VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

The Public Works Statute 1865, section 123.—"It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the board or company, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this part of this Act or of the bye-laws made under the authority of this Act, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some justice without any warrant or other authority than this Act; and such justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender."

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby authorize and appoint the person named in the schedule hereto annexed as its agent and officer for the purpose of carrying into effect (so far as applicable to each respective case) the 123th section of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, and also at any time hereafter to lay any information or complaint before any justice against any person for any offence against the provisions of Part III. of *The Public Works Statute 1865*, or of any bye-law made or to be made under the authority of such Act; and to summon such person before any justice or justices for such offence, or to charge him or her with such offence.

This authority is not to supersede any authority for the like purpose heretofore made and given by the Board of Land and Works.

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1882 (23,991) was greater than that in 1881 by 1826, and although less than that in 1880—the Exhibition year—by 2,166, was greater than in any other year since 1871; the increase by excess of recorded arrivals by sea over recorded departures by sea (10,880) was exceeded in 1880 by 780; but was greater by 3,558 than the same excess in 1881, and was also above that in any other year since 1870; the increase by excess of registered births over registered deaths (13,111) was, with the exception of that in 1875, the smallest in the last 14 years. It should be stated that, whilst it is probable nearly all the deaths and arrivals by sea are noted, there is reason to believe that some births and departures by sea are not recorded; it should also be borne in mind that no account is or can be taken of persons who come and go overland. The figures of births and deaths during 1882, and consequently those of population, will probably be slightly altered when the returns of the deputy registrars are finally examined.

PROCLAMATION OF A DISTRICT WHERE PUBLICANS' LICENSES MAY BE SPECIALLY GRANTED, REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; a Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Licensing Act 1876 (No. 566, section 44) it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding the provisions thereinbefore contained, it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to proclaim any place or district a place or district where, owing to a sudden increase of population or otherwise, the necessity for the immediate grant of publicans' licenses exists, to be a place or district wherein publicans' licenses might be specially granted, and from time to time to revoke any such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of October One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, proclaiming Barnawartha a district wherein publicans' licenses may be specially granted, under the provisions of the 44th section of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

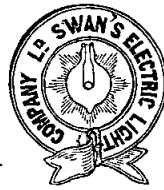

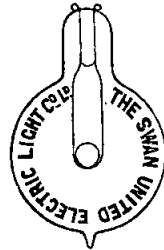
