NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR THE POLICE FORCE.

ALIMITED number of candidates being required for the Police Force, applications from persons desirous of being employed therein will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda road, on Tuesday the 30th instant, at Ten a.m., and on the following Tuesday, 6th day of June next, at the same hour.

Each applicant must present personally a written application in his own handwriting, when, if considered suitable, he will be examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the purpose.

As no exceptions to the rule above set forth will be made, it will be useless to make application for admittance into the Force in any other manner or place than as above prescribed.

Candidates will not be appointed if over the age of thirty years, and if for employment in the Mounted Force, must be at least twenty-five. Applicants for the Foot Police must be at least five feet nine inches in height. Candidates for the Mounted Police must be at least five feet seven inches high, must not exceed eleven stone seven pounds in weight, and must be able to ride well.

All candidates must be smart and active, of a strong constitution, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. To ascertain
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these facts independently candidates must undergo a strict medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other force or Government Department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

COUNTY COURT RULES AMENDMENT.

WE, Thomas Spencer Cope, James Frederick Nolan, and Richard Annesley Billing, being three of the County Court Judges, do hereby, under the powers vested in us by *The County Court Statute 1869*, further amend the amended Rules, Orders, and Forms for regulating the practice and proceedings in County Courts, made by the said Judges on the twenty-eighth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, by repealing the rule numbered eighty: And we do hereby substitute the following rule, which shall be read as the eightieth rule:—

80. The practitioners' costs, and the charges and expenses of service of a plaint summons, shall be fixed and assessed by the Registrar, as nearly as can be ascertained, and inserted in the plaint summons, at the time of issue, but subject to subsequent amendment or alteration, by increase or diminution, by the Registrar, of the amount thereof, in accordance with the authorized costs and charges actually paid or incurred; before entering up judgment or payment into court; or at any time, at the desire of either party, in case of a settlement out of court.

And this rule shall come into operation on the first day of June next:

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506, § 19, 38, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and

annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the sections of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the South-Western Riding of the Shire of Buln Buln; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai, and of the Corinella Riding thereof, as hereby diminished, and of the said Shire of Buln Buln and of the South-Western Riding thereof hereby added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF PHILLIP ISLAND AND WOOLAMAI REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Bounded by a line being at the shore of the eastern passage, Western Port, opposite the northern boundary of Hurdy Gurdy pre-emptive section, county of Mornington; thence to and by the said boundary and a line east therefrom to the north-west angle of allotment 38, parish of Jeetho West; thence southerly by the west boundary of allotments 38, 44, 45, and 52 of that parish, and of allotments 1, 2, 3, 22, and 23 of the parish of Jumbunna, east to the south-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence further south by a continuation of the line last described to a point due east from the south-east angle of allotment 16, parish of Jumbunna; thence by a line due east to the east boundary of the county aforesaid with that of Buln Buln; thence south-westerly along that boundary to the shore at Cape Patterson; north-westward by the shore to Griffith's Point, and to the south-east angle of the village reserve of Newhaven, Phillip Island; southward and westward around this island to the north-west angle of said reserve; thence to and around Churchill Island and to the last-named angle; eastward and southward to the south-east of aforesaid reserve, and to Griffith's Point, and northward by the shore of the eastern passage to the starting point.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it was amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council might proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the thirteenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the Municipal District of Inglewood was proclaimed to be a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke, from and after the first day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do revoke the Proclamation bearing date the twenty-fourth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removing of certain timber from the Crown lands not included in a State forest within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office, &c., and, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare—

(1) That no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove timber which, at the height of two feet, is of less diameter than twelve inches, from the Crown lands not included in a State forest within a radius of ten miles from the Beaufort Post Office.

(2) That no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall remove stone from the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundary of the town of Hamilton.

"VICTORIA PARK," ECHUCA.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for a public park and recreation ground at Echuca, known as "Victoria Park."

THE Council of the Borough of Echuca having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 21st August, 1865, for a public park and recreation ground at Echuca, and for the preservation for the good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of "The Land Act 1869":—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the written permission of the council, and all moneys derived from depasturing in the reserve shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement thereof.
 6. No person shall bring any dog into the reserve unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the council.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the council first obtained.
 8. No person except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
 9. A fee not exceeding (2s.) Two shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every person to the reserve on such days as may be set apart by the council for any special purpose. The moneys received as admission fees shall be expended on the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.
- Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of "The Land Act 1869," on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Regulations fixing the amount to be paid by persons using or carrying away water from that portion, consisting of 25 acres, of the reserve for Camping in the parish of Gowar, known as "Tarbit's Tank Reserve," and for the care, management, and protection of the said reserve.

WHEREAS by a regulation of the Board of Land and Works, made on the fourteenth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud was duly appointed a Committee of Management of portion of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of the twenty-third July 1877, as a site for Camping, in the parish of Gowar, and hereinafter styled "Tarbit's Tank Reserve:" Now therefore the said Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having framed the following Regulations for the care, management and protection thereof, submit the same to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in accordance with the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

Regulations.

1. Every person using or carrying away water from "Tarbit's Tank Reserve" shall pay therefor to any person duly appointed by the committee of management in that behalf, and duly authorized to demand the same, the fees hereinafter specified:—
1. For one hogshhead of water taken away in any one day—Sixpence.

11. For every hogshhead of water after the first hogshhead taken away in any one day—One shilling.
111. For each head of cattle brought to water at any one time—Threepence.

2. No person shall permit, allow, or cause to enter within the fence enclosing the water in the said reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, geese, or other animals, without the written authority of the committee of management or their officer duly appointed.
 3. No person shall climb, or jump over, or break, or otherwise damage the fence or gates of the said reserve, or break or otherwise damage the pumps and troughs attached thereto.
- Every person offending against these regulations, or refusing to pay upon demand the fees specified therein, shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW NO. IX.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Kyneton, made under section 215 of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered IX., for regulating the due management of the business of the Council of the Shire of Kyneton, and the conduct of their officers and servants.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton order as follows:—

That Bye-law No. IV., for providing for the due management of the affairs of the council, and regulating the conduct of their officers and servants, heretofore existing, be and the same is hereby repealed.

The president, councillors, and ratepayers of the said shire doth further order that Bye-law No. IX. shall be in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed as by the Local Government Act 1874 required.

3. After the signing of the minutes aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

1. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
2. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
3. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
4. Payments.
5. Receiving deputations.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Extraordinary business under new rules and regulations.
8. Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
9. Notices of motion.
10. Tenders.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

DIVISIONS.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result declared by the chairman; and, if requested by any councillor present at the meeting when such division takes place, the names of the councillors voting on the division shall be recorded on the minutes of the said meeting. And any councillor present not voting—not being disabled by law—shall be guilty of an offence.

ADDRESSES TO GOVERNOR.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and secretary of the shire, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

6. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day. And every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that its contents do not violate any bye-law or provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

7. No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

DEPUTATIONS.

8. Deputations from ratepayers wishing to be heard before the council in support of any petition, or otherwise, must acquaint some one of the councillors representing them, or the secretary, of their intended interview.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council; any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; and any matter arising out of the correspondence, reports, memorials read or presented during the same day, if by special motions ordered to be considered.

MOTIONS.

10. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given to the secretary, and by him read at the close of the meeting at which they are handed in.

11. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

12. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

13. The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

14. Unless in cases of emergency, no sum exceeding the amount of five pounds (£5) shall be expended by the council, unless by notice of motion duly given.

15. It shall be competent for any councillor, by notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of

any subject at the next meeting, or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post or otherwise, of the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

DEBATE.

16. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

17. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

18. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

19. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

20. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

21. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

22. A councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

23. The councillors, in meeting of council assembled, shall designate each other by the official titles, namely, that of president or councillor, as the case may require.

24. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

25. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

26. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

27. No councillor shall use offensive or disorderly language, and every councillor so doing shall, upon being called to order by the chairman, apologise for such conduct and withdraw such language, and on his refusal to do so, he shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any person not being a councillor, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may on his order be forthwith removed, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

29. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

30. The mover of every original proposition and amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

31. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

32. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on the motions moved and seconded, or on any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

COMMITTEES.

33. Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of committee, shall be presented to the council.

PROTESTS.

34. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given forthwith, on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful of the council.

APPOINTMENTS, ETC.

35. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

36. The salary or allowance attached to the offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before advertisement inviting application as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

37. The shire office shall be open every day (except Sundays and bank holidays) between the hours of Ten and Three, and Saturdays from Ten till Twelve noon; during which hours the secretary shall attend to transact the business of the council. The engineers and inspectors shall attend during the hours of every council meeting, and at such committee meetings as they may be required.

TENDERS, ETC.

38. The security in all cases of contracts shall be ten per cent. upon the amount of contract, except contracts under £20, on all of which a uniform deposit of £1 shall be required, and such deposit in all cases shall accompany each tender; said deposit to be actually forfeited in the event of the contractor not taking up the contract, and only repaid to the contractor when a final certificate is obtained that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

41. 42. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this Bye-law may be suspended *pro tem*, in cases of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the councillors present at any meeting.

PENALTY.

43. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misdemeanour, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this Bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS, ETC., ARRIVING FROM SUMATRA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Public Health Statute 1865* (28 Vict. No. 264) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place, and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria, and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid, shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of this Part of this Act, and of any order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of the departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively; and it is also enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid, and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid, or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid, shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine, no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such license as shall be directed or permitted by any such order as aforesaid). Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation notify that the Island of Sumatra is infected with Cholera, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and in the forty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.
