NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR THE POLICE FORCE.

A LIMITED number of candidates being required for the Police Force, applications from persons desirous of being employed therein will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda road, on Tuesday the 30th instant, at Ten a.m., and on the following Tuesday, 6th day of June next, at the same hour.

Each applicant must present personally a written application in his own handwriting, when, if considered suitable, he will be examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the purpose.

As no exceptions to the rule above set forth will be made, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than as above prescribed.

Candidates will not be appointed if over the age of thirty years, and if for employment in the Mounted Force, must be under twenty-five. Applicants for the Foot Police must be at least five feet nine inches in height. Candidates for the Mounted Police must be at least five feet seven inches high, must not exceed eleven stone seven pounds in weight, and must be able to ride well.

All candidates must be smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. To ascertain

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these facts independently candidates must undergo a strict medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other force or Government Department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

ALL members of the late Victorian Artillery Corps who have received notice to attend at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, for the purpose of being appointed to the Police Force, but have failed to comply therewith, or who may have been from any cause inadvertently not noticed, must attend at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda road, on or before Tuesday the 6th day of June next. RUNS, ETC., INTERSECTED BY BOUNDARY-LINES COMMON TO TWO DISTRICTS.

APPROACHES TO NELSON HARBOR.

FROM recent survey of entrance to Nelson Harbor it was found that the bar in the direction of the old course had much shallowed: Notice is therefore given that, on and after the 1st May next, the position of the fairway and bar buoys will be altered.

The fairway buoy will be shifted 3 cables nearer to the light-house, and will be distant from it $5\frac{1}{2}$ cables, with the following bearings:—Lighthouse, E. by N. as before; Magazine, S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; Arrow Rock, S.S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.

The bar buoy will be shifted a bare cable due east, and will be off the east end of a bank in 7 feet water at low-water springs, with the following bearings:—Lighthouse, N.E.; Magazine, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.; Arrow Rock, S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.

Vessels bound in may pass fairway buoy on either hand, but the bar buoy should be left on the starboard side, as the channel lies between these buoys and the Boulder Bank, with its narrowest part $2\frac{1}{2}$ cables opposite the bar buoy, and with not less than 7 feet at low-water springs, 17 feet at high-water neaps, and 20 feet at high-water springs. A chart will shortly be issued showing the various changes. Bearings magnetic.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Williamstown has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned, within the said borough, be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Williamstown, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

The births of 834 children, viz., 416 boys and 418 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February, 695 births were registered, or 139 more than in the month under review. The births were 101 above the average of the previous seven years; and 14 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 592, viz., 319 of males and 273 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 242. The deaths outnumbered those in February by 40, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 93. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 13.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2'95, and of deaths registered 2'00.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 102° 1' on the 10th, and the lowest was 45° 3' on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (64° 2') was four-tenths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44° 2') took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 102° 1' to a minimum of 57° 9'. The least range (7° 2') was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 65° 6' to a minimum of 58° 4'. The mean daily range was 23° 6'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29° 881 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 43 per cent. in March 1881; 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in March 1874; 49 per cent. in March 1873; and 53 per cent. in March 1872.

The number of persons who died at the age of 75 years or upwards was 16, viz. :—Two females, each aged 75, of phthisis; a carter, aged 76, of dropsy; a female, aged 76, of varicose veins; a gentleman, aged 76, of kidney disease; a station employé, aged 77, of lumbago; a female, aged 77, of diarrhoea; a female domestic servant, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 78, of pneumonia; a dealer, aged 79, of softening of the brain; a gentleman, aged 79, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 80, and one female aged 90, of bronchitis; an accountant, aged 75, and a female, aged 81, of old age.

Deaths from external causes during the month numbered 20, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths, a boy, aged 12, was killed by a piece of timber falling on him; a laborer, aged 49, died of gangrene of the foot and leg, caused by an iron safe falling on him; a ship's apprentice, aged 18, of injury to the brain, caused by a fall into the hold of a ship; a mariner, aged 48, of injury to the head, and a seaman, aged 53, of fracture of the skull—both the result of falls; 2 laborers, each aged 31, were killed—the one by a railway truck, and the other by a train passing over him; a laborer, aged 52, was killed by a train passing over his leg; a laborer, aged 54, died of erysipelas consequent on fracture of the leg; a laborer, aged 60, of peritonitis, resulting from a kick in the abdomen; a female child, aged 2, and a girl, aged 6, of burns; a male child, aged 3, and a butcher, aged 68, of sunstroke; a laborer, aged 44, was drowned, through falling off a plank whilst painting a ship; a female infant was overlain by the mother; a widow, aged 50, was suffocated through falling through a window, and hanging there. The homicidal death was that of a clerk, aged 44, who died of erysipelas supervening on a gunshot wound inflicted by an hotel-keeper (verdict of manslaughter). The suicidal deaths were those of a commercial traveller, aged 22, who poisoned himself with opium whilst of unsound mind, and a coachbuilder, aged 26, who drowned himself.

One hundred and eight deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz. :—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 10 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Deaf and Dumb Asylum, 1 in the Police Hospital, and 1 in the Industrial School.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 254, of which 136, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 118, or 46 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 189 were under one year of age, 36 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 338. Of these, 183, or 54 per cent., were males, and 155, or 46 per cent., were females; 8 were between five and ten, 18 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 33 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 22 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were upwards of eighty.

In March as compared with the previous month the deaths under the head of zymotic diseases rose from 133 to 164, and those under the head of local diseases from 181 to 231. Under the zymotic head the chief increase was in deaths from croup, which rose from 4 to 6; in those from whooping-cough, which rose from 6 to 9; in those from typhoid fever, which rose from 20 to 37; and in those from rheumatism, which rose from 2 to 7. Under the head of local diseases the chief increase occurred in deaths from apoplexy, which rose from 16 to 23; in those from bronchitis, which rose from 4 to 19; and in those from liver disease, which rose from 8 to 21. Deaths from constitutional diseases decreased from 106 to 93, the diminution being in deaths from scrofula, which fell from 5 to nil; and in those from phthisis, which fell from 68 to 62. Five deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth, or one death of a mother to every 167 births registered.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eleventh day of September 1871, the Borough of Woods Point was declared to be a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke from and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the reserve for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Birregurra.

WE, Charles Beal, James Wilson Bird, William Edmundson, James McCallum, and William Sherren, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land in the town of Birregurra, temporarily reserved by Order of eighteenth May 1869, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, or improvements in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring any dog into the reserve, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee first obtained.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
 8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 9. A fee not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every person and every horse to the reserve, on such days as may be set apart by the committee for any special purpose. The moneys received as admission fees shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. No person shall put in the park any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee first obtained.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee first obtained.
8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs.
9. A fee not exceeding One shilling (1s.) may be charged and taken for admission of every person and every horse to the park, on such days as may be set apart by the committee for any special purpose. The moneys received as admission fees shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the park.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF KEW.

REGULATION No. 4.

Regulation of the Borough of Kew, made under the Second Section of the Act to amend the Police Offences Statute 1865, 42 Victoria, No. 630, for preventing the assemblage of persons on the carriage-ways and footways of the borough.

IN pursuance of the Act 42 Victoria, No. 630, section 2, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kew make the Regulations following:—

1. No two persons or more shall be permitted to assemble or stand together on any part of any footway or carriage-way within the limits of the Borough of Kew, after being requested by any police constable on duty to move away from where such persons may be so assembled or standing together.

2. In case of any person or persons being requested to move away as hereinbefore provided, and such person or persons thereupon refusing to move away as requested, the police constable making the request is hereby authorized to ask from such person or persons his or their

name or names and place or places of residence, and in case any such person or persons shall refuse to state to the constable his or their name or names and place or places of residence, such constable may deal with such person or persons in the mode prescribed by section 56 of the Police Offences Statute, 28 Victoria, No. 265.

3. Every person committing an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
