## REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, do make the following regulation:—

## No. 4.

Regulation for the making of a rate on all the rateable property in the Shire of Stawell Waterworks District:—

1. A rate of Twopence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Shire of Stawell Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Stawell, is hereby made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January 1884 and ending on the 31st day of December 1884.

2. Such rate is hereby made payable in two equal instalments, the first of which instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January 1884, and the second instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of July 1884.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorised to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation No. 4 was made by the Commissioners of the Shire of Stawell Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 44 of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, this fourth day of December 1883.

The births of 776 children, viz., 392 boys and 384 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 912 births were registered, or 136 more than in the month under review. The births were 86 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 8 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 451, viz., 240 of males, and 211 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 325. The deaths outnumbered those in October by 17, but were below the average of November during the previous ten years by 19. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 78.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2·66, and of deaths registered 1·55.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 93·0° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 38·1° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (61·3°) was exactly the same as in November 1882, and was more than two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35·2°) took place on the 6th, viz., from a maximum of 89·4° to a minimum of 54·2°. The least range (9·3°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 63·3° to a minimum of 54·0°. The mean daily range was 21·0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29·875 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month under review. Children under 5 years of age contributed 45 per cent. to that mortality as against 49 per cent. in November 1882; 38 per cent. in November 1881; 41 per cent. in November 1880; 39 per cent. in November 1879; 35 per cent. in November 1878; 42 per cent. in November 1877 and 1876; 46 per cent. in November 1875; 47 per cent. in November 1874; and 42 per cent. in November 1873.

The deaths of 15 persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 76, of apoplexy; a gardener, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of dysentery; a female, aged 83, of heart disease; a maltster, aged 85, of pneumonia; a female, aged 86, of heart disease; a female confectioner, aged 88, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 99, of bronchitis; and a laborer, aged 78, a miner and a female, each aged 80, and a laborer and a female, each aged 81, died of old age.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 29 resulted from external causes, of which 28 were ascribed to accident, and 1 to suicide. A male infant, aged 2 months, was killed by the upsetting of its cradle: a male child, aged 7, died of injuries caused by the kick of a horse; another at the same age, of injuries caused by the limb of a tree falling on him; a laborer, aged 15, of a blow from a steam shaft; a male, aged 17, of tetanus resulting from an injury to the hand; a laborer, aged 50, of a fall from St. Patrick's Cathedral; a tinsmith, aged 60, of the effects of a fall in the street; a male child, aged 9 months, and two females, each aged 17, of burns; an infant, aged 7 months, of sunstroke; a female child, aged 4, of alcoholic poisoning; and a female, aged 60, of accidental poisoning by strychnine; two female children, aged 5 and 10 respectively, a female, aged 19, a seaman, aged 30, two laborers, aged 43 and 51, were accidentally drowned; a male child, aged 9, a salesman, aged 23, a mason, aged 32, a bootmaker, aged 47, a male, of occupation not stated, aged 60, and a turner, aged 65, were "found drowned"; an illegitimate child, aged 9 months, and two female infants, aged 3 and 4 months respectively, were accidentally suffocated. The suicidal death was that of a female, who poisoned herself with aconite liniment whilst in a state of unsound mind.

Seventy-three deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—32 in the Melbourne Hospital, 7 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 1 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 202, of which 108, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 94, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 164 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 249. Of these, 132, or 53 per cent., were males, and 117, or 47 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 23 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 13 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 16 were between fifty and fifty-five, 19 were between fifty-five and sixty, 19 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 10 were upwards of eighty.

## CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion Tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban lines excepted), from the 18th December 1883 to 3rd January 1884, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for 30 days, days of issue and return and Sundays included. When the 30th day falls on a Sunday the return journey must be completed on the previous Saturday. The journey can be broken on these tickets, and the first half of them must be used on day of issue.
