After the expiration of three years from the 21st June 1879, greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

The average price for a remount has been fixed at 550 rupees. Every horse presented for purchase will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given, provided that the average of the purchases does not exceed that limit.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the township hereinafter mentioned to be a district where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say :-

The Township of Lillimur South.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteen section of the Act above recited the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say :-

Allotment 4, section C, parish of Dartagook.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

RIVOLI BAY.

(1) *Beachport—Alterations in Jetty Light.*

THE Government of South Australia has given notice that, on 1st September 1881, the following alterations would be made in the light exhibited on the jetty at Beachport, northern side of Rivoli Bay:—

The temporary red light previously shown from the north end of the jetty is discontinued; and in lieu thereof a fixed red light is now exhibited from the south end—this light is elevated 10 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 5 miles.

NOTE.—Vessels approaching Beachport at night, after passing Penguin Island at the distance of about half-a-mile, should not steer towards the jetty until the red light bears N.W. by N.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.

(1) *Signals used by Dredgers.*

THE Government of South Australia has given notice that, on and after 6th October 1881, the following signals would be shown from the dredgers at work in that colony, in lieu of those previously used:—

During the day—inward bound—a red ball denotes leave the dredger on the starboard hand. A black ball denotes leave the dredger on the port hand when passing.

At night—inward bound—a red light under a white light denotes leave the dredger on the starboard hand. A green under a white light denotes leave the dredger on the port hand when passing.

SPENCER GULF—HARDWICKE BAY.

(2) *Fixed Light at Port Victoria.*

Also that, on 1st October 1881, a light would be exhibited from the extremity of the jetty at Port Victoria, Hardwicke Bay.

NOTE.—This light kept in line with the old light (fixed white) bearing N. 39½ E. leads in mid-channel through the northern Bulari Passage.

In order to maintain the deepest water, vessels should keep the red light open a little northward of the white light, and, with a heavy sea, should avoid opening it to the southward of the white light.

NEW ZEALAND—NORTH ISLAND.

PORT NICHOLSON.

(1) *Sunken Rock in Fitzroy Bay.*

THE New Zealand Government has given notice, dated 6th September 1881, of the existence of a sunken rock lying in the southern part of Fitzroy Bay, eastern side of approach to Port Nicholson.

This danger (Arabella Rock), on which the barque *Arabella*, drawing 15 feet, struck, when getting underway, is stated to be a pinnacle rock with a depth of 7 fathoms near it. The master of the vessel was not able to ascertain the exact position of the rock, but has given the following bearings and distance, as a near indication:—

Pencarrow Head Lighthouse N.N.W.
Baring Head ... E.S.E., distant about one mile.

NOTE.—Vessels passing or rounding Baring Head should give the head a wide berth.

(2) *Alteration in Railway Pier Light at Wellington.*

STATION TÉLÉGRAPHIQUE ET SÉMAPHORIQUE DE VINGA.

A dater du 15 Septembre prochain, la direction royale des télégraphes ouvrira à *Vinga* (entrée de Gothembourg) une station électro-télégraphique, à laquelle sera annexé un établissement spécial pour l'échange de signaux avec les bâtiments passant en mer.

Cette station télégraphique et sémaphorique combinée est située à une distance de 140 mètres à l'ouest de la *baie de Vinga*. On y recevra et on y expédiera des télégrammes tous les jours, depuis le lever, jusqu'au coucher du soleil.

La correspondance par la voie de signaux avec les bâtiments en mer se fera exclusivement au moyen de pavillons et signaux de distance, d'après les règles du "code commercial de signaux à l'usage des bâtiments de toutes les nations."

Pour ce qui regarde les dépêches télégraphiques à destination des bâtiments, les règles à observer sont les suivantes :

- 1^o. L'adresse devra donner, outre les indications ordinaires, le nom du bâtiment, son numéro officiel (c. à d. le signal distinctif dans la liste des bâtiments) ainsi que son port d'attache ;
- 2^o. Le texte de la dépêche devra être rédigé, soit en suédois, soit en groupes de lettres. Dans ce dernier cas, les lettres employées devront être choisies parmi les consonnes B, C, D, F, G, H, J, K, L, M, N, P, Q, R, S, T, V, et W. Chaque groupe ne sera composé que de quatre lettres au plus ; une dépêche rédigée de cette façon sera traitée comme chiffrée.

Les communications en provenance des bâtiments seront transmises à destination par la voie télégraphique, et, si l'expéditeur en exprime la demande, la transmission aura lieu en ces chiffres ; sinon la dépêche sera transmise en traduction suédoise.

La taxe des télégrammes est fixée comme suit :

a) Pour la transmission des signaux entre le bâtiment et la station, il sera perçu une surtaxe de 1 couronne 50 öre par dépêche, sans tenir compte du nombre des mots ;

b) Pour la transmission de la dépêche par la voie télégraphique, il sera fait application des taxes établies pour la correspondance télégraphique avec l'intérieur et l'étranger.

Le port total sera, pour les télégrammes envoyés aux bâtiments, à la charge de l'expéditeur ; pour les dépêches en provenance des bâtiments, il sera perçu à destination.

Il suffit qu'un bâtiment passant devant la station ait arboré le pavillon national et son signal distinctif (numéro officiel) pour que son passage soit annoncé par le télégraphe à la personne en Suède qui, par lettre ou par télégramme adressé d'avance au poste sémaphorique, en aura exprimé le désir et aura en même temps donné son adresse.

Dans ce cas, il ne sera perçu aucune taxe, jusqu'à nouvel ordre, pour la transmission par la voie de signaux : le destinataire n'aura à payer que la taxe ordinaire pour la transmission de l'avis par le télégraphe, ainsi que les frais que pourra occasionner l'expédition du télégramme depuis le dernier bureau télégraphique jusqu'à destination.

Dès l'ouverture de cette station, l'ancien poste sémaphorique établi à *Vinga* jusqu'à présent sera supprimé.

NOTICE.

TELEGRAPH AND SIGNAL STATION OF VINGA.

On the 15th of September an electric telegraph office combined with a special establishment for exchanging signals with vessels passing at sea will be opened at *Vinga* at the entrance to *Gottenburg*.

This office is situated 140 meters westward from the *Vinga beaen*.

Telegrams will there be received and dispatched daily from sunrise to sunset.

The signalling to ships at sea will be carried on exclusively by means of flags and distance signals according to the rules laid down in the International "Commercial Code of Signals."

With regard to telegrams sent to vessels, the following rules are to be observed :

1^o. The address must give not only the ordinary indications, but also the name of the vessel, its official number (i.e., signal letters in the Code List) as well as the port to which the ship belongs ;

2^o. The telegrams shall either be written in the Swedish language or be composed of combinations of letters. In the latter case only the following 18 consonants of the alphabet, viz., B, C, D, F, G, H, J, K, L, M, N, P, Q, R, S, T, V, and W, may be used ; each combination shall not contain more than four letters ; a telegram of this description will be considered as if it were ciphered.

Telegrams coming from ships will, at the request of the sender, be forwarded to their destination in the above-mentioned kind of cypher ; in case no such request should be made, the despatch will be forwarded in Swedish translation.

The charge for messages by signal letters will, in the rule, be calculated at the following rate :

a) for signalling : 1 krona 50 öre for any number of words ;

b) the forwarding of the message through the telegraph will be charged according to the established tariff of rates for inland and foreign telegraphic correspondence.

The whole amount of both these posts is to be paid : for telegrams sent to vessels by the sender, and for despatches coming from vessels by the receiver.

Passing vessels will be able, by simply hoisting the ensign with their distinguishing signal, i.e., their official number in the Code List, to have their passage reported by telegraph to any person within Sweden, who, by letter or telegram, shall have previously applied to the office for such purpose, at the same time giving his address.

In such cases no charge will at present be made for the signalling, and the person to whom a message is addressed will only have to pay the ordinary charge for the transmission by telegraphic wire and such expenses as the forwarding of the message to its address from the nearest telegraph office may involve.

After the establishment of the electric telegraph office, the optical telegraph at *Vinga* will no longer be used.

PART OF THE BOROUGH OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON SEVERED THEREFROM, AND CONSTITUTED THE BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of March 1882.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1874 (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 21, and 38), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned. And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not ; and, in case it should be subdivided, name and describe the subdivisions. And every such Order should take effect according to the tenor of the same ; and every such Order constituting any new municipality, having for its municipal dis-

trict portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district. And every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication : And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of the Flemington and Kensington Ward of the Borough of Essendon and Flemington, praying that the said ward therein described might be severed from the Borough of Essendon and Flemington, and constituted a separate municipality (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act) : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Borough of Essendon and Flemington the portion of the borough described in such petition (being the Flemington and Kensington Ward aforesaid), and doth direct that the portion so severed from such borough shall be constituted a separate municipality under the designation of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington ; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby adjust the boundaries of the said Borough of Essendon and Flemington, as hereby diminished, and of the hereby constituted Borough of Flemington and Kensington, in manner following, that is to say :—

BOROUGH OF ESSENDON AND FLEMINGTON, AS REDUCED.—Commencing at the point of intersection of the northern boundary of portion 12, parish of Doutta Galla, with the Moonee Ponds ; thence by the Moonee Ponds in a northerly direction to a point where it intersects the north side of Woodland street, Essendon ; thence by the north side of Woodland street west until it intersects the north-east side of the main line of road from Melbourne to Broadmeadows ; thence by a line westerly to a point where it intersects the north side of the Mount Alexander road, due north of the north-west angle of allotment A, section 13, parish of Doutta Galla ; thence south by the boundaries of allotments A of section 13 and 1 of section 7 to the south-west angle of sec-

tion 7, allotment 1, on the north bank of the Saltwater River; thence by the Saltwater River easterly and southerly to a point where the said river intersects the north-western boundary of the Racecourse reserve; thence north-easterly by that boundary to its intersection with a Government road, described as Epsom road; thence south-easterly by that road to its intersection with another Government road, described as Ascot Vale road; thence north by that road to Kent street, being the south boundary of allotment 13, parish of Doutta Galla; thence east by that street to its intersection with the Main Mount Alexander road; thence north-westerly by that road to its intersection with the northern boundary of portion 12 before mentioned; and thence east by said boundary to the commencing point.

BOROUGH OF FLEMINGTON AND KENSINGTON CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.—Commencing at the point of intersection of the northern boundary line of portion 12, allotment 5, parish of Doutta Galla with the Moonee Ponds; thence by a line westerly along the said boundary about twenty chains to the Main Mount Alexander road; thence by that road south-easterly to the intersection of the southern boundary of allotment 13 of said parish with the said road; by the centre of Kent street, being the boundary of said allotment westerly about thirty chains to the centre of a Government road, known as the Epsom Vale road; thence by that road southerly to its intersection with another Government road, described as the Epsom road; thence by that road north-westerly to the north-western boundary of the Racecourse reserve; thence by that boundary south-westerly to the Saltwater River; thence by that river southerly and easterly to a point where said river intersects the north side of the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway; thence by the north side of the railway easterly to its intersection with the Moonee Ponds; and thence by the said Moonee Ponds in a northerly direction to the commencing point; excluding

from the area above described the pieces or parcels of land described in the second and third schedules to the Act 21 Victoria, No. 11, and the roadway which separates the said pieces or parcels.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

It is also hereby further ordered that the Council of the Borough of Flemington and Kensington now constituted shall consist of nine members, and that the said borough shall not be subdivided at present.

And the Honorable Charles Young, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE RUTHERGLEN COMMON.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Rutherglen having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Rutherglen Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common.

Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the 1st day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every head of large cattle ... 2s. per annum.
" " " small " ... 1s. " "

4. Sheep will be permitted to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.
5. No bull shall be allowed to run on the common without the permission in writing of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
