be entitled to one reply and no more during the debate on the subject.

25. The seconder of a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon if he have only seconded the same without remark ; and any member may, with leave of the chairman, offer an explanation of any particular words he has used and which have been misunderstood, but shall not add new matter.

26. No question which is substantially the same as one which has been negatived at the same meeting shall be entertained at such meeting or adjournment thereof.

27. Any amendment to proceed with the next business shall, if carried, supersede the original motion and every amendment thereon.

28. The chairman of any meeting or committee shall have no vote, except in case of equality.

29. No person shall be allowed to vote or take any part in the proceedings at any meeting who shall have an unpaid fine, penalty, or subscription recorded against him, or who shall in any way be considered to have violated the rules of the corps, or any condition of a rifle competition, during the commanding officer's pleasure.

30. All motions shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a ballot be previously decided upon by the meeting.

31. Minutes of "general" or "special" meetings of the corps shall be read and confirmed prior to the close of such meeting.

32. To constitute a "general" or "special" meeting of the corps, there shall be present before commencing business twenty of the members then upon the roll.

*Liabilities incurred by the Corps for Members.*

33. If on the first of July in any year a member's debit exceed his credit by one pound or upwards, he may be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds.

34. If a member desire at any time to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he may be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings, whereby his debit exceeds his credit; provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds, and that the half may, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be remitted.

35. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any of the foregoing rules, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice, in writing, to the officer commanding, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescision, or addition to be posted in the orderly-room, or on the volunteer notice-board, such notice to be given at least one week before the meeting.

These rules were adopted by a meeting of the corps on the fourth day of May 1881.

**SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE.**

Bye-LAW No. 7.

Bye-law No. 7 of the Shire of Mount Rouse, made under the 213th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," for the suppression of nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Rouse order as follows:—

1. No person shall leave any live animal in a dying state in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or in or upon any crown lands within the boundaries of the Shire of Mount Rouse.

2. No person shall slaughter or skin any animal in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or permit the carcass of any animal to remain in or upon any public road or thoroughfare, or upon any crown lands, nor in or upon any lands whether the same be private or public property within the boundaries of the Shire of Mount Rouse.

3. The owner of any dead animal within the boundaries of the Shire of Mount Rouse shall immediately cause the same to be buried a sufficient depth beneath the surface of the soil, and shall cause the same to be covered with sufficient earth to prevent any effluvia arising therefrom dangerous to the health of the inhabitants.

4. In the event of any dead animal being left exposed in any place within the boundaries of the Shire of Mount Rouse, whether it be on public or private property, the council of the shire is hereby authorized and directed to instruct their inspector of nuisances to have such carcass buried at once, to prevent any effluvia dangerous to the public health arising therefrom.

5. The council of the Shire of Mount Rouse, through their inspector, may summon the owner of such dead animal to the court of petty sessions, and shall be entitled to recover all expenses incurred by the said council in burying the carcass of such animal, together with all reasonable costs, such costs to be adjudged by the adjudicating justices.

6. In the construction of this bye-law, the word "animal" shall mean and include all horses, mares, geldings, fillies, bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, calves, sheep, rams, ewes, goats, and swine.

7. No person shall deposit within the Shire of Mount Rouse, in other than the places appointed for that purpose by the said shire council, any night-soil or other offensive matter.

8. Every person guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of the foregoing bye-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) sterling, nor less than Five shillings (5s.).

THE Council of the Borough of Hamilton doth hereby, in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," fix the following scale of charges for water supplied by measure, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied, and determine the time at which such charge shall be payable, that is to say:—

The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Council, shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

The charges shall be paid in advance, quarterly—on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in each year.

The charges for water supplied at stand-pipes shall be Three-pence for each 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons, provided that any person rated for water supplied shall not be called upon to pay for water drawn from stand-pipes if such water is to be used only for domestic purposes at the premises assessed.

Bye-law No. 19 of the Borough of Hamilton, dealing with the same matters as this present bye-law, is hereby repealed.
