WHEREAS by The Land Act 1869 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of His Excellency the Governor, hereby rescind the Regulations dated the 19th day of March 1880, and numbered respectively 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, and the three schedules thereto, and doth make the subjoined Regulations and Schedule in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

1. That no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber from allotment 145, parish of Yea, county of Anglesy.

2. That no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber, sand, or loam from the unappropriated Crown land in the town of Euroa, counties of Moira and Delatite.

And that no person as aforesaid shall exercise on any or either of the said portions of Crown lands the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

REGULATIONS FOR COMMONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the undermentioned Commons.

SHIRE OF BET BET.

Regulations:—Bealiba Common, United Moliagul, Inkerman, and Wattle Flat Farmers' and Goldfield Common, Bet Bet No. 1 Farmers' Common, Bet Bet and Wreck United Farmers' Common, Dually and Burnt Creek Common, and Tarnagulla Farmers' Common.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Bet Bet, having drafted the following regulations for management of the above-named commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on any of the above-named commons within a distance of five miles from their places of residence four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on any such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fee for depasturing stock shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall be as follows:—For every head of large or small cattle, Two (2) shillings per annum, provided that the full fee shall be paid for each half-year for every head of large or small cattle depasturing on any of the above-named commons during any portion of such period. All stock remaining on any of the above-named commons fourteen days after the period for which payment has been made may be impounded without notice to the owners of such stock.

3. All persons desiring to depasture stock on any of the above named commons shall apply to the managers for permission to do so, and shall deliver to them a written description, showing the numbers, sexes, colors, brands, and other conspicuous marks (if any), and if found entitled shall pay the fee for the then current half-year. All unlicensed stock to be considered as trespassing on the commons.

4. The owners of stock depasturing on the above-named commons shall muster them at such places as may be appointed by the managers, as often as the managers may deem necessary, for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four clear days before such musters take place.

5. All stock not branded at the latest time appointed by the managers for branding shall be deemed to be trespassing on the commons, and shall, except as hereinafter provided, be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

6. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on any of the above-named commons is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common on receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice to do so from the managers or herdsman; and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing so to remove such infected animal, it shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be dealt with accordingly.

7. Bulls or entire horses shall not be permitted to run on any of the above-named commons without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

8. All stock depastured on the commons shall run at the owners' risk.

9. No stock bearing the brand of an adjoining common will be impounded until after 48 hours' notice has been given to the herdsman or managers of said common, by the herdsman or managers of the common trespassed on.

10. No person shall be allowed to transfer his or her right of commonage.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

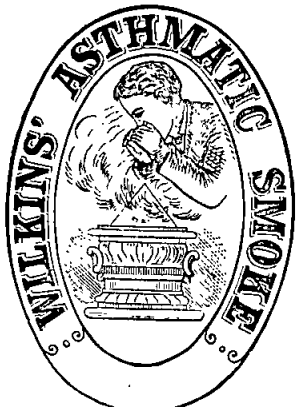
