ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

An Act to amend *The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876*.

An Act to re-enact and continue *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878*.

An Act to continue various Expiring Laws.

An Act to authorize the construction of additional works on the Victorian State Railways and for other purposes.

An Act to sanction the issue and application of certain sums of money as loans for water supply in the country districts.

An Act to provide for reimbursing Members of the Legislative Assembly their expenses in relation to their attendance in Parliament.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

No. 506, § 19, 38, 39, and 49), it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that might be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition signed by the requisite number of the ratepayers of the Shire of Buninyong therein described (notices of which said petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the same Act): Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Buninyong the portion of the shire described in such petition, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be annexed to the West Riding of the Shire of Ballan; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Buninyong hereby reduced and of the Shire

of Ballan as hereby enlarged and of the West Riding of the said Shire of Ballan, in manner following, that is to say:—

BUNINYONG SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave, of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON TO BE FILLED UP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health Amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up, as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the above-recited Act to the Shire of Shepparton.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter or add to (as the case may be) the undermentioned Commons, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say :-

COSTERFIELD COMMON.—The Costerfield Common, proclaimed by Order of the 13th of January 1873, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries, viz. :- County of Dalhousie, parishes of Heathcote and Costerfield: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the Heathcote Common where it is intersected by the Heathcote and Redcastle road; thence north-easterly by the said road to the western boundary of the Costerfield Goldfield Common; thence south-easterly, south-westerly, and south-easterly by that common, and south-westerly by the lower Costerfield road to the Heathcote Common aforesaid; and thence north-westerly by that common to the point of commencement.
