**REGULATIONS.**

1. Before any package or case is received into the magazine it is to be carefully examined, and if it is not perfectly closed, or if it shows any sign of damage by water, or if it shows any exudation (i.e., greasy stains on the wood of the package or case near the joints), or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received into the magazine.

2. Only known approved brands of nitro-glycerine compounds shall be admitted into the magazine (i.e., only those which have been imported, and have been inspected and passed by a Government Inspector of explosives), and the dynamite and lithofracteur manufactured by the Australian Lithofracteur Company.

3. No nitro-glycerine compound that has been manufactured for a period of more than nine months shall be admitted into the magazine; and if any explosive in the magazine shall during the period of storage become nine months old, it shall be at once removed.

4. Every package or case shall be distinctly marked with the date of its receipt into the magazine, and under no circumstances whatever shall any package or case be allowed to remain in the magazine for a longer period than three months.

5. No package or case is on any account to be opened in the magazine.

6. The magazine is to be kept strictly clean and dry, and free from all gravel, sand, or grit; and no iron, light, lucifer match, greased rag, or anything liable to cause combustion, is to be admitted therein; and no water is to be used in cleansing the magazine.

7. No person is to enter the magazine unless he shall wear magazine slippers, or be bare-footed; and then only in the presence and with the permission of the keeper.

8. No smoking or fire is to be permitted in or near the magazine.

9. All tools used in or about the magazine for any purpose whatever must be of wood or copper, or of both such material.

10. Where there is an outer wall or embankment surrounding the magazine, no vehicle is to be permitted to enter within such wall or embankment.

11. No person shall be allowed to store in the magazine at any one time more than half a ton in weight of explosives.

## AUSTRALIA DIRECTORY, VOL. II.—NOTICE No. 7.

THE following information relating to certain shoals on the east coast of Australia, and in Torres Strait, has been received from various authorities, 1882.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation in 1883.]

Solitary Islands, 9° E. Trinity Bay, 6° E. Torres Strait, 4½° E.

**SOLITARY ISLANDS.**—*Shoals.*—Two shoal patches, with breakers, have been seen respectively one mile and half a mile distant in a northerly direction from north-west rock of the north Solitary Islands.

**MOURILIYAN HARBOR.**—A rock with 4½ feet over it at low-water has been found in the entrance to Mouriliyan Harbor; from it Goodman Rock bears N. ½ W., distant 60 yards. Other rocks, awash at low-water, were found with Goodman Rock bearing N.W., distant 30 yards.

The available channel is only 40 yards wide, and must be used with the greatest caution.

**TRINITY BAY.**—*Corca Shoal.*—This shoal, lying about 3½ miles southward of the Wentworth Reef, Trinity Bay, is stated to be about one cable in extent, with 4 to 6 feet water over it at low-water; from it white cliffs bear S. by E. ¼ E., Harris Peak S.W. by S., and Island Point N.W. ½ W.

**MARGARET BAY.**—*Sand Bank.*—A sand bank with 3 feet over it at low-water has been found in Margaret Bay; from it the northern extremity of Cape Grenville bears E. by S. ¾ S. Centre of Sunday Island N. by W. distant one mile.

This bank, though out of the main navigation, is a danger to vessels seeking anchorage in Margaret Bay, or working along the coast under shelter of Cape Grenville.

**TORRES STRAIT.**—*Jacobus Shoals.*—The commander of the Imperial German vessel of war *Moeck* reports that, upon passing Arden Island, the east Jacobus Shoal was recognized by the breakers upon it. The west Jacobus Shoal was seen at the same time.

Also, that a patch with one fathom over it, lies distant 4½ miles west of Malleanoah Island; it is marked by a red buoy.

A shoal of 2½ fathoms lies E.S.E. distant 2 miles from Attataa Island.

A patch with 4 feet over it, lies nearly midway between the Juno Shoal and Augusta Rock, it is marked by a red buoy.

Off Mafanga village, and about half a mile from the shore, is a shoal of 3 fathoms, marked by a white buoy.

**AMARGURA ISLAND.**—A reef is said to extend under water half a mile in an easterly direction from this island.

## UEA OR WALLIS ISLANDS.

UEA OR WALLIS ISLANDS' consist of one principal island and several smaller islands and islets surrounded by a barrier reef, through which there is only one channel (the southern one) available for large vessels.

Uea, the largest island, is 197 feet high near the centre, and covered with vegetation. It is divided into three parishes, Mua upon the south, Lano upon the north, and Matautai upon the east. The town of Matautai is the capital, and residence of the native queen.

*Population.*—The population in 1879 numbered 3,500, all converted to Christianity by the Mariste missionaries; they possess a small armed force, who manoeuvre in European style, and are provided with muskets.

*Supplies.*—Pigs and poultry may be readily obtained, also yams, bananas, and kava-root; coconuts are abundant. Water is scarce.

*Winds and weather.*—During the months of June, July, and August the prevailing winds are between E.S.E. and N.N.E. Breezes from the North or N.N.W. are accompanied with squalls and rain.

*Tides.*—It is high-water full and change, at 6h. 40m.; springs rise 6 feet. In the Bay of Matautai the tide ebbs 8 hours, and flows 4 hours. The sea washing over the Barrier Reef sometimes makes the tide irregular.

*Houikulu Pass.*—The southern opening in the Barrier Reef, leading into Allier Bay, is practicable for a steamer, but sailing vessels should not enter, unless with a fair wind, and upon the first of the flood tide. The channel is easily recognized, being west of Fenua-fu Island, the south island of the group, the fringing reef of which extends about one cable westward, and forms the eastern side of the Pass. Upon the west side of the Pass, the wreck of the *L'Hermite* will be seen.

*Directions.*—Having arrived off the Pass at low-water, bring the south-east point of Nukutea Island to bear N.N.E., and open to the westward of Fenua-fu Island, which mark will lead in. Care should be taken to give the north point of Fenua-fu Island a berth of at least 1½ cables. Upon the ebb-tide there are strong eddies, which must be crossed with speed, and borrowing upon the western side of the Pass, both upon entering and leaving; upon the flood tide the eddies are scarcely noticeable.

The tide has been reported to run in the Pass at the rate of 8 knots an hour, but recent observations give a maximum of 6 knots, slack water lasts about 15 minutes.

*Pilots.*—Native pilots from Mua will board the vessel off Houikulu Pass, too much confidence must not be placed in them, for they are unaccustomed to large vessels. The reefs can be seen from aloft under favorable circumstances, with the sun astern. The charge for pilotage is 10 piastres each way, whatever tonnage the ship may be.

*Nukutea Island* is high, rugged, and conspicuous.

*Nuku Akimoa* (Sail Rock) is remarkable, and has the appearance of a vessel under sail.

*Faioa Island*, bounding the eastern side of Allier Bay, is one of the largest of the group, it is low and covered with coconuts.

*Allier Bay—Anchorage.*—When bound for this anchorage and well within the Houikulu Pass. Steer for the north point of Faioa Island; when Sail Rock bears N. ¾ W., and the south point of Nukutea Island W.S.W., anchor in 22 fathoms, sand and coral. This anchorage is, however, inconveniently far from the shore.

*Mua anchorage.*—There are two channels to this anchorage, one to the east, the other to the west of Nuku Akimoa. The commander of the *Vaudreuil* recommends the eastern one.

*Eastern Channel—Directions.*—Steer as directed for the anchorage in Allier Bay until the west point of Nuku Fetau bears N.N.W., when the channel between the banks extending eastward from Nuku Akimoa, and a reef with one fathom over it will be seen, the most favorable time being in the forenoon.

The channel first takes a W.N.W. direction, and when the west point of Nuku Fetau bears N. ¾ W. steer for it until Nuku Akimoa bears S.W. ¾ S.; then alter course N.W. ¼ N. for the anchorage in 8 fathoms, sand, with Mua steeple (a dark-colored stone tower among the trees) bearing N.W. by N., distant one mile from Mua village. Landing is difficult at low-water.

*Matautai—Anchorage.*—There is anchorage off Matautai village which can be reached by an intricate channel (in which the tide runs 4 knots) from Allier Bay, near the north extreme of the Faioa Island.

A local pilot and a good look out from aloft are the best guides, the weather should be clear and the sun in the south-east.

Landing is easy at high-water, a little north of the church. Two miles north of Matautai the channel is completely obstructed by sand-banks.

SAMOAN OR NAVIGATOR ISLANDS.<sup>8</sup>

SAVAII ISLAND.<sup>9</sup>—*Falelima*.—There is no anchorage at Falelima, upon the west coast of Savaii Island. There is, however, a boat harbor, but landing is possible only at high-water.

*Safoné Road* affords anchorage in 13 fathoms during the south-east winds, but there is usually much swell. There are two boat passages to the shore through the Barrier Reef; the western one is the best, although farthest from the settlement. If there is much swell, the eastern passage is practicable at high-water only.

UPOLU ISLAND.—*Apia Harbor*.—When sighting Apia some houses with red roofs are prominent objects. They are situated well up the hill side, and can be seen before the town or shipping.

*Saluafata Harbor*,<sup>10</sup> situated in a bay 9 miles east of Apia, is about half-a-mile square, protected from the swell by coral reefs, through which the channel is 2 cables wide. The western side of the bay is occupied by a reef 3 to 7 cables from the shore, upon which are two small islets and having a boat passage inshore of it.

*Beacon*.<sup>11</sup>—A pyramidal beacon, having a triangular-shaped head and painted white, has been erected upon Ariadne Point, 114 feet above the sea. It shows well against the wooded hills behind it, and serves as a mark for recognizing the harbor.

*Anchorage* is 6 to 7 fathoms, fine sand, will be obtained about 2 cables S.S.E. of the eastern of the two small islets before-mentioned; the western part of the harbor is preferable, as being the most sheltered.

*Pilots*.—A native pilot can be obtained at Saluafata.

*Supplies*.—Fish, fowls, and eggs can be obtained in small quantities; oranges and coconuts are abundant. Cattle may be procured from Messrs. Godeffroy's plantation, about 5 miles distant upon the coast, and if it be expedient to keep them alive good pasturage will be found upon the shores of the bay.

*Water* may be obtained from a stream situated in the south-west part of the harbor.

*Landing*.—The best landing is at the village of Fusi in the south part of the bay, through a small opening in the fringing reef 40 feet wide.

*Natives* of Saluafata are friendly and obliging.

FANGALOA BAY,<sup>12</sup> upon the north-east coast of Upolu, is an inlet 2½ miles in length, N.E. ¼ E. and S.W. ¼ W., one mile wide between the entrance points, midway between which the depth is 56 fathoms, decreasing gradually to 6 fathoms at the head of the bay. The shores are fringed by coral reefs extending from one to 2½ cables from the coast, the outer edges of which dry at low-water.

A detached shoal, having 14 feet water over it, is reported to lie N.W. by N., distant 3¼ cables from Lena village upon the south shore.

NAUTILUS BANK,<sup>13</sup> upon which there is a depth of 9 fathoms, lies with Mount Apia bearing W. by S., Mount Fao S.E. ¼ E., and Albatross Island (in Saluafata Harbor) bearing S.S.E. ¼ E.

FALALILI HARBOR,<sup>14</sup> upon the south coast of Upolu, is sheltered from northerly winds only, and is very small. The entrance is difficult to recognize, narrow, and obstructed by outlying reefs.

## NORTH ISLAND—HAURAKI GULF.

(1) *Moko Hinou Islands—Intended Flashing Light on Burgess Islet, and Sector of Red Light from Tiri Tiri Lighthouse.*

**AVON SHIRE.**

**BYE-LAW.**

A Bye-law of the Shire of Avon, made under section 213 of The Local Government Act 1874, for prescribing the rate of speed of crossing over a bridge for horses, carts, and carriages.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Avon order as follows:—

All horses, carts, and carriages shall not pass over the bridge spanning the Avon River at Stratford, in the Shire of Avon, at any other than a walking pace.

If any person riding any horse, or driving or having charge of any horse or horses, cart or carriage, shall violate this Bye-law, he shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.
