## “LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT 1881.”—ISSUE OF ELECTORS’ RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that persons desiring to have their names enrolled on the first General Lists for the Divisions of the new Electoral Provinces, which must be prepared during the week ending the 1st July next, must obtain from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, original Electors’ Rights, without regard to the Rights at present held by them for the old Provinces under the Act No. 334, which latter Rights, under the provisions of the Act No. 702, § 43, continue in force till 7th August next.

## NOTICE TO DEALERS IN TOBACCO, CIGARS, AND SNUFF.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.  
PORT PHILLIP ENTRANCE.

(1) *Shortland Bluff Low Lighthouse—Additional Sector.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 235 (2), of 26th November 1881, on the destruction by collision of Swan Spit Lighthouse, Port Phillip Entrance:—

The Government of Victoria has given further notice that, on 16th December 1881, in addition to the present sectors, a sector of red light would be exhibited from Shortland Bluff Low Lighthouse, Queenscliffe, visible between the bearings of about S. W. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S. W. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W., or from Black Buoy No. 1, to French Buoy No. 2, at the entrance to the West Channel.

This sector of light is intended as a guide in the fairway from Swan Spit to between Buoys Nos. 1 and 2; thus, so far, will meet the requirements previously fulfilled by Swan Spit Lighthouse (recently destroyed), but will not be of service in judging the distance from Shortland Bluff Reef.

Vessels leaving should haul to the eastward when Queenscliffe jetty light bears about W. by N., sufficiently to clear Shortland Bluff Reef.

PORT WESTERN.

(2) *Hastings Jetty Light—Partial alteration in color.*

Also, has given notice, dated 2nd December 1881, that the portion of the light on Hastings jetty showing towards the channel, has been altered in color from white to red, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 3 to 4 miles.

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

(3) *Discontinuance of Suwarrow Island Light.*

The French Government has given notice, on the authority of the commander of the French vessel of war *Hussard*, that the light on Suwarrow (Souwaroff) Island is discontinued.

The wooden pyramid with base of masonry, from which the light was exhibited, remains standing.

The position of this pyramid is stated to be lat. 13° 13' S., long. 163° 10' W.

(The bearings are magnetic. Variation  $8\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  easterly in 1882.)

AUSTRALIA—NORTH-WEST COAST  
CLARENCE STRAIT—PORT DARWIN.

(1) *Beacon on Charles Point.*

THE Government of South Australia has given notice, dated 16th January 1882, that a beacon has been erected on Charles Point, western side of entrance to Port Darwin:—

The beacon, 41 feet high, constructed of wood and pyramidal in shape, is 20 feet at the base and  $8\frac{1}{2}$  feet at the apex; with 20 feet from the apex downwards covered with galvanized iron, and painted white.

SOUTH COAST—SPENCER GULF.

(2) *Eastern Shoal Light-vessel—Intended Withdrawal.*

Also, that on or about 1st December 1882, it is intended to withdraw the light-vessel at present stationed north-westward of Eastern Shoal, approach to Port Augusta.

WHEREAS by The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1861 it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application, or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that, if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: and every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a.) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least One-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted:

(b.) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks within which such trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District:

(c.) Should state what are the principal works proposed to be constructed: and

(d.) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by the said Act that whenever any Waterworks District was comprised wholly within one municipal district, although portion of the works might be outside same, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council thereof for the time being, together with one other commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Mayor and Councillors of the Borough of Maryborough for a Loan of Forty-three thousand pounds sterling, to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Water Supply District under the said Act, embracing the Borough of Maryborough, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks:

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Borough of Maryborough for the time being and William Ross Anderson to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District:

(3.) That the amount of the loan hereby granted shall be Forty-three thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out the proposed works and paying the costs and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the rate of interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum:

(4.) That the limits of the land to be proclaimed within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the Borough of Maryborough:

(5.) That the principal works proposed to be constructed shall consist of a storage reservoir at McCallum's Creek, in the shire of Talbot; a service reservoir outside and near the Maryborough borough boundary, a pipe main from the storage reservoir through portions of the Shire of Talbot to the service reservoir, a pipe main from the service reservoir into Maryborough, as shown on the approved plans deposited in the Water Supply Department, Melbourne, with the application for a loan, and sub-pipe mains for the reticulation of the township of Maryborough:

(6.) That the Waterworks Trust aforesaid, from November to April of each year (and continuously if required by the Shire Council of Talbot to do so), shall allow a sluice-head of water to flow from the head reservoir down McCallum's Creek for the use of the ratepayers, and shall furthermore, at all times, give a special supply of water down McCallum's Creek to Messrs. PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE BOROUGH OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Hawthorn has requested that certain streets and roads in the Borough of Hawthorn be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets and roads hereinafter named and described, and situate in the Borough of Hawthorn aforesaid, to be respectively public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WALHALLA PUBLIC CEMETERY, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE CEMETERY STATUTES NOS. 201 AND 677.

- Applications for graves must be made at the office of the trustees at least eight hours previous to interment (except under urgent circumstances), and all fees must be then paid, when an order for interment will be given by the trustees to the sexton before the ground is broken.
- The sexton shall dig all graves.
- All interments shall be made between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Six o'clock in the afternoon, "except by special order of the trustees."

4. The time fixed for any funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

5. A plan of every vault, monument, cenotaph, headstone, railing, or fence must be submitted to the trustees for approval, and the proper fees paid before the same is erected.

6. On the application of the owner of any purchased grave allotment for permission to make a brick grave or vault, or to erect a monument, headstone, railing, or fence thereon, being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be given (if approved) for the erection of the same, which shall be made and kept in repair and proper condition by the owners, and to the satisfaction of the trustees.

7. A plan of the cemetery, and a register, which may be inspected, will be kept at the office of the trustees.

8. If any person do, or cause to be done, any injury to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, whether the same be done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, he shall be liable to pay a reasonable sum of money, by way of damages and compensation therefor, which said sum of money shall be recoverable in any

court of competent jurisdiction by the trustees of the said cemetery, or any person injured by such damage.

9. The interment fees will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

10. No interment shall be less than six feet in depth for adults and children over seven years of age, nor less than four feet in depth for children under seven years of age. Said depths to be measured at the shallowest portion of the grave.

11. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations and scale of fees attached hereto, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

12. All the rules and regulations and scale of fees of the Walthalla Public Cemetery heretofore existing shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
