SHIPS OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, exempting from re-measurement sailing and steam ships belonging to the United States of America, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH 1883.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers; and, thereupon, it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage, denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships, is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.

And whereas it was made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act had been, with certain exceptions, adopted by the Government of the United States of America, and Her Majesty, by Order in Council dated the 30th day of July 1868, was pleased to direct that the merchant ships of the said United States of America the measurement whereof should, after the 1st of January 1865, have been ascertained and denoted on the registers and other national papers of such ships, testified by the dates thereof, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships, after making therefrom the same deductions, in respect of crew space and engine room, as would, if such ships were British, be made from their gross tonnage, under the laws relating to British ships:

And whereas the Government of the said United States of America have provided that, on and after the 5th day of August 1882, a deduction from the gross tonnage of every vessel of the United States, shall, on measurement or re-measurement thereof, be made for crew space in sailing ships, and for crew and engine space in steam ships:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that, in consequence of such last recited provision, the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, have been adopted by the Government of the United States of America, with the exception of a difference in the mode of certain steamers, of estimating the allowance for engine room, and such rules are now in force in that country, having come into operation on the 5th day of August 1882, and that it is desirable that the ships of the said United States, measured or re-measured as aforesaid, on or after

the said 5th day of August 1882, shall, instead of requiring re-measurement in the United Kingdom for crew space in sailing ships, or for crew and engine space in steam ships, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows:—

1. As regards sailing ships; that merchant sailing ships of the said United States of America, the measurement whereof after the said 5th day of August 1882 has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers, and other national papers, in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of British sailing ships, is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.
2. As regards steam ships; that merchant ships belonging to the said United States of America, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 5th day of August 1882, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steam ships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers or other national papers in the same manner, and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the owner or master of any such American steam ship desires the deduction for engine room in his ships to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships, instead of under the American rule, the engine room shall be measured, and the deduction calculated, according to the British rules.

HAURAKI GULF, NORTH ISLAND, N.Z.—EXHIBITION OF LIGHT
ON MOKO HINOU ISLAND, AND ALTERATION TO TIRI TIRI
LIGHT.

WITH reference to the preliminary notices issued by this Depart-
ment, dated the 6th day of December 1882, and the 29th March
1883, it is hereby notified that, on and after Monday, the 18th
day of June 1883, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse
which has been erected on Moko Hinou Island, the position and
characteristics of which are as follow:—

The lighthouse is situated on Burgess Island, one of the Moko
Hinou Group, at the entrance to Hauraki Gulf, North Island,
New Zealand; lat. 35° 55' 15" S., long. 175° 8' 47" E. The tower is
46 feet in height from base to top of cowl, and is painted white.
The light will be a *first order flashing white light*, visible all round
seaward, and will show a flash every ten seconds.

The light is elevated 385 feet above the sea, and, allowing
15 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of
about 26 nautic miles in clear weather, and at lesser distances
according to the state of the atmosphere.

On the same night that the Moko Hinou Light is exhibited,
a section of the Tiri Tiri Light will be altered to show *red over an
arc of about 23°* from over Flat Rock on to Kawau Island, the
rest of the light remaining white as at present. The red light
will show between the bearings from seaward of S. ½ E. and
S.S.E. ½ E.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR THE POLICE FORCE.

A LIMITED number of Candidates being required for the
Police Force, applications from persons desirous of being
employed therein will be received at the Police Depot, Victoria
Barracks, St. Kilda road, on Tuesday the 31st July next at Ten
a.m., and on the following Tuesday, 7th day of August next, at
the same hour.

Each applicant must present personally a written application
in his own handwriting, when, if considered suitable, he will be
examined by the Board appointed by the Government for the
purpose.

As no exceptions to the rule above set forth will be made, it
will be useless to make application for admittance into the force
in any other manner or place than as above prescribed.

Candidates will not be appointed if over the age of thirty
years, and if for employment in the mounted force must be under
twenty-five. Applicants for the foot police must be at least
five feet nine inches in height. Candidates for the mounted
police must be at least five feet seven inches high, must not

exceed eleven stone seven pounds in weight, and must be able to
ride well.

All candidates must be smart and active, of a strong constitu-
tion, and free from any bodily complaint or defect. To ascertain
these facts independently candidates must undergo a strict
medical examination.

They must be able to read and write well, and must indispens-
ably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candi-
dates who have served in any other force or Government
department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

POLICE REGULATIONS — TRAVELLING
ALLOWANCES.

THE Governor in Council has rescinded the Police Travelling
Allowance Regulations of the 28th October 1878, published
in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of November 1878, p.
2781, and has approved of the following Regulations, which are
to be observed in lieu thereof from and after the 1st day of July
1883, viz:—

POLICE TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE REGULATIONS.

For Officers.

s. d.

1. For each day on which an officer travels not less than
thirty miles on duty, or is necessarily absent from
his station on duty not less than eight hours ... 7 0
2. For each night necessarily absent from his station on
duty ... 5 0

For Sub-Officers and Constables.

3. For each day on which a sub-officer or constable
travels not less than thirty miles on duty, or is
necessarily absent from his station on duty not less
than eight hours ... 1 6
4. For each night necessarily absent from his station on
duty, travelling where police sleeping accommo-
dation is available ... 1 0
5. For each night necessarily absent from his station on
duty, travelling where police sleeping accommo-
dation is not available ... 3 6
6. For each night wholly spent in travelling on duty ... 3 6
7. For each day and night, when temporarily stationed
at any place where police sleeping accommodation
is available ... 1 0
8. For each day and night, when temporarily stationed
at any place where police sleeping accommodation
is not available ... 2 0

9. Members of the force will be allowed, when trans-
ferred from one station to another on account of
the exigencies of the service, and not in conse-
quence of their own request or fault, reimburse-
ment, upon vouchers, of a portion of the expenses
of their removal as follows:—Officers—The actual
necessary cost of transport of not exceeding ten
hundredweight of luggage, and half the actual
necessary cost of conveyance of their wives and
children. Sub-Officers and Constables—The actual
necessary cost of transport of five hundredweight
of luggage, and half the actual necessary cost of
conveyance of their wives and children.

a. These regulations apply only within or near the border of
Victoria.

b. The absence while travelling thirty miles, or for eight hours,
must be continuous.

c. For any day for which a member of the force receives an
allowance as a witness attending court, he will not be entitled
to claim also under these regulations.

d. Under these regulations the day shall be reckoned to com-
mence at 5 a.m. and end at 9 p.m.; and the night to begin at
9 p.m. and end at 5 a.m.

e. Members of the force who claim for an absence of eight
hours, extending past 9 a.m., cannot also claim for the night.

f. Eight hours' absence cannot be claimed for ordinary beat
duty, nor for other similar duty at elections, races, shows, &c.,
under a distance of four miles one way.

g. No allowance will be paid under these regulations for at-
tendance at races, sports, shows, &c., when refreshments or an
allowance of money in lieu thereof is given by the managers of
the sports, &c., &c.

h. Claims under sections 1 and 3, for travelling home after
a night's absence, must account satisfactorily for eight hours
being taken to reach home, when the distance is under twenty
miles.

i. In reckoning distances travelled by claimants, four (4) miles
by railway, or two (2) by public conveyance, shall be reckoned
as one (1) mile.

j. Allowances under sections 7 and 8 will not, as a rule, be
continued beyond two months.

DISSOLUTION OF AN UNION UNDER "THE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might, at any time, if he think fit, and should at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by proclamation: And whereas the Borough of Amherst and the Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes were proclaimed a Union on the twenty-seventh day of June One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Talbot and the Council of the Shire of Talbot, which respectively represent the Borough of Amherst and the Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes, have requested that the said union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation dissolve the union of the Borough of Amherst and the Road Board District of Amherst and Clunes for the purposes of the said Act.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and in the forty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1882-83.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations.

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE GRANT OF NINE THOUSAND POUNDS (£9,000) FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, ETC.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any Public Park or Garden having a claim on the grant, and whose claims have not been satisfied under Regulations of 30th January 1883, for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, formation of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve in such park or garden between 1st January 1882 and 31st December 1882, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim has been received by the Acting Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 23rd June 1883.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any Public Park or Garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st January 1882 and 31st December 1882; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance or any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1882.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any Public Park or Garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1882, and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions, as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy.

4. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne nor to the Botanical Garden of Geelong.

5. A sum of Two hundred pounds (£200) shall be paid to the treasurer of the Borough Council of Dunolly, as subsidy for expenditure, during the years 1873 to 1882 inclusive on Public Parks and Gardens under the control of the borough council.

6. A sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds shall be paid to the treasurer of the Chiltern Shire Council as subsidy for expenditure during the year 1879 on Chiltern Public Park.

7. The balance of the grant shall be distributed *pro rata* on expenditure, from funds locally contributed, on Public Parks

and Gardens to the treasurer of the managing body of any Public Park or Garden having a claim on the grant under Regulations of 30th January 1883, and Clause 1 of the present Regulations.

NOTICE TO TRESPASSERS.

"If any person wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Board or company in the execution of his duty upon any railway, pier, station, or any land or premises in connection therewith, or wilfully trespass upon any such railway, pier, station, land, or premises, or neglect and omit to shut and fasten any gate set up across or at either side of any railway, so soon as he or they and the carriage, cattle, or other animals under his or their care have passed through the same, every person so offending shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds."
