SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNDERMENTIONED COMMONS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA:—

" " BOOMAHNOOMOONAH COMMON,
KATAMATITE COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the above-named Commons, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on the common, within a distance of five miles from their places of residence, four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle.

A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year, for depasturing stock on the commons shall be as follows:—

For every head of large cattle, 5s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, 5s. per annum.

Progeny of horned cattle or horses under six (6) months old, if running with their mothers, free.

3. No person shall depasture stock on the commons who is not a *bona fide* owner of the same.

4. Bulls or entire horses, over the age of nine months, shall not be allowed on the commons without the written sanction of the managers.

5. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the commons as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

6. The herdsman of the commons shall attend on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each quarter, at a place to be named, for the purpose of registering stock and receiving fees, and due notice of such attendance, and the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

7. All persons taking stock to depasture on the commons shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock; and the manager shall, on receiving the fees payable thereon, give a receipt for the same, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such stock depasture on the commons.

8. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the commons unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

9. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock depasturing on the commons, save as provided in Clause ten (10).

10. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the commons or on being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the owner within ten days thereof. And if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owner notice in writing within that time, the former shall, should such stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling for horned cattle.

11. The managers may grant to butchers or to slaughtermen special licenses to depasture on the Katamatite Common, for such periods of time as may be agreed upon, stock intended for slaughter, subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than Two shillings per head per annum for large cattle, and One shilling per head per annum for small cattle.

12. All stock depasturing on the commons on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after the date for renewal of license, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the commons, and may be impounded.

13. All carcases found on the commons which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, may be removed, or destroyed by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

14. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the commons; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof, in writing, to the owner of such stock and also to the nearest inspector of stock having jurisdiction in the district in which the common is situated, and shall also forthwith give notice to the managers of the commons.

15. Whenever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done, if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.—"O'BRIEN'S TANK RESERVE."

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for conservation of Water in the parish of Katandra, known as "O'Brien's Tank Reserve."—(2a. 2r. 24p.)

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the fifteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of twenty-fourth January 1882, as a site for conservation of Water in the parish of Katandra, and hereinafter styled "O'Brien's Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.

2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or to be placed within the reserve; nor shall any person bathe or wash in or otherwise pollute the water within the reserve.

3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platforms, or other appliances attached thereto.

4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the reserve shall be for the free use of the public for domestic purposes and for watering stock.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing regulations were framed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga this sixth day of March 1882.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for conservation of Water in the parish of Katandra, known as "McLean's Tank Reserve."—(24a. Or. 25p.)

WHEREAS, by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the fifteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga was duly appointed a Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of twenty-fourth January 1882, as a site for conservation of Water in the parish of Katandra, and hereinafter styled "McLean's Tank Reserve": Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, submit

the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.

2. No person shall allow any foul or deleterious matter injurious to health to run into or to be placed within the reserve; nor shall any person bathe, or wash in, or otherwise pollute the water within the reserve.

3. No person shall climb or jump over or break or otherwise damage the pumps, troughs, platforms, or other appliances attached thereto.

4. Subject to the foregoing regulations, the water in the reserve shall be for the free use of the public, for domestic purposes, and for watering stock.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing regulations were framed by the Council of the Shire of Yarrawonga this sixth day of March 1882.
