The births of 818 children, viz., 407 boys and 411 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of March. In the month of February 673 births were registered, or 145 less than in the month under review. The births were 72 above the average of the previous eight years, but 4 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 621, viz., 346 of males and 275 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 197. The deaths were more numerous than those in February by 74, and exceeded the average of March during the previous ten years by 97. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been above the average of those ten years by 32 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.81 and of deaths registered 2.13.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.0° on the 18th, and the lowest was 46.0° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (64.2°) was half a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (40.5°) took place of the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 96.1° to a minimum of 55.6°. The least range (7.8°) was on the 19th, viz., from a maximum of 69.4° to a minimum of 61.6°. The mean daily range was 20.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.977 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality as against 43 per cent. in March 1882 and 1881; 47 per cent. in March 1880 and 1879; 49 per cent. in March 1878 and 1877; 50 per cent. in March 1876; 58 per cent. in March 1875; 46 per cent. in March 1874; and 49 per cent. in March 1873.

The number of persons who died at the age of 75 years or upwards was 29, viz.:—A fisherman, aged 75, of pleurisy; a tailor, aged 76, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of enteritis; a female, aged 75, a gentleman, aged 78, a female, aged 80, and a gardener, aged 83, of heart disease; a pensioner, aged 78, of drowning; 2 females, aged 78 and 81 respectively, of congestion of the lungs; a laborer, aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 80, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a laborer, aged 83, of nephritis; a gentleman, aged 83, of pneumonia; an ex civil servant, aged 85, of dysentery; a pensioner, aged 75, a gentleman, an importer, and a female, each aged 75, a gardener and a retired civil servant, each aged 76, a plasterer, aged 78, 2 gentlemen, aged 79 and 82 respectively, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 84, and a pensioner and a female, each aged 85, of old age.

Twenty-six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 20 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, was killed by a train passing over him; a second officer of a ship died of fracture of the skull, a block striking him on the head; a boy, aged 11, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling from a platform; a tailor's apprentice, aged 17, of internal injuries, resulting from falling from an omnibus; a slater, aged 56, of fracture of the spine, occasioned by a fall from a scaffold; a hawker, aged 63, of fracture of the skull, caused by a



fall in the street; and a female, aged 68, of injury to the head through falling; a laborer, aged 48, died of rupture of the bladder, the result of a kick from a horse; a laborer, aged 64, of compound fracture of the thigh, caused by a dray wheel passing over him; 2 boys, aged 9 and 17 respectively, died of gunshot wounds, the former being accidentally shot by his brother, and the latter whilst drawing the charge of a gun; a female child, aged 4, died of burns, her night-clothes having caught fire; a female child, aged 4, was poisoned by taking phosphorous pills, and a painter, aged 45, died of plumbism. A boy, aged 7, was drowned in a waterhole, and a quarryman, aged 27, a bootmaker, aged 40, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, were found drowned. A male infant, aged 5 months, was suffocated in bed; a laborer, aged 45, died of injuries resulting from an explosion of dynamite. The homicidal deaths were those of 2 female infants, who were suffocated at birth, and a female, aged 28, who died of injury to the head. A verdict of wilful murder was brought in in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a railway porter, aged 26, who cut his throat whilst suffering from delirium tremens, a grocer's assistant, aged 38, and a pensioner, aged 78, who drowned themselves.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—63 in the Melbourne Hospital, 9 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 15 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 228, of which 120, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 108, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 158 were under one year of age, 39 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 15 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 393. Of these, 226, or 58 per cent., were males, and 167, or 42 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 36 were between twenty and twenty-five, 27 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 36 were between forty-five and fifty, 31 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 21 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 14 were upwards of eighty.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of Wesleyan Methodists, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the first day of May 1883, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—Two roods, county of Grant, parish of Paywit, municipal district of Queenscliffe, being allotments 1 and 2 of section 3: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 1, being the point of intersection of the northern side of Stokes street and the eastern side of Hess street; bounded thence by the last-named street bearing N. 15° E. two chains; and thence by allotment 3 bearing S. 75° E. two chains and fifty links; and thence by allotments 17 and 18 bearing S. 15° W. two chains; and thence by Stokes street aforesaid bearing N. 75° W. two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—Edward Hawse, Henry Richardson, Peter Angel, John Henry Prathan, and John Butler.

*Power of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land when and as the trustees, or the major part of them, shall with the approval of the annual conference regulating the affairs of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria think most advantageous. The authorized representative for the time being of the said church shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts under the provisions of *The Successory Trusts Act 1878*. The printed minutes of the meetings of the said annual conference shall for the purposes hereof be received and taken as sufficient evidence of its acts and proceedings. Subject to such power as aforesaid the land or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid shall be held upon the trusts of the Wesleyan Model Deed, enrolled in the Supreme Court of New South Wales under the Act of Council of that colony, 2 Victoria, No. 7, so far as such trusts can be applied and are not inconsis- tent; herewith.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such Wesleyan Methodist building purposes in Queenscliffe as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees and the super- intendent minister of the circuit.

## SHIRE OF ST. ARNAUD.—REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF NAVARRE COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Navarre Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

## Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The scale of fees payable, half-yearly in advance, on the first day of March and the first day of September in every year, for depasturing stock on the common, shall be as follows:—

For every head of large cattle ... ..	5	0
For every head of small cattle ... ..	2	0
Progeny of horned cattle and horses, under six months old, if running with their mothers ... ..	Free	

3. Every person depasturing stock on the common must be the *bona fide* owner of such stock.

4. Bulls or entire horses, over the age of nine months, will not be allowed on the common without the written sanction of the managers first obtained.

5. Sheep will be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

6. The herdsman of the common shall be in attendance at a place to be named on the seven days immediately preceding the first day of each half-year, for the purpose of registering stock; and due notice of such attendance, and of the time and place thereof, shall be given by the managers.

7. All persons taking stock to depasture on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the time and place appointed as aforesaid, together with a written statement of the number and brands of such stock; and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable on such stock, give a receipt for the same; and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or the person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar; and such brand shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period such stock are depasturing on the common.

8. No stock duly registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention to remove be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock so removed.

9. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of any stock from the common, save as provided in clause 10.

10. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the owner thereof within ten days; and should the herdsman fail or neglect to give notice to the owner within that time, the herdsman shall, if such stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall be computed at the rate of Two pounds sterling per head for horses, and Two pounds sterling per head for horned cattle.

11. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten days after the date for renewal of licenses, will be liable to be impounded.

12. All dead carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

13. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the common, and shall give notice, in writing, to the owner of such stock to remove the same. The managers shall at once take precautionary measures to remove stock so diseased from the common, but they shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such stock may sustain.

14. Whenever, in these regulations, any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed, from time to time, to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c.

2. Bread—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. The bread for Kew and Yarra Bend Asylums will be required in two-pound turned over loaves, baked on the bricks. Second quality to be made of flour known in the trade as "best second," and the third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin skinned, good colored wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

3. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

4. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

6. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.

7. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with the delivery of the supplies. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

8. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 8.

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

11. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board to survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 8.

12. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivery or replacing them when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

14. 11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Government may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

14. It will be competent either for the contractor on his own behalf, or for the Secretary of the Tender Board on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving notice, in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of the month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the cemetery, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse at a time.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

7. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided, and the contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the contractor gives the order for interment. The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

## BYE-LAW NO. 19.

All verandahs, sign-boards, or awnings over footpaths must be according to a pattern prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved of by the Borough Council, said pattern to be shown on a plan kept for inspection at the Town Hall, in the office of the Borough Engineer, the minimum height in broad streets or roads to be nine feet, and in narrow streets or roads eight feet, the posts to be of redgum, iron, or composition; and after the adoption by the Council of such pattern no verandah, sign-board, or awning shall be erected across any public footpath unless they shall be in conformity to such pattern; and whenever the posts of any verandah erected or to be erected become defective or dangerous to the public they must be removed or repaired to the satisfaction of the Borough Engineer, who shall have power to order such repairs as he may deem necessary; and in the event of neglect by the owner or occupier to remove or repair any verandah, sign-board, or awning, or the posts supporting such verandah, sign-board, or awning, within seven days from the service of such order, the verandah, sign-board, or awning may be removed by the Borough Engineer at the cost and expense of the owner or occupier of the premises.

Any person wishing to erect a verandah must, previous to commencing such erection, obtain from the Borough Engineer written permission to do so; and he will be required to deposit with the Borough Engineer such amount as the said Engineer may deem sufficient, such deposit to be retained until the said Engineer shall certify that the verandah has been erected in accordance with the pattern above mentioned.

Every person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
