4 PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF KYNETON. PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and theneforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Kyneton has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, within the said shire, be so declared public highways. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Shire of Kyneton, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

No. 506), § 19, 38, and 49, it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the timeoment Gractic, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Borough of Footscray, therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Borough of Footscray the portion of the Borough of the Shire of Wyndham; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Wyndham and the East Riding thereof hereby enlarged, and of the said Rorough of Footscray hereby reduced, in manner following, that is to say:—

## SHIRE OF MERRIANG.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF WALLAN WALLAN FARMERS' COMMON. -

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Merriang, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Wallan Wallan Farmers Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works

and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

## Regulations.

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

- small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

  2. The following shall be the scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance, for depasturing stock on the common:

  For every horse ... ... ... 10s. per annum.

  head of other large cattle ... 5s. ... ... 1s. 6d. ...

  3. Persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall, after payment to the managers of the prescribed fees, deliver the same to the herdsman, to whom the receipt for such fees shall be produced, if required.
- 4. The days for receiving and delivering stock shall be each day in the week (Sundays excepted) and the last Tuesday in every
- All stock remaining on the common fourteen (14) days after the period for which payment has been made will be liable to be impounded, without notice to the owners of such stock.
- 6. All persons desiring to remove their stock from the common shall give the herdsman two days' notice thereof in writing, during which period he will muster or collect such stock in the paddock or yards, as the case may be, and give notice thereof to the owners. In no case shall the herdsman be allowed to take stock to the owner's residence.
- 7. No person shall be allowed to remove stock from the common without first applying to the herdsman, to whom a receipt shall be given for all stock removed.
- 8. The herdsman shall, when required by the managers, muster the stock legally depasturing on the common, but not oftener than twice in any one year.
- 9. If any stock legally depasturing on the common shall stray therefrom and be impounded from private lands or from any other common, the herdsman shall release the same at his own
- 10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common, and any stock so affected found depasturing thereon must, within twenty-four (24) hours, after notice thereof, in writing, from the herdsman, be either removed or destroyed by the owners of such stock.
- removed or destroyed by the owners of such stock.

  11. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

  12. All carcases and offensive matter on the common shall be thoroughly burned by the herdsman, as soon as found by him, and, if he neglect or fail to do so, the work may be carried out by the officers of the Public Works Department to the satisfaction of the resident inspector at Yan Yean, at the cost of the Shire Council of Merriang.
- 13. The register and other books in connection with the common may be inspected at the Shire Office by any person, on payment of a fee of sixpence for each inspection.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regula-tions, shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
