#### VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint each and every of the persons named in the schedule hereto annexed (being servants or employés of the Board) as its agent for the purpose of severally carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the undermentioned provisions of The Public Works Statute 1865, that is to say:—

Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain Under the 128th section of the said statute to seize and detain any person trespassing on any line of state railway, or on any state railway premises, whose name and residence shall be unknown to such agent, and to give such person in charge to a police constable, whose duty it is to bring the offender before a justice, and also to complain to any justice against such offender, and charge him with an offence against the 155th section of The Public Works Statute 1865.

Also to complain to any justice against any person trespassing on any line of railway or on any railway premises for an offence against the 155th section of *The Public Works Statute* 1865, and to summon such person before a justice and charge him with such

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

The births of 721 children, viz., 360 boys and 361 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 815 births were registered, or 94 more than in the month under review. The births were 17 below the average in July during the previous seven years, or 105 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population. The deaths registered in July numbered 446, viz., 253 of males and 193 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 275. The deaths outnumbered those in June by 1, and exceeded the average of July, during the previous ten years, by 64. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over that average will be reduced to 2.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63° on the 21st, and the lowest was 34°5° on the 28th. The mean temperature of the month (48°5°) was more than a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27°0°) took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 36°9°. The least range (7°2°) was on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 53°2° to a minimum of 46°0°. The mean daily range was 14°2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30°180 inches) was above the average.

Fifty-seven per cent. of the deaths during the month were of males, and 43 per cent. were of females. Thirty-three per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, as against 36 per cent. in July 1880; 29 per cent. in July 1876; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 39 per cent. in July 1875; 38 per cent. in July 1874; 36 per cent. in July 1873 and July 1872; and 34 per cent. in July 1871.

Thirteen persons who died during the month were stated to have arrived at or passed the age of 75 years. Of these:—A gardener, aged 75, died of dysentery; a military pensioner, aged 75, of heart disease; a market gardener, aged 76, of congestion of the liver; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; a customs officer, aged 77, of injury to the leg; a seedsman, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of brain disease; a bookbinder, aged 82, of drowning in a warm bath; a female, aged 86, of congestion of the lungs; a laborer, aged 90, of apoplexy; a female, aged 77, a supernumerary clerk in the Post Office, aged 84, and a female, aged 86, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide and 4 to suicide. #### THE PHARMACY ACT 1876.

THE PHARMACY ACT 1876.

WHEREAS by The Pharmacy Act 1876 the Board is empowered from time to time to make, alter, or rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas in pursuance of the said power the Board made certain regulations which were duly confirmed on the 22nd day of October 1877, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by the Governor in Council, and published in the Government Gazette of the 26th day of October 1877: And whereas it is expedient to rescind clauses numbered 41 and 43 of the said regulations of the 22nd day of October 1877, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof: It is ordered by the said Board that clauses 41 and 43 of the said regulations shall be rescinded, and that the subjoined clauses, numbered 41 and 48, shall be inserted and read as clauses 41 and 43 respectively of the said regulations, save that the clauses hereby rescinded shall continue to apply to all persons who have entered into Articles of Agreement for Apprenticeship before these regulations came into operation, that is to say:

PRELIMINABY EXAMINATION CERTIFICATE.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWN OF BAIRNSDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the town of Bairnsdale temporarily reserved by Order of 28th June 1871 as a site for Recreation purposes, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869:—

1st. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2nd. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4th. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5th. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or

6th. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8th. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1860, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailliff of Crown lands, or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailliff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.


