The births of 739 children, viz., 399 boys and 340 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March, 834 births were registered, or 95 more than in the month under review. The births were 60 above the average of the previous seven years, and 3 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 526, viz., 291 of males and 235 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 213. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 66, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 77. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 19.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.59, and of deaths registered 1.85.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 85.1° on the 10th, and the lowest was 42.0° on the 8th. The mean temperature of the month (57.3°) was more than a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.0°) took place on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 83.0° to a minimum of 48.0°. The least range (6.5°) was on the 3rd, viz., from a maximum of 58.0° to a minimum of 51.5°. The mean daily range was 17.5°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.908 inches) was a tenth of a degree below the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths during the month were of males, and 45 per cent. were of females. Forty-one per cent. were of children under 5 years of age, as against 36 per cent. in April 1881; 40 per cent. in April 1880; 43 per cent. in April 1879; 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1877 and April 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; 42 per cent. in April 1873; and 50 per cent. in April 1872.

Twenty of the deaths recorded during the month were of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards, viz.:—Those of a female, aged 75, who died of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of rheumatism; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 76, of gastritis; a gentleman, aged 76, of intussusception; a clerk, aged 77, of dysentery; a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of the thigh; a female aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 88, of diarrhoea; a brassmoulder, aged 75, a widow, aged 76, a female, aged 76, a baker and a plasterer, each aged 77, a captain in the Royal Artillery, aged 82, three females, each aged 85, and a shepherd, aged 91, of old age.

Seventeen deaths, during the month, were set down to accidental causes. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 6, was killed through coming into collision with a revolving spindle; an upholsterer, aged 26, died of fracture of the thigh and other injuries caused by the bursting of a shell at Queenscliffe; a fireman, aged 23, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from an engine; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of the thigh, occasioned by falling down; a carrier, aged 47, and a carter, aged 52, of injuries resulting from being passed over by the wheels of their vehicles; a slater, aged 60, of tetanus and compound fracture of the leg, sustained whilst working; a female, aged 41, of burns received whilst drunk; a letter-sorter, aged 23, and a laborer, aged 27, were drowned in the Yarra; a railway-guard, aged 25, and a clogmaker, aged 45, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 55, was found drowned in the Yarra; a female infant, aged 3 weeks, was suffocated in bed; a female child, aged 2, died of the effects of falling into a cesspit; a stonemason, aged 18, was suffocated in a drain whilst intoxicated; a male infant, aged 2 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage.

Ninety-five deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 218, of which 120, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 98, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 164 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 308. Of these, 171, or 56 per cent., were males, and 137, or 44 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 16 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month a decrease occurred in all the classes of diseases, except developmental. The chief decreases were, however, in deaths from zymotic diseases, which fell from 164 to 119, and in those from local diseases, which fell from 231 to 197. Under the zymotic head, deaths from whooping-cough fell from 9 to 6; those from typhoid fever from 37 to 27; those from erysipelas from 5 to nil; those from metria from 4 to nil; and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 71 to 50. Under the local head deaths from cephalitis fell from 20 to 10; those from apoplexy from 23 to 14; those from liver disease from 21 to 12; and those from kidney disease from 5 to nil. On the other hand, deaths from affections of the heart rose from 25 to 33. Under the head of developmental diseases, the deaths rose from 84 to 106. Deaths from old age were mainly instrumental in causing the increase, no less than 25 deaths having been set down to that circumstance in April as against 7 in March.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might add to the names of the species of Fish mentioned in the Second Schedule to *The Fisheries Act 1873* the names of any other species of Fish, and set opposite thereto any weight which might be deemed expedient: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Second Schedule of *The Fisheries Act 1873* the name of the fish mentioned below, with the weight set opposite thereto, under which it shall be unlawful for any person to take, sell, expose for sale, or have in possession any such fish, namely,

#### BOROUGH OF WALHALLA.

Bye-Laws of the Borough of Walhalla, made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 18 and 19 respectively.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the 218th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," the Council of the Borough of Walhalla ordain as follows, that is to say—  
BYE-LAW No. 18.—For the better management and control of creeks, watercourses, drains, channels, and other things.

1. If any person shall, without the authority of the council, alter, obstruct, or in any manner interfere with any creek, aqueduct, watercourse, culvert, sewer, drain, ditch, channel, grating, tree, shrub, or any bank, breasting, revetment, or retaining-wall of any creek under the control of the council, or do, cause, or procure any damage thereto, shall, on conviction, be liable to pay for each and every such offence a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and shall pay to the council, by way of compensation for such damage, such further sum as the convicting justices shall order.

2. If any person do, cause, or procure any damage to be done to any track, footway, street, road, thoroughfare, viaduct, bridge, parapet-wall, railing, fence, or any other thing whatsoever; or if any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land under the control of the said council, shall, on conviction, for each and every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and shall pay to the council aforesaid, by way of compensation for such damage, such further sum as the convicting justices shall order.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—For the better regulating the keeping of goats within the borough.

1. Interpretation clause.—The words "owner and keeper" of goats within the borough shall mean and include any person who shall at any time keep and have in his or her possession any goat over the age of three months; and any such goat found, kept, harbored, or allowed to live or remain on any land or premises whatsoever within the borough, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the owner or occupier of such land or premises (as the case may be) is the owner and keeper of such goat, and shall be deemed to be the owner and keeper of such goat accordingly, unless the contrary be proven to the satisfaction of the justices.

2. Every person within the borough who shall keep any goat over the age of three months, or own any such goat usually kept therein, shall, within fourteen days after this bye-law shall come into force, register with the town clerk thereof the name of such person as the keeper of goat within the borough; and shall, at the time of such registration, pay to the town clerk the sum of One shilling as the registration fee for each and every goat owned and kept by him; and thereafter, between the first and fourteenth days of January in each and every subsequent year, shall likewise pay to the town clerk the sum of Two shillings as the annual registration fee for each and every goat so kept by him within the borough; and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so registered a triangle, made with bars not less than one foot six inches in length, having attached thereto a metal plate bearing a legible number corresponding with the number entered in the register opposite the name of the person so registered as the owner and keeper of such goat. And on and after the first day of July in each year the registration fee for each and every goat shall be One shilling for the unexpired portion of the year ending on the thirty-first day of December then next ensuing, when all registrations shall expire. And the onus of proof of the age of any goat shall rest on the owner. If any person offend in any respect against this section, he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each and every such offence a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

3. If any goat shall be found within the borough having on its neck a triangle and plate, purporting to bear a number as of a person registered as the owner and keeper of goat within the borough, such goat shall (*prima facie*) be presumed to be owned and kept by the person whose name is registered with the town clerk, and opposite whose name the said number shall appear in the registration book aforesaid.

4. Any person putting on, or allowing to be put on, or keeping on the neck of any goat owned or kept by him, a triangle and plate as aforesaid, without such goat having been registered, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each and every such offence a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

5. The Council of the Borough of Walhalla may from time to time provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided, shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the borough.

6. Every goat found at large in any road, street, thoroughfare, or public place within the borough, not having on its neck a triangle and plate as hereinbefore required, shall be deemed to be an unregistered goat, and may, by the proper officer of the council, or any person on whom he may call to

his assistance, or any constable or peace officer, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid, until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

7. Every goat so seized and confined aforesaid, may be destroyed at or after noon of the day following such seizure. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in this and the last preceding section, the council may from time to time, as they may deem fit, appoint any person or persons to summarily destroy any unregistered goat in any road, street, thoroughfare, or public place, which may be found wandering at large therein.

8. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid, may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if such justice shall so order, and on payment to the town clerk of the borough the sum of Five shillings, "and not otherwise," be restored to such owner accordingly (unless the goat shall have been destroyed). And such order of a justice, or any minute thereof under his hand, shall, for all purposes of this bye-law, be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

9. The council may from time to time fix the amount of the fees to be paid for the seizure destruction of each and every goat, which fee shall include the removal and disposal of the carcass of any such goat, in such manner as shall not be or become a nuisance and injurious to the public health.

10. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any road, street, thoroughfare, or public place within the borough, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings for each and every such offence.

11. The first, second, and third sections of bye-law numbered fifteen of the borough of Walhalla shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

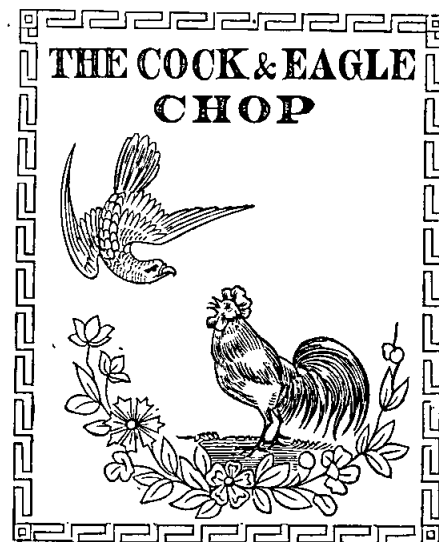
