DANISH STEAM VESSELS.

THE accompanying copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, exempting Danish Steam Vessels from re-measurement, which has been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is published for general information.

Present :

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, it is enacted that, whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships, for the time being in force under the principal Act, have been adopted by the Government of any foreign country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other national papers; and, thereupon, it shall no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry, or other papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage, denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships, is to be deemed the tonnage of such ships.

And whereas by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1876* it is enacted that "where Her Majesty has power under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, or any Act passed or hereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty from time to time to make such Order in Council, and by Order in Council to revoke, alter, or add to, any Order so made."

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February 1868, Her Majesty, to whom it was made to appear that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under *The Merchant Shipping Act 1854*, had been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the King of Denmark, and were in force in that country, was pleased to direct that the ships of Denmark the certificates of Danish nationality and registry of which were dated on or after the 1st day of October 1867, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry.

And whereas certain modifications were subsequently made in the said rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships in Denmark, whereby from and after the 1st day of October 1873 the allowance for engine room in certain steam ships would be estimated in a mode differing from that in force in this country; and it was made to appear to Her Majesty that it was desirable to alter the said first recited Order in Council so far as the same applied or related to the mode of estimating the allowance for engine room in Danish steam ships.

And whereas Her Majesty by Order in Council dated the 30th day of December 1873 was pleased to direct as regards Danish steamships that if the owner or master of any Danish steamship measured after the said 1st day of October 1873 desires the allowance for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the

British instead of under the Danish rules, such engine room shall be measured, and the allowance calculated according to the British rules.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient that certain additions should be made to the provisions of the said last recited Order in Council in regard to the mode of estimating the net registered tonnage of certain Danish steamships.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is further pleased to direct as follows, viz., that in the event of the net registered tonnage of merchant ships belonging to the said Kingdom of Denmark, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room estimated under the British rules being denoted in the said certificates of Danish nationality and registry issued on or after the 1st day of September 1882, such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted in the said certificates.

NEW LIGHTS AT POINT ARCHER AND ROCKY ISLET.

NOTICE is hereby given, that on and after this date, two new lights will be exhibited from Point Archer and Rocky Islet respectively. The former, which stands on the highest part of the point, at an elevation of 220 feet above high-water, consists of a 4th order holophotal condensing apparatus exhibited from a circular tower forty-five feet in height.

The light is seen from the southward, from Cape Tribulation round to S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., but is intensified on a N.W. by N. bearing, when it is in line with the light on Rocky Islet. It is obscured between the bearings of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. and S. by E. South-easterly, when it is seen as a green light, until it bears S. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. Between that bearing and S.S.E. it is seen as a white light, and again as a red light from the latter bearing to S.E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

The apparatus at Rocky Islet is a holophote, showing a beam of light S.E. by S. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. The light is exhibited from a tower 20 feet high, standing on the western slope of the islet, at an elevation of 90 feet above high-water.

The lights can be seen at a distance of 20 and 14 miles respectively.

The two lights in line give nearly a mid-channel course between a reef and Point Thomas.

While the light on Point Archer is visible to the westward of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S., vessels are clear of c and c reefs.

The eastern edge of the green sector cuts the western edge of d reef.

While in the white sector vessels are clear of d reef on the one hand, and the Blackbird Patch on the other.

In working to the southward, after passing Monk-house Point, vessels may stand into Walker Bay as far as the western edge of the red sector, which leads clear of the rocky ground in the Bay.

Directions.—Vessels from the northward leaving the Endeavour River will, by night, when steering to the south-eastward pass through the red sector; and those rounding Cape Bedford, and steering for Monk-house Point, will pass through the green sector and into the white sector of the light on Point Archer, steering for it until nearly abreast the southern end of Walker Bay. They will then cross the green and obscured sectors, rounding Walker and Archer Points, and Rocky Islet at a safe distance. After passing the latter the two lights should be brought into line on a N.W. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. bearing, and kept in that position until a reef is passed.

Similarly, vessels from the southwards steering to clear a reef with the lights in line will, after rounding Rocky Islet and passing Walker Point cross the obscured and green sectors, and keep within the white sector until d reef and the Blackbird Patch are passed.

SAILING DIRECTIONS FOR THAMES RIVER, NEW ZEALAND.

THE Harbor-master at the Thames reports that the color of the light on Curtis's Wharf at that port has been changed from green to white; and that the buoys in the Thames River have, with one exception, been done away with, and beacons erected instead on the banks of the river up to the Hauraki sawmills. The beacons are diamond-shaped, painted black, with a large white ball in the centre, and stand 8 feet off the ground measured to the lower angle of the diamond; the face of the beacon measures 7 feet each way, consequently their extreme height will be about 15 feet.

The sailing directions for approaching the river are as follow: When about four miles from the mouth of the river the Fairway Buoy will be seen, which should be left on the port hand. The Fairway Buoy is black-and-white chequers, with the word "Fairway" painted on it in white letters. After passing the Fairway Buoy, Opani Point, in a line with a clump of willows at Kopu, should be steered for, leaving the Swashway Buoy (black) and the Sandspit Beacon (upright spar with cask perch,

also black) on the port hand, taking care not to approach either too close, as the sandbank on that side is making out. Upon arriving off Opuni Point, about 1½ cables length off, a red buoy will be seen, which must be left on the starboard hand about a cable off. From the red buoy steer up to the first beacon on the left bank of the river, thus clearing Kopu Wharf. When pretty well up to the beacon another one will show nearly astern, and by looking up the river on the right-hand side another beacon will be seen; these two last mentioned are to be kept in line ahead and astern, as they show mid-channel. The same will occur upon arriving in the vicinity of the next, when another will be seen astern, and one upon the opposite bank, to be kept, as before, ahead and astern, and so on from side to side until arriving at the sawmills.

HOBART MARINE BOARD.

Bye-Law No. 15.

A Bye-law to regulate and determine the Rates of Pilotage and Fees for service by the Harbor-master.

At a meeting of the Hobart Marine Board, at which a majority of the members were present, the following Bye-law was duly made and passed, pursuant to the powers vested in the Board by *The Marine Board Act* (21 Victoria, No. 16) and of every other power enabling the Board in that behalf:—

1. Bye-law No. 3 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.
2. Clauses 7 and 9 of Bye-law No. 4 shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Pilotage.

3. The rate of pilotage payable on and in respect of vessels not exempt therefrom, on each and every occasion on entering into the Port of Hobart, shall (save as hereinafter provided) be as follows:—

For every sailing vessel, the sum of Sixpence per ton.
For every steam vessel, the sum of Fourpence per ton.

Provided that the total amount payable by any vessel so entering the said port shall not exceed the sum of £15 nor be less than the sum of £4.

4. Any vessel under 80 tons register shall not be liable to pay pilotage unless the master thereof shall require and employ the services of a pilot.

5. All vessels (other than such as are exempted from pilotage by the said Act or any amendment thereof) entering the Port of Hobart, and exceeding 80 tons register, shall be liable to pilotage whether a pilot be actually employed or not.

Harbor Dues.

6. The following services performed to any vessel by or under the direction of the Harbor-master shall (save as hereinafter provided) be severally paid for at the rate of One halfpenny per ton; that is to say:—

- For mooring or anchoring on arrival.
- For unmooring and moving to the wharf.
- For hauling off the wharf and re-mooring.
- For unmooring and moving to a fairway to sea.
- For any removal from one place of anchorage or mooring to another.

Provided that the total amount payable for all or any one or more of the several services above mentioned shall not exceed the sum of £7 10s.

7. This Bye-law shall commence and take effect on and from the 1st day of August next.

BETHANGA PARK, SHIRE OF TOWONG.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Public Recreation, in the parish of Berringa, known as "Bethanga Park."

THE Council of the Shire of Towong, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation, in the parish of Berringa, known as Bethanga Park, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order to decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve known as "Bethanga Park" shall be parcelled out into the following divisions:—

1. The Cricket Ground.
2. The remainder of the park.

2. "Bethanga Park" shall be open free of charge from sunrise till sunset, except on days set apart for shows, races, sports, fêtes, and holiday amusements, on which occasions a charge for the admission of every adult may be made.

3. The following is the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to any of the above-named divisions of "Bethanga Park":—

For admission of every adult person to the second division, such sum as the council may determine, not exceeding	0	2	6

4. The council may allow any duly recognized committee of any shows, races, sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements to use any of the above-named divisions of "Bethanga Park," and such committee shall abide by any order given by the council in reference to the park, or buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon.

5. No person shall remain in "Bethanga Park" who shall offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

6. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in "Bethanga Park," or light fires therein.

7. No person shall climb upon or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage the trees, seats, or any buildings whatsoever, or roll or throw stones in "Bethanga Park."

8. No person shall put any horses or cattle in "Bethanga Park," or take horses therein, without first obtaining the written sanction of the council.

9. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in "Bethanga Park," shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

10. No person shall erect any dwelling in "Bethanga Park," nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the council first obtained.

11. The council may allow quiet horses or cattle to be depastured in "Bethanga Park," and use the proceeds of such agistment of stock for the maintenance of the park.

12. The council may from time to time appoint a caretaker of "Bethanga Park" who shall carry out these Regulations, and enforce the same in accordance with the directions of the council.

13. Any person committing in "Bethanga Park" or in any of the buildings, or other erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the park, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission to the park or any division thereof:—

1. Assaulting any person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Crossing or trespassing on the cricket or playing ground during the time any cricket match, or other amusement is taking place, or when crossing or trespassing on such ground would be injurious to the several purposes for which the same is set apart.
4. Using profane or obscene language.
5. Using abusive or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Obtaining admission into the park or any buildings thereon when not entitled to such admission, or refusing to surrender (if required) to any gatekeeper, or other person having authority from the council to demand production of the same, any ticket duly authorizing admission to that division of the park where such person shall be found.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

WATER SUPPLY.

By-law No. 34.—For making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.

THE Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford order as follows :-
The Council of the Borough of Daylesford doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by "The Local Governing Bodies Loan Act 1872," make the following rate from the date hereof upon all lands and tenements within the water supply district, that is to say :-

The rates and charges hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied, viz. :-

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20, and under the annual minimum sum of £1 sterling, except for lands where no water is laid on, and on these the annual sum of 2s per cent. on the amount of the valuation.
2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding £200 per annum, the annual sum of 2s per cent. on valuation.
3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the annual sum of 4s 10s. per cent. on the amount of valuation.
4. On warehouses and wholesale stores, not being domiciles or used in retail business, 4s per cent. on valuation.
5. On every hotel of the annual value of £33 and under, a minimum rate of 40s. per annum.
6. On every hotel above the annual value of £33, 26 per cent. per annum on the valuation.
7. Livery and coach-horse stables, and hotel premises where horses are constantly kept, to be charged for at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. Private premises, 10s. for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. for each additional horse.
8. Cows, 1s. each per annum.
9. Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.
10. Government departments at the rate of 2s. per 1000 gallons.
11. Water supplied for steam boilers at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.
12. For water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket clubs, &c., 1s. 6d. per 1000 gallons, provided the quantity consumed is not less than 20,000 gallons per annum.
13. For water supplied to manufactories, aerated-water makers, &c., 1s. 6d. per 1000 gallons.
14. For water supplied to hospitals or charitable institutions, 1s. 6d. per 1000 gallons.
15. For water supplied from stand-pipes, 1s. per load of 100 gallons or less.

16. For water supplied temporarily to buildings in course of progress, 20s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1000 gallons.

17. Water for mining purposes to be as per agreement.

[These rates shall be payable by equal instalments on the 1st day of January, April, July, and October in each year, except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the council in each case; and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water.]

18. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house, walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the council; and no cock or tap, with any connection for attaching hose, shall be affixed to any service-pipe, connection, or fitting, without the written authority of the council.

19. The council may cause meters to be affixed in each case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by special arrangement. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

20. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

(a.) A meter shall not be used unless the same is of a kind and is placed in a situation approved in each instance by a memorandum in writing made by the duly authorised officer of the Council.

(b.) Every meter shall be so placed as to be open to inspection, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

(c.) A meter shall not be used, or be continued to be used, if it is found, on being tested by the council, to be inaccurate.

(d.) A meter shall not be connected to more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the council, unless permitted by a memorandum in writing under the hand of the duly authorised officer of the council.

21. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the council, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the council.

22. Any person receiving water from the council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

23. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

24. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

25. Before any such license shall be granted by the council, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the council that he is a competent person, and pay the sum of £1 as the fee for such license. The council shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

26. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, without giving two days' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

27. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council. Wrought galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service-pipe of a larger bore than ½-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the council.

28. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service-pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said council

may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

29. Any person supplied with water by the council, who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council.

30. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of the offence from the council. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

31. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the council.

32. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof; and such bath shall be provided with a proper well-fitted and perfectly water-tight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

33. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

34. If any person supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

35. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the council, shall be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

All lands abutting on the main street: Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment No. 1, township of Walhalla, and terminating at the north-west corner of allotment No. 123, Main road west, and including all lands abutting on the said roads between the aforesaid allotments.

2. After the expiration of seven years from the coming into force of this regulation, it shall not be lawful for any person, within the limits defined and described in the last preceding section, "without the consent of the Council," to use, keep, continue, or suffer to remain any fireplace or chimney, or the enclosure of any fireplace or chimney, constructed wholly or in part of any combustible or inflammable material.

3. A fee of not less than Five shillings, nor more than Forty shillings, shall be charged and received on account of the borough fund, by the proper officer of the Council, for any inspection, superintendance, or other services made or performed by him; and the said fee shall be paid by the owner or occupier on demand; and if such owner or occupier fail or refuse to pay the said fee when so demanded, the amount of the said fee or fees, with costs, may be recovered by the proper officer aforesaid, before any two or more justices.

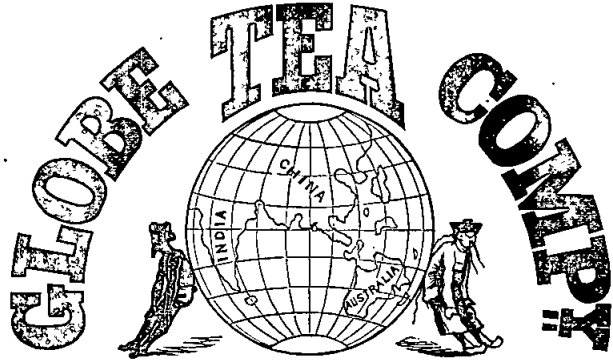

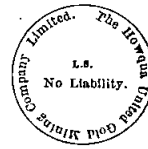

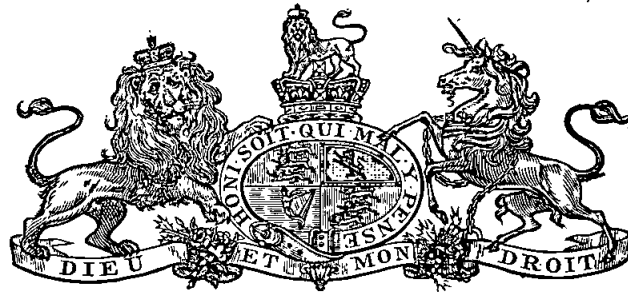

The births of 844 children, viz., 446 boys and 398 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June. In the month of May 850 births were registered, or 6 more than in the month under review. The births were 85 above the average of the previous nine years, but exactly the same as that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 437, viz., 238 of males, and 199 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 407. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 51, but exceeded the average of June during the previous ten years by 49. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by only 1.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 2.90, and of deaths registered 1.50.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.2° on the 15th and 16th, and the lowest was 37.3° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (53.4°) was more than four and a half degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.3°) took place on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 61.2° to a minimum of 37.9°. The least range (6.4°) was on the 23rd, viz., from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 50.8°. The mean daily range was 12.25°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.991 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 28 per cent. to that mortality as against 35 per cent. in June 1882; 32 per cent. in June 1881; 36 per cent. in June 1880; 27 per cent. in June 1879; 20 per cent. in June 1878; 38 per cent. in June 1877; 30 per cent. in June 1876; 32 per cent. in June 1875 and June 1874; and 33 per cent. in June 1873.

Nineteen deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a station employe, aged 75, died of heart disease; a gardener, aged 75, and a carpenter, aged 80, of pneumonia; a pensioner and a brewer, each aged 75, a female, aged 75, a bootmaker, aged 76, a female, aged 80, and an engineer, aged 81, of bronchitis; a farmer, aged 76, of fracture of the skull; a cabinetmaker, aged 76, and a laborer, aged 78, of liver disease; a carpenter, aged 77, and a male of occupation unstated, aged 83, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of brain disease; a female, aged 81, a farmer, aged 83, and two females aged 85 and 92 respectively, of old age.

Only 15 deaths were set down to external causes during the month, all of which were ascribed to accident. The following are the particulars:—A boy, aged 7, died of injuries received through the upsetting of a cart; a carpenter, aged 20, of fracture of the skull, leg, &c., caused by falling from a building; a laborer, aged 40, of fracture of the skull, caused by a ladder falling on him; a laborer, aged 40, of fracture of the bladder, caused by a man falling on him; a farmer, aged 76, of fracture of the skull, caused by falling over a log; a carrier, aged 33, of fracture of the skull, caused by being thrown from a van; a night watchman, aged 72, was killed by a train which passed over him; a cooper, aged 25, died of hemorrhage, consequent on amputation of the leg after erysipelas. A male child, aged 2, a groom, aged 29, and 2 laborers, aged 45 and 46 respectively, were drowned; a male infant, aged 4 months, a female infant, aged 5 months, were suffocated in bed; and a female, aged 35, was suffocated in a fit.

One hundred and eight deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 8 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 122, of which 63, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 59, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 91 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 315. Of these, 175, or 56 per cent., were males, and 140, or 44 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 22 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 24 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 25 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 9 were upwards of eighty.

In June, as compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 94 to 70. Under this head, measles and scarlatina, each of which caused 1 death in May, entirely disappeared as fatal complaints; deaths from typhoid fever fell from 49 to 23, and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 22 to 21. Deaths from developmental diseases also decreased from 65 to 49. Under this head, deaths from premature birth fell from 12 to 10, those from old age from 22 to 15, and those from atrophy and debility from 28 to 17. Only 1 death was set down to childbirth during the month.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations are published in pursuance of section 10 of *The Victorian Exhibitions Act 1878*.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE EXHIBITION TRUSTEES.

1. The Trustees shall meet from time to time, at a place and hour to be fixed in the notice of meeting.
2. Three members shall form a quorum. If that number be not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for the meeting, the members present may adjourn to a particular day, and receive notices of motion for the next or any other day of meeting.
3. At all meetings the Chairman shall take the chair, and may vote, and, in case of equality of votes, shall have a casting vote. In the absence of the Chairman the meeting shall elect their chairman, who may vote, and in all cases shall also have a casting vote.
4. The Chairman shall have power to call a meeting at twenty-four hours' notice; and, on the receipt of the requisition of four members, shall call a meeting on not less than twenty-four hours' notice.
5. All proceedings of the Trustees shall be entered in a journal; and the first business at each meeting shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall, if necessary, be corrected, and, when confirmed, be signed by the Chairman.
6. Notice of the business to be considered at each meeting shall accompany the notice to attend, and may be delivered or transmitted by post within a reasonable time before the meeting.
7. All receipts, income, and moneys, from whatever source received by or on account of the Trust, shall be paid forthwith, in the name of the Trust, into such bank or banks as the Trustees may from time to time select, and shall be applied towards the maintenance of the Exhibition Buildings and grounds, the carrying out of any scheme the Trustees may adopt in connection therewith, and as they may from time to time direct.
8. The Finance Committee, which shall consist of three members of the Trust, to be elected annually, shall supervise the accounts of receipts and expenditure. All vouchers shall be certified to by the responsible officer of the Trust, as a guarantee of their correctness. All accounts shall be examined by the Finance Committee, and then be brought before a general meeting of the Trustees to be passed for payment, with the exception of current accounts for salaries and wages, which may be paid from time to time, as they fall due. All cheques shall be signed by the Chairman and any other member of the Trust, and countersigned by the Secretary.
9. The Chairman, at each meeting of the Trust, shall affix his signature to the Government forms for the accounts submitted.
10. The seal of the Trust shall be kept in the custody of the Secretary, and shall be attached (in the presence of the Chairman and two other members of the Trust) to all contracts entered into by the Trustees as evidencing the execution of such contracts by them, the attachment of the seal being attested by the Secretary.
11. All officers and employes of the Trustees who may be entrusted with the moneys of the Trust shall find security.
12. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already been passed by the Trustees, shall be entertained, unless a call of the whole of the Trustees has been duly made for that purpose; and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the Trustees, which shall have been negatived by the Trustees, shall be again entertained, unless by consent of a majority of the Trustees.
13. The Press shall not be admitted to any meetings of the Trust, but the Secretary shall supply the newspapers with the proceedings of the Trustees, and with a report of their meetings held from time to time, previously submitting the matter to the Chairman.
14. Any alterations to the building or grounds shall be under the supervision of the Building Committee, which shall consist of three members, to be elected annually, but no alterations shall be made without the consent of a majority of the Trustees.

Prevention of Fire.

15. No canvas or calico linings shall be allowed in any part of the Exhibition Buildings, either as screens, ceilings, or for any

other purpose, except when the Trustees may grant special permission; in such cases the linings shall be previously saturated with alum, or such other non-inflammable preparation as the Trustees may approve.

16. No movable gas-brackets or other portable appliances for lighting shall be used in the Exhibition Buildings, except by special consent of the Trustees.

17. All artificial light, except that created by ordinary coal gas or electricity, or other approved means, shall be prohibited, except in special cases where it may be permitted by the Trustees.

18. No fire in the building or grounds will be allowed except those authorized by the Trustees.

General Regulations.

19. The price of admission to the Exhibition Building and grounds, as specified in the Second Schedule to the Act No. 619, shall be such sum (if any) as the Trustees may deem advisable, during such hours and on such days as the Trustees may decide that the building and grounds may be kept open for the admission of the public; provided that when the main hall or any other portion of the building is let for any concert, bazaar, or other entertainment, the lessee or lessees shall place their own servants at the gates and doors to collect the charge they may demand from the public.

20. No person visiting or walking through the grounds shall walk elsewhere than on the footpaths.

21. No person shall remove or damage any of the seats, lamps, trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuary, lakes, fountains, aquaria, fish, or birds, or any other material or property in the above-named grounds; and no person shall throw stones or other missiles, or smoke, or light fires therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or litter, or refuse of any kind.

22. No person shall enter the grounds otherwise than by the public gates, or climb or jump over the seats or fences in and around the said grounds, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences or on the gates, or cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write, or print, or stick bills thereon.

23. No person shall bring into the grounds any vehicle, or horse, or dog, or other animal.

24. No child under seven years of age shall be allowed in the grounds unless in charge of an adult friend or nurse.

25. Any person found in the Exhibition Building in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said building, gardens and grounds any act of indecency, or damaging the building or any part thereof, shall be expelled from the said building, gardens and grounds, and may be forthwith removed therefrom by any constable; and any such person shall also be liable to prosecution for a breach of these Regulations.

26. No persons, except artisans, laborers, or workmen employed in the grounds shall enter any plots which may be enclosed within the said grounds, and then only such plots as they may be employed in, except by order of the Trustees.

27. Any person who gains admittance to the Exhibition Building, gardens or grounds otherwise than as herein provided, or, being in, does contravene or not observe these Rules, Regulations, and Conditions, shall be and be deemed to be excluded from the said building, gardens and grounds, and liable to be forthwith removed, as stated in clause 25, and also to be prosecuted as for a contravention of the Rules, Regulations, and Conditions, as the said Act, No. 619, directs.

28. Every Trustee, upon presenting his medal, shall have at all times, even when the main hall or any other portion of the Exhibition Building is let for entertainments or any other purpose, full power and authority to enter and inspect all any every portion of the building and grounds as he may desire.

29. Any person who lights, or assists in lighting, any match, paper, wood, straw, or any other combustible material on the grounds or in the buildings of the Trust, except by direction of the Trustees, and any person who is found using any lighted pipe or open light on the grounds or in the buildings shall be dealt with as in clause 25 of the Regulations.

Sanitary Regulations.

30. Refuse shall only be placed at the appointed places for removal.

31. Places have been provided in different parts of the building for the purposes of public convenience, and no person is permitted

to use any other place; and if any one be found offending he will be liable to be permanently excluded from the building and dealt with as in clause 23 of these Regulations. All employees of the Trustees are required to prevent any breach of this Regulation.

Conditions of Hiring the Main Hall of the Exhibition Building.

32. For night use the ordinary charge shall be £25 each evening for day use £15, and for day and night use £30, payable in advance, subject to any increase or remission that the Trustees may agree to make.

33. If the organ be used, the charge for it to be £10 in addition, subject as above.

34. Lessees to pay for the gas used during their occupation, and to arrange previously with the Gas Company, and settle with them.

35. Lessees to arrange and pay for the attendance of the caretaker and three men to attend to the lighting up of the building, to the fire apparatus, and the escape doors.

36. If attendance required in hat and cloak room, the attendants to be persons appointed by the chairman, but paid by the hirer of the hall, at the rate of 5s. each for a concert, and of 7s. 6d. each for the first two hours of a ball, and for every additional hour or part of an hour 1s. extra each.

37. Applications for the use of the hall to be made to the Trustees through the Secretary, who shall keep a book containing these conditions, and which shall be signed by each hirer.

38. The rent must be paid in advance, together with such deposit as may be determined by the Trustees as security against damage to the furniture or building; such deposit will, however, not be in satisfaction of any damage beyond that amount, but the hirer will be liable for all such greater damage to the full extent thereof.

39. The hirer must arrange for the placing and replacing of the chairs under the supervision of an overseer or servant of the Trust, and must also provide for the cleaning of the hall after any entertainment, &c.

40. The floors, walls, or any other parts of the building must not be broken or pierced by nails, screws, or other contrivances.

41. It shall be in the discretion of the Trustees to refuse the use of the building in any case.

42. The Trustees, and their officers shall, at all times and notwithstanding any hiring, be entitled to free access to any and every part of the building.

43. During the period of using the main hall all the doors of it must be kept unlocked and ready for use as escape doors in case of alarm from fire or other cause.

44. All concerts, bazaars, or other entertainments shall close not later than Eleven o'clock p.m., except permission be previously obtained from the Trustees.

45. In all cases where any damage shall be done, or where breach of these rules, regulations, and conditions by the lessees or their employes, the Trustees shall have power to forfeit their deposit or any part of it.

46. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of terminating any agreement, at any time, which may have been made with lessees.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency The Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the undermentioned commons in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE GLEN GRANT AND TARNAGULLA UNITED FARMERS' COMMON (within the Shire of Strathfieldsaye).—The portion of the Glen Grant and Tarnagulla United Farmers' Common, within the Shire of Strathfieldsaye, proclaimed a separate common by Order of 21st October 1867, increased by Order of 16th November 1868, and diminished by Order of 9th October 1882, is hereby further diminished by deducting therefrom 2450 acres of land, more or less, being the portion in the parish of Mandurang comprised within the area permanently reserved for Victorian Water Supply purposes by Order of 16th January 1883.—(83.S.26848.)

THE SANDHURST GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Sandhurst Goldfield Common, proclaimed by Order of 28th January 1861, increased by Order of 25th November 1861, modified by Order of 31st August 1863, and further increased by Orders dated respectively 14th December 1863, 21st March 1864, 19th November 1866, and 9th May 1870, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom 1850 acres of land, more or less, being the portion in the parishes of Lockwood and Mandurang comprised within the area permanently reserved for Victorian Water Supply purposes by Order of 16th January 1883.—(83.S.26848.)

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make and alter Regulations in pursuance of section 110 of the said Act, as hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Regulation to be read as section 15 A, chapter VI. of the Consolidated and Amended Regulations of the 1st April 1879:

1. Every application by a non-residence licensee, under section 11 of *The Land Act 1878*, for a certificate of improvements, as far as required, before the end of the third year of the currency of the license held by him, shall be in the form and accompanied by the declaration prescribed in Schedule XV A hereto, and the certificate of improvements issued by the Board of Land and Works with respect to such applications shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule XV B hereto.

Regulation to be read as section 1 B, chapter VII. of the Consolidated and Amended Regulations of the 1st April 1879:

2. Every application by a licensee, under section 19 of *The Land Act 1869*, as amended by *The Land Act 1878*, for a lease of Crown grant of the land held by him shall be in the form and shall be accompanied by the declaration prescribed in Schedule XVI B hereto.

Consolidated and Amended Regulations of 1st April 1879, Schedule IX.:

3. In Schedule IX. of the Consolidated and Amended Regulations of the 1st April 1879, the words "and that the Board of Land and Works shall not be liable to construct any crossings, or other accommodation works, under, over, or upon any railway which may be made through or near such land," shall be inserted after the word "severance" and before the word "and" in the eighth line.

Consolidated and Amended Regulations of 1st April 1879, Schedule X.:

4. In Schedule X. of the Consolidated and Amended Regulations of the 1st April 1879, the words "and that the Board of Land and Works shall not be liable to construct any crossings, or other accommodation works, under, over, or upon any railway which may be made through or near such land," shall be inserted after the word "thereon."

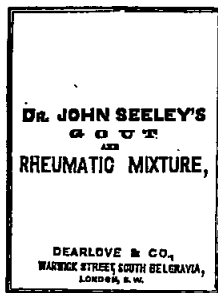
