THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say :-

- An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Six hundred and fifty-three thousand seven hundred and eighty-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two and three.
- An Act to authorize the Raising of Money for the Redemption or Payment of certain Debentures.
- An Act to provide for the creation of Victorian Government Inscribed Stock and for the inscription and transfer thereof in London.
- An Act to provide for the Redemption and Payment of certain Debentures by increasing the amount of Victorian Government Stock.

THE Wanganui Harbor Board notifies that, on and after the 6th November 1882 the signals used on board the dredge in the Wanganui Rivor will be as follow:—

In the daytime (inward bound): A rod ball denotes—"Leave the dredge on the starboard hand;" and a green ball denotes—"Leave the dredge on the port hand when passing."

At night (inward bound): A red under a white light denotes—"Leave the dredge on the starboard hand;" and a green under a white light denotes—"Leave the dredge on the port hand when passing."
