The births of 695 children, viz., 357 boys and 338 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January, 826 births were registered, or 131 more than in the month under review. The births were 58 above the average of the previous seven years; but 18 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 552, viz., 289 of males and 263 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 143. The deaths were lower than those in January by 20, but greater than the average of February during the previous ten years by 93. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to be greater than the average of those ten years by 19.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.46, and of deaths registered 1.95.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 105.1° on the 26th, and the lowest was 46.1° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (65.8°) was a third of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.9°) took place on the 26th, viz., from a maximum of 105.1° to a minimum of 58.2°. The least range (9.5°) was on the 18th, viz., from a maximum of 68.0° to a minimum of 58.5°. The mean daily range was 24.1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.958 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 46 per cent. to that mortality, as against 45 per cent. in February 1881; 52 per cent. in February 1880; 45 per cent. in February 1879; 52 per cent. in February 1878; 51 per cent. in February 1877; 53 per cent. in February 1876; 63 per cent. in February 1875; 54 per cent. in February 1874; 53 per cent. in February 1873; and 56 per cent. in February 1872.

Nineteen deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of congestion of the liver; a male, of no occupation, aged 77, of bronchitis; a hatter, aged 78, and a retired major in the Canadian Militia, aged 79, of heart disease; a shipwright, aged 78, of disease of the kidneys; a female, aged 78, of



apoplexy; a solicitor, aged 79, of disease of the aorta; a leather-dresser, aged 81, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 84, of burns; and a gentleman and a female, each aged 75, a widow, aged 76, a farmer, aged 79, an ironfounder and 2 females, each aged 81, a merchant, aged 82, a groom, aged 83, and a female, aged 93, of old age.

As many as 31 deaths were set down to external causes during the month under notice, of which 28 were ascribed to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. Of the accidental deaths, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 24, died of blood-poisoning and wound in the knee, caused by a knife being thrown at him in a quarrel; a brickmaker, aged 50, of erysipelas, contracted in the hospital, the result of injury to the shoulder and face; a quarryman, aged 35, of amputation of the thigh, caused by rupture of an artery, and oedema of leg, sustained whilst working; a groom, aged 28, of fracture of the spine, and a laborer, aged 36, of fracture of the base of the skull, both consequent on being thrown from horses; a laborer, aged 30, of fractured ribs, caused by a log of wood falling on him; a laborer, aged 39, was killed by the fall of a limb of a tree; a laborer, aged 39, was crushed to death between two buffers of railway carriages; a cook, aged 45, was killed by being struck by a train; a laborer, aged 42, and another, aged 49, by trains passing over them; a publican, aged 59, by the wheel of a cart passing over his chest; a female, aged 58, died of convulsions, from injuries to the chest and head, caused by falling from a railway carriage on to the platform; a laborer, aged 59, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a window; a commission-agent, aged 23, from the effects of a self-inflicted wound from a revolver, but there was no evidence to show with what intent the weapon was discharged; a female, aged 84, was burnt to death, a lighted match falling on her bed-clothes; 3 boys, aged 7, 9, and 11 respectively, a ship's cook, aged 35, and a laborer, aged 45, were drowned, the first three whilst bathing; a female infant, aged 1 day, and 2 females, aged 27 and 42 respectively, were found drowned; a male infant was suffocated during birth, a male infant, aged 1 month, and a female infant, aged 1 day, were both suffocated in bed; and a laborer, aged 38, died from suffocation, caused by food regurgitating into the windpipe, probably occurring during an epileptic fit. The homicidal death was that of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated. Of the suicidal deaths, a groom, aged 25, shot himself, and a female, aged 62, cut her throat, whilst of unsound mind.

Eighty-three deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 254, of which 127, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 127, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 184 were under one year of age, 51 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 298. Of these, 162, or 54 per cent., were males, and 136, or 46 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 17 were between thirty and thirty-five, 30 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 11 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

Under the head of zymotic diseases, the deaths fell from 147 in January to 133 in February. The decrease occurred chiefly in deaths from whooping-cough, which fell from 12 to 6; in those from rheumatism, which fell from 5 to 2; in those from syphilis, which fell from 6 to 1; and in those from want of breast-milk, which fell from 17 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 11 to 20. Under the head of constitutional diseases, the deaths increased from 94 to 106, which was occasioned by the deaths from phthisis, which rose from 53 to 68. Measles proved fatal in one case during the month. Only 3 deaths occurred in childhood during the month under notice—which is a very low number—as many as 8 cases having taken place in the previous month.

## SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.—"PINE LODGE TANK RESERVE."

*Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for affording access to Water in the parish of Katandra, known as "Pine Lodge Tank Reserve."*

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the sixth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the ninth day of August 1881, as a site for affording access to Water in the parish of Katandra, and hereinafter styled "Pine Lodge Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

## Regulations.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or to be placed within the reserve; nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute the water within the reserve.
3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platform, or other appliances attached thereto.
4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and for watering stock.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing regulations were framed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, this fifth day of January 1882.

*Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for affording access to Water in the parish of Dunbulbalane, known as "Wattle Scrub Tank Reserve."*

WHEREAS, by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the sixteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the sixth day of December 1880, as a site for affording access to Water in the parish of Dunbulbalane, and hereinafter styled "Wattle Scrub Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

## Regulations.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or to be placed within the reserve; nor shall any person bathe, or wash in, or otherwise pollute the water within the reserve.
3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platform, or other appliances attached thereto.
4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the reserve shall be for the free use of the public, for domestic purposes, and for watering stock.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 5, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

14. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts

made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works, or on account of other Governments; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

16. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Government, or the contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected.
