BOUNDARIES OF CERTAIN MINING DIVISIONS ALTERED.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the 46th section of *The Mining Statute* 1865, the Governor in Council has altered the limits and boundaries of the Stringer's Creek and Russell's Creek divisions of the Mining District of Gippsland, and has defined the limits and boundaries of the said mining divisions in the manner following, that is to say:—

STRINGER'S CREEK DIVISION (one member).—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the township of Seacombe; thence by a line northerly to the outlet of Lake Wellington; thence by the eastern and northern shores of Lake Wellington to the River Avon; thence by the River Avon to the township of Stratford; thence by a line westerly to the township of Seaton; thence northerly by the range dividing the waters of the Macallister River and the River Thompson to a point due east of the head of Stringer's Creek; thence by a line westerly to the junction of Donnelly's Creek and the Aberfeldy River; thence by a line south-westerly to the peak of the Baw Baw Mountains; thence southerly and south-easterly by the range dividing the waters of the Tyers River and the Tangil River and a line in the same direction to the La Trobe River; thence easterly by the La Trobe River to its junction with the Traralgon Creek; thence by a line south-easterly to the nearest source of Merriman's Creek; thence by Merriman's Creek to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast north-easterly to a point due south of the township of Seacombe, the commencing point aforesaid.

The births of 673 children, viz., 343 boys and 330 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February. In the month of January 788 births were registered, or 145 more than in the month under review. The births were 29 above the average of the previous eight years, but 36 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 547, viz., 270 of males and 277 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 126. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 45, but exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 70. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been only 11 above the average of those ten years.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of deaths registered was 2.31 and of deaths registered 1.81.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100.0° on the 16th, and the lowest was 46.4° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (66.5°) was nearly a third of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (37.1°) took place of the 15th, viz., from a maximum of 95.1° to a minimum of 58.0°. The least range (7.7°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 69.5° to a minimum of 61.8°. The mean daily range was 20.0°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.745 inches) was below the average.

Of the deaths registered during the month 49 per cent. were of males and 51 per cent. were of females. 42 per cent. were of children under 5 years of age as against 46 per cent. in February 1882; 45 per cent. in February 1881; 52 per cent. in February 1880; 45 per cent. in February 1879; 52 per cent. in February 1878; 51 per cent. in February 1877; 53 per cent. in February 1876; 63 per cent. in February 1875; 64 per cent. in February 1874; and 53 per cent. in February 1873.

Twenty-one deaths of persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month, viz.:—Those of a dealer, aged 75, who died of erysipelas in the head; a wheelwright, aged 75, of enteritis; a female, aged 75, found drowned; a traveller, aged 75, and a female, aged 76, of rheumatism; a banker, aged 76, of dropsy; an inspector of distilleries, aged 77, of cancer of the stomach; a gentleman, aged 77, of ileus; a female housekeeper, aged 78, of heart disease; a male patient in the Kew Lunatic Asylum and a female, each aged 79, of brain disease; a laborer, aged 79, of pneumonia; a female, aged 80, of cystitis; a widow, aged 80, of paralysis; and a female, aged 76, a shoemaker, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a gardener, aged 82, an engineer and a female, each aged 85, and a groom, aged 88, of old age.

Nineteen deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 17 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 1 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 6, died of injury to the right elbow, caused by stepping on a ball which was rolling, whilst playing cricket; a laborer, aged 18, of injury to the spine, occasioned by diving into shallow water; a groom, aged 22, of rupture of the intestines, the result of a fall from a horse; a ship's apprentice, aged 19, of injuries caused by falling from the mainmast of a ship; an able seaman, aged 43, of injuries resulting from falling down the forehold of the ship *Sobraon*; a female, aged 48, of injuries caused by falling from a window; a laborer, aged 66, of injury to the spine, resulting from

falling into a creek; a gentleman, aged 56, died of a wound on the finger, a soda-water-bottle bursting in his hand; a boy, aged 10, a shipwright, aged 34, a draper, aged 44, a male of occupation unknown, aged 45, a tailor, aged 60, and a dealer, aged 47, were drowned, the latter whilst bathing. A mariner, aged 36, a butcher, aged 49, and a female, aged 75, were found drowned, the first in Hobson's Bay. The homicidal death was that of a female infant, aged 1, who died of fracture of the skull—verdict, manslaughter. The suicidal death was that of a waiter, aged 27, who shot himself in the head whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and twelve deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—45 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 4 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 9 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, and 5 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 230, of which 108, or 47 per cent., were of males, and 122, or 53 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 154 were under one year of age, 56 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 317. Of these, 162, or 51 per cent., were males, and 155, or 49 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 25 were between twenty and twenty-five, 30 were between twenty-five and thirty, 31 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 16 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 23 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 6 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 180 to 147. Under this head, deaths from diphtheria and metria fell from 3 each to *nil*, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 117 to 76, and those from want of breast milk from 11 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from scarlatina rose from 1 to 3, and those from typhoid fever from 26 to 36. Under the head of constitutional diseases, deaths rose from 74 to 103, the increase being in deaths from gout, which rose from *nil* to 4, in those from cancer, which rose from 10 to 15, in those from tubes mesenterica, which rose from 7 to 13, and in those from phthisis, which rose from 46 to 59. Childbirth caused 3 deaths, or 1 death of a mother to every 224 children born alive during the month, as against 9 in January, or 1 death of a mother to every 89 children born alive.

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the Yark Common Proclaimed by Order of the sixteenth December One thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and increased by Order of the twenty-ninth April One thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.
