Spencer Gulf, Germein Bay,—Entrance to Port Pirie Creek.

Notice is hereby given that, on and after the night of the 16th October 1882, leading lights will be exhibited from beacons lately creeted for the guidance of vessels entering the Port Pirie Creek at night.

DIRECTIONS.—When approaching the chequered buoy on outer bar bring the upper fixed red light and the lower fixed bright light in a line, bearing, when in one, S.E. by E. ‡ E. nagnetie, nearly; this will lead close past the chequered buoy moored a short two miles to the westward of Mount Ferguson

Keep the lights in one until opening out the first fixed bright light at the entrance to the narrows, which can be passed about a ship's length off, the other two lights to the southward will then become visible. Pass the second light about a ship's length off, and continue thus until passing the bar buoys, when a course can be steered for the inner light, which pass a quarter of a cable's length off. The last three lights should be left on the starboard hand when passing inward.

The mariner after passing this light must be guided by the buoys marking the narrow channel, and should proceed cautiously.

HEREAS by The Legislative Council Act 1881, No. 702, it was amongst other things enacted, that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might, by Order in Council, take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: And whereas in the preparation of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Hampden division of the Nelson Province in August last, the Electoral Registrar for the said division did accidentally omit therefrom the names of certain electors: And whereas in the preparation, in August last, of the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Swam Hill division of the North-Western Province, the Electoral Registrar for that division did also accidentally omit therefrom the names of certain electors, and it is expedient that the said rolls be rectified: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 31st section of the said Act, doth by this present Order direct that the Rolls of Ratepaying Electors for the Hampden and Swan Hill divisions of the said Provinces be rectified, by inserting therein the names so accidentally omitted therefrom, in accordance with the subjoined Schedules marked A and B hereto, notwithstanding such accidental omissions as aforesaid:—


