[REGULATIONS RELATING TO GOLD MINING LEASES.

- 4. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the any mechanical or artificial contrivation for conveying water to the roots of plants without labor), or for water-power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.
- 5. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- 6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 8. Before any such license shall be granted by the board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.
- 9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the board, without giving two days notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be

liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty

pounds.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe, to communicate with the pipes of the board, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

1. The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labor, and also all material where so specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, monthly, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied.

It will also be competent for any company or companies renting, using, or employing any of the drills belonging to the Department of Mines, to exercise, on behalf of the Department of Mines, or on their own behalf, all the rights, powers, and privileges conferred by the foregoing clauses, save and except that (clause 8) referring to giving notice, which will only vest in the parties named therein.

10. The Secretary for Mines shall from time to time communicate, in writing, to the contractor the name of the company or companies authorized to exercise such rights, powers, and privileges, and the contractor will not be required to acknowledge any other company or companies than those so named by the Secretary for Mines.

11. For the purposes of this contract, all the rights, power, and authority conferred upon the person indicated as the "officer in charge," shall also be taken to mean such officer or officers as the aforesaid company or companies shall nominate or appoint for the purpose.

12. Any company or companies having authority to order and receive supplies under this contract shall pay to the contractor the cost of such supplies before obtaining delivery thereof, and the accounts, in such cases, are not to be rendered to the Department of Mines, but to the company or companies direct.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No experiment or vivisection shall be performed by any person upon any animal under the provisions of the above Act unless the Governor in Council shall have granted to the said person a license to perform such experiment or vivisection.
- 2. Every such license shall be in the form, or to the effect set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed.
- 3. The Chief Secretary may direct any person performing experiments or vivisection under the said Act from time to time to make such reports to him of the results of such experiments or vivisection in such form, or with such details, as he may require.
- 4. No experiment or vivisection, as aforesaid, shall be performed for the purpose of obtaining manual skill, or merely satisfying curiosity.
- 5. In every experiment or vivisection the animal operated upon shall be kept thoroughly under the influence of some efficient anæsthethic during the time of such operation.
- 6. Where permanent injury, or abiding discomfort is likely to result from such experiment the person operating shall procure the extinction of the animal's life without delay, and in as painless a manner as possible.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF BROADFORD TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMONS.

In pursuance of the regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st April 1879, the managers of the Broadford Town and Farmers' Commons, having drafted the following regulations for the management thereof, submit the

same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the regulations heretofore in force in respect of such commons:—

in force in respect of such commons:—

Regulations.

1st. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers, may respectively depasture on the common, within five miles of their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof, in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of land occupied by him, may depasture on the Broadford Farmers' Common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2nd. Sheep or goats may be depastured on such portions only of the commons as the managers may set apart for that purpose; provided always that no one person shall be entitled to depasture on the commons more than three goats, and that the owners thereof provide a triangle, not less than three feet long, and keep it fastened on to each goat's neck whilst depasturing on the commons.

3rd: No bulls or he-goats shall be depastured on the commons without the authority, in writing, of the managers.

4th. All young cattle, the progeny of stock depasturing on the commons, may; while under six months old, run thereon free of

charge.

5th. All persons desirous of depasturing stock on the commons shall be in attendance therewith at the Broadford yards on the first Monday in January and July in every year for the purpose of giving a full and correct description of such stock, and assisting to brand the same, and shall pay the prescribed fees for such

6th. The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing

6th. The following shall be the scale of fees for depasturing stock on the commons, viz.:—

For every horse or mare, Six shillings per annum. For every head of horned cattle, Four shillings per annum. For every sheep or goat, Two shillings per annum. The fees for stock depasturing on the commons shall be paid by the owners of such stock half-yearly in advance, and the half-years shall commence respectively on the first Monday in January and July in every year, and the fee for the half-year then next ensuing shall be deemed to be due on the first Monday aforesaid.

7th. All cattle, horses, pigs, and goats found on the commons without the commons brand shall be deemed to be trespassing thereon, and may be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

8th. No person shall be permitted to remove any stock from the commons without having given notice to, and obtained permission from, the managers, or herdsman in charge of the commons.

the commons without having given notice to, and obtained parmission from, the managers, or herdsman in charge of the commons.

9th. The managers shall not be held responsible for any loss of, or injury to, stock depasturing on the commons, but shall, by their herdsman, take every possible care of such stock, and in the event of loss or injury, shall give to the owners every information and assistance.

10th. The managers shall cause to be removed from the commons all diseased stock which may, by a competent person, be declared to be diseased and dangerous to the health of the other stock on the commons, and may require the owner thereof to keep such stock off the commons; and should such owner refuse or neglect so to do, the managers may cause such diseased stock to be forthwith destroyed and buried, and the owner thereof shall be liable for any necessary expenses incurred in their destruction and interment.

11th. The managers may destroy any goats found upon the commons, unless such goats are branded with the commons brand, and have a triangle on their necks, as provided for in clause No. 2 of these regulations.

12th. No person shall wilfully injure or destroy, or unnocessarily disturb any stock depasturing upon the commons.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF BERRIMAL.

Regulations for the care, protection, and management of the Reserve for Cricket and other purposes of public recreation, in the parish of Berrimal.

WE, Olof Hoyen, Charles Price, Arthur Holt, George Brown, and William Brown, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for cricket and other purposes of public recreation in the parish of Berrimal, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 108 of The Land Act 1869.

Regulations.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of The Land Act 1863, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The births of 881 children, viz., 467 boys and 414 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 843 births were registered, or 38 fewer than in the month under review. The births were 143 above the average of the previous nine years, but only 60 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 422, viz., 237 of males, and 185 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 459. The deaths were fewer than those in June by 15, but exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 2. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than the average of those ten years

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was 3 02, and of deaths registered 1 45.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.0° on the lst, and the lowest was 31.7° on the 23rd. The mean temperature of the month (47.8°) was six-tenths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.2°) took place on the 24th, viz., from a maximum of 53.2° to a minimum of 33.0°. The least range (31°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 53.1° to a minimum of 50.0°. The mean daily range was 13.6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.021 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality as against 34 per cent. in July 1882; 33 per cent. in July 1881; 36 per cent. in July 1878; 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878; 33 per cent. in July 1879; 30 per cent. in July 1876; 29 per cent. in July 1875; 38 per cent. in July 1874; and 36 per cent. in July 1873.

The deaths of 26 persons who had attained the age of 75 years or upwards were recorded during the month. Of these a gentleman and a female, each aged 75, died of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of inflammation of the bowels; a female, aged 75, of stomach disease; a bootmaker, aged 76, a laborer, aged 78, and a female, aged 79, of apoploxy; a carpenter and a cabinet maker, each aged 79, of heart disease; a female, aged 79, of burns; 3 females, aged 77, 80, and 81 respectively, and a blacksmith, aged 83, of bronchitis; a woolclasser, aged 84, aged agentleman, aged 87, of paralysis; a laborer, aged 82, of inephritis; a gentleman and a female, cach aged 82, of idarrhous; a bootmaker, aged 84, of gout; a settler, and a male patient in the Lunatic Asylum, Kew, each aged 84, of brain disease; a farmer, aged 78, a wood-cutter, aged 80, and a hawker, aged 84, of old age.

As many as 30 deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 24 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A laborer, aged 13, was killed by falling from a lift; a grocer, aged 21, died of compound-fracture of the leg—cause not stated; a jockey, aged 24, of injuries received whilst riding in a stepelechase; a brick-carter was killed by falling from a load of bricks; a coaches; a brick-carter was killed by falling from a load of bricks; a coachen, aged 24, of injuries received whilst riding in a stepelechase; a brick-carter was killed by falling from a load of bricks; a coachen, aged 30, died of pertionitis, caused by a dray-wheel passing over him; a fellmonger, aged 30, of injury to the hand, sustained whilst working; a laborer, aged 39, was killed by a fall of

earth; a seaman, aged 40, by a train passing over him; a laborer, aged 45, by a fall from a ladder; an engine-driver; aged 45, died of an injury caused by a cart-wheel passing over him; a groom, aged 49, of internal injuries, caused by a kick from a horse; a dealer, aged 65, of injuries received in getting out of a train whilst in motion. A female, aged 33, died of a gunshot wound in the legal cocasioned by putting the barrel of an old loaded pistol into the fire; a female, aged 79, was burnt to death in her dwelling; a female infant, aged 1 year, was poisoned with lucifer matches; a male child, aged 1 year, was drowned by falling into a tub of water; a female infant, aged 24, a bricklayer, aged 23, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 45, were found drowned; a female infant, aged 1 day; a female infant, aged 6 days, and a male infant, aged 6 months, were suffocated in bed; a fireman, aged 39, was choked with a piece of meat. The homicidal death was that of an opium dealer, aged 40, who was wilfully nurdered. Of the suicidal deaths, a laborer, aged 57, cut his throat; a male, of occupation unknown, shot himself; a female, aged 27, poisoned herself with spirits of salts; a female, aged 57, drowned herself, and a cabman, aged 50, hanged himself.

Eighty sight deaths, a 21 per cent of the whole took place in public institutions, viz: —41 in the Melbourne Hospital.

Eighty-eight deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homocopathic Hospital, 4 in the Childrens' Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Industrial Schools.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 137, of which 76, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 61, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 87 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 3 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 285. Of these, 161, or 56 per cent., were males, and 124, or 44 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 21 were between twenty-five and firty-five, and thirty, 18 were between thirty-five and thirty-five and forty-five, 35 were between forty-and of forty-five, 35 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fixty and sixty-five and sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 13 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 13 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the previous month, deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 70 to 62. Under this head, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 23 to 15, those from dysentery and diarrhea from 21 to 11, and those from want of breast-milk from 5 to 2. On the other hand deaths from diphtheria rose from 1 to 2, those from influenza from nit to 2, those from croup from 4 to 6, and those from erysipelas from 1 to 3. The only class in which the mortality increased during the month was "violence," deaths from which rose from 15 to 30. The increase was principally in deaths from fractures and contusions, which rose from 7 to 12, and in those from suicide which rose from nil to 5. Three deaths were set down to the consequences of childbirth as against 1 such death in June.



BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

BYE-LAWS. Object.

1. The object of the institution is the establishment of a home for incurables.

Common Seal.

2. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a box with two locks and keys (one of which shall be kept by the treasurer, and the other by the secretary). The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or instrument except by order and in the presence of the committee, and shall be verified by the signature of the chairman and the secretary.

Contributors and their Privileges.

Contributors and their Privileges.

3. The following shall be life contributors:—Every donor of £20 or upwards in one year. Every person who shall raise £20 or upwards in one year, by one or more collections from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sun. The executor first named in any will by which £25 or upwards is bequeathed to the hospital, on proving the will and paying the bequest.

4. Every contributor of £1 per annum, and every contributor of £10 in one donation, shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings at which he or she may be present; and every contributor of £2 per annum, and every contributor of £50 in one donation, shall be entitled to two votes; and every contributor of £50 in one donation, shall be entitled to two votes; and every contributor of £50 in one donation, shall be entitled to three votes.

5. No annual contributor shall be entitled to exercise any privileges as such till the subscription for the past year shall have been paid. And every yearly subscription shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment, but no such first yearly payment shall entitle to a vote at a general meeting within three mouths from the date of such payment.

6. Any contributor being absent from the colony of Victoria may, by power of attorney, exercise all the privileges to which he or she would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be lodged for examination with the secretary forty-cight hours before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

7. Applicants for admission as inmates shall produce satisfactory proof that they are suitable and worthy objects for admission to the institution.

Officers and Committee.

Officers and Committee.

8. There shall be a president, vice-president, treasurer, and two auditors, as hereinafter provided, who shall hold office for a year, and until their successors are appointed, but they shall be eligible for re-election. The committee of management shall consist of twenty-two contributors, of whom six shall be ladies and sixteen gentlemen (inclusive of the honorary officers, viz., president, vice-president, and treasurer), of whom five shall form a quorum.

9. The president vice-president, the treasurer, and auditors shall retire from office at the annual general meeting in every year, and, if otherwise qualified, shall be eligible for re-election.

year, and, if otherwise qualified, shall be eligible for reelection.

10. The members of committee to be elected for three years,
one-third retiring by rotation each year, but eligible for reelection. During the first two years those retiring to be decided
by lot. Any vacancies occurring during the year may be
filled up by the committee.

11. The committee shall direct all business of the
hospital, shall provide all requisites for its use, may
appoint, hire, and discharge or dismiss all paid officers and
servants, and fix and pay all salaries and wages; may from
time to time make rules not inconsistent with these byelaws for the regulation of the hospital and of such paid
officers and servants, and generally, for all matters whether
of the same kind as those hereinbefore mentioned, or of a
different kind not provided for by law or by these bye-laws,
that they think proper.

12. The general committee shall meet once a fortnight, or oftener if necessary, on such day and at such bour and place as they may appoint, five to form a quorum.

The order of business to be as follows:—

To receive the reports of officers and visitors.

To decide on admission and discharge of immates.

To inquire into complaints, and to consider reports.

To ascertain that the duties of officers and servants are duly performed.

To attend generally to the business requirements of the institution.

To attend generally to the business requirements of the institution.

13. The president, or, in his absence, the vice-president or treasurer, shall preside at all meetings of the committee, and in their absence the majority present shall appoint their own chairman, and the president or chairman shall have an additional or easting vote.

14. Any member of the committee of management who shall be absent from four (4) consecutive meetings of the committee without leave from the committee shall cease to be a member. The remaining members shall have power to fill up all such vacancies.

15. The general committee may convene a special general meeting of contributors at any time upon giving notice at

least seven days previously in two or more of the Melbourne newspapers; which notice shall be advertised three times in each of such papers, and shall contain the particular subjects to be brought before such general meeting, and none other shall be discussed thereat. Any twenty contributors may request the committee to call a special meeting at any time, and should the committee after receiving such requisition, signed by twenty or more contributors, refuse or neglect to call such meeting within seven days, then any twenty contributors shall have power to convene such meeting upon giving notice as directed above.

16. At all meetings the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

Elections.

17. Any candidate for election shall furnish to the secretary in writing, three clear days prior to the day of election, a notification of his intention to become a candidate for election. notification of his intention to become a candidate for election. If less than the number to be elected be nominated, the meeting shall have power to nominate subscribers; and if more than those required to fill the vacancies be nominated, the election shall be decided by show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded by any candidate, to be taken on such day and at such place as may be appointed by the chairman, between the hours of Twelve noon and Four o'clock p.m., such ballot to be conducted by a member of the committee and two scrutineers appointed by the meeting. In all cases of equal voting the member of committee conducting the ballot shall have the casting vote. Visiting Committee.

Visiting Committee.

18. A visiting committee, consisting of three or five members, shall be elected by and from the general committee, and shall hold office for six months.

19. It shall be the duty of the visiting committee to inspect the institution in every particular, and all belonging thereto, and to offer any suggestions.

Religious Instruction.

20. The inmates of the institution shall be at liberty to receive religious instruction and consolution from the minister of the congregation or denomination to which they belong, at such time as the committee shall appoint.

Meetings.

21. Annual general meetings of contributors shall be held in the city of Melbourne, on the third Thursday in the month of January in every year, at such time and place as the general committee shall appoint, of which notice shall have been given in two or more Melbourne newspapers, seven clear days before the day of meeting, to receive a report from the committee, to elect members of committee, president, vice-president, treasurer, and auditors for the current year, and to transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given.

22. A special general meeting of contributors shall be held in the city of Melbourne annually, on the third Thursday in the month of July, to receive and consider the accounts and balance-sheet of the institution, and to transact any other business of which due notice shall have been given.

A sub-committee, consisting of three or more medical men, shall be appointed to determine the eligibility of applicants whom they will recommend to the committee of management for admission. No person suffering from any infectious or contagions disease will be admitted to the hospital.

A book shall be kept at the hospital, in which shall be entered the name, age, date of admission, nature of malady, previous occupation, residence, and religion of each immate, also the name and abode of their nearest relative or friend, and a column in which to show cause of discharge or date of death.

Friends of inmates will be allowed to visit them between the hours of Two p.m. and Six p.m. on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, and Sundays.

All immates must obey the instructions of the medical

All inmates must obey the instructions of the medical officers and matron.

Inmates are expected when able and when so desired to help the matron and nurses in any needful duties of the hospital—such as mending the linen, &c., and especially in attending upon the other inmates whose weakness and wants may be greater than their own.

Gambling, improperlanguage, and smoking in the wards are strictly prohibited.

All lights to be out and inmates to be in bed by Nine o'clock p.m. in winter, and Ten in summer.

Any inmates disobeying any of the rules of the hospital will be liable to expulsion by the committee.

Inmates will be required to sign a "form of will" provided by the committee, on admission.

He shall conduct the correspondence and clerical business of the hospital; and prepare, sign, and issue all summonses, notices, and advertisements.

He shall attend all general meetings, committee meetings, and sub-committee meetings, giving all the information and assistance in his power to the members of these bodies, and keep a book of the minutes.

He shall keep all books and accounts of the hospital.

He shall order all supplies of stores required by the matron, and see that all supplies are of the quality and description contracted for.

He shall carefully examine all accounts for articles supplied, and make the accounts ready for the stabilities meeting. He shall take stock at the end of every quarter of the stores remaining in the hospital, and shall report the same to the committee.

The matron is to superintend and have charge of the hospital.

She shall have charge of all the furniture, bedding, and stores of every kind in the institution.

She shall keep a strict account of every article, not only in the store, but in the wards; let nothing be issued from the store but by her direction; see that nothing is lost, wasted, or destroyed; hold the nurses and servants of the hospital responsible for whatever is entrusted to their care, and take an account weekly of everything in use.

When articles require washing, she shall see that accurate lists are made in duplicate, one of which is to be delivered to the laundress, who is to be responsible for them whilst being washed, and return them in accordance with the lists.

She shall daily ascertain what is necessary for the food of the inmates; give the requisite orders to the contractors, and see that the food is supplied in compliance with the orders.

She shall direct the food to be cooked and served to the inmates in as palatable form as possible, and with such economy as to ensure a minimum amount of waste; also keep a daily list of the dicts.

She is to hire, suspend, or discharge the nurses and servants; to instruct them in the performance of their duties, and to see that they perform their duties with diligence, attention, gentleness, and humanity.

She shall be responsible to the committee for the discharge of her duties; not leave the hospital without their permission, and when absent provide that her duties are efficiently discharged by some responsible subordinate.

She shall enforce the strictest cleanliness throughout the wards, bedding, and clothing of the patients scrupulously clean.

night.

She shall give due attention to the medical officer when he visits the hospital; see that his instructions are duly carried out, and that the medicines and medical comforts prescribed by him are duly administered.

She shall take care that none of the inmates receive liquors or improper provisions, and that fruit or delicacies of any kind, brought by visitors or friends of the patients, be distributed entirely by her direction.

She is to afford the patients every facility for obtaining religious instruction and consolation, and the attendance of their respective ministers when they desire it.

The medical officer will visit the hospital ordinarily once a week; but should any urgent case require it, the matron will send for him in the meantime, taking care in such cases not to put off sending till too late, so as to avoid, if possible, night visits.

She shall make a weekly report to the committee—noting

She shall make requisitions for any articles of stores that may be required, and submit them to the committee for approval. When the stores are supplied she shall take charge of them.

She shall report to the committee any repairs of the building and furniture that may be necessary; see that they are properly performed, and that they are efficient.

In the event of the death of any inmate, she is to communicate immediately with the friends of the deceased; or, if these are not to be found, or they have no means wherewith to pay the funeral expenses, she shall see that the funeral is properly conducted.

She shall have apartments and board in the hospital; will receive such salary as the committee may appoint, and will be liable to be discharged at a month's notice, or on receiving a month's salary, or in case of misconduct at once, without salary, by the committee.

The nurses shall diligently obey the orders of the matron; carry out the directions of the medical officer; keep themselves neat and clean, and conduct themselves with civility to all persons they come in contact with.

They shall keep the wards, furniture, bedding, and clothes of the patients scrupulously clean, and the wards well ventilated and properly warmed.

They shall attend to the wants and comforts of the patients, and treat them with the greatest gentleness and humanity.

They shall pay particular attention to patients suffering from malignant or orfensive diseases; promptly remove all offensive discharges, and adopt all suggestions for rendering their position comfortable and free from unnecessary offence.

They shall watch carefully all patients suffering from dangerous diseases or symptoms, and report to the matron any change in their state, or anything requiring immediate attention.

They shall not permit the patients to get liquors or food, except their proper diet, or whatever the matron may direct to be given them.

They shall not permit any unnecessary noise or disturbance in the wards, nor allow strangers or visitors in the wards, except during the proper visiting hours, and they shall report any breach of discipline to the matron without delay.

They shall not receive any money, gratuity, or reward from
