The following information relative to the existence of some dangers in Carimata Strait, has been received from the commanding officer of H.N.M. surveying vessel, *Hydrograaf*.

*Florence Adelaide Reef*.—A dangerous coral reef, extending N.E. and S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile, E. and W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile, with some stones carrying at low-water only  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 fathoms.

To the N.W. and N. sides it is steep-to, and at a distance of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile soundings of 17 fathoms, and more to N. of 20 fathoms, mud, were obtained.

A small sandpatch, carrying 6 fathoms, was found eastward of the reef, and steep sand ridges, carrying 13 to 16 fathoms, with 20 fathoms water over a muddy bottom between, were found more to E. till at a distance of 1 mile.

To the S. side it is steep-to, at the distance of 1 mile depths of 20 fathoms were found, and between these soundings and the reef, 17 to 19 fathoms.

When at anchor on  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables' length from this reef neither breakers nor discolored water, not even the slightest indication of this danger was to be seen.

Adopting as the longitude of the time-ball at Batavia,  $106^{\circ} 48' 25''$ , 5 E., its position was determined in:

lat.  $2^{\circ} 4' S$ .long.  $108^{\circ} 4' 6'' E$ .

A fruitless search was made for the danger (marked?) laid down on the chart at 4 miles W. of Leman Islands. It has consequently been removed from the chart.

Another fruitless search was made again, during 3 days, for the Rival Reef, which was removed from the charts in 1881, in consequence of an unsuccessful search of H.B.M.S. *Flying Fish*.

## TOWN PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave, of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and might also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and might divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such counties, parishes or towns, and might distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish or town, by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the town hereinafter described and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall dig, or remove earth or loam from the Crown lands situate within the boundaries of the Town of Hamilton.

## BERRINGA COMMON.

*Regulations for Management of the Berringa Common within the Shire of Towong.*

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the Council of the Shire of Towong, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Berringa Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## Regulations.

1. In the construction, and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' licensees, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of "large cattle," or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in "small cattle," on the basis that one head of "large cattle" shall be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of "small cattle."

A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow:—

For every horse	...	Six shillings per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	...	Four shillings "
For every head of small cattle	...	One shilling "
Progeny under nine (9) months old of stock legally depasturing on the common	...	Free.

4. The fees for depasturing large cattle on the common shall be payable half yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year; and the fees for depasturing small cattle on the common shall be payable yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January in each year.

5. Stock placed on the common at any intermediate date shall be paid for as if depasturing thereon at the commencement of the period.

6. The managers may grant to butchers or to slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed on, cattle intended for slaughter, subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than Two shillings (2s.) per head per annum for large cattle, and One shilling (1s.) per head per annum for small cattle.

7. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

8. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

9. No entire horse, bull, or he goat shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the consent, in writing, of the managers first obtained.

10. The herdsman shall register the permanent brands of, or brand with the "common" brand, all stock depasturing on the common on payment of the prescribed fees. All stock not registered or branded with the "common" brand shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common.

11. When the owners of stock depasturing on the common refuse or neglect to pay the prescribed fees within twenty-one days from the date on which they may be due, and payment of which shall have been demanded from the owners by the managers or herdsman, such stock shall be liable to be impounded.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

## HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.

*Regulations for the Management of the Horsham Town Common.*

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on 1st April 1879, the Council of the Borough of Horsham, having drafted the following Regulations for the management of the Horsham Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

## Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' license, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—

For every horse	...	12s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle	...	8s. "
For every sheep	...	2s. "
For every goat	...	6s. "

Progeny (under six months' old) of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. All milch cows shall be under the immediate charge of the herdsman, whose duty it will be to take them to and from the common at stated hours, and for which an additional fee of One shilling per head per week shall be paid to the herdsman weekly in advance.

4. The managers may grant to butchers or to slaughtermen special licenses to depasture, for such periods of time as may be agreed on, cattle intended for slaughter, subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than Two shillings per head per annum for large cattle and One shilling per head per annum for small cattle.

5. Bulls and entire horses over nine (9) months' old shall not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the managers first obtained.

6. The herdsman shall muster, in some convenient place appointed by the managers, all stock on the common for the purpose of branding them with the common brand, due notice of which shall be given by the managers not less than three (3) days previously. Horses to be exempt from branding.

7. All stock shall be branded before being registered; and all goats over the age of six (6) months shall wear round their necks a wooden collar in the form of a triangle, each arm of which collar shall be 18 inches in length. Goats found depasturing on the common without such collar shall be deemed to be trespassing, and may be dealt with accordingly.

8. Any stock removed from the common, and afterwards returned thereto without due notice having been given to the herdsman, with description of brands, shall be liable to be impounded.

9. The fees payable on travelling stock remaining on the common over 24 hours shall be as follow:—For every head of large cattle, Threepence (3d.) per night; for every head of small cattle, One halfpenny (½d.) per night.

10. All stock upon which the prescribed fees have not been paid shall be liable to be impounded.

11. Any stock diseased, or supposed to be diseased, shall be removed by the owner thereof from the common within 24 hours after notice in writing requiring such removal has been given by the managers or herdsman, and in the event of refusal, or neglect to comply therewith, such stock shall be liable to be destroyed or removed at the owner's expense.

12. No person shall depasture stock on the common who is not the *bond fide* owner of such stock.

13. The managers shall not be responsible for any neglect or irregularity on the part of the herdsman.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

#### KERANG TOWN COMMON.

*Regulations for Management of the Kerang Town Common.*  
In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the first day of April 1879, the Managers of the Kerang Town Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

#### Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean oxen, cows, heifers, steers, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licensees, or carriers' licensees, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer, having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the first day of October, the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, in every year:—For every mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Ten shillings (10s.) per annum; for every ox, cow, heifer, or steer, Six shillings (6s.) per annum; for every head of small cattle, Two shillings (2s.) per annum; progeny under six months' old of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. The managers shall appoint certain times and places for the registering and branding stock, and shall give notice thereof; and the herdsman shall attend at such times and places for the purposes aforesaid, and all persons desirous of depasturing stock shall be in attendance therewith at the time and place appointed for the purpose of assisting in branding the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such stock before the branding thereof.

5. No person shall depasture stock on the common who is not the *bona fide* owner of the same.

6. No bulls or entire horses shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the written permission of the managers first obtained.

7. All large horned cattle shall be marked with the common brand, and all other large cattle shall bear a distinguishing brand.

8. The managers shall not be responsible for loss or injury to any stock legally depasturing on the common.

9. Persons removing stock from the common shall be allowed to substitute others upon payment of a registration fee of One shilling per head.

All carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT WABBA.

1st. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.

2nd. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m. the previous day.

3rd. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4th. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

5th. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months of the year.

6th. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7th. By the 7th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or near relations for ever."

8th. Application for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the schedule.

9th. As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has not been purchased: the trustees will cause the grave for the burial of the body of a person of the age of twelve years or upwards to be dug to the depth of 5 feet 6 inches, and the grave for the burial of the body of a child under the age of twelve years to be dug to the depth of 4 feet 6 inches; for any additional depth the trustees will require the payment of Three-pence for every cubic foot.

10th. As to ground in which the right of constructing any vault or place of burial has been purchased: the trustees will require the vault or place of burial to be dug to the depth of not less than 6 feet, and such digging is to be done, and all mason's or bricklayer's work is to be performed, under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them, by and at the cost of the person possessing the right of constructing such vault or place of burial.

11th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

12th. The right to erect monuments, tombstones, gravestones, or tablets on purchased land to be left to the discretion of the trustees, and every monument, tombstone, gravestone, or tablet, as to its design, and every inscription must first be approved of by the trustees.

13th. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

14th. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

15th. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule.

16th. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

17th. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to be punished, as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria, No. 12.

18th. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

19th. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and regulations.

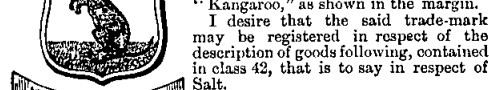

## **BYE-LAWS OF THE RICHMOND DISPENSARY.**

1. All bye-laws or rules made previously to this date, and in force at the time of the coming into operation of these bye-laws, are hereby repealed.

2. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical relief to destitute or necessitous persons in the city of Richmond, at the Dispensary, or, in special cases, at the homes of the patients.

3. Every contributor of Ten guineas or more in one sum shall be a "life governor," and every person (except a paid collector) who shall collect or raise for the institution Twenty pounds or more in one year shall be a "life governor." Any annual meeting of contributors may, on the recommendation of the committee, elect any person who shall have rendered any special benefit or service to the institution a "life governor," but no such recommendation shall be made by the committee unless agreed to by at least three-fourths of the members present at the meeting at which the same is proposed.

4. Every "life governor" shall be deemed a contributor within the provisions of the Act of Parliament of Victoria No. 220, and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors.

5. Every person who has heretofore been elected or enrolled a "life governor" or "honorary life governor" of the institution shall be deemed to be a "life governor" under or within the meaning of the bye-laws.

6. Every contributor of Five pounds or more in one sum shall be entitled to recommend two patients annually for each Five pounds so contributed, and shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors.

7. Every contributor of Five shillings or more annually shall be entitled to recommend one patient annually for each Five shillings so contributed, and every such contributor shall be entitled to vote at all meetings of contributors.

8. The councillors of the city of Richmond shall be entitled to recommend ninety patients for every Fifty pounds contributed by the Council to the institution in one year, and every life governor qualified by a donation of Ten guineas or upwards in one sum, or by having collected Twenty pounds or upwards in one year, or elected because of special benefit or service, shall be entitled to recommend four patients in each year.

9. Every annual contribution shall be payable in advance, and shall date as from the first day of January of the year in which it shall be paid.

10. A meeting of the contributors shall be held on the second Friday in the month of January in each year, at such place, in
