PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the county of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506), it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land should thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Fitzroy has requested that the street hereinafter mentioned within the said city be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the land reserved acquired or used for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Fitzroy, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :-

SHIRES OF SEYMOUR AND YEA.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, § 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 14th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :-

The Petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of Seymour Shire which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from that shire and annexed to the Shire of Yea.

Area described in the petition :-

Part of the parish of Ghin Ghin: Commencing at the Goulburn River, due south of the south-west angle of the Switzerland pre-emptive right (Grant's); thence north to a point on the southern boundary of the parish of Kobyoyn; thence west by the south boundary of the said parish (being parallel 37' 6") to the north-east angle of allotment 3B in the parish of Ghin Ghin; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 4B in the said parish; thence west by the middle of a one-chain road 930 links; thence south by the middle of a one-chain road to the reserve abutting on the Goulburn River; thence southerly and easterly by the Goulburn River to the commencing point aforesaid.

Petitioners state that the above area is distant about twenty-five miles from Seymour and only four from Yea; that the country between Ghin Ghin and the former place is very rugged and the roads difficult to travel; that Yea is the natural and most convenient market-town, and that they have no community of interest with Seymour; that they cannot avail themselves of the railway to Yea, as the Seymour Council has refused to erect a bridge over the Goulburn because it would injuriously affect the interests of Seymour storekeepers.

Petitioners therefore pray "That an Order be made severing the area above described from the Seymour Riding of the Shire of Seymour and annexing it to the Shire of Yea.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such Council, not being a borough having a population of five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the above in part recited Act the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say :-

The portion of the Shire of Braybrook to the west of the junction of the Ballarat and Exford roads.

It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, and at any time during the continuance of this license, to resume all or any portion of the land hereby licensed if the same shall be required for any purposes, repaying to the licensee a sum equal to the amount paid by him as rent or license fee in respect of every acre of such land so resumed; but the licensee shall not be entitled to receive nor be paid any compensation for severance, improvements, or fences thereon, and the Board of Land and Works shall not be liable to construct any crossings or other accommodation works under, over, or upon any railway which may be made through or near such land.

If the licensee shall apply for a lease of the land held under the within license, and such application be granted, such lease shall be made subject to a similar condition to the above, without prejudice to the right of the Governor in Council to insist on such other conditions as may be deemed necessary.
