DISTRICTS WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exist, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts where publicans' licenses may be specially granted under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act, that is to say:—

1. An area of half a mile radius from the Water Tower at the Seymour Railway Station.
2. An area of half a mile radius from the Railway Station at Wychetella.
3. That part of the parish of Bundalong which is bounded on the north by the township of Bundalong; on the west by the Wangaratta road; on the south by the Peechelba Pre-emptive Section; and on the east by the Ovens River.
4. Eaglehawk, in the Shire of Rosedale.

MURDER NEAR DEEP LEAD, VICTORIA.

NOTICE.

ON the 17th January 1882 the headless body of a man was found near the Deep Lead Railway Station, Stawell, Victoria, and at an inquest held, subsequently, it was shown that the man had been wilfully murdered. The remains are believed to be those of one Charles Forbes, or Forbys, who worked on the Dimboola line of railway during the months of October, November, and December 1881, with a man named Robert Francis Burns. The said Robert Francis Burns has since been arrested, and committed for trial at the Central Criminal Court, to be held at Melbourne on the 15th day of August 1882, for the murder of Charles Forbes, or Forbys; but as the prisoner alleges that Forbes is still alive, it is requested that the said Charles Forbes, or Forbys, if living, or any person acquainted with him, or able to give information about him since the date of his disappearance, should at once communicate with the Chief Commissioner of Police, Melbourne. Description of the missing man Charles Forbes is as follows:— About 40 years of age, 5 feet 10½ or 11 inches high, 14 stone weight, full sandy beard, and hair a shade darker. Supposed to be a native of the north of Ireland.

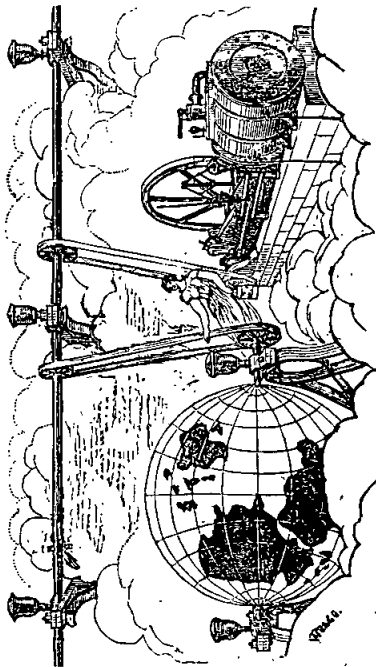
