WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called The Public Health Amendment Act 1876, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the Government Gacette extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required! Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Shire of Shepparton.
