VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed (being servants or employes of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of severally carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the undermentioned provisions of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of state railway, or on any state railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and to summon such person before a justice and charge him with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

The births of 721 children, viz., 360 boys and 361 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 815 births were registered, or 94 more than in the month under review. The births were 17 below the average in July during the previous seven years, or 105 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 446, viz., 253 of males and 193 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 275. The deaths outnumbered those in June by 1, and exceeded the average of July, during the previous ten years, by 64. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over that average will be reduced to 2.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.9° on the 21st, and the lowest was 34.5° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (48.5°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.0°) took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 63.9° to a minimum of 36.9°. The least range (7.2°) was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 53.2° to a minimum of 46.0°. The mean daily range was 14.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.180 inches) was above the average.

Fifty-seven per cent. of the deaths during the month were of males, and 43 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, as against 36 per cent. in July 1880; 29 per cent. in July 1879 and 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1877; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; 38 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; and 34 per cent. in July 1871.

Thirteen persons who died during the month were stated to have arrived at or passed the age of 75 years. Of these:—A gardener, aged 75, died of dysentery; a military pensioner, aged 75, of heart disease; a market gardener, aged 76, of congestion of the liver; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; a customs officer, aged 77, of injury to the leg; a seedsman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of brain disease; a bookbinder, aged 82, of drowning in a warm bath; a female, aged 86, of congestion of the lungs; a laborer, aged 90, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, a supernumerary clerk in the Post Office, aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female, aged 26, died of injury to the spine caused by a fall down stairs; a sailmaker, aged 35, of injuries received through falling into the hold of the hulk *City of Melbourne*; a carter, aged 43, of injury to the side, caused by falling from a dray; a carpenter, aged 47, of fracture of the spine, the result of a fall from the roof of a house; a farmer, aged 72, of extravasation of blood on the brain caused by falling out of bed while in a fit; a customs officer, aged 77, of injury to the leg, occasioned by a fall; a laborer, aged 50, of injuries received from a fall of clay while working in a hole; a female, aged 22, of idiopathic tetanus; a laborer, aged 38, by being passed over by a train; a sailmaker, aged 48, of internal injuries, caused by being knocked down by an omnibus; a master mariner, aged 33, of secondary amputation of the stated; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a female, aged 29, of burns, her clothes catching fire; a female, aged 41, of the effects of a poisonous dose of blistering fluid taken by mistake; a cabman, aged 44, a contractor, aged 53, and a bookbinder, aged 82, of drowning; and a tailor's cutter, aged 25, and a female, aged 62, of choking by pieces of meat. The homicidal deaths were those of a male child, who was suffocated at birth, and a female, aged 51, who was murdered by her husband. Of those who committed self-destruction a female, aged 33, did so by forcing a dinner-knife down her throat, whilst of unsound mind; a laborer, aged 62, cut his throat; a female, aged 29, poisoned herself with liniment; and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 45, hanged himself.

One hundred and three deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—65 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, and 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 149, of which 87, or 58 per cent., were of males, and 62, or 42 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 108 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 297. Of these, 166, or 56 per cent., were males, and 131, or 44 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 25 were between sixty and sixty-five, 19 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 7 were upwards of eighty.

THE PHARMACY ACT 1876.

WHEREAS by *The Pharmacy Act 1876* the Board is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas in pursuance of the said power the Board made certain regulations which were duly confirmed on the 22nd day of October 1877, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by the Governor in Council, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 26th day of October 1877: And whereas it is expedient to rescind clauses numbered 41 and 43 of the said regulations of the 22nd day of October 1877, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof: It is ordered by the said Board that clauses 41 and 43 of the said regulations shall be rescinded, and that the subjoined clauses, numbered 41 and 43, shall be inserted and read as clauses 41 and 43 respectively of the said regulations, save that the clauses hereby rescinded shall continue to apply to all persons who have entered into Articles of Agreement for Apprenticeship before these regulations came into operation, that is to say:

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION CERTIFICATE.

Clause 41.—Every person must, before he enter into Articles of Agreement to be an Apprentice, within the meaning of section 18, sub-section 4, of *The Pharmacy Act 1876*, pass a preliminary examination before the Board, or before some person appointed by it in that behalf, in the following three subjects:—

Latin.—Grammar, and translation De Bello Gallico, Book I. Translation of simple sentences from English into Latin.

English.—Grammar and Composition.

Arithmetic.—Including first four Rules Simple and Compound Vulgar and Decimal Fractions, and Simple and Compound Proportion. Thorough knowledge of the British and Metrical system of Weights and Measures.

(Quality of handwriting to be taken into account in awarding marks)

and obtain a Certificate that he has passed in the same from the Board or from the person examining, as the case may be.

43. Every person who shall have obtained a Certificate of having passed the preliminary examination hereinbefore prescribed, and who shall also have entered into Articles of Agreement as an Apprentice with a registered Pharmaceutical Chemist shall, on production of such Certificate and of such Articles of Agreement, and upon payment of the fee of One guinea, be entitled, upon application to the registrar within three months of the date of such articles, to have his name placed upon the Register of Apprentices.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Statute of Gaols 1864* (27 Vict. No. 219), it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, enclosed, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within Victoria, which were from time to time proclaimed by the Governor in Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments (thereinafter called "gaols") respectively of the place or district where the same are situated, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected (also thereafter called "gaols"), and of the prisoners confined within the same; and it was also enacted that, except where it was otherwise proclaimed by the Governor in Council, every gaol should be and be taken for all purposes as being equally a house of correction and a prison for debtors, and also every house of correction should be taken to be a prison: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and notify that the buildings and premises hereinafter described are and shall be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

SALE GAOL.—Comprising all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places, and premises erected, built, or enclosed on the following site, viz., two acres two roods, county of Tanjil, municipal district of Sale, being allotment 1 of section 12: Commencing at the intersection of the western side of Reeve

street and the northern side of Foster street; bounded thence by the latter street bearing S. 78° W. five chains; thence by allotment 8 bearing N. 12° W. five chains; thence by allotment 2 bearing N. 78° E. five chains; and thence by Reeve street aforesaid bearing S. 12° E. five chains to the point of commencement.

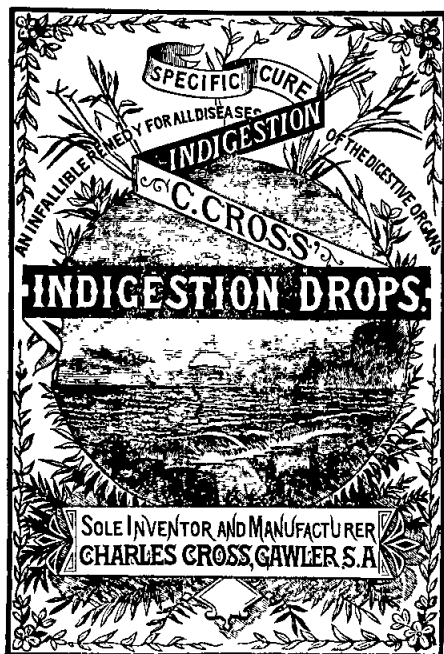
