Outer South Head Light—Intended alteration in character.

AUSTRALIA.—SOUTH COAST.—PORT PHILLIP.

(1) *St. Kilda, Harbor Light on Mole.*

THE Government of Victoria has given notice that, on 13th January 1883, a harbor light was exhibited from the extremity of the Mole at St. Kilda, eastern side of Hobson's Bay, Port Phillip:—

The light is a fixed green light, elevated 19 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 2 miles.

EAST COAST.—KEPPEL BAY.

(2) *Leading Light on Cape Capricorn.*

The Queensland Government has given notice that, on 2nd March 1883, a leading light of small power would be exhibited on the north-west slope of Cape Capricorn, south side of Keppel Bay:—

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 100 feet above the sea, and should be visible in the direction of Cape Capricorn lights in line from a distance of 14 miles.

This light kept in line with the main light on Cape Capricorn bearing S. 70° E., leads northward of Cottier Bank; and intersects the line of the leading lights on Sea Hill at a distance of nearly 3 miles from Timandra Bank buoy.

NOTE.—During south-easterly winds, small craft will find good anchorage under the lee of Cape Capricorn with the lights in line, in 3 fathoms water—with the main light just dipped behind

the buildings, and at the distance of a short quarter of a mile from the shore.

(The bearings are magnetic. Variation 8½° easterly in 1883.)

THE EXPLOSIVES ACT 1877.

THE Governor in Council has exempt the safety blasting powder manufactured by Mr. Henry S. Chittenden, Stawell West, from the operation of the following portions of the Regulations framed under *The Explosives Act 1877*, published in the *Government Gazette* of 13th December 1878, No. 127, viz:—

That portion of clause 4 commencing with the word "other" in the fourth line of the second paragraph, and ending with the word "building" in the eighth line thereof. That portion of clause 8 commencing with the word "and" in the fourth line of the first paragraph, and ending with the word "thereof" in the seventh line thereof.

The whole of the first and ninth paragraphs of clause 11, and with the advice aforesaid has made the following regulation to apply only to the safety blasting-powder above-mentioned, in lieu of the ninth paragraph of the said clause 11:—

Regulation.

All carriages used for the conveyance of safety blasting-powder shall be of good and substantial make, and shall be so constructed that the explosive conveyed therein shall be properly protected from the weather by fire-proof tarpaulings; and such carriages shall have the name of the explosive conveyed therein in plain and conspicuous letters on both sides thereof; and no such carriage shall at any time be used for the conveyance along a public road of a quantity of such explosive exceeding fifteen hundredweight (15 cwt.)

CONDITIONS.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which could interfere with the proper exercise of his profession.

He must possess one of the following qualifications:—Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University, passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or, having passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above named; or he shall produce such a certificate as to his competency in those three subjects as shall satisfy the Board of Examiners for Authorized Surveyors. He shall also, with such certificate, send in a specimen of his plan drawing.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination in trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing, on Thursday, 18th October, when the three competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

TERM OF SERVICE.

The pupil's service in the department will be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting for field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory, he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

REMUNERATION.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £52; 3rd year, £60; 4th year, £84.

SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Civil Service of Victoria dated 31st of December 1866, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

BONDS REQUIRED.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds of £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

By His Excellency the Most Honorable George Augustus Constantine, Marquis of Normanby, Earl of Mulgrave, Viscount Normanby, and Baron Mulgrave of Mulgrave, all in the County of York, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; and Baron Mulgrave of New Ross, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland; a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees should be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees should be disposed of, and at any time alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it was also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons should be published and all objections thereto should be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act; Now therefore I, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE RUTHERGLEN COMMON, proclaimed by Order of the 24th January 1876, and increased by Order of the 8th December 1879, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom twenty-one acres, more or less, of land, being the portions hereinafter described, viz.:—

Seven acres, more or less, county of Bogong, parish of Lilliput, being the portion of land lying between allotment 13 of section 1 and the road from Rutherglen to Wangaratta.

And Fifteen acres, more or less, county of Bogong, parish of Norong, being portion of the land lying between allotments 5 and 6 of section 1.—(1554 and 2902/47.)

REGULATION.

17. Sheep introduced from neighboring colonies.—Every sheep introduced by sea into the colony from any place in any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, except King's Island, shall, immediately on being landed, be removed to some quarantine ground determined by the Governor in Council, or to some store or place in the city of Melbourne, of which the Chief Inspector of Stock may, by writing under his hand, approve for that purpose, and which shall be deemed a quarantine ground, and shall be detained there until it has been dipped once, or oftener, as the Chief Inspector may direct, in the medicaments provided by the regulations under The Scab Act 1870, No. 370, and until the Chief Inspector, shall, by writing under his hand, authorize its removal.

And the Honorable John Felix Leven, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Alteration in the Scale of Fees for depasturing Stock on the Navarre Common.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of chapter xvii. of the Regulations made under the "Land Act 1869" by the Governor in Council, on the 1st day of April 1879, the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud, as Managers of the Navarre Common, did submit to the Board of Land and Works, for approval, certain Regulations for the Management of the said Common; and whereas such regulations, having been revised by the Board of Land and Works, were approved by the Governor in Council on the 1st day of May 1883; and whereas among other matters the Scale of Fees for depasturing Stock on the Navarre Common was fixed as follows:—

Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise, shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine, shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriageway, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot-passenger proceeding along the carriageway, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot-passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse, or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this Bye-law shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
