PREPARATION OF GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS DURING THE WEEKS ENDING 1ST SEPTEMBER AND 1ST DECEMBER 1881.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights issued on or before 1st September 1880 for the Provinces, and 1st December 1880 for the Districts, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the General Lists to be made up from and after the 1st September next for the Provinces, and 1st December next for the Districts. Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists to be made up as aforesaid.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will bear the same number, and be in the same form and tenor as that in lieu of which it is issued, and will be equally available for any election that may take place before the completion of the new Rolls in October and January next.

No elector whose name is on a Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Province or District, is entitled to a renewed elector's right for such Province or District (*vide* sections 61 and 62 of *The Electoral Act 1865*, and section 21 of Act No. 334).

The births of 815 children, viz., 430 boys and 385 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 832 births were registered, or 17 more than in the month under review. The births exceeded the average in June during the previous seven years by 78. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 3.

The deaths registered in June numbered 445, viz., 220 of males and 216 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 370. The deaths outnumbered those in May by 1, and were above the average of June, during the previous ten years, by 85. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over that average will be reduced to 30.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.0° on the 1st, and the lowest was 31.9° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (47.2°) was more than two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.8°) took place on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 62.0° to a minimum of 37.2°. The least range (6.9°) was on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 52.9° to a minimum of 46.0°. The mean daily range was 14.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.939 inches) was a small fraction below the average.

Of the total mortality of the month 51 per cent. was of males, and 49 per cent. was of females. Thirty-two per cent. was of children under 5 years of age, as against 36 per cent. in June 1880; 27 per cent. in June 1879; 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; 42 per cent. in June 1872; and 37 per cent. in June 1871.

The deaths of persons of 75 years and over were above the average, as many as 25 being registered during the month under notice. Of these:—A female, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; another female, aged 75, of dropsy; a miner, aged 75, of apoplexy; a hawker, aged 75, of brain disease; a tanner and a female, each aged 76, of heart disease; a gunsmith, aged 77, of asthma; a hawker, aged 80, of bronchitis; a marblemason, aged 80, and a cook, aged 81, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 82, a farmer and a widow, each aged 84, of paralysis; a female patient in the lunatic asylum, aged 83, of brain disease; a female, aged 84, of cancer; a housewife, aged 90, of bronchitis; a mariner, aged 92, of heart disease; and a plasterer, aged 76, a shipwright, aged 78, a gardener, aged 79, two females, each aged 85, a widow, aged 86, another widow, aged 87, and a female, said to be aged 103, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 19 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 7, died of fracture of the skull, caused by being knocked down by a horse; a boy, aged 10, of fracture of the skull caused by a dray wheel falling on him; a laborer, aged 23,

was crushed to death by the wheels of a crushing-machine; a hotelkeeper, aged 20, was killed by a railway train passing over him; a miller, aged 31, by becoming entangled in machinery at which he was working; a butcher, aged 37, died of internal injuries, and a driver, aged 44, of fracture of the skull, both received through being thrown from carts; a laborer, aged 44, of erysipelas, consequent on injury to the leg caused by a cart wheel passing over it; a carpenter, aged 49, of blood poisoning, the result of an injury to the head caused by a telegraph post falling on him; a laborer, aged 56, of blood poisoning, and fracture of the ribs, the result of a fall whilst fighting; a gentleman, aged 45, of injury to the head, the result of a fall; a gilder, aged 62, of erysipelas, following a fracture of the leg caused by a fall; a schoolboy, aged 11, of traumatic tetanus, caused by falling on a rusty nail; a cabinet-maker, aged 32, of narcotic poisoning, caused by opium smoking; a female, aged 33, was poisoned by strychnine, there being no evidence to show how or by whom administered; a clerk, aged 18, and a seaman, aged 19, were drowned; a male infant, aged 6 months, was suffocated in bed; and a male infant, aged 14 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a girl aged 4, who died of scalds, verdict of manslaughter being brought in against the mother. Of the suicidal deaths a laborer, aged 61, hanged himself; a laborer, aged 33, drowned himself; and a licensed victualler, aged 63, hanged himself with a rope fastened to a beam in a cellar.

One hundred and one deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—61 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 141, of which 68, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 73, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 90 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 304. Of these, 161, or 53 per cent., were males, and 143, or 47 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 17 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 15 were upwards of eighty.

In the month of June, as compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 98 to 63. Under this head, the decrease occurred chiefly in deaths from diphtheria, which fell from 9 to 4; in those from typhoid fever, which fell from 18 to 16; and in those from dysentery and diarrhœa which fell from 25 to 4. On the other hand, deaths from local diseases rose from 177 to 220. The increase took place in deaths from affections of the heart and nerves, which rose from 30 to 41; in those from throat affections, which rose from 16 to 33; and in those from chest and lung diseases, which rose from 25 to 46. As the temperature was accounted for. Deaths from childbirth and metria still continue very numerous, as many as 11 deaths from these causes being set down in the month under notice, or 1 death of a mother to every 74 children registered as born alive. During the last six months, the number of deaths from childbirth and metria combined, the number of births, and the proportion of the former to the latter, were as follow:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- 2nd. Orders for interment to be given to the Secretary the day previous, before 4 o'clock p.m.
- 3rd. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- 4th. The usual hours for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the remaining months of the year, except on Sunday, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock throughout the year.
- 5th. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick-graves or vault will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees or their surveyor; or, in the case of interment to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
- 6th. By the Act 27 Vict., No. 201, any person making a vault or erecting or placing a monument or tombstone in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees and upon the payment of proper charges, is entitled to have maintained and kept up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.
- 7th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owner.

8th. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be cemented and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

9th. A drawing of every stone, tomb, fence, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees, who are empowered by the Act to withhold permission and prevent the erection of any monument which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and who are required to determine and fix the position of any monument having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner; and in the erection of tablets copper clamps must be used.

10th. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charges.

11th. No person engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees shall be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12th. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

13th. A plan of the cemetery will be kept at the office of the secretary for inspection.

14th. Any person who wantonly or wilfully shall destroy or do or cause to be done any damage to any grave, vault, monument, tombstone, or fence, or damage or remove any shrub, tree, or plant, shall, on conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or be otherwise dealt with as the Act provides.

15th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

16th. The dimensions of ordinary graves will be as follows, viz., 6 feet deep, 7 feet long, 2 feet 2 inches wide at the shoulders, with other parts proportionate. In the event of any larger size being required, due notice must be given; in default thereof, the undertaker will have to enlarge the same at his own expense.

SHIRE OF DUNMUNKLE.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A Bye-Law of the Shire of Dunmunkle, made under the 213th section of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 2, for Regulating the proceedings of the Council, Officers, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dunmunkle order as follow:—Sections 1 to 57 of Part XI. of the 13th schedule of the Local Government Act 1874 is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Dunmunkle.

Passed the twentieth day of June A.D. 1881, and confirmed this twentieth day of July A.D. 1881.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings of the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject, for discussion, but in pursuance of notice, given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained, unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman; and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it is seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decisions as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologise for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands; and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of

the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provisions thereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents, shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment of any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayers during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion not exceeding in the whole in any interval two ordinary meetings of the council, the sum of five pounds.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds. No. 4386

Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever; or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine or boiler, or other filthy unwholesome or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

2. Whosoever being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to, or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully

or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have such access, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding ten pounds.

3. Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way, shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment or any part thereof shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, the stormwater having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or other waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

5. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl, and the taking of fish upon or in or within one quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding five pounds.

Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding ten pounds, and shall pay to the council by way of compensation for any such damage such further sum, not exceeding ten pounds, as the convicting justice shall order.
