By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

SHIRE OF PYALONG.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE PYALONG AND GLENAROUA COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Pyalong having drafted the following Regulations for management of the l'yalong and Glenaroua Common submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

Regulations.

- 1. In the construction, and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.
- cattle "shall mean sheep and goats.

 2. Ratepayers, holders of minors' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or any portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle shall be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten across of such land cultivated by him.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of November and on the first day of May in each year:—

- For every head of small cattle ... 1s. per annum.

 4. All cattle intended to be depastured on the common shall, in the first instance, be produced to the herdsman by the owner, either at the common yards or the promises of the owner, for the purpose of being branded and registered, and the owner shall also furnish him, in writing, with the particulars of their private brands, and general description; and at each periodic branding the owner shall afford the herdsman all reasonable aid in mustering his cattle.
- $5.\ \mathrm{No}$ person shall be allowed to depasture more than twelve goats on the common.
- 6. Bulls and entire horses shall not be allowed on the common. 7. No animal infected with any contagious disease shall be allowed on the common.
- allowed on the common.

 8. No person depasturing cattle will be permitted to herd his own cattle nor shall he remove them from the common without the knowledge of the herdsman. If, however, in the interim of the periods which may from time to time be fixed for branding, any owner of cattle intends to remove his stock, or any portion of them, from the common, he may do so by delivering a written notice to the herdsman of such intention, and shall specify in such notice the cattle proposed to be removed, and the day of removal, prior to which he shall give a receipt for the same to the herdsman, and the cattle so removed may be replaced without extra fee by an equal number of others, or their equivalent, upon such being produced to the herdsman for branding and registration. Any breach of this regulation shall exonerate the herdsman from further responsibility in respect of any cattle belonging to such owner.
- 9. The common register shall be open at the office of the Shire Secretary, Pyalong, and may be inspected at all reasonable times, without fee, by any person who shall have stock running on the

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (\$20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS

1st. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to

1st. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2nd. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against deceney as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3rd. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4th. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5th. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs. 6th. No person shall bring any dog into the reserve, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

7th. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

8th. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed

Sth. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1869, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
