PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Licensing Act 1876* (No. 566, section 14) it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time upon the application in writing of the council of any municipality to proclaim any part of the municipal district of such municipality, to be defined by such council, not being a borough having a population of Five hundred persons liable to be rated, as shown by the rate-book, a special area; and it was further enacted that the fee which should be paid for a publican's license in respect of premises situated within a special area should be Ten pounds only; and the Governor in Council might from time to time revoke any proclamation made under the authority of the above recited section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a special area under the provisions of the fourteenth section of the Act above recited the locality hereinafter mentioned, within which the fee to be paid for a publican's license shall be Ten pounds only, that is to say:—

The site of the "Barr Creek Hotel," being allotment 14a, section A, parish of Kerang, containing three acres.

AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.—PORT PHILLIP ENTRANCE.

(1.) Removal of Lightning Rocks.

Information has been received from the Government of Victoria, dated the 11th September 1882, that Lightning rocks, in the entrance to Port Phillip, have been removed, and that there is now a least depth of 32 feet over and around their positions.

Also that the depths—over the patches of 25-28 feet, 28 and 29 feet, which existed about $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables north-west of the position of Lightning rocks; and over that of 29 feet about 2 cables south-east of that position—have been increased to 30 feet.

EAST COAST.

(2.) Rocks in Mourilyan Harbor Entrance.

The Government of Queensland has given notice, dated 25th July 1882, that the Commander of the Colonial Government schooner *Pearl* reports having found a rock with $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet over it at low-water spring tides, lying in Mourilyan Harbor entrance, with Goodman rock bearing N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 60 yards. Also, other rocks awash at low-water, lying with Goodman rock bearing N.W., distant 80 yards.

NOTE.—The available channel, which is between these dangers, is only 40 yards in width, and must be used with the greatest caution.

(The bearings are magnetic. Variation $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ easterly in 1882).

The Government of Victoria has given notice that on 14th August 1882 a light would be exhibited from the extremity of the southern dike forming the entrance to Moynes River:—

The light is a *fixed* light, and is cut to show *red* to clear the black buoy off the river entrance, round westerly over the foul ground to Griffith Island; and *white* from the black buoy, round easterly over the river entrance. It should be visible in clear weather from a distance of about 3 miles.

NORTH COAST—CLARENCE STRAIT.

(2.) Vernon Islands—Buoys marking Passage between.

The Government of South Australia has given notice, dated 11th September 1882, that large iron cheese-shaped buoys, having pyramidal open frame-work surmounted by balls, have replaced those which formerly marked the usual passage between the Vernon Islands, south side of Clarence Strait:—

The buoy, placed off the north-west extremity of Henry Ellis Reef, South Vernon Island, is colored black, and moored in 17 fathoms water. The buoy marking the end of the spit extending to the westward from the south-west point of East Vernon Island, is colored red.

These buoys are about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles apart.

NOTE.—A mid-channel course is recommended when passing through, either to the eastward or to the westward.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of ratepaying electors, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or might declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance or omission, and every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas in the preparation, in November last, of the rolls of ratepaying electors the names of the persons enumerated in the first schedule subjoined were incorrectly supplied by the Town Clerk of the Borough of Footscray to the Electoral Registrar for the Footscray division of the Electoral District of Footscray, the said persons not being entitled to be enrolled on the roll of ratepaying electors for the said division: And whereas the names set forth in the second schedule hereto were accidentally omitted from the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Flemington division of the Electoral District of West Bourke: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power in him vested by the 68th section of the Act No. 279, doth by this present Order direct that the rolls of ratepaying electors for the said electoral divisions be rectified, by expunging from the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Footscray division of the Electoral District of Footscray the names so incorrectly supplied as aforesaid and contained in the first schedule, and including in the Roll of Ratepaying Electors for the Flemington division of the Electoral District of West Bourke the names as set forth in the second schedule hereto, notwithstanding such accidental misfeasance as aforesaid; and the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby declare valid the said divisional Rolls of Ratepaying Electors so rectified.
