## EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES.—REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of July 1882.*

**W**HEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute* 1864 and the Act No. 440, and "*The Explosives Act* 1877," power is given to the Governor in Council to make and to rescind regulations providing for the storage of gunpowder, guncotton, and any substance used for blasting or exploding mines, and to license on such conditions as he may deem fit any private magazine for the storage of any such substance as aforesaid, and by order to prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the manufacture, keeping, or importation from any place out of Victoria, or the conveyance or sale or any of them, of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of the Governor in Council it is expedient for the public safety to make such order : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, having regard to the dangerous character of certain explosives, and it being in his judgment expedient for the public safety that the importation from places out of Victoria should with respect to some of such explosives be prohibited absolutely, and with respect to others that the keeping or importation should be subject to certain conditions and restrictions, doth in pursuance of such powers hereby make the following regulations (that is to say) :—

Interpretation.

1. The words "Explosive," and "Ship," in these regulations, shall have the same respective meanings as are assigned to them in the first section of *The Explosives Act* 1877, and the word "Gunpowder" wherever the same occurs in these regulations shall mean any powder composed only of a mixture of nitre, sulphur, and charcoal, and the word "Premises" shall mean any house, storehouse, warehouse, shop, cellar, yard, building, or enclosed space occupied by the same person or persons.

Importation of all explosives except gunpowder forbidden after 31st October 1882.

2. No person shall, under any circumstances, after the 31st October 1882, import into Victoria any explosive other than gunpowder.

Regs. 4 to 9 to cease to be of force after 1st November 1882.

3. The regulations following, numbered four to nine, both inclusive, shall cease to be of any force or effect after the 1st November 1882.

Importation of Nobel's blasting gelatine forbidden.

4. No person shall under any circumstances import into Victoria either by land or sea the explosives known as Nobel's blasting gelatine, and Nobel's Hamburg Dynamite, except where such explosive has been shipped for any Victorian port before the making of these rules.

Importation of explosives from Australasian colonies.

5. No person shall under any circumstances import any explosive other than gunpowder into Victoria, either by land or by sea, from any of the Australian colonies, Tasmania, or New Zealand : Provided that the importation of explosives shipped for any Victorian port before the making of these rules shall not be deemed to be hereby prohibited.

Explosives (except gunpowder) not to be landed without permission and inspection.

6. No ship having on board any explosive other than gunpowder shall land such explosive in any port in Victoria, unless previous application in writing has been made to and permission in writing obtained from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and unless such explosive has been previously inspected by a Government inspector ; and such permission shall be shown to any pilot or any officer of the Customs Department who may demand to see the same.

Application to be accompanied by report of two competent experts.

7. Such application shall in the case of any explosive other than gunpowder, nitro-glycerine, dynamite, lithofractor, blasting gelatine, insoluble dynamite, or guncotton, state the name or names by which such explosive is usually known, and shall be accompanied by a report of the components and properties of such explosive ; such report shall state the date of their examination, and shall have attached thereto the duly attested signatures of at least two competent experts who have examined the explosive previous to shipment.

Ships with more than 20 lbs. may be ordered to any specified part of Port Phillip.

8. Any ship arriving in Port Phillip and having on board more than twenty pounds of any explosive other than gunpowder may be ordered by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs to lie in any part of Port Phillip which the Commissioner may specify until such explosive be duly discharged, destroyed, or otherwise dealt with.

Explosives may be temporarily stored on powder hulks.

9. Explosives other than gunpowder in course of transit may be stored upon an explosives hulk temporarily only, and all such explosives shall be removed from any explosives hulk where the same have been temporarily stored as soon as conveniently may be to some duly licensed magazine or other place where the same may legally be kept, and no such explosives shall be permitted to remain on board an explosives hulk more than two months.

#### LICENSES FOR MAGAZINES FOR THE STORAGE OR KEEPING OF EXPLOSIVES.

Explosives not to be kept on unlicensed premises.

10. No person (except a "dealer" within the meaning of Act No. 196) shall keep more than twenty-five pounds of gunpowder nor more than five pounds of any other explosive on any premises not duly licensed, and no person shall keep gunpowder on any such premises so long as there is any other explosive thereon.

Ammunition for sporting purposes excepted.

11. The preceding regulation shall not be deemed to extend or to apply to the making, keeping, or selling of cartridges and other ammunition used only for sporting purposes.

Licenses for private magazines may be granted subject to certain conditions.

12. The Minister of Mines may, from time to time, grant licenses to persons for private magazines at such places as he thinks fit, subject to the conditions hereinafter-specified.

Applications for licenses.

13. Every application for a license for a private magazine must be in writing, addressed to the Minister of Mines, and before the Minister grants a license to the person making such application, he shall cause such inquiry and report to be made in respect to such application as the circumstances of the case may seem to him to require.

14. The maximum quantity of explosives to be stored in each private magazine shall be stated in the license; but in no instance shall such maximum exceed one ton. Maximum quantity to be stored to be named in license.
15. The licensees of magazines shall comply with the following regulations:—  
 (1.) Every package, except packages containing gunpowder, received therein shall be marked, in legible and indelible characters, with the date of the receipt of such package into the magazine, and no package shall be allowed to remain for more than three months in any magazine. Licensees to comply with certain rules.  
 (2.) Any Government inspector may enter all magazines at any hour at which it may seem to such inspector reasonable or necessary that he should enter for the purposes of inspecting such magazine or the explosives therein.
16. If a holder of any license under these regulations be proved, to the satisfaction of the Minister of Mines, to have committed any breach of these regulations or conditions, or if it be shown, to the satisfaction of the Minister, that the continuance of such license is dangerous to the public, the Minister may thereupon revoke such license wholly or for such time as he thinks fit. Revocation of license.

#### FACTORIES.

17. Every occupier of any factory licensed for the manufacture of explosives, and every dealer selling any explosive except gunpowder, shall keep a record of the name and address of each person to whom and the date on which he sells such explosive, together with the description of such explosive, and the quantity thereof sold. Manufacturers and dealers to keep a record of sales.

#### PENALTIES.

18. If any explosive is imported or conveyed in contravention of any of the preceding regulations, such explosive may be forfeited, and the owner or master of the ship in which the same is so imported or conveyed shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings for every pound of such explosive brought in such ship; and the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, the Collectors, and all Officers of Customs shall have the same power with regard to any such explosive, and the ship conveying the same, as they have for the time being with respect to any article prohibited to be imported by the laws relating to the Customs and the ship containing the same. Penalty for contravention of regulations with regard to importation. Sec. 8 No. 592.
19. If any explosive be delivered to any person, or if any person sell or keep any explosive in contravention of any of the preceding regulations, such explosive may be forfeited, and the person to whom such explosive is so delivered, and the person so selling or keeping the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten shillings for every pound of such explosive delivered or sold, kept or found in his possession. Penalty for contravention of regulations with regard to keeping and selling. Sec. 8 No. 592.
20. If any person offend against any of the preceding regulations relating to the storage of explosives, he shall be liable to forfeit such explosive in respect of which he so offends, and he shall in addition be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds. Penalty for contravention of regulations relating to storage. Sec. 1 No. 440.
- And the Honorable James Howlin Graves, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### NOTICE.

With reference to the above Order, the attention of masters of vessels and importers of Gunpowder is directed to the following sections of "The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864":—

"Section 6.—The master of every ship arriving in any port of Victoria with Gunpowder on board, whether as stores or cargo, shall at the time of making entry at the Custom House specially report the same, and if any Gunpowder be not so reported it shall be forfeited, and the master neglecting to make such report shall forfeit and pay a penalty for such omission or neglect any sum not exceeding One hundred pounds."

"Section 7.—No Gunpowder shall be landed from any ship except between the hours of seven in the morning and five in the afternoon, and any person who shall land or be concerned in landing any Gunpowder contrary hereto shall forfeit and pay the sum of Five pounds for every barrel or package of such Gunpowder so landed contrary to this provision."

"Section 8.—Every ship or vessel having Gunpowder on board exceeding twenty pounds in all shall immediately on entering any port in Victoria hoist a union jack at the mainmast head, which union jack shall not be hauled down until the Gunpowder on board is landed according to law."

"Section 9.—The importer of Gunpowder at any port where a public magazine shall have been appointed, or a private magazine shall have been licensed, shall within twenty-four hours after the arrival of the importing ship enter such gunpowder at the Custom House, and shall obtain from the collector, or other principal officer, a permit for the same to be landed and deposited in one of such magazines, which permit shall describe the said Gunpowder and name the magazine in which it is to be deposited."

"Section 10.—No boat shall be used for the conveyance of Gunpowder, either to or from any ship or wharf or other place, unless duly licensed for that purpose in accordance with the provisions of the Act now in force, or some Act hereafter to be in force relating to the customs, and no Gunpowder shall be landed or conveyed from any ship until notice shall have been given to the water police, if any there be at the port or place where such ship shall lie, in sufficient time to enable the police to give such directions as may be necessary to prevent danger, which directions the officer or person in charge of such Gunpowder shall in all things obey."

"Section 11.—No Gunpowder shall be removed from any ship for conveyance to the magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon, or shall be permitted to be deposited in the magazine except between the hours of seven in the morning and four in the afternoon."

The births of 856 children, viz., 468 boys and 388 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May, 860 births were registered, or 4 more than in the month under review. The births were 109 above the average of the previous eight years, but only 32 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 469, viz., 266 of males and 203 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 387. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 41, but above the average of June during the previous ten years by 97. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average during those ten years by 49 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.01, and of deaths registered 1.65.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.0° on the 10th, and the lowest was 31.5° on the 9th. The mean temperature of the month (48.0°) was more than a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.8°) took place both on the 5th and 10th, viz., in the first-named date from a maximum of 61.9° to a minimum of 36.1°, and in the second from a maximum of 62.0° to a minimum of 36.2°. The least range (6.1°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 54.0° to a minimum of 47.9°. The mean daily range was 13.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.968 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 35 per cent. to that mortality, as against 32 per cent. in June 1881; 36 per cent. in June 1880; 27 per cent. in June 1879; 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; 33 per cent. in June 1873; and 42 per cent. in June 1872.



Seventeen deaths of persons who had arrived at the age of 75 or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—A bricklayer, aged 75, who died of rheumatism; a miller, aged 76, of bronchitis; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum, and a carpenter, each aged 79, of brain disease; a butcher, aged 81, of injury to the hip; a laborer, aged 82, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 82, and a widow, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, and a gentleman, aged 84, of cystitis; a female, aged 83, of liver disease; a female, aged 86, of cancer; a laborer, aged 75, a female, aged 81, a female, aged 83, a gentleman, aged 83, and a female, aged 84, of old age.

Twenty-three deaths from external causes were registered during the month, of which 20 were ascribed to accident, 2 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 1, was killed by being run over by a cart; a boy, aged 5, died of injury to the foot, sustained whilst swinging on a lorry, his leg catching between the spokes of the wheel; a police constable, aged 34, was killed by a train whilst crossing a line of railway; a laborer, aged 39, by the bursting of a copper digester in a candle manufactory; a plasterer, aged 53, died of injuries resulting from a scaffold falling; a laborer, aged 55, was crushed to death by an embankment falling on him; a bricklayer aged 27, and a draper, aged 46, died of fracture of the skull, and a quarryman, aged 31, of fracture of the spine, caused by falls; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 71, died from injuries to the head, caused by falling in the street; a butcher, aged 81, of injury to the hip; a boy, aged 5, of burns about the legs and arms, his night-shirt having caught fire; an engaged driver, aged 20, was suffocated in a house which took fire whilst he was asleep; a laborer, aged 19, was poisoned with strychnine; a female infant was suffocated at birth; and 2 youths, aged 13 and 14, were suffocated in a cave which fell in on them; a publican, aged 58, was found drowned; and a male infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, who was suffocated at birth, and of a modeller, aged 30, who died of fracture of the skull, received in a quarrel with his brothers, (verdict manslaughter). The suicidal death was that of a pattern-maker, aged 30, who poisoned himself with strychnine.

One hundred and six deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—52 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 2 in the Children's Hospital, 16 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 1 in the Infants' Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 164, of which 96, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 68, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 116 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 305. Of these 170, or 56 per cent., were males, and 135, or 44 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 24 between fifteen and twenty, 30 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 28 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 17 between sixty and sixty-five, 13 were between 65 and 70, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 11 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases, which numbered 90 in May, fell to 64 in June. Under this head, deaths from scarlatina fell from 5 to 3, those from diphtheria from 4 to 1, those from croup from 8 to 4, those from typhoid fever from 27 to 17, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 14 to 7. Under the constitutional head, the deaths fell from 104 to 83, the decrease being almost entirely in deaths from cancer, which fell from 24 to 8. On the other hand, deaths under the local head rose from 220 to 241, the increase being in deaths from nervous affections, which rose from 53 to 62, and in those from heart affections, which rose from 25 to 35. Childbirth caused 7 deaths in the month, or 1 death of a mother to every 122 infants registered as born alive.

## "THE FISHERIES ACT 1873."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act 1873* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, might define the limits of and what waters should be deemed to be and what should be deemed to be the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and might fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines were not to be used: And whereas it is expedient to repeal a Proclamation dated 11th October 1880 relating to Yarram Creek: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby repeal the proclamation mentioned, and do, with the advice aforesaid, define the mouth of Yarram Creek within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used as follows, viz.:—

A line running north and by east from the point known as the Spit forming the southern entrance to Swan Bay or Ponds to a point on Swan Island known as Look's Point; and by a line running north and by east half-east from a point on the northern point on Swan Island known as Pigdon's Point to a point on the opposite shore or mainland known as Sheoak Point or Point Edward, forming the northern entrance to Swan Bay or Ponds, and within a radius of a quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the line defining the mouth of the afore-mentioned creek.

WHEREAS by *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make proclamations, which should be published in the *Government Gazette*, for the imposing and prescribing of conditions and restrictions for the regulation of fishing: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the use of any trammel, trawl, or other net or engine, whether fixed or unfixed, for the purpose of taking fish in the vicinity of the piers in Corio Bay, namely:—

Within a line drawn from the approach of the Railway pier to a buoy about 122 yards off and abreast of the west side of that pier; thence to a buoy about 194 yards off the north-west end of the same pier; thence to a buoy about 418 yards off the end of the Moorabool street pier in a northerly direction; thence to the easternmost buoy about 222 yards off end of Yarra street pier; thence to a buoy about 126 yards off and abreast of same pier; and thence to east side of approach to Yarra street pier.

## DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

The authorized representative for the time being of the said church shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of the *Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said Annual Conference shall, for the purposes hereof, be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings. Subject to such power as aforesaid, the land, or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan model deed enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales, under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsistent herewith.

Purposes to which Proceeds of Disposition are to be applied.—To such Wesleyan Methodist building purposes in the town of Ballarat East as shall be approved by a majority of trustees.

*Regulations for care, protection, and management of a Reserve for purposes of Public Recreation at Baringhup.*

WE, John Powell, Frederick Blenheim, David Marshall, Thomas Lillie, Phillip Morris, Edward Edwards, and Daniel Thomas, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Baringhup, temporarily reserved, by Order of 11th January 1869, for purposes of Public Recreation, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
