The births of 922 children, viz., 465 boys and 457 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 818 births were registered, or 104 less than in the month under review. The births were 236 above the average of the previous eight years, but only 167 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 472, viz., 252 of males, and 220 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 450. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 149, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 3. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years by 55.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3.16, and of deaths registered 1.62.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 84.7° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 45.2° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (60.6°) was more than 2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (32.1°) took place on the 14th, viz., from a maximum of 79.2° to a minimum of 47.1°. The least range (6.1°) was on the 30th, viz., from a maximum of 62.1° to a minimum of 56.0°. The mean daily range was 19.77°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.041 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 33 per cent. to that mortality as against 41 per cent. in April 1882; 36 per cent. in April 1881; 40 per cent. in April 1880; 43 per cent. in April 1879; 38 per cent. in April 1878; 40 per cent. in April 1877 and 1876; 47 per cent. in April 1875; 32½ per cent. in April 1874; and 42 per cent. in April 1873.

Thirteen of the deaths recorded during the month were of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years, viz.:—Those of 2 gentlemen, aged respectively 76 and 82, who died of heart disease; a laborer, aged 77, of apoplexy; a laborer, aged 79, of bronchitis; a market gardener, aged 80, of kidney disease; a carter, aged 82, and a laborer, aged 83, of pneumonia; a female, aged 81, and a farmer, aged 83, of disease of the brain; a female, aged 77, a female, aged 82, a brickmaker, aged 88, and a fisherman, aged 89, of old age.

Of the deaths registered during the month, 19 were ascribed to external causes, of which 15 were set down to accident and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 3, of injuries resulting from being run over by a waggon; a carter, aged 26, and a laborer, aged 53, of fracture of the skull (cause not stated). A bootmaker, aged 23, of fracture of the spine, caused by a fall from a horse; a farmer, aged 35, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall; a market-gardener, aged 38, and a gardener, aged 49, were killed by falling from drays; and a publican, aged 51, by falling from a buggy. A female, aged 20, died of burns; a laborer, aged 21, and a master-mariner, aged 47, were poisoned, the former by taking belladonna liniment, and the latter by taking opium. A male child, aged 3, a boy, aged 14, and a female, aged 39, were drowned; and a male

infant, aged 3 days, and a female infant, aged 10 days, died of suffocation. The suicidal deaths were those of a builder, aged 49, who poisoned himself, and of 3 males, of occupations unknown, aged 30, 40, and 55 years respectively, who drowned themselves. The first of these was set down as insane at the time of committing self-destruction.

Ninety-four deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—43 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 9 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 155, of which 93, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 62, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 111 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 317. Of these, 159, or 50 per cent., were males, and 158, or 50 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 22 were between forty and forty-five, 34 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 27 were between sixty and sixty-five, 21 were between sixty-five and seventy, 17 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 145 in March to 96 in the month under notice. Under this head deaths from measles fell from 2 to nil, those from typhoid fever from 45 to 40, those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 49 to 27, those from want of breast-milk from 8 to 5, and those from alcoholism from 7 to 2. Deaths from developmental diseases also decreased from 112 to 66. Under this head, deaths from old age fell from 20 to 7, and those from atrophy and debility from 63 to 34.

## NEW CUTTING AND LEADING LIGHTS, BRISBANE RIVER BAR, AND DISCONTINUANCE OF WEST BEACON LIGHT AND LIGHTS IN FRANCIS CHANNEL.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of a notice issued from this office on the 23rd ultimo, the Lightship at the Brisbane Bar has been this day moved to a position in 8 fathoms of water on the outer edge of the bar at a distance of half a cable to the eastward of the line of the new cutting. The tidal signals will be made from her as usual.

On and after this date the West Beacon light and all the lights in Francis Channel will be discontinued, the direction of the line of the new cutting being given by the two lighthouses on the Fisherman Islands, in line; and at night by two leading lights, the more northern of the two being red, and standing at an elevation of 27 feet above high water; the back light white, at an elevation of 47 feet. The lighthouses in line lead through the cutting, which is 200 feet wide, at a distance of 50 feet from its eastern edge.

The white light is dioptric of the 5th order, and shows between the bearings of S.E. by S. and S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., and between W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. and N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. where not obscured by trees.

While this light is in sight to the southward of S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., vessels will be clear of the shoal water off Mud Island. The line also of eclipsed light, bearing N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., leads half a cable to

the north-east of the black and white beacon at the entrance to the Boat Channel.

The red light is a 6th order Holophote, and shows through a sector of 10° in the line of the cutting. The towers are white and circular, and are placed at a distance of 1433 yards apart, bearing N. by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and S. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. nearly.

There is a depth of 15 feet at low-water in the new cutting, but the cuttings across the inner bar and the Pelican Bank, which are not yet deepened, have a depth still of only 10 feet 6 inches at low water.

*Directions.*—Vessels entering from Cowan Cowan Point will steer so as to pass to the northward and westward of the lightship outside the bar, entering the cutting with the lighthouses just open to the westward. Similarly at night, vessels, on dipping Cowan Cowan Point light, will pick up the light from the lightship outside the bar, and steer so as to pass well to the northward of her, entering the cutting with the lights just open to the westward, and keeping them in that position until nearing the line of beacons or leading lights on the East Banks, which will lead through the cutting across the inner bar as formerly.

Vessels leaving the river will pass through the cutting with the lighthouses in line.

Vessels by night, coming from the southern part of the Bay, after passing between King and Green Islands, will keep the leading lights at Lytton in line until the white light on the Fisherman Island is obscured. Vessels will then be about half a cable from the black and white outer beacon at the entrance to the Boat Channel, and by again opening the light may haul up for the south-west end of Fisherman Island as usual.

# POWER TO COMPEL CESSPOOLS IN CERTAIN BOROUGH, ETC., TO BE FILLED UP.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-ninth year of Her Majesty's reign, called *The Public Health Amendment Act 1876*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend the provisions of the twentieth section of the said Act to any part of Victoria, and from and after three months from the coming into operation of the said section in any part of Victoria, if the owner of land whereon there should be a cesspool for the reception of nightsoil, which cesspool in the opinion of the local Board should be in such a condition or position as to be calculated to generate disease or be a public nuisance, should be required by notice from the local Board to fill up the same within a time to be expressed in such notice, not being more than one month from the date thereof, such owner should be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day from the expiration of the time mentioned in such notice that such cesspool should not be filled up as thereby required: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation extend the provisions of the above-recited twentieth section of the said Act to the boroughs and township of Victoria hereinafter respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

THE BOROUGH OF CARISBROOK,  
THE BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD,  
THE TOWNSHIP OF WARRAGUL.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-ninth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## MAKING A RATE.

THE Benalla Waterworks Trust, a body corporate under the provisions of the *Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881*, 45 Vic., No. 716, having had money granted as a loan by the Governor in Council, to construct waterworks, being under the provisions of the said Act empowered to make a rate, and (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council) to make regulations relating to the subjects mentioned in section 44 and sub-sections 1 to 9, inclusive of the said Act, doth by this regulation make a rate for the purpose of maintaining such waterworks in an efficient state for the term of one year from the 16th day of February 1883, at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum (or one shilling in the pound) on all lands and tenements within the Benalla Water Supply District; and that such rate shall be due and payable in equal moieties on the first day of July 1883, and on the first day of January 1884.

The Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 44 of the "Victorian Water Conservation Act 1881," do make the following Regulations.

## No. 1.

## REGULATIONS AS TO ORDINARY AND SPECIAL MEETINGS.

1. *Ordinary meetings.*—The ordinary meetings of the commissioners shall be held at Murtoa on the third Tuesday in each month, at the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon, and such meetings may be adjourned from time to time if the commissioners see fit.

2. *Special meetings.*—The commissioners may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such special meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given to each commissioner, and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

3. *Resolutions, how revoked.*—No resolution at any meeting of the trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting.

unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting; if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

## No. 2.

REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS OF MEETINGS OF THE WIMMERA  
UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST OFFICERS, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the trust at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions, of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the trust, unless otherwise ordered by the trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the

close of the meeting of the trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of the trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the trust thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the trust.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners, in meeting of trust, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of Commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Commissioners to apologise for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the trust.

24. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologise for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may, of right, demand the production of any of the documents of the trust applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The trust shall vote by show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the trust, put the question first in the affirmative then

in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the trust, but, if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered, three days at least, before the next ordinary meeting of the trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion, moved and seconded, be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition, to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the trust, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

44. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the trust, shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents, shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the trust, shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointment of officers, &c.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the trust shall take place until seven clear days public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the waterworks district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all officers and places at the disposal of the trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the trust, and no assessor or auditor of the

trust shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the trust, or for any work to be done for the trust.

52. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this sub-division may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the trust.

54. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this sub-division, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

55. *Bank account and signing cheques.*—All moneys of the trust, amounting to twenty pounds and upwards, shall, within seventy-two hours, or such shorter period as the trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the proper officer of the trust, be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank, save by cheque signed by any three commissioners authorized from time to time by the trust in that behalf, and countersigned by the secretary.

### NO. 3.

#### REGULATIONS AS TO WATERWORKS, DRAINS, ETC.

1. *Polluting water, reservoir, &c.*—Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the trust, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the trust or under their management or control shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall for every such offence forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

2. *Wilful waste of water.*—Whosoever being supplied with water by the trust from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the trust, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have such access shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

3. *Damming up water without consent.*—Whosoever shall without the consent, in writing, of the trust, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

4. *Diverting water from reservoirs of trust in certain cases.*—In any case in which the trust have the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the trust or under their management or control the stormwater having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks, or some watercourse leading thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit, on conviction, a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

5. *Shooting or fishing in or near reservoirs.*—It shall be lawful for the trust, from time to time, to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl and the taking of fish upon, or in, or within one-quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the trust; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

6. *Obstructing &c., culverts, &c.*—Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the trust shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding *Five pounds*.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency, the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it was amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or bark from the Crown Lands in the parishes of Lockwood and Mandurang, in the county of Bendigo, permanently reserved for Victorian Water Supply purposes by Order of the sixteenth day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and described in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.—(83.S.25807.)

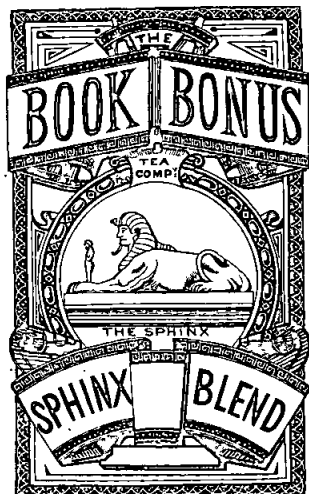
